In considering applications for premises licences under the Licensing Act 2003, the sub-committee is advised of the following:

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The City of Westminster statement of licensing policy applies to all applications where relevant representations have been made. The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the City of Westminster statement of Licensing Policy and the guidance issued by the Secretary of state under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

LIVE MUSIC ACT 2012

The Live Music Act amends the Licensing Act 2003 by:

- removing the licensing requirement for amplified live music taking place between 8am and 11pm before audiences of no more than 200 persons on premises authorised by a premises licence or club premises certificate to supply alcohol for consumption on the premises (at a time when those premises are open for the purposes of being used for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises), subject to the right of a licensing authority to impose conditions about live music following a review of a premises licence or club premises certificate
- removing the licensing requirement for amplified live music taking place between 8am and 11pm before audiences of no more than 200 persons in workplaces not otherwise licensed under the 2003 Act (or licensed only for the provision of late night refreshment)
- removing the licensing requirement for unamplified live music taking place between 8am and 11pm in any place, subject to the right of a licensing authority to impose conditions about live music following a review of a premises licence or club premises certificate relating to premises authorised to supply alcohol for consumption on the premises
- removing the licensing requirement for the provision of entertainment facilities
- widens the licensing exemption for live music that is integral to a performance of Morris dancing or dancing of a similar type, so that the exemption applies to both live or recorded music instead of just unamplified live music in that instance.

Preliminary Note:	Since the Review Application has been submitted, a vary DPS application has been submitted and was received by the Licensing Authority on 11 th April 2016.		

2. SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

- 2.1 An application submitted by the Metropolitan Police Service for a review of the premises licence for Altitude 360, Twenty Eighth, Millbank Tower, 21- 24 Millbank Tower, London, SW1P 4QP, was received on 21st April 2016 on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. **Please see Annex A1.**
- 2.2 Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (para 11.2) states that at any stage following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police or the Environmental Health Service, or any other person who can seek a review, may ask the Licensing Authority to review the premises licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.
- 2.3 As such, in accordance with section 52(2) of the above-mentioned Act, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider the application and any relevant representations.
- 2.4 The premises currently benefits from a premises licence that permits:

Exhibition of a Film, Performance of Live Music, Playing of Recorded Music, Anything of a similar description to Live or Recorded Music:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 until 02:00

Sunday: 12:00 until 02:00

Non-standard timings: From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

Late Night Refreshment:

Monday to Sunday: 23:00 to 02:00

Non-standard timing: From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day

Sale of Retail of Alcohol:

Monday to Sunday: 07:00 to 02:00
(Before 10:00 the sale of alcohol shall be ancillary to a table meal and for consumption ancillary to that meal and by waiter/waitress service.)

Non-standard timing: From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day

- 2.5 These review proceedings are brought under the licensing objectives on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. The applicant has concerns with the reported serious incident on 27th March 2016 at approximately 03:00 hours. Details of the incident are contained within the review application and can be found at **Annex A1**.
- 2.6 The holders of the Premises Licence for these premises are also the holders of a similar Premises Licence on the 29th Floor of Millbank Tower, because of their concerns about the management of the incident on 27th March 2016 the Police have also made an application to review that Premises Licence. This is subject to a separate report being put before the Licensing Sub-Committee.
- 2.7 A copy of the existing Premises Licence (16/03633/LIPDPS) is attached at **Annex A2**.

3. REPRESENTATIONS:

- 3.1 The Environmental Health Service, as a responsible authority supports the review application on the grounds of Public Safety and Public Nuisance. **Please refer to Annex B1 for further information.**
- 3.2 Comments from the Planning Department. **Please refer to Annex B2 for further information.**

4. OPTIONS:

- 4.1 The applicant is seeking revocation of the licence
- 4.2 The Authority must, having regard to the application and the representations take such steps (if any), as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence;

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition added.

- 4.3 In accordance with section 52(6) of the 2003 Act, if the authority takes measures to modify conditions or exclude licensable activities from the licence, it may stipulate that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for only such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify.
- 6.3 The licensing authority's determination of this application does not have effect until the 21 day appeal period has expired or if the decision is appealed the date the appeal is determined and / or disposed of.

CRIS 6513529/16 refers.</p> <p>This review is being requested to Prevent Crime and Disorder and to Protect the Public Safety after there was serious disorder inside the venue which lead to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This lead to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons.</p> <p>There has been previous engagement by Police with the venue for a similar incident within the last 12 months.</p>

PROTECTIVE MARKING

This Review application on behalf of the Metropolitan Police Service, concerns the events that took place in Altitude, 28th Floor, Millbank Tower on Sunday 27th March 2016 at approximately 0300 hours.

Altitude is a venue that predominantly caters for corporate events. The venue consists of a large bar area and open space that can be used as a dance floor for planned events.

The event was a promoted event held by the 'Paravana Project' which openly advertised tickets for sale to members of the public which could be purchased at any time. The event was similar to those held in night clubs.

During the event, there was serious disorder inside the venue which led to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This led to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons. They ran throughout the venue fighting as they met with the opposing group. At one point a group had to barricade themselves in a store room for safety, as the opposing males attempted to force entry, smashing the door window in the process. Security personnel completely lost control and were unable to deal with the incident as it developed. The disorder continued for approximately 10 minutes before continuing outside. Males then armed themselves with traffic cones before the Police attended, following which the males ran off.

CCTV inside the venue has captured the majority of the disorder and demonstrates the event had insufficient security personnel and was poorly managed. Males can be seen running through the venue searching for their next victim. Others are covered in blood and no attempt is made by staff to administer first aid.

The premises was trading under a Temporary Event Notice which extended its trading hours from 0200 -0400 for a capacity of 300 people. The notice gave the undertaking that all premises licence conditions were to apply during the event.

The investigation to date shows that during the event there were several breaches of various licence conditions including:

Condition 13 - The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

* Recordings were only stored for 9 days

Condition 20 - The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.

