The premises are located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area as defined within the City of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy.

The applicant has submitted the following plans for the premises:

• Licensing Plans: drawing number 21996-L01, Dated January 2017

This representation is based on the plans and Operating Schedule submitted.

The applicant is seeking the following variations:

- 1. To change the layout of the premises in accordance with the submitted plans; this includes the addition of the first floor of the premises to the licensed area, and removal of the licensed area from the basement.
- 2. To extend the terminal hour to 0100 Monday to Sunday for licensable activities namely Regulated Entertainment, Late Night Refreshment and the Supply of Alcohol both 'on' and 'off' the premises.
- 3. To add, amend and remove conditions from the existing licence.

I wish to make the following representations in relation to the above application:

- 1. Any alterations to the premises are required to be inspected by the Council's Environmental Health Service to confirm that they are satisfied that the premises are suitable, in relation to addressing the licensing objectives of Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance.
- 2. The applicant sought pre-application advice prior to making this application. Within my report I advised that although this proposal is technically against Policy CIP1, this premises already benefits from hours longer than core hours, and policy RNT2 recognises that appropriately conditioned restaurants have little association with crime and disorder or public nuisance up until 0100 hours. Appropriate conditions have been proposed by the applicant.
- 3. The applicant sought pre-application advice prior to making this application. The changes to the conditions are in accordance with this advice, with one exception as detailed below:

Within my pre-application report I advised the applicant that to address Public Nuisance and Public Safety concerns a 'works' condition as detailed below should be included in an application:

The variation of this premises licence to include the (state the works requested and plans reference) will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from this licence by the licensing authority.

Although all other conditions were amended or included as suggested, this key condition was omitted, I believe in error. If the applicant were to amend the operating schedule to include this condition, this would help address my concerns.

The granting of the variation where representation is made, as currently presented, would have the likely effect of causing an increase of Public Nuisance in the West End Cumulative Impact Area and may impact upon Public Safety.

Following the agreement of conditions Environmental Health have since withdrawn their representation.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a responsible authority, are making a representation. It is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue is situated within the West End Cumulative Impact Area, a locality where this is traditionally high crime and disorder but I believe this application may cause further policing problems in the area.



(ii) Applications for hours outside the core hours set out below in this policy will be considered on their merits, subject to other relevant policies.



We refer to our client's application and the Licensing Sub-Committee hearing scheduled 4 April 2017. We would be grateful for Member's consideration of this letter before the hearing.

The application is submitted in accordance with recent planning consent and pre application advice reference 16/11510/PREAPM. As a result, the Environmental Health Consultation Team have withdrawn their representation. Only representations from the Police and Licensing Authority remain.

The application was submitted in conjunction with a minor variation application submitted in respect of 12 Macclesfield Street. Our client is the freehold owner of both premises.

The applications involve:

- The reduction in licensable area in respect of 12 Macclesfield Street, which has an existing
 premises licence authorising licensable activities until 01:00hrs. The effect is a reduction of
 capacity of 40 persons.
- A reconfiguration of the licensable areas in 10 Gerrard Street resulting in an increase in capacity
 of approximately 34 persons and an extension in hours to 01:00hrs.
- The net reduction in capacity of 6 persons in the Cumulative Impact Area.
- The addition of updated model licence conditions to both licences (including MC38 and MC39).

Pre application advice purpose: Both premises are being redeveloped. Advice has been requested regarding changes to the licensed areas and changes to licensed hours and conditions.

Issues discussed and actions taken:

Various office and site meetings with Nicola Curtis (Environmental Health Enforcement Officer), Alan Lynagh (District Surveyor) and Alex Doyle (Apprentice District Surveyor) were conducted.

Proposal and Licensing Position:

The current licence for 10 Gerrard Street (06/09119/WCCMAP) authorises the following licensable activities across the Basement and Ground floors of the premises:

Playing of Recorded Music – unrestricted

Private Entertainment consisting of dancing, music or other entertainment of a like kind for consideration and with a view to profit – unrestricted

Late Night Refreshment – Monday to Saturday 2300 to 0030 hours, Sunday 2300 to 0000 hours

Sale by Retail of Alcohol 'on' and 'off' the premises Monday to Saturday 1000 to 0000 hours and Sunday 1200 to 2330 hours

The current licence for **12 Macclesfield Street (16/01941/LIPDPS)** authorises the following licensable activities across the basement (back of house), ground, first and second floors of the premises:

Exhibition of a Film – Monday to Sunday 1200 to 2330 hours

Performance of Live Music - Monday to Sunday 1200 to 2330 hours Playing of Recorded Music – unrestricted

Provision of facilities for entertainment of a similar description to making music or dancing -Monday to Sunday 1200 to 2300 hours

Anything of a similar description to Live Music or Recorded Music Monday to Sunday 1200 to 2330 hours

Late Night Refreshment – Monday to Saturday 2300 to 0030 hours, Sunday 2300 to 0000 hours

Private Entertainment consisting of dancing, music or other entertainment of a like kind for consideration and with a view to profit – unrestricted

Sale by Retail of Alcohol 'on' the premises - Monday to Sunday 1200 to 0100 hours

There are no capacity figures on either licence, save for a restriction of 40 persons on the 2^{nd} floor of 12 Macclesfield Street.

