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1. Executive Summary

- 1.1 This report sets out details of a forthcoming review of the City Council's Code of Governance to ascertain what updating is necessary, and will consider in particular what further guidance could usefully be given on the publication of ward newsletters.
- 1.2 The outcome of the review will be reported to the Standards Committee at its meeting on the 15 November.

2. Recommendations

2.1 That the Committee note the report and consider whether there are any particular areas covered by the Code of Governance which should be addressed in the review.

1. Background

- 1.1 There is a need for a review of the Code of Governance arising from a request by the Standards (Hearing) Sub-Committee of Westminster City Council's Standards Committee following the conclusion of a hearing into an investigation of a complaint. The complaint alleged that council facilities had been used in connection with party political matters, produced newsletters for circulation to the public on a large scale and had sought officer assistance to do so.
- 1.2 The Sub-Committee requested, as part of its findings, that a review should be undertaken of the relevant parts of the Code of Governance to ascertain if any updating was necessary and that consideration be given to what further guidance could be given on the publication of ward newsletters, the outcome of such a review should be presented to the Standards Committee.
- 1.3 The review which has been requested presents an opportunity for a wider review of the Code if the Committee considers it appropriate.

2. Review of the Council's Code of Governance

- 2.1 The City Council's Code of Governance was first issued in 1998 and is kept under review and updated in accordance with the principles and requirements of the CIPFA/SOLACE revised framework which itself builds on governance work both in the public and private sectors and in particular "The Good Governance Standard and Public Services" drawn up by the Independent Commission on Good Governance in Public Services.
- 2.2 The City Council's Code of Governance was last reviewed in 2006 and is updated as necessary to reflect organisational changes. The request of the Standards (Hearing) Sub-Committee provides a timely opportunity to review the Code so as to provide greater clarity to Members and also Officers of what is expected of them when representing the Authority.

- 2.3 As part of the review officers will consult Party Whips on the issue of the production of ward newsletters and any other significant changes. Their views will be included in the report presented to Committee.
- 2.4 Following consideration of the report by the Standards Committee any revisions agreed to the Code of Governance will be made and published on the Council's website and a summary of key changes circulated to Members and officers of the Council.

3. Legal Implications

- 3.1 The City Council's revised Members Code of Conduct sets out the conduct which is expected of members and co-opted members of an authority came and into effect from 5 September 2007. It supersedes the original Code adopted by the City Council in 2002 and thus complies with Section 51(2) of the Local Government Act 2000.
- 3.2 The Council may include other provisions which are consistent with those of the revised model code issued in 2007.

4. Financial Implications

4.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report.

5. Conclusion and Reason for Decision

5.1 The review will respond to the request of the Standards (Hearing) Sub-Committee and will offer an opportunity to consider how the Code of Governance could be improved so as to provide greater clarity to Members and also Officers of what is expected of them when representing the Authority.