* Tickets were on sale to the general public via the internet and could be purchased at any time, even on the night of the event.

Condition 21- In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

* No dedicated security risk assessment was completed or could be provided to Police.

Condition 51 - No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

* The event was run and advertised by PARAVANA PROJECT which is a large and well known promoted event.

Condition 17 - A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer in request.

* No record of recorded capacity has been provided to Police and security reports state they were asked to reset the clickers by management upon Police arrival.

Enquires to date also show that there was no DPS in place on the date of the event (27/03/16) as the DPS on the current licence - 15/I0890/LIPDPS was released from duties by mutual consent on 28/02/16.

It is my opinion that if the premises licence conditions had been adhered to on the night of the event then the serious disorder would not have occurred.

Due to the serious nature of this incident we would like the committee to consider revocation of the premises licence. I would add that this is one of the most serious incidents of crime and disorder I have dealt with during the time I have served on the Westminster Police Licensing Team

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

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

10. There shall be no dedicated low frequency bass bins/cabs used within the premises.
11. Any DJ monitor speakers must be isolated from the building structure and any other surface where they may be placed.
12. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
13. The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
14. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
15. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorized to sell alcohol.
16. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises.
17. A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer in request.
18. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a) All crimes reported to the venue.
 - b) All ejections of patrons
 - c) Any complaints received.
 - d) Any incidents of disorder.
 - e) Seizures of drugs and offensive weapons
 - f) Any faults in the CCVT system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - g) Any refusals of the sale of alcohol
 - h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency.
19. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
20. The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.
21. In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

22. The provision of films shall be incidental to other licensable activities and there shall be no cinema style showing of films.
23. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service's Community Protection Department to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
24. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
25. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
26. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents in the vicinity.
27. No drinks shall be consumed outside the premises nor glasses/bottles removed from the premises by patrons when leaving.
28. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).
29. No entertainment, performance, service, or exhibition involving nudity or sexual stimulation which would come within the definition of a sex establishment in Schedule 3 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended by the Greater London Council (General Powers) Act 1986 (whether or not locally adopted), shall be provided.
30. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times.
31. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - smoke machines and fog generators
 - pyrotechnics including fire works
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - real flame.
 - strobe lighting.
32. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased. NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provision of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.

33. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
34. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
35. All exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
36. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
37. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
38. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.
39. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
 - Any emergency lighting battery or system
 - Any electrical installation
 - Any emergency warning system.
40. All waste shall be properly present and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection time.
41. No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours.
42. There shall be no deliveries between 23:00 and 08:00 hours.
43. Patrons wishing to smoke may only do so in the designated Millbank Tower smoking area to the rear of the building.
44. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
45. All patrons and staff waiting for a taxi shall be encouraged to do so within the premises.
46. The licence holder will enter into an arrangement with a hackney carriage or private carriage firm to provide transport for patrons when requested.
47. The capacity for the 28th and 29th floors combined shall not exceed 600 at any one time excluding staff.
48. Before 10:00am the sale of alcohol on the premises shall be ancillary to a table meal and for consumption ancillary to that meal.
49. Before 10:00am the sale of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress service.

50. There shall be no new entry or re-entry to the premises after midnight save for the purposes of patrons wishing to smoke in accordance with condition 43 above.
51. No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

I refer to the email from Metropolitan Police for the review of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

Permission was granted on 23 April 2009 (RN 08/10112/FULL) for the '*Use of 29th floor for office, conference centre and private function use (sui generis)*'.

Permission was subsequently granted on 27 October 2011 (RN 11/03155/FULL) for '*Use of 28th floor for office, conference centre and private function use (sui generis)*'. Conditions were attached to both applications as follows:

- 1) You must not open the private function and conference centre element of the use to customers, and you must not allow customers on the premises, outside the following times: between 07:00 and 02:00.
- 2) No goods, including fuel, delivered or collected by vehicles arriving at or departing from the building shall be accepted or despatched if unloaded or loaded on the public highway. You may accept or despatch such goods only if they are unloaded or loaded within the curtilage of the building.
- 3) You must not play live or recorded music which is audible outside the premises.
- 4) You must not allow more than 600 customers on either the 28/29th floor at any one time.

I would therefore note that allowing the premises to open until 4am was in breach of condition 1 above.

 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone,

encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

- 10. There shall be no dedicated low frequency bass bins/cabs used within the premises.
- 11. Any DJ monitor speakers must be isolated from the building structure and any other surface where they may be placed.
- 12. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.

13. The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
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 - b) All ejections of patrons
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 - h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency.
19. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
20. The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.
21. In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.
22. The provision of films shall be incidental to other licensable activities and there shall be no cinema style showing of films.
23. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service's Community Protection Department to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.

