Summary 1.

1.1 This report seeks approval for the expenditure of £28,167.45 from the Ward Budget in order to commission:

The installation and maintenance of 237 hanging baskets throughout the Marylebone High Street ward in June and October 2016.

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1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007. The extension to the ward budget programme was agreed in March 2010 for continuation until March 2014.
- 1.2 The renewal of the ward budget programme for the years 2014-2018 was agreed in June 2014.
- 1.3 Budget provision of £46,000 for the financial year 2016/17 exists to fund ward based projects, in addition to any unallocated funds from the 2014/15 and 2015/16 ward budget allocation.

2. Proposed Projects

2.1 £28,167.45 will fund the installation and maintenance of 237 hanging baskets throughout the Marylebone High Street ward these will be installed in June 2016 and again in October 2016. This proposal has been developed in response to the priority of greening (full details are set out in Appendix A).

3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 To date there been no expenditure from the 2016/17 ward budget for Marylebone High Street. £9,644.89 has been rolled over from the 2015/16 ward budget giving £55,644.89
- 3.2 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £28,167.45 and leaves £27,477.44 available for future allocation.

4. Legal Implications

4.1 The proposals accordingly involve expenditure which is within the City Council's power, and within the guidelines for the use of Ward Budgets.

5. Outstanding Issues

5.1 There are no outstanding issues. All ward councillors' agree to the expenditure.

6. Consultation

- 6.1 The proposal has been agreed by all three ward members.
- 6.2 The proposal for the installation of hanging baskets has been drawn up and verified following consultation with the provider (Windowflowers), Finance and Legal.

7. Equalities

7.1 The proposals in this report will support the Council's wider equalities and diversity agenda by focusing on addressing local issues with enhanced local engagement.

8. Reason for Decision

8.1 The expenditure is expected to help address the priority of 'greening' throughout the Marylebone High Street ward.
