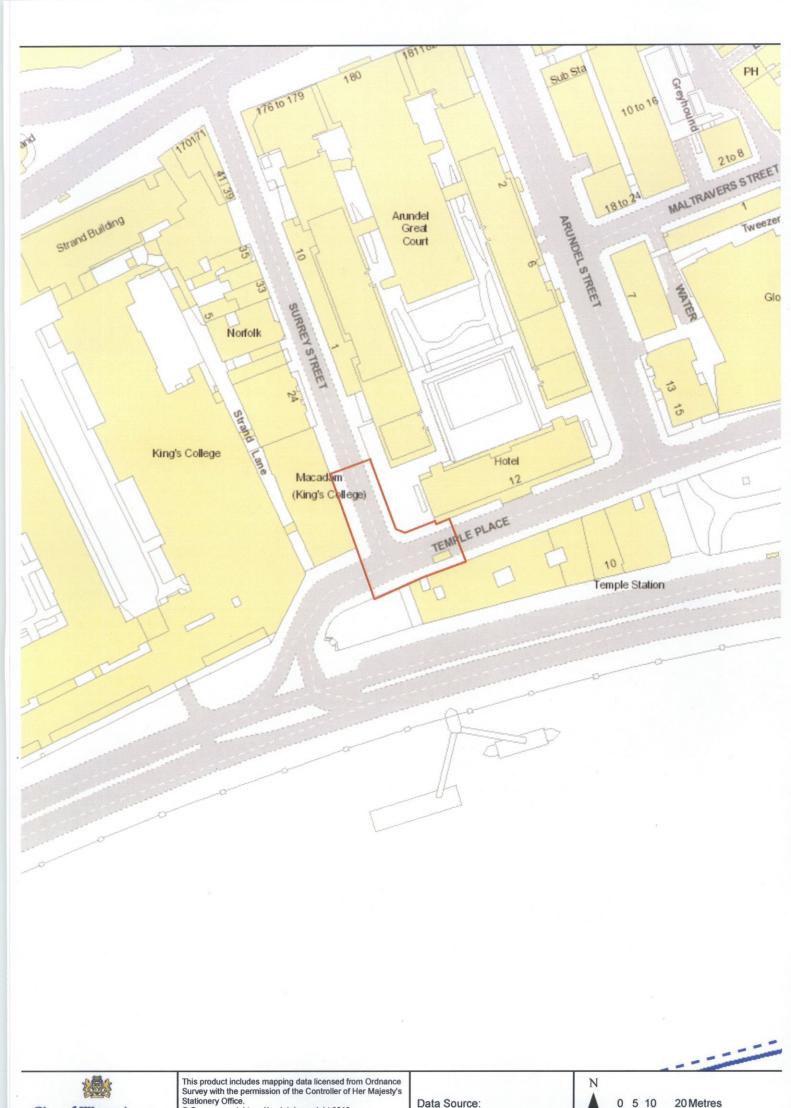

2. SUMMARY

The application site is located on the south side of Temple Place within the Strand Conservation Area.

Listed building consent is sought to relocate the existing Grade II listed cabmen's shelter from its current location on the southern side of Temple Place to the eastern side of Surrey Street.

The listed taxi cab shelter in Temple Place is proposed to be relocated to Surrey Street. The structure is designed to be moveable and there is no specific relevance to its location in Temple Place and the reasons for its listing. The alternative location is considered acceptable in historic building terms.

The application has been submitted in connection with the planning application for the Garden Bridge. It needs to be relocated due to proposed highway alterations to Temple Place. However, the proposal is acceptable in listed building terms on its own merits as a stand alone proposal.