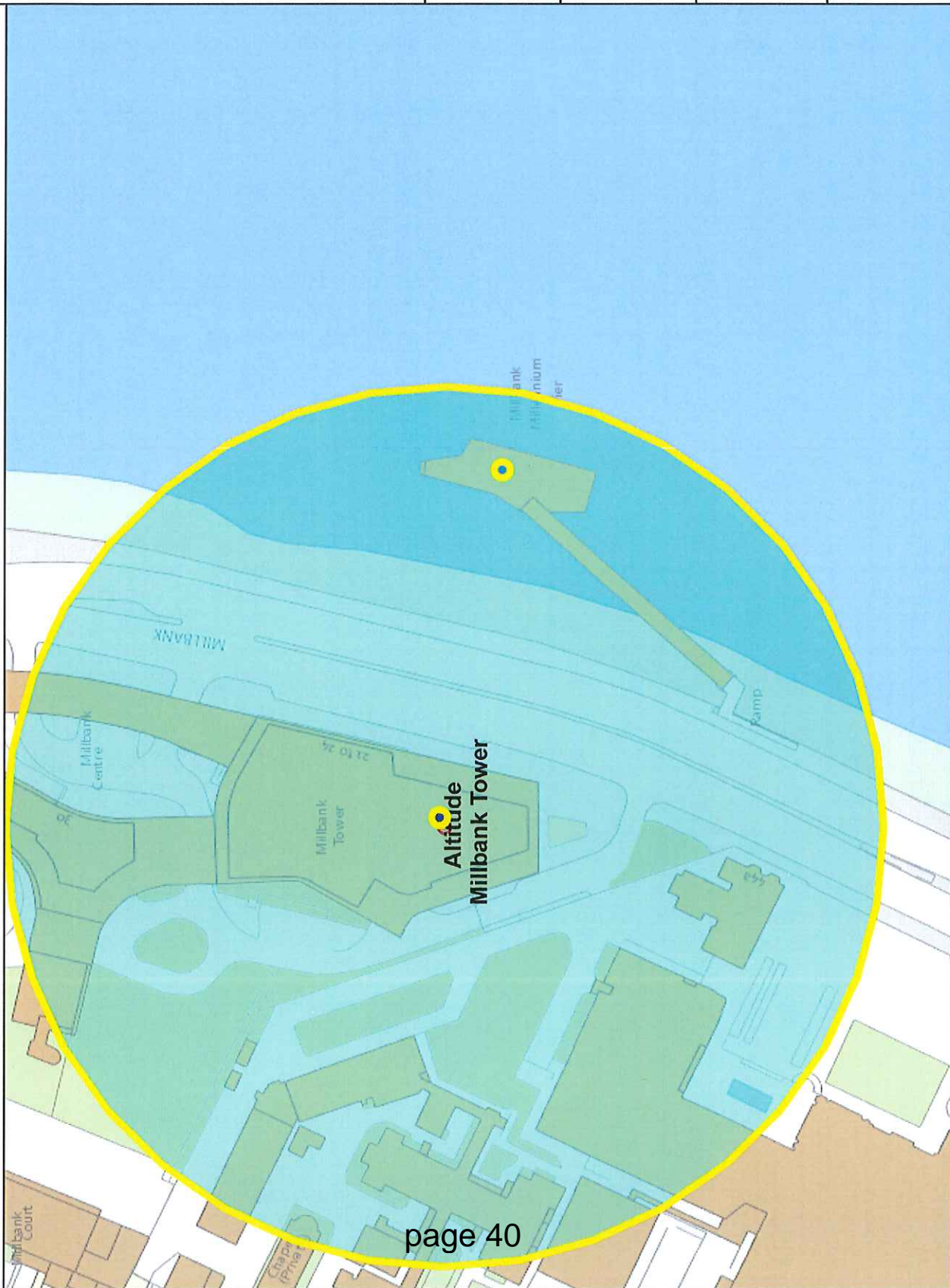
24. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
25. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.

The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - smoke machines and fog generators
 - pyrotechnics including fire works
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - real flame.
 - strobe lighting.
32. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased. NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provision of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
33. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
34. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.

45. All patrons and staff waiting for a taxi shall be encouraged to do so within the premises.
46. The licence holder will enter into an arrangement with a hackney carriage or private carriage firm to provide transport for patrons when requested.
47. The capacity for the 28th and 29th floors combined shall not exceed 600 at any one time excluding staff.
48. Before 10:00am the sale of alcohol on the premises shall be ancillary to a table meal and for consumption ancillary to that meal.
49. Before 10:00am the sale of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress service.
50. There shall be no new entry or re-entry to the premises after midnight save for the purposes of patrons wishing to smoke in accordance with condition 43 above.
51. No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

This review is being requested to Prevent Crime and Disorder and to Protect the Public Safety after there was serious disorder inside the venue which lead to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This lead to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons.

There has been previous engagement by Police with the venue for a similar incident within the last 12 months.

PROTECTIVE MARKING

This Review application on behalf of the Metropolitan Police Service, concerns the events that took place in Altitude, 28th Floor, Millbank Tower on Sunday 27th March 2016 at approximately 0300 hours.

Altitude is a venue that predominantly caters for corporate events. The venue consists of a large bar area and open space that can be used as a dance floor for planned events.

The event was a promoted event held by the 'Paravana Project' which openly advertised tickets for sale to members of the public which could be purchased at any time. The event was similar to those held in night clubs.

During the event, there was serious disorder inside the venue which led to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This led to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons. They ran throughout the venue fighting as they met with the opposing group. At one point a group had to barricade themselves in a store room for safety, as the opposing males attempted to force entry, smashing the door window in the process. Security personnel completely lost control and were unable to deal with the incident as it developed. The disorder continued for approximately 10 minutes before continuing outside. Males then armed themselves with traffic cones before the Police attended, following which the males ran off.

CCTV inside the venue has captured the majority of the disorder and demonstrates the event had insufficient security personnel and was poorly managed. Males can be seen running through the venue searching for their next victim. Others are covered in blood and no attempt is made by staff to administer first aid.

The premises was trading under a Temporary Event Notice which extended its trading hours from 0200 -0400 for a capacity of 300 people. The notice gave the undertaking that all premises licence conditions were to apply during the event.

The investigation to date shows that during the event there were several breaches of various licence conditions, including:

Condition 13 - The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

* Recordings were only stored for 9 days

Condition 20 - The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.

* Tickets were on sale to the general public via the internet and could be purchased at any time, even on the night of the event.

Condition 21- In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

* No dedicated security risk assessment was completed or could be provided to Police.

Condition 51 - No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

* The event was run and advertised by PARAVANA PROJECT which is a large and well known promoted event.

Condition 17 - A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer in request.

* No record of recorded capacity has been provided to Police and security reports state they were asked to reset the clickers by management upon Police arrival.

Enquires to date also show that there was no DPS in place on the date of the event (27/03/16) as the DPS on the current licence - 15/10890/LIPDPS was released from duties by mutual consent on 28/02/16.

