<p>I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the above premises.</p> <p>The applicant has submitted plans of the Ground Floor, First Floor (references not legible) and Basement (reference - drawing no 1257-07.1 Rev B dated 30.10.12).</p> <p>The following licensable activities are being sought:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To provide for the Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off' the premises between 10:00 to 23:30 hours Monday to Thursday, 10:00 to 00:00 hours Friday and Saturday, 12:00 and 22:30 hours Sunday. 3. To provide Late Night Refreshment 'indoors' between 23:00 and 23:30 Monday to Thursday and 23:00 to 00:00 hours Friday and Saturday. 4. To provide Recorded Music between 10:00 to 23:30 hours Monday to Thursday, 10:00 to 00:00 hours Friday and Saturday and 12.00 to 22:30 hours Sunday. 	

5. All licensable activities shall be extended from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

I wish to make the following representations based on the plans submitted and the supporting operating schedule:

1. The hours requested for and the Supply of Alcohol may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the area
2. The hours requested for and the provision of Late Night Refreshment may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the area
3. The hours requested for and the provision of Recorded Music may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the area
4. The extension in hours sought for all the licensable activities may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the area.

Environmental Health also makes the following further comments:

- i. I understand the premises has an existing Premises Licence, 16/08432/LIPDPS, and clarification is sought on the status and operators of this licence.
- ii. An extensive list of conditions has been offered in the operating schedule and these are under consideration as to whether they are sufficient to allay Environmental Health concerns.
- iii. It is unclear from the application if the premises have undergone changes to layout etc from that of the existing licence. Nevertheless, the premises will need to be inspected for Public Safety prior to commencement of the licensable activities.
- iv. If there have been changes the premises will also need to be assessed for its food preparation/cooking facilities and for any external plant and machinery as a premises history check of the operation under the previous licence shows odour and noise nuisance complaints.
- v. The provision of sanitary accommodation for any proposed capacity is recommended to be in line with the minimum standards as provided in British Standard 6465 to help prevent an increase in Public Nuisance in the area.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a responsible authority, will be objecting to this application. It is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

I would like to visit the premises next week sometime if possible before making decisions regarding suitable conditions. I look forward to hearing from you.

2-B Other Persons

I strongly object to extending the licensing hours beyond 23:00 for 47-48 Newman Street. My bedroom and living room wall is right next to the proposed pub and I cannot cope with the loud music that penetrates through. Previously with the Taverns this was usually til 23:00 on Thursday and Friday, which was difficult enough to tolerate. To have this for later hours and all week would be intolerable. The ventilation system at the back of the building was also very noisy but at least the previous tenants usually remembered to switch it off at midnight. The noise people make on leaving the pub is also acceptable til 11:30pm but not beyond.

The premises in question is surrounded by residences. The licence to serve alcohol and food after 23.00 and for the premises to be kept open until after midnight has the potential to cause major disruption to neighbours who are trying to sleep. When the premises were last in operation noise from events that had music was always clearly audible from my bedroom and sitting room. The noise in the bedroom made it difficult to sleep. I have a demanding job which often means that during the week I have to be awake by 6 am. Having my sleep potentially disrupted beyond the usual pub closing times in the neighbourhood -11.00 pm during the week will potentially have a very negative effect on my well being. In addition the experience I have had with previous tenants has been that air conditioning and other ventilation systems at the back of the building are either turned off some time after the premises has been closed and on many occasions left on all night disrupting sleep. I have had to call the Westminster Noise team on a number of occasions to assist with this type of problem with 47-48 Newman Street. I also object to the application for music to be played from 10.00 am in the morning. This is potentially an extreme form of noise pollution that seems to have little relevance to the services being provided by the business. It has the potential to cause a disruption that runs over 12 hours EVERY day of the week.

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- a) Eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act,
- b) Advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it, and
- c) Foster good relations between persons who share relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

Proposed Conditions

1. The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested
3. The number of persons accommodated at the premises (excluding staff) shall not exceed (insert number). Subject to the sanitary accommodation being improved to the satisfaction of the Council's Environmental Health Officer, the capacity may be increased to such number as may be agreed with the licence holder. The actual capacity will only increase when an appropriate condition to that effect has replaced this condition on the licence.
4. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages shall be available throughout the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
5. There shall be no takeaway of hot food or hot drink from the premises after 23:00 hours.
6. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
7. Notices shall be prominently displayed at exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
8. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
9. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
10. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours.
11. No deliveries to the premises shall be arranged between 23:00 and 08:00 hours.
12. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

13. After 23:00 hours patrons temporarily leaving the premises shall not be permitted to take drinks outside with them.
14. All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after 23:00 hours, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
15. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given:-
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog (except for food presentations)
 - smoke machines and fog generators
 - pyrotechnics including fire works
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - real flame (except for candles)
 - strobe lighting.

16. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.

NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.

17. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
18. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
19. All exit doors on designated escape routes shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
20. All self closing doors shall be effectively maintained and not held open other than by an approved device.
21. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
22. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.
23. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
 - Any emergency lighting battery or system
 - Any electrical installation
 - Any emergency warning system.

24. No entertainment, performance, service, or exhibition involving nudity or sexual entertainment shall be provided except under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence pursuant to the Local Government Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1982 as amended.
25. The air conditioning units operating within the premises must be switched off when licensable activities have ceased for the day.
26. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the licensing authority.
27. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor.

For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

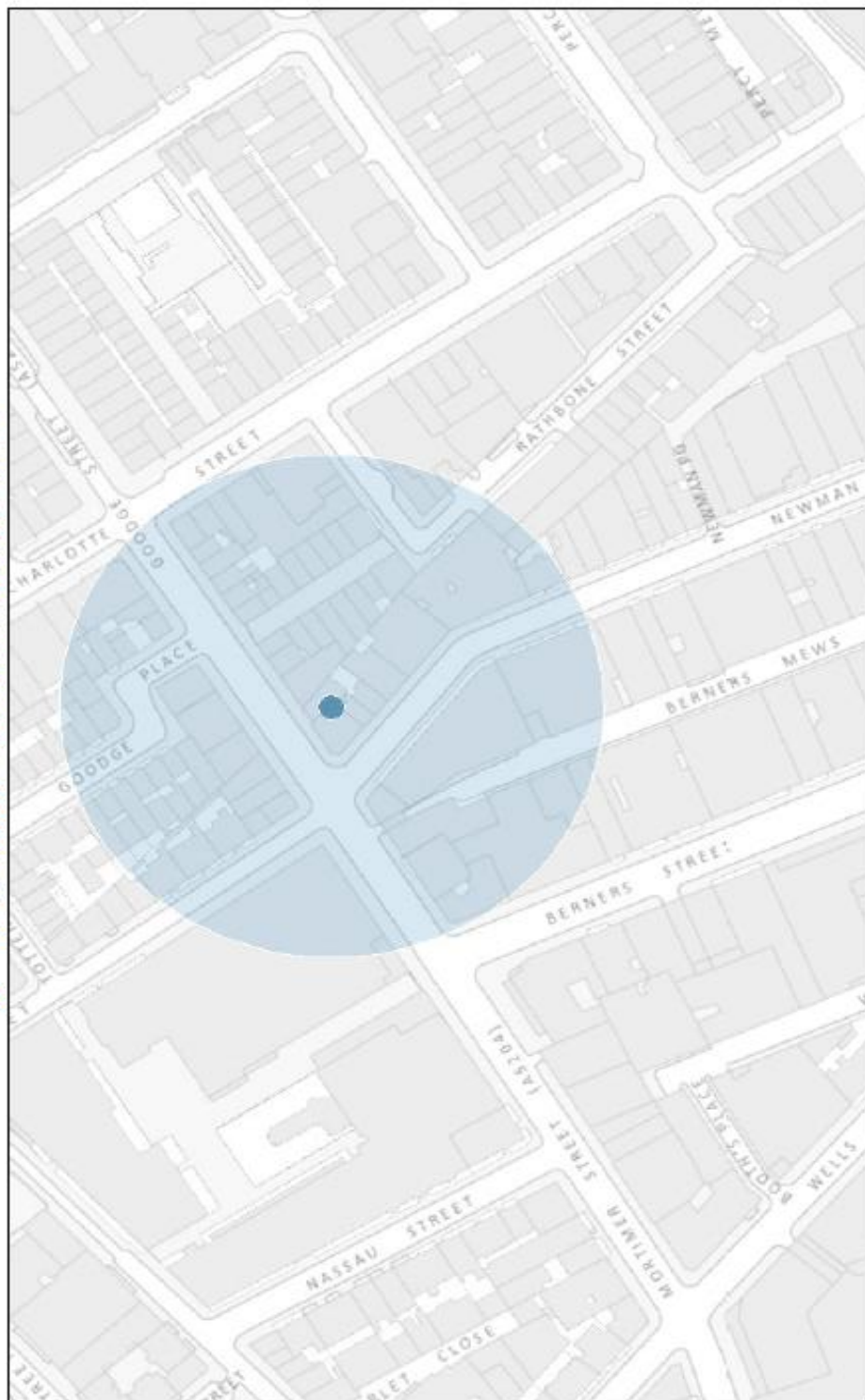
