- (a) Alcohol is permitted to be sold at any time to people staying in hotel rooms for consumption on the premises.
- (b) The hours of serving of alcohol to the general public will be subject to conditions limiting the sale of alcohol after a specified time to those attending pre-booked events held at the hotel,
- (c) The exhibition of film, in the form of recordings or non-broadcast television programmes to be viewed in hotel bedrooms, will generally be permitted.

1G Policy PB1 applies:

Applications will only be granted if it can be demonstrated that the proposal meets the relevant criteria in Policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone,

encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price.
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.
- 10. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority

Proposed conditions from Environmental Health and agreed by applicant:

EH consolidated conditions:

- 11. Subject to Condition (15) below, all door staff engaged at Steam Bar whether inside the bar or outside shall wear fluorescent arm bands displaying their SIA badges.
- 12. On Friday and Saturday nights a minimum of 4 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the premises from 2200 to close of business
- 13. On Friday and Saturday nights the premises must employ 1 female SIA door woman from 2200 to close of business.

- 14. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
 - (a) The Police (and where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;
 - (b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the Police;
 - (c) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the Police; and
 - (d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.
- 15. From the end of licensable activities up until 30 minutes after the end of licensable activities in the Steam Bar on a Friday and Saturday night, the door staff employed outside the premises shall wear high vis jackets to ensure safe and crime free dispersal of customers from the premises
- 16. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 17. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 18. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed the following:
 - a) Ground Floor

Steam Bar: 180 (Sunday to Thursday) Steam Bar: 230 (Friday to Saturday)

Restaurant: 150

Executive Lounge: 100

MacIver Function Room: 40

Thunderbolt Function Room: 50

Maine Function Room: 20 Tangley Function Room: 20 Talisman Function Room: 20

b) First Floor

Hobart Function Room: 20 Campanula Function Room: 25 Hurricane Function Room: 15 Kingfisher Function Room: 25 Redstar Function Room: 40 Comet Function Room: 20 Hotspur Function Room: 10 King George Function Room: 25 Great Western 1 and Great Western 2 Function Rooms: 400

c) Second Floor

Somerset Function Room: 12

d) Fourth Floor

Cornwall Function Room: 20

- 19. Substantial food will be available throughout the permitted hours.
- The supply of alcohol and provision of regulated entertainment in the Function and Meeting Rooms shall be restricted to pre-booked functions only.
- 21. The supply of alcohol in the Restaurant after 23:00 hours until 03:00 hours shall be ancillary to table meals or to persons who are:
 - (i) Residents of the hotel
 - (ii) Guests of residents of the hotel
 - (iii) Persons attending a pre-booked function at the hotel
 - (iv) Bona fide guests of the proprietor
 - (v) Artistes or persons employed at the premises.
- The supply of Alcohol in the Steam Bar after 23:00 hours shall be ancillary to music and/ or dancing and substantial refreshment.
- 23. For any persons admitted to the Steam Bar after 23:00 hours, the supply of alcohol shall only take place if they fall into one of the following categories, namely:
 - a) persons who have paid a minimum admission fee of £5 Sunday to Thursday and £7 Friday and Saturday, such sum not to be credited against consumables, or
 - b) persons attending a pre-booked private function at the premises, or
 - c) artistes or persons employed at the premises, or
 - d) bona fide guests of the proprietor, or
 - e) persons who are taking or have taken a table meal within the hotel, or
 - f) persons residing at the hotel and their bona fide guests.
- 24. With the exception of residents and their bona fide guests, all alcohol must be consumed within 30 minutes after the end of permitted hours.
- 25. Persons under 16 shall not be permitted in the bar areas unless accompanied by an adult.
- 26. With the exception within hotel bedrooms there shall be no striptease, no nudity and all persons shall be decently attired at all times in all parts of the premises.
- 27. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and

mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.


- 28. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 29. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 30. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 31. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 32. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
- 33. All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features including materials used in finishing and furnishing shall be either non-combustible or be durably or inherently flame-retarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes (other than foyers), entertainment areas or function rooms, shall be non-combustible.
- 34. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
 - a. Any permanent or temporary emergency lighting battery or system
 - b. Any permanent or temporary electrical installation
 - c. Any permanent or temporary emergency warning system
- 35. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties, save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime.
- 36. The provision of Regulated entertainment shall be ancillary to the main use of the premises as a hotel.
- 37. Food and non-alcoholic drinks including drinking water shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is available.
- 38. On Sunday to Thursdays if there is a pre-booked party of 100 persons or more at the Steam Bar then an SIA registered door supervisor shall be present at the entrance to the Steam Bar from 21:00 until the close of the said Steam Bar.
- 39. On Fridays and Saturdays an SIA registered door supervisor shall be present at the entrance to the ground floor steam bar from 21:00 until close for the said Steam Bar and if there is a party of 100 persons or more booked at the said Steam Bar then there shall be 2 door supervisors at the entrance to the said Steam Bar from 21:00 until close for the Steam Bar.