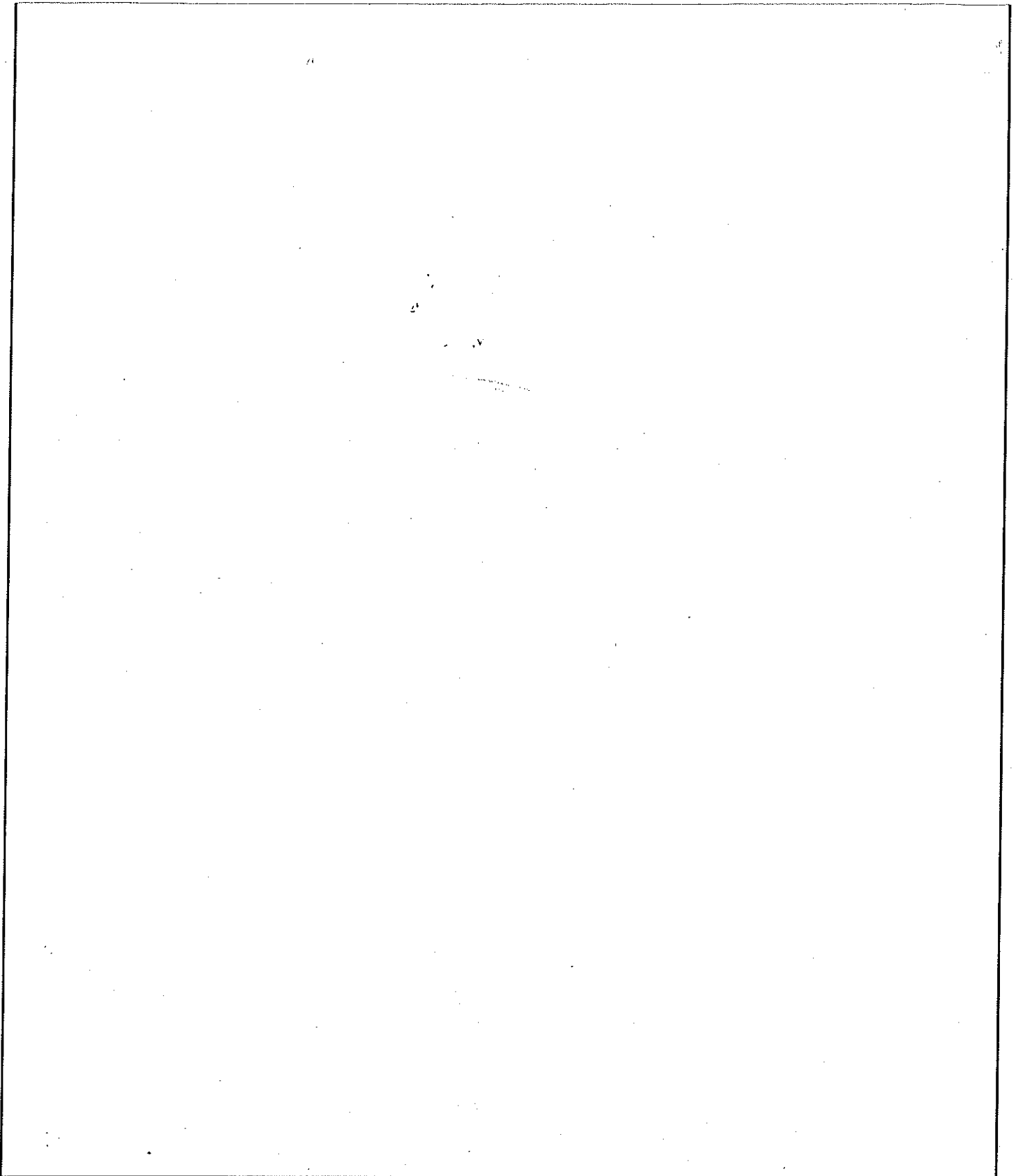
It is my opinion that if the premises licence conditions had been adhered to on the night of the event then the serious disorder would not have occurred.

Due to the serious nature of this incident we would like the committee to consider revocation of the premises licence. I would add that this is one of the most serious incidents of crime and disorder I have dealt with during the time I have served on the Westminster Police Licensing Team







Location

The Millbank Tower is a 33 storey building that is predominantly set out as office space. Altitude and the Sky Loft Bar are situated on the 28th and 29th floors of the Millbank tower and use the same ground level entrance/exit as the other businesses within the building. The venue is accessed via a lift from the ground floor which is situated behind the 24 hour reception desk and electronic barrier gates.

Altitude on the 28th Floor consists of a large bar area and open space that can be used as a dance floor and has panoramic views of the city. This space is generally used for corporate and private functions.

The review application follows an incident of serious disorder which resulted in a number of serious injuries to members of the public and required a large Police call out,

On Sunday 28th March 2016 a promoted event known as the 'Paravana Project' was held at Altitude on the 28th Floor. The event started at 1400 hours and finished the following morning at 0400 hours, with the last two hours operating under a Temporary Events Notice. Tickets were available to members of the public and were being sold online via the Paravana website.

At 23:15 hours on Sunday 27th March 2016 Police received an emergency call from a witness stating 30 to 40 people from the party were fighting at the location CAD 7792 27MAR16 refers. Police attended and found no sign of a disturbance but spoke to a male victim who had attended the event at Altitude. The male stated that while he was standing in the smoking area, outside the venue, he was punched in the face and knocked to the floor and while on the floor his watch had been stolen. He states that security did not assist him and Police have no record of either the management or security informing the Police. CRIS 6513519/16 refers.


At 00:32 hours on Monday 28th of March, Police received an emergency call from a witness stating that 3 males were hitting a female security guard in the lift on the ground floor CAD 227 28MAR16 refers. Police attended and spoke to a member of security and resulted the incident as a lawful ejection.

