

Sussex Gardens section at Norfolk Place and Radnor Place junction.

- Explains the proposals; right turn pocket retained to enable buses to turn right into Norfolk Place, segregated cycle lanes continue, footway reduced to enable the right turn pocket form vehicles and segregated cycle facility.
- Rationalize tactile paving and passive bollards to be consistent, as part of the works. How many buses turning right at Norfolk Place?
- Three bus routes.
- Sign on Sussex Gardens to be lit and improved.
- Praed Street takes lots of east bound traffic.
- Are lamp columns shown on the drawing? Can scaffold lorries turn into private roads?
- Yes.

Sussex Gardens, London Street and Sussex Place junction.

- Explains the proposals; segregated lanes continue, bus stop bypass.
- Bus stand is for the 436 bus on diversion, which will be abolished in November. The Yellow box junction is not being replaced?
- Not required, but if problems occur we can implement later.
- Bins at Sussex Gardens to be considered.
- Will check with Church Commissioners.

Sussex Gardens, Talbot Square and Spring Street junctions.

- Explained proposals; segregation continues, footway cut back and repaving.
- Right turn into Spring Gardens doesn't have a turning pocket.
- Zebra crossing at island near Sussex Gyratory will provide a break in traffic.
- Works at Paddington Station may cause changes to buses, which directs them into Spring Street. These proposals don't account for future changes.
- To confirm that the carriageway layout can be altered if changes are required.