Advice is sought regarding the following proposals:

- · Change the layouts of each of the two premises.
- Add the first floor of 10 Gerrard Street to the licensed area, and remove the licensed area from the basement level. A capacity of 70 persons is proposed on each of the ground and first floors, making 140 persons in total.
- Remove the 2nd floor from the licensed area at 12 Macclesfield Street, and introduce capacities of 40 persons on the ground floor and 60 persons on the first floor, making 100 persons in total.
- Extend the terminal hour for licensable activities at 10 Gerrard Street to 0100 Monday to Sunday.

The applicant has calculated that the above proposals would, given the current lack of fixed capacities on the two licences, lead to a reduction of at least 6 persons from the West End Cumulative Impact Area:

- plus 70 on 10 Gerrard Street first floor
- minus 36 in 10 Gerrard Street basement (based on current layout)
- minus 40 on 12 Macclesfield Street second floor
- equals a reduction of 6 persons in the West End cumulative impact area.

Plans (dated January 2017, drawing numbers 21996-L01 (10 Gerrard Street) and 22511-L01 (12 Macclesfield Street) have been submitted with the pre-application request. **Technical** advice has been issued by the District Surveyor separately from this report.

Sanitary provision - 10 Gerrard Street

The plans show the following sanitary provisions at the premises

- 1 Male WC and 1 urinals
- 3 Female WCs
- At basement level 3 hand wash basins are in a shared male/female lobby this area should be covered by CCTV and be proactively monitored.
- 1 self-contained DDA facility
- 1 staff WC

Sanitary provision - 12 Macclesfield Street

The plans show the following sanitary provisions at the premises

- 1 Male WC and 1 urinals
- 3 Female WCs
- 1 staff WC

The proposal to vary the layout, remove the 2nd floor from the licensed area, and add capacity figures could be considered appropriate to <u>submit as a minor variation</u> – subject to the removal, addition and variation of conditions as detailed below:

Amend Licence Condition 10

TO: MC38 The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.

Amend Licence Condition 11

TO: MC41 Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

Amend Licence Condition 14

TO: MC01 The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.

Amend Licence Condition 16

TO: The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed: Ground floor 40 persons; First floor 60 persons

Remove Licence Conditions 12, 15, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 27 and 28

Amend Licence Condition 24

TO: MC12 No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

Amend Licence Condition 25

TO: MC14 All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after 21:00 hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.

Amend Licence Condition 26

TO: MC11 A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service, so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured by key or password to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental Health Service and access shall only be by persons authorised by the Premises Licence holder. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Environmental Health Service. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.

Add New Conditions:

MC02 A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

10 Gerrard Street (06/09119/WCCMAP)

The premises are located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area (CIA) and therefore WCC Policies HRS1, CIP1 and RNT2 apply.

Currently these premises (and those at 12 Macclesfield Street) could potentially attract an unspecified and unrestricted number of people to the West End CIA. This proposal will limit by condition the number of people coming to the two premises to no more than 240 persons overall. This goes towards addressing cumulative impact concerns.

The proposal also seeks to increase the terminal hour at 10 Gerrard Street to 0100 hours for all licensable activities. Although this is technically against Policy CIP1, this premises already benefits from hours longer than core hours, and policy RNT2 recognises that appropriately conditioned restaurants have little association with crime and disorder or public nuisance up until 0100 hours.

The proposal to vary the layout, add the first floor of 10 Gerrard Street to the licensed area, and remove the licensed area from the basement level, add capacity figures, and extend the terminal hour for licensable activities to 0100 Monday to Sunday should be <u>submitted as a full variation</u> with the recommended removal, addition and variation of conditions as detailed below:

Amend Licence Condition 4

TO: MC38 The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.

Amend Licence Condition 5

TO: MC41 Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

Remove Licence Conditions 6 and 7

Add New Conditions:

The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed: Ground floor 70 persons; First floor 70 persons

MC01 The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.

MC02 A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

MC12 No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

MC13 Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.

MC16 There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after 23.00

MC17 All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.

MC21 Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

MC23 Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.

MC34 All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

MC39 The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.

MC42 During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.

MC56 There shall be no sales of hot food or hot drink for consumption off the premises after 23.00.

MC82 The variation of this premises licence (state the licensing reference number) to include the (state the works requested and plans reference) will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from this licence by the licensing authority.

MC87 No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.

The terminal hour for the supply of alcohol on New Year's Eve shall be extended to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

Conclusions

If my advice is incorporated into the respective applications, and model conditions are included then Westminster Licensing Policy will be met, and the licensing objectives of Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Protection of Children from Harm and Prevention of Crime and Disorder will be addressed.

As part of the application process it is advised that the other responsible authorities will also need to assess the proposals and may wish to make additional comments.