At 00:33 hours on Monday 28th March Police received a call from the building security stating there was a fight in progress on the ground floor between two males and they need Police quickly as Altitude security were struggling. Police attended and were informed that two males had entered the building and jumped over the barriers to gain entry to the lift, members of security for Altitude attempted to stop them but were pushed aside and the males managed to get into the left and go to the 28th floor and gain entry to the venue.

At 03:10 hours on Monday 28th March Police received a further call from building security stating that there were 7 to 8 males fighting and that weapons were being used. CAD 1141 28MAR16 refers

At 03:13 hours on Monday 28th March Police received a call from the London Ambulance Service requesting Police assistance as there was a fight in progress at the location and a person had been stabbed. CAD 1148 28MAR16 refers.

Police attended and after speaking to building security on the ground floor went directly to the 28th Floor, where they found a male with both head and torso injuries; more units were requested as a large crowd was gathering. A primary survey found that this male had not been stabbed but had been bottled and had also

sustained a fractured leg. On the way to hospital he was found to be in possession of a large quantity of class A drugs. At the time of attending Police also found a trail of blood leading to the service lift and so a total of three crime scenes were put in place linked to this assault..

At no point did the Police receive a call from the Management or any staff member from Altitude.

Licensing Investigation


On Tuesday 29th March 2016 Police Licensing received several emails from police officers who had attended on the night of the incident and had concerns about the way in which the event was managed, Exhibit TJ/9 refers. We also identified a number of crimes that had been recorded from the night of the event which included an Affray CRIS 6513529/16, Robbery CRIS 6513519/16 and a Crime related incident CRIS 6513531/16.

I contacted the management at Altitude and a meeting was arranged for Friday 30th March 2016.

We attended the venue and met with David Coley (Marketing manager) Tomas Skrina who introduced himself as the Designated Premises Supervisor and their legal representative Thomas O'Maoileoin.

We pointed out that Tomas was not the DPS shown on the premises licence and then Thomas stated an application was in the process of being submitted. We enquired as to the whereabouts of the Mr Suresh Abbas the DPS shown on the licence and were told he was still the DPS but was not able to meet us.

Tomas left the meeting shortly after introducing himself and David Coley described the incident to us in more detail. He began by informing us that the event was a private event held for the fashion model industry and that the evening had been largely peaceful and they had not expected any trouble. He showed us the ground floor entrance and then took us through reception and up to the 28th floor via the lift where he later walked us around the venue. He informed us that they had employed 8 SIA security personnel from a contractor named Valid Security and that they had 550 guests booked prior to the event starting. It was evident to us that due to the lay out of the building and the number of expected guests, the numbers of security had not been properly risk assessed and the number of security used on the night was insufficient for a venue this size: placing both the customers and staff at risk. They had used a total of 8 security personnel and had placed two security outside at the entrance, who were required to manage the guests arriving and the smoking area which was close by. Approximately 30 meters into the building on the ground floor they had placed two more security near

the lift to search guests prior to entering the lift. They had one managing the lift, which left only 3 security personnel to manage up to 550 guests in a large nightclub on the 28th floor with two dance floor areas, corridors and toilets.


We asked to see the risk assessment for SIA security as required by condition 21 on the licence, David was only able to provide a general risk assessment form (TJ/4) and not one dedicated to risk assessing security. He also provided us with a Promoted Event Risk Assessment Police 696 form (TJ/5,) which had been completed just one day before the event. These forms are clearly marked to be completed and submitted to Police 14 days before an event.

David also provided us with a guest list and an incident report (TJ/3) for the night in question. The incident report included details of 5 separate incidents of disorder including males forcing their way past security into the venue, fights on the dance floor and a male being knocked unconscious. None of these incidents were reported directly to Police by the venue staff or their security.

I then asked to view the CCTV. While they were finding the correct cameras it became evident that the system had only recorded 9 days of data and not the 31 days as required by CCTV condition 13 on the premises licence.

As the seriousness of the incident was becoming more apparent I requested that they provide the footage from all cameras for that evening. Due to the time it would have taken to copy the footage it was agreed that we would wait until the Monday to give them a reasonable period of time to download the images.

I continued to investigate the event and via a search on the internet found that the event was being advertised by Paravana Project, the same company that was promoting the event. Exhibit TJ/12 refers. They displayed a clear ticket price list and easy links for members of the public to purchase tickets right up to the night the event was taking place. They also offered discounts to anyone attending their other events at various locations. This provided evidence that the event was open to any member of the public and was not a private pre-booked event as conditioned on the premise licence. Condition 20 states that the provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private pre-booked event. It also appears that the event had been booked by the promoter 'Paravana Project' a further breach as detailed in condition 51 on the premises licence, 'No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises'.

On Tuesday 5th April 2016 I sent an email to Thomas O'Maoileoin requesting a number of assurances from the Management of Altitude while we continued our investigation.

They responded with the following:

- 1. *My client will not permit similar events on the 28th floor to run past midnight until this matter has been resolved*
- 2. *David Coley will not be involved with the operation of the premises*
- 3. *Tomas, whilst remaining DPS, will not be "in-charge" of any event*
- 4. *The DPS prior to Tomas left the employment of the company on 31st March*
- 5. *I understand the CCTV had been supplied*

In relation to our letter of 31 March I am pleased to confirm that

- 1. *Crime scene preservation training is taking place on 6th April*
- 2. *Award for Personal License Holders: for more staff to apply for Personal Licence will be held on site next week*
- 3. *Award in Responsible Alcohol Retailing: particularly for bar staff will be held on site next week*
- 4. *A review of the policies and procedures with the new head of security will take place with Adrian Studd next week.*

On Wednesday 6th April I received the CCTV footage provided by the venue which I exhibit as TJ/16 and TJ/17 I viewed all the footage provided and it soon became apparent that the incident was far more serious than described by the Managers at the time of the meeting.


