I wish to make the following representations in relation to the above application:

1. The provision of Late Night Refreshment 'indoors' and the hours requested for this activity will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the area.

The applicant has provided additional information with the operating schedule which is being considered but does not address the concerns of Environmental Health.

The granting of the new Premises Licence as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the Edgware Road Cumulative Impact area.

UDPATE: On 20 October 2016, the Environmental Health Consultation Team proposed the conditions set out in Appendix 4. The application has not been amended to date to include these conditions.

With reference to the above application I am writing to inform you that the Police, as a Responsible Authority, object to your application for a new Premises Licence as it is our belief that if granted the application may undermine the Licensing Objectives contained in the 2003 Licensing Act.

Our objections relate to the follow:

- The hours applied for late night refreshment are beyond core hours as set out in the WCC Statement of Licensing policy
- The hours sought for LNR are later than the hours the premises are open to the public

UPDATE: On 28 October 2016, the Metropolitan Police provided a number of conditions (see Appendix 4) and advised the applicant:

I will still have to maintain my objection as previously explained. However your agreement to my conditions will provide reassurances. Any reduction in the hours sought for late night refreshment will reduce our concerns.

The application has not been amended to date to include these conditions and there has been no reduction in the hours sought for the provision of late night refreshment.







This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health


- 1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 3. There shall be no sales of hot food or hot drink for consumption off the premises after 23.00.
- 4. The number of persons permitted in the premises after 11pm at any one time (including staff) shall not exceed 30 persons.
- No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

- 6. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 7. All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by **23.00** each day.
- 8. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 9. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 10. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between **23.00** hours and **08.00** hours on the following day.
- 11. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between **23.00** and **08.00** on the following day.
- 12. After 23:00 hours the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 13. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Conditions proposed by the Police

- 14. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 15. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested

- 16. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 17. Outside tables and chairs shall be removed or rendered unusable by 23:00 hours
- 18. The provision of takeaway food shall be no later than midnight
