Dear Westminster Licensing Services I am writing on behalf of the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police Service ("The Police") to make representations opposing the grant of a premises licence application for 23 Barrett Street, W1U 1BF.				
The application seeks the following licensable activities: Late Night Refreshment Monday – Wednesday: 23:00 – 00:00 Thursday – Saturday: 23:00 – 00:30 Supply of alcohol Monday – Thursday: 10:00 – 23:30 Friday and Saturday: 10:00 – 00:00				

Sunday: 10:00 – 22:30

Following consideration of the application and how it may affect the Licensing Objectives, I wish to make the following representation: The proposed licensable activities are likely to undermine the following licensing objective: The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The premises is located at 23 Barrett Street, W1U 1BF. The Police have concerns that a new premises, which provides Late-Night Refreshment outside of core hours on Friday and Saturday, and alcohol without a substantial table meal will adversely impact the area. The premises is located near the very busy shopping district of Oxford Street, and close by to St Christophers Place and James Street.

These streets are already saturated by licensed premises, which can bring crime and disorder to the area. The police are already struggling to cope with excessive crime levels, and this area already suffers from robberies, pickpocketing and theft. If this premises licence is granted, there is nothing stopping patrons from drinking alcohol all day without a substantial table meal, becoming intoxicated and then being targeted by robbers when they leave the premises.

Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy 2021 states under its Public Houses and Bars Policy ("PB1") section A:

Applications outside the West End Cumulative Zone will generally be granted subject to:

The application meeting the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.
 The hours for licensable activities being within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1.

The Police request that the licensing sub-committee take into account all the above points.

Following a reduction in hours the Metropolitan Police withdrew their representation on 14 March 2024

I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the premises.

This representation is based on the operating schedule and plans of the ground floor and basement reference J002165_A2-03.

The applicant is seeking the following.

1. To provide for the Supply of Alcohol both 'On' and 'Off' the premises Monday to Thursday between 10:00 and 23:30 hours. Friday to Saturday between 10:00 and 00:00 hours and Sunday between 10:00 and 22.30 hours. From the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve until 00:30 on New Years Day. Sundays prior to a bank holiday until 23:30.

2. To provide Late Night Refreshment both 'Indoors' and 'Outdoors' Monday to Thursday between 23:00 and 00:00 hours and Friday to Saturday between 23.00 and 00:30 hours. From 23:00 on New Years Eve until 01:00 on New Years Day. Sundays prior to a bank holiday until midnight.

I wish to make the following representation.

1. The supply of alcohol and the hours requested may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the area and may impact on Public Safety.

2. The provision of late-night refreshment and the hours requested may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the area and may impact on Public Safety.

The granting of the application as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the area and may impact on Public Safety. Additional EH conditions may be proposed to uphold the licensing objectives.

We object to the application as currently drafted as it envisages the premises being open beyond Core Hours (Policy HRS1) and therefore likely to contravene PN1, the creation of a public nuisance. Other restaurants and bars in the St Christophers Place and nearby close at Core Hours or earlier and we see no good reason why there should be exceptions to the policy for this application.

Following a reduction in hours the Interested Party withdrew their representation on 18 March 2024

If the application is located within a Special Consideration Zone they have demonstrated that they have taken account of the issues identified in that area and provided adequate mitigation. Whether there is residential accommodation in the proximity of the premises that would likely be adversely affected by premises being open or carrying out operations at the hours proposed.

customers will be permitted to remain on the premises.
5. The proposed hours when any music, including incidental music, will be played.
6. The hours when customers will be allowed to take
food or drink outside the premises or be within

of the premises (if any) and hours of licensable premises in the
vicinity.
8. Whether customers and staff have adequate access to public
transport when arriving at and leaving the premises, especially at
night.
9. The capacity of the premises.
10. The type of use, recognising that some venues are more likely to
impact the licensing objectives than others; for example, pubs
and bars are higher risk than theatres, cinemas and other cultural
and sporting venues due to the nature of the operation.
11. The Licensing Authority will take into account the active
measures proposed for a 'winding down' period including
arrangements for people to be collected from the premises to travel
home safely.
12. Conditions on hours may be attached that require that the supply
of alcohol for consumption on the premises ceases a suitable period
of time before customers are required to leave the premises.
13. The council, acting as the Licensing Authority, may reduce hours
if, after review, it is necessary to impose conditions specifying
shorter hours in order to promote the licensing objectives.
14. Specific days for non-standard hours should be identified and justified as part of the application to allow responsible authorities
and interested parties to evaluate the impact that these licensable
activities may have, and to plan accordingly. The consideration of
applications for later hours for Bank Holiday Mondays will take into
account that later hours are generally granted for preceding
Sundays and that the next day is a working day. Non-specific days
are expected to be covered by Temporary Event Notices or variation

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

(b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and

(c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.



CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule


- 9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 11. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - a. all crimes reported to the venue,
 - b. all ejections of patrons,
 - c. any complaints received concerning crime and disorder,
 - d. any incidents of disorder,
 - e. all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons,
 - f. any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment,
 - g. any refusal of the sale of alcohol,
 - h. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 13. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 14. Notices shall be prominently displayed at exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 15. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 on the following day.
- 16. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 17. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 18. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only and shall not be consumed on the premises, except for patrons seated at tables in the outside area.
- 19. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.

- 20. Save in any authorised external seating area patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall not be permitted to take glass containers with them.
- 21. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to persons seated and by waiter or waitress service.
- 22. All tables and chairs shall be removed (or made unusable) from the outside area by 23.00 hours each day.
- 23. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are properly supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 24. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 25. Deliveries of food and drink shall only be made to a bona fide residential or business addresses.
- 26. Delivery drivers/riders shall be given clear written instructions to use their vehicles in a responsible manner so as not to cause a nuisance to any residents or generally outside of the licensed premises.
- 27. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the licensing authority.
- 28. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where there are minor changes to the premises layout during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.
- 29. No licensable activities shall take at the premises until the capacity of the premises has been determined by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the licensing authority has replaced this condition on the licence with a condition detailing the capacity so determined provided that the internal capacity of the premises shall be no less than 52 excluding staff; which number has been approved as being satisfactory under Building Regulations on the basis of 2 unisex WCs.

Environmental Heath have proposed the following alternative condition:

No licensable activities shall take at the premises until the capacity of the premises has been determined by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the licensing authority has replaced this condition on the licence with a condition detailing the capacity so determined provided that the internal capacity of the premises shall be 52 excluding staff; which number has been approved as being satisfactory under Building Regulations on the basis of 3 unisex WCs.

30. A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