The CCTV footage within the venue is of good quality and clearly shows a series of failings by the management.

The incident in the smoking area is not covered and there is no footage of this assault, however there is limited footage from the buildings CCTV that shows two males jumping over the barriers on the ground floor reception and security personnel are unable to stop them and they gain entry to the lift.

The venues CCTV shows the following:

At 02:52 Camera 1 shows a fight on the dance floor between two males, during which a member of security is present and watches the fight take place. He intervenes only once punches are thrown and with the assistance of others, ejects one of the males. Camera 9 shows the same Security officers being followed by a group into the corridor. There is disorder during this ejection, as it appeared they only had a limited number of security personnel to deal.

At 02:54 Camera 6 shows a group of 4 males standing outside the toilets in the corridor. There is no static security deployed in this area and no regular Security patrol to ensure this area is monitored. One of the males


is seen to show a knife to the rest of the group, which he had concealed in his waist band. It is clear by their facial expressions that some of the groups do not agree with him carrying the knife.

At 02:56 Camera 10 shows the male with the knife walk into the corridor, with his hand in his pocket; which we now know contained the knife. He stops and is confronted by another group of males. It is not clear what happens next but witnesses states the male pulls out the knife, which causes the group of males to respond by punching him to the ground. He is knocked unconscious and violently stamped on several times. He sustained injuries to his face, torso and a fractured leg.

Security personnel arrive and stop the fighting. The knife is picked up by Rosen, a member of the Security Team. He confirms this in his Security Report and also states he was told by David Coley not to call the Police; Exhibit TJ/7 refers.

At 02:57 Camera 9 shows a very aggressive male roaming around the venue, apparently looking for the group that knocked his friend unconscious. David Coley attempts to talk to the male but he is grabbed by the head before he backs away. The male then starts to fight with two other males and punches are thrown as they struggle near the bar. This fight continues and on Camera 7 a male in a black top is seen arming himself with a large bottle and striking another male hard on the head with it. Again there is no Security to deal with the incident and Management does not stop the event even though they witnessed the disorder.

At 02:59 on Camera 6 another male with a larger knife is seen chasing a large male in a white top. He chases him along the corridor and the disorder spills into the area where the male is still lying unconscious, from the first knife incident. The chase continues and female customers and staff can be seen barricading themselves into a room as the male with the knife runs past. A large knife is clearly seen in the hand of the suspect. At this point CCTV coverage is lost but a statement taken from a member of staff- the Operations Supervisor - OROS states that while she was hiding in the store room, two males ran in and barricaded themselves in making attempts to keep the door shut. The door was then forced open by two other males, smashing the glass window in the door, while forcing entry. Once inside one of the males who had forced entry, picked up a full bottle of Vodka, which he used to strike one of the males. He hit the male over the head with such force that the bottle smashed upon impact. The male victim fell to the floor and the two suspects ran out of the room grabbing another glass bottle on the way out.

At 03:14 Camera 8 shows a male covered in blood, with a head injury, walking around the venue with his friends. He is unchallenged by staff and no first aid is given.

At 03:15 Camera 10 shows the unconscious male still lying on the floor.

On the buildings CCTV the male with the head injury is captured leaving the venue unchallenged, via the fire exit/ service entrance to the rear of the building. A short time later, the male who was in possession of the large knife is also seen leaving via this route.

A blood trail down stairs from the 28th floor was later found by Police and suggesting an unknown victim has sustained serious injuries, possibly a stab wound due to the amount of blood found. In total three crime scenes were setup within the building.

The outside cameras then show a further fight where males arm themselves with traffic cones, as the male with the large knife chases them around a parked vehicle.

At 03:30 hours outside camera footage shows the extent of the Police resources required to regain control of this incident.

As well as the serous disorder, customers can be seen throughout the evening walking around and drinking from large bottles of Vodka and openly inhaling Nitrous Oxide contained in rubber party balloons, in full view of bar staff.

I exhibit a summarised CCTV log at TJ/2

Police have no record of any calls made by the premises Management, to report any of the crime and disorder that occurred that evening.

The evidence gained from watching the CCTV was so serious and revealed so many breaches of both the licence conditions and the licensing objectives, that I had no option but to submit a Premises Review application.

Throughout the initial investigation, we made several requests to speak with Mr. Suresh Abbas, who was the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) shown on the Premises Licence and we were lead to believe he was the DPS still in place prior to the application being submitted on 31st March 2016. This is evidenced in an email received from Thomas O'Maoileoin, Exhibit TJ/10 refers.

I managed to make contact with Suresh Abbas. He provided me with an email stating that he was no longer employed at Altitude. He stated by mutual agreement, he had been released from his duties as of 28th February 2016. Exhibit TJ/11 refers.

It appears that at the time of the event there was no DPS in place and that the Management of Altitude were fully aware of this.

The following breaches of Premises Licence conditions have been identified during this investigation:

Condition 13 - The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

Recordings were only being stored for a total of 9 days.

Condition 20 - The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.


Tickets were openly being sold on the Paravana website and Facebook to the general public. Tickets were advertised at various prices and could be purchased up until and including the day of the event.

Condition 21 - In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

The venue was unable to provide a dedicated security risk assessment to Police and Security numbers on the night were not sufficient to ensure the safety of customers and staff.

Condition 51 - No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

The event was being promoted and run by Paravana project that advertised online and were selling tickets for the event to members of the public. Paravana Project are a well-known company that organise and run events both in the UK and internationally.