- 40. In relation to licensable activities or the provision of facilities to enable licensable activities to take place no noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 41. Entrance to the Executive Lounge shall be restricted to those guests who are residing in an Executive room at the premises, or to those people who pay an entry fee.
- 42. The Executive Lounge shall be supervised at all times by a dedicated member of staff.
- 43. All 'off' sales are to be in sealed containers and for consumption off the premises.
- 44. To permit Regulated Entertainment consisting of Live Music, Performance of Dance, Anything of a similar description to Live Music, Recorded Music or Performance of Dance, on New Year's Eve from 10:00 hours until 03.00 on 2 January.
- 45. The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment from the terminal hour for those activities on New Year's Eve through to the commencement time for those activities on New Year's Day.
- 46. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 47. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the Following.
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) any complaints received regarding crime and disorder
 - (c) any incidents of disorder
 - (d) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (e) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 48. There shall be no admittance after 02:30 hours to the Steam Bar.
- 49. There shall be no re-admittance after 02:30 hours to the Steam Bar except for those wishing to smoke.
- 50. The licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by door staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction to the public highway.
- 51. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 52. No advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) that advertises or promotes the Steam Bar, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services shall be inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or be distributed to the public.

- 53. The Licence will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and this condition has been removed from the Licence.
- Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - smoke machines and fog generators
 - pyrotechnics including fireworks
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - real flame.
 - strobe lighting.

Proposed by residents associations:

- 55. The direct entrance to the Steam Bar should only be used within core hours,
- 56. There should be SIA provision at the Steam Bar entrance in the evenings, after 8pm.
- 57. After core hours, entrance and exit of patrons should be through the hotel lobby
- 58. No drinking outside is permitted
- 59. The number of smokers permitted outside at any one time shall not exceed (awaiting clarification from CAB).













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




Drawing No 712/7 Area for the Sale and Consumption of Alcohol A A A A 1

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8. (i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (iii) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (iv) (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.
- 10. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

- All door staff engaged at Steam Bar whether inside the bar or outside shall wear fluorescent arm bands displaying their SIA badges.
- 12. On Friday and Saturday nights a minimum of 4 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the premises from 2200 to close of business
- On Friday and Saturday nights the premises must employ 1 female SIA door woman from 2200 to close of business.
- 14. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
 - (a) The Police (and where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay:
 - (b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the Police;
 - (c) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the Police; and
 - (d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.
- 15. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

Further to our telephone conversation last week, I write to confirm the views of the Paddington Waterways and Maida Vale Society (PWMVS) and SEBRA in respect of the application. In a nutshell, subject to the clarification requested below re: late night refreshment, the concern is that the application to remove condition 42 and establish a new entrance to the bar where the entrance to the casino was could in effect lead to the establishment of a late night bar which operates, or gives the impression of operating, independently of the hotel itself, particularly late at night. This gives rise to a number of concerns:

- Para 2.5.49 of the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy states that 'The extent and location of provision of bar facilities will be taken into account. Hotel bars that are directly or easily reached from the street will be likely to raise similar concerns to pubs and bars.' With a new entrance, and without SIA provision except after 10pm on Friday and Saturday, the bar will be 'directly or easily reached from the street'.
- It is generally appreciated in the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, and indeed by PWMVS and SEBRA, that dedicated hotel bars (even with an element of use by the public) do not tend to be problematic. However, they are mindful of a number of review applications in recent years in Westminster which have been made against hotels where the operation of the hotel itself is unproblematic, but the use of late night bar and club areas for members of the public have raised concerns- for example, Mayfair Hotel (Mayfair Bar) and St Martin's Lane Hotel (Bungalow 8). In each of these examples, there was a separate entrance for the public to the areas in question.
- The conditions on the licence suggest that the operation of the bar can change after 11pm to more of a 'nightclub' atmosphere (conditions 21 and 22). This seems to be borne out, at least on a Friday and Saturday, by internet reviews. PWMVS and SEBRA would be against changes to the operation of the bar which lead to it becoming a late night bar for members of the public with an entrance/exit a considerable distance from the main hotel entrance meaning that hotel guests may not be disturbed by late night revellers but that local resident may be.
- The Pride of Paddington public house is directly opposite the proposed new entrance. A late night bar accessible from the street to members of the public could lead to customers of this and other pubs in the area migrating to the bar after core hours.

It may be helpful if your client could clarify the following:

- Would the extended hours for late night refreshment apply solely to hotel residents and their *bona fide* guests?
- Is your client seeking to extend the bar area as part of this application? It is not clear from the plans submitted for the ground floor whether the bar area is being extended, and the plans available on the City Council's Licensing Register do not include the plans for the basement, in which I believe the casino was situated. I note that a planning application has been submitted (14/10183/FULL), which is for 'change of use of ground and lower ground floors from Casino to ancillary bar for Hilton London Paddington Hotel and associated alterations', and 14/10184/LBC, for 'internal alterations to part of ground and basement floors in connection with use as a bar.'

What is the purpose of changing the entrance for members of the public?

Having considered the conditions proposed (including the amendments agreed with the police), the amenity societies are of the view that the application if granted as sought would impact on the licensing objectives. They therefore propose that, should the Sub-Committee approve the removal of condition 42, the new entrance should only be used within core hours, and that there should be SIA provision at the new entrance in the evenings, after, say, 8pm. After core hours, entrance and exit of patrons should be through the hotel lobby, as is the case now. They also propose that, in light of the potential effects of the removal of condition 42, modern 'good practice' conditions are added to the licence, e.g. that no drinking outside is permitted, and a restriction on the number of smokers permitted outside at any one time.