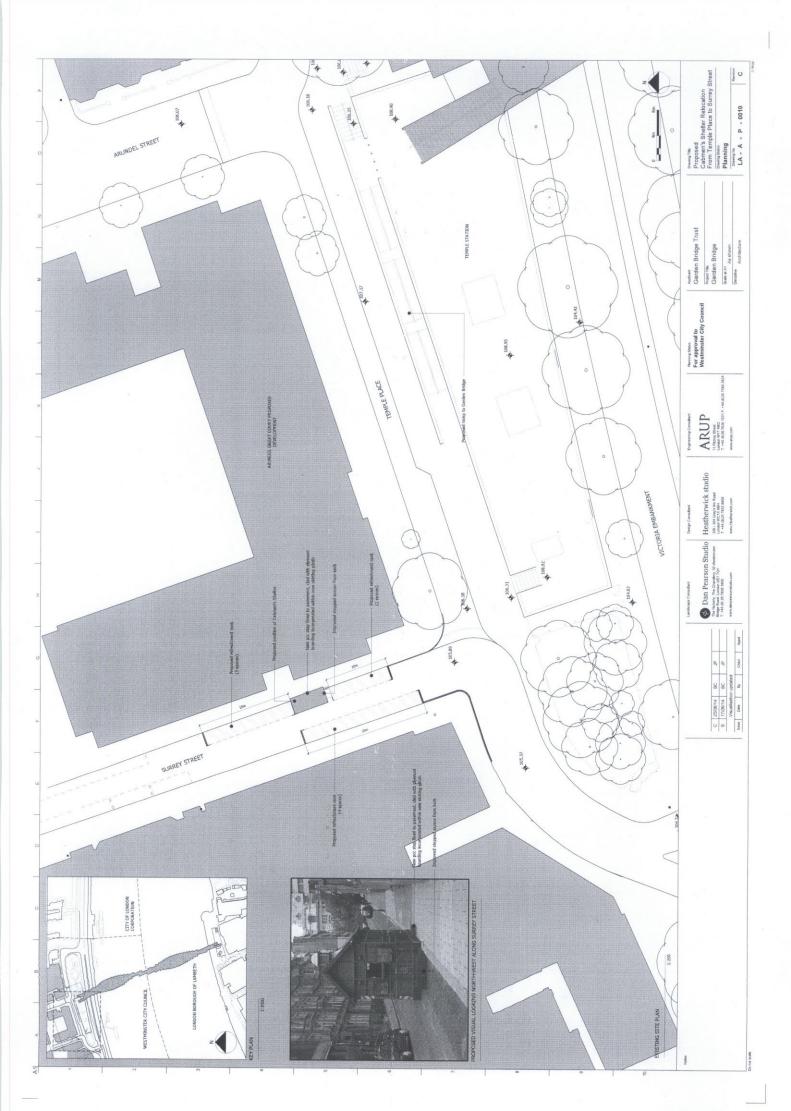

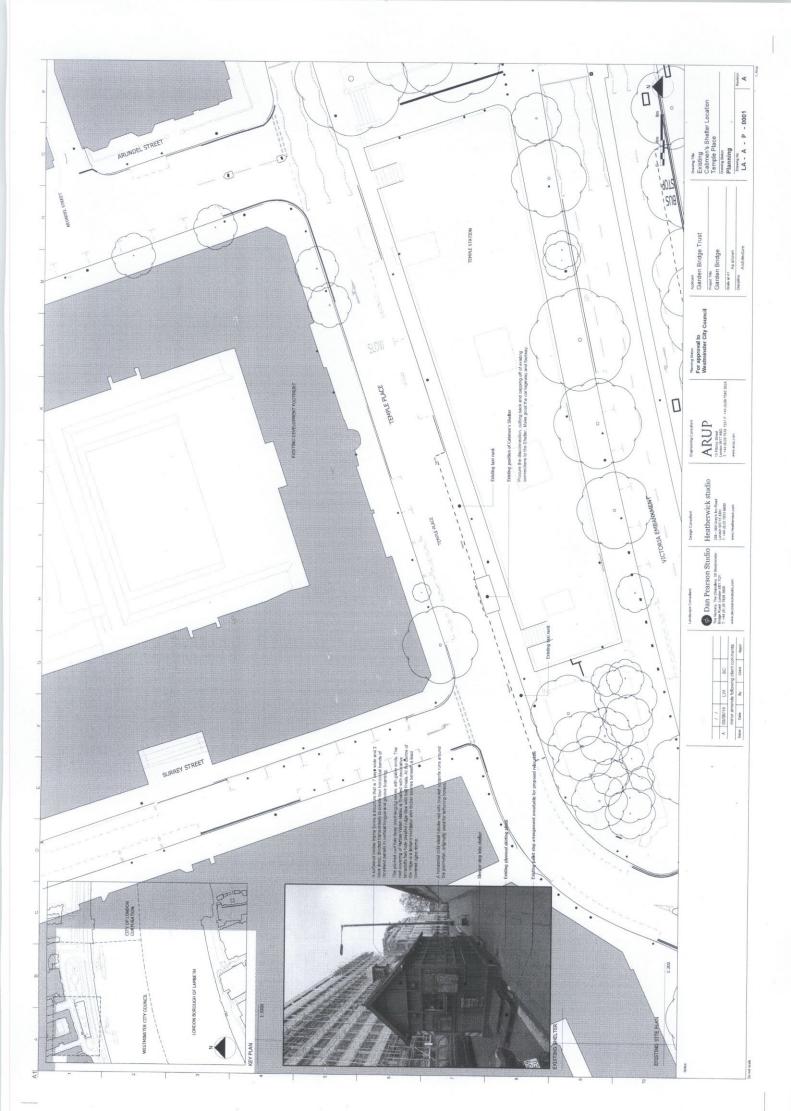

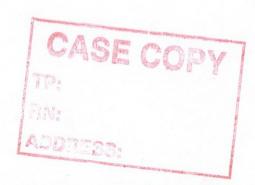
SUMMARY OF REASONS FOR GRANTING CONDITIONAL LISTED BUILDING CONSENT - In reaching the decision to grant listed building consent with conditions, the City Council has had regard to the relevant policies in the National Planning Policy Framework March 2012, the London Plan July 2011, Westminster's City Plan: Strategic Policies adopted November 2013, and the City of Westminster Unitary Development Plan adopted January 2007, as well as relevant supplementary planning guidance, representations received and all other material considerations.