Other concerns over the responsible running of the venue include:

- **Failure to call Police** - after several fights throughout the venue, the management failed to call Police. It was not until the male with the knife was knocked unconscious that security informed the building security who then called for assistance.
- **No 696 Risk Assessment Form submitted** – The venue has previously been advised by Police to submit a 696 for promoted events.
- **Security numbers were insufficient** and well below what we would expect for an event and customer capacity of this size.
- **No SIA licence badges displayed by Security**
- **Nitrous Oxide (legal high) was being openly used** and inhaled by customers in full view of bar staff which could be an unlawful activity and a risk to Public Safety.
- **Customers were walking around the venue drinking directly from large bottles of Vodka** and were not challenged by staff.
- **Management did not respond when advised by security that the event was out of control** and that there were not enough security present.
- **The fire exits and rear stairs were not managed by security** - this allowed customers to exit the venue via the service area. It is also possible that customers may have been able to enter via this route and in doing so would have avoided any checks by security.

Other Concerns

Incident Reports have been provided by security personnel who were working at the venue that evening.

- Door Supervisor Rosen Zehirov's report states David Cooley told him not to call the Police and Paravana organisers were allowing customers to enter without being searched.
- Door Supervisor Krasimir Pantev states he informed both David Coley and Tomas that the venue was over capacity as they had 640 customers inside and he wanted to close the entrance. David refused and later asked for one of the security to clear the customer capacity clickers.
- Door Supervisor Plamen Pantev also advised David to stop the event as it was out of control, but David refused.

- There are several reports that refer to David being advised to stop the event due to the amount of fights that were occurring. Each time David refused to stop the event.
- David Coley appears on CCTV to be wearing very casual clothing and had clearly chosen not to be identified by customers as someone managing the event. Some Security reports state David had appeared to be under the influence of alcohol and illegal substances.


Previous Engagement

On Monday 17th August 2015 Police attended Altitude and spoke with the DPS Phillip Hilbeck after a serious assault occurred at the venue during an event, when a male had been hit on the head with a bottle, sustaining a serious injury. During the meeting the following failings were identified:

- 1.No 696 risk assessment form submitted despite it being a promoted event. The organiser had requested their own security which should have highlighted an increased risk
2. The Security Team did not respond appropriately to the assault. The suspect was not detained and Police not called.
3. The CCTV was well below the minimum standard expected by Police.

An Action Plan was requested and the venue agreed to submit a 696 for all future promoted events and provide Crime Scene Management training to staff. They made the decision to change the existing Security company. Police advised that the new company should be ACS registered, (Approved Contractor Scheme). The current company Valid security are not ACS registered. They were also required to update the CCTV system to meet the minimum requirements by Police.

In summary, this is the most serious incident of crime and disorder I have dealt with during my time in Police Licensing. The large scale disorder that occurred at Altitude on Sunday 28th March resulted in at least four customers receiving serious injuries as a direct result of the Management's failing to adhere to the licence conditions. If the licence conditions had been adhered to, then the event would not have taken place, tickets would not have been sold openly to members of the public and a Security Risk Assessment would have identified the appropriate security numbers to use for an event of this nature.


The absence of a Designated Premises Supervisor and a lack of management of the venue, added to the escalating violence and disorder during the event. A total loss of control of the premises resulted.


Due to the serious nature of the incident and the fact that Police have engaged with the venue on a previous occasion due to similar failings, Police do not have any confidence in the Licensee.

The nature of this crime and disorder is so serious that it represents significant failings in upholding and promoting the Licensing Objectives. Therefore we feel the only option remaining, is full revocation of this Premises Licence; to ensure the prevention of crime and disorder. We feel that a full variation to add conditions to the existing premises licence would not be sufficient to address the concerns of police.

Since submitting the review application I have not heard from the premises operator or their legal representative and they have not sort further discussions with Police to provide us with sufficient assurances that there will not be a repetition of this type of incident.

Altitude 360 on the 29th Floor is operated by the same Licensee as Altitude 360 on the 28th Floor. Although they hold different Premises licenses they are intrinsically linked. The venues can trade individually or operate as one. When operating together they have a combined capacity of 600 as conditioned on the Premises Licence and share the same terminal hour and similar licence conditions. Our concern is that the 29th Floor could continue to be used for similar high risk events, for this reason we are also seeking joint revocation of both licences.

Background

I am a serving officer with the Metropolitan Police and am currently attached to the Westminster Professional Standards Unit. Throughout the policing year my duties also include the policing of Alcohol Licensing events which involve the supervision and policing of licensing related activity under the Licensing Act 2003. I have previously been employed as a Police Licensing Officer within the Clubs and Vice Operational Command Unit. My duties included the supervision of Liquor Licensed venues with 'Pan London' responsibility to assist other Boroughs to offer advice and provide assistance to address problematic premises. Other forces and Licensing Councils also made such requests and my specialist experience was used around the UK. I have also been employed as a Sergeant on a night time economy team dealing with alcohol fuel related disorder within Night-time economy premises within Westminster. I was the Officer in charge of the 2012 Olympic Licensing Response to Criminality in licensed premises across London. I feel that I am experienced in commenting on Licensing issues surrounding anti social behaviour linked with the night-time economy and venues engaged in Licensable activity.

Information

I make this statement in order to give my professional observations and concerns to the Police Licensing team following a visit to a Westminster Licensed Premises namely Altitude 360, 28th Floor Milbank Tower, 21-24 Milbank, SW1P 4QP.

On 29th March 2016 I accompanied Detective Emma Hammatt to Altitude as part of her enquiry following disorder that had occurred at the venue on the 26th and 27th March 2016.

I met two persons at the venue Tomas Skrina who introduced himself as the DPS and Karen Linforth who is the finance Director. Prior to meeting them at the venue on the 28th floor I had an opportunity to meet with the estate security of Milbank Tower. I observed CCTV footage of various incidents at the venue both in the Foyer leading upto the premises, in the car park outside and also in the venue itself.

The incidents included violence against security staff at the venue and a person seen chasing another outside using traffic cones to effect violence. Within the venue the CCTV is clear and shows groups of males assaulting each other and running through the venue causing concern and panic to other patrons.

Observations

Having spoken with the DPS and Director of the venue information was provided to enable Detective Hammatt to investigate the disorder. The following information was provided

- 8 Security were on for the event
- Approximately 550 Tickets had been pre sold
- The entry in the foyer of the Milbank Tower had searching/ entry via a rope area behind the reception desk. The patrons would then make their way to the lift lobby then upto the 29th. CCTV showed persons jumping the barriers adjacent to the lift lobby thereby gaining access. During this process an incident has taken place where venue security was assaulted when she tried to prevent the queue jump.
- The Building security commented that they witnessed this and that there was no security covering this area, the building security critique on the event security was in my opinion correct. An easy and simple fix would be to have the search area at the point of entry at the lifts and this would remove the risk of prohibited articles getting in.
- The CCTV was unable to be fully accessed. Standard conditions would be listed on the premises license indicating that CCTV should be made available by Police an authorised person on request for the 31 days following the event date. The CCTV was unable to be made available in full due to the DPS stating that they were on separate severs.
- Patrons concerned in the event were able to exit via 'Back' stairs and lift into the loading bay during which no apparent control over entry and exit (No SIA staff with clickers etc). Again an issue over keeping a record of the capacity in the venue and conflicts with conditions of licence.

The director asked me about prevention of drugs at event

- I explained that the brief for the venue security / DPS would be to maintain vigilance throughout event to ensure persons who were intoxicated were removed and any evidence of drug misuse could be challenged.
- I asked if Wands were in use or available and was told no, I explained that this should have been factored into the risk assessment and at least have them available

After viewing the CCTV it appeared that the crowd has more control of the event especially during the disorder. Given the size of the venue and its location I would have expected more staff to be factored into the risk. The estate security were the ones on scene and dealing with the outbreak of disorder and have been able to give a salient account and parallel this with CCTV.



During the outbreak of the disorder in the venue I saw on the CCTV two security staff who appeared to follow and watch the disorder but no proactive approach appeared to have been taken.

On the estate CCTV I saw a male re-entering the venue with what appeared to be a head injury and blood running down his back. He did not appear to be challenged by the event security and if he were connected to disorder allowing him back into the venue placed staff and the public at risk.

Westminster premises are expected to observe the Licensing Objectives and parallel an appropriate risk assessment for events to ensure that they are met. On this occasion I had concerns on my limited information that the venue failed to prevent crime and disorder and also to protect public safety.

While it was not my intention to conduct licensing observations during this visit, my concerns were such that I made them available immediately to the licensing team who subsequently conducted a full visit to the premises the following day.

without incident up until approximately 2300 hours. At this time I was in the corridor when I saw a number people running into the Venné's bar area. It was dark and there were too many people so I cannot remember who was involved. I called Security that were stationed on the ground floor and asked them to come up as I believed there was a fight. A few minutes later I saw a male being escorted by two Security personnel. One of the members of Security told me he had been punched while breaking up the fight. I do not know the name of this member of Security and am not aware that the police were called for this incident. I then continued with my work.

At approximately 0250 hours I was in the corridor area when I heard another outbreak of disorder. I went back into the bar area and the fighting had stopped however there were bottles and cups all over the floor. I instructed my staff to assist me in cleaning up. After I had finished I went to the other side of the Venné to check everything was ok. While over the other side I saw a several males gathering and thought they were

getting ready to start another fight. I cannot describe any of these males. I then ran to my manager and told him to go and check, just before this a member of Security called Chris approached me and my manager Thomas and told us that we need to stop the event and should turn off the music. We both agreed but it was not our decision. I was aware that Thomas had spoken to David about the issues, but the final decision was David's and the event continued.

I then went to the Store room where I stayed for approximately 10 minutes. I was also with another member of my staff. All of a sudden a girl came running into the room. She was very distressed and crying. I asked if she was with them - meaning someone else. She replied "I NEED TO HIDE". She then hid under the table and the other member of my staff also hid. At this point two black males ran into the room. One was wearing a white T-shirt and one was wearing a grey T-shirt. The male wearing the white T-shirt closed the door and held it shut as if to block anyone else entering. At that point someone on

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the other side of the door started to hit the door with window in the door with force. He was trying to force his way in. He hit the window so many times that it smashed. The black male in the white T-shirt was unable to hold the door and I saw one black male force his way in. I don't remember what the male was wearing. I am unable to describe any of the black males in detail. The male who forced his way in wanted to attack the other two males and I saw him looking around for something to grab. I saw him grab a bottle off one of the tables, the bottle was glass and full of alcohol. It was a standard size bottle (approx 70 cl). The male in the white shirt was shouting "IT'S NOT US, IT'S NOT US" and was not being aggressive. At that point the male with the bottle hit the male in the white shirt over the head with the bottle. The force of the blow caused the bottle to smash on the male's head and knocked the male to the ground. He got up quickly and ran out, on the way he grabbed two glass bottles himself. The male with the bottle ran out grabbing to glass bottles on the way. The male





in the grey T-shirt picked up a coat rack and walked out the room along with the male who was hit. While I was trapped in the room with the male trying to force entry I was scared and found the whole incident very distressing. Although I was worried about my own safety, I was more worried about members of my staff. I have never seen an incident this violent before and hope I never see something like this again.


The incident in the store room lasted for approximately 5 minutes and at all times I had a good and unobstructed view of what was happening. The lights were on and my visibility was good. I have not seen any of these males before and would not recognise them again. Although I am happy to assist police I do not want to attend court.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premises licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

13. The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
14. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
15. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorized to sell alcohol.
16. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises.
17. A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer in request.
18. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a) All crimes reported to the venue.
 - b) All ejections of patrons
 - c) Any complaints received.
 - d) Any incidents of disorder.
 - e) Seizures of drugs and offensive weapons
 - f) Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - g) Any refusals of the sale of alcohol
 - h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency.
19. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
20. The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.
21. In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

22. The provision of films shall be incidental to other licensable activities and there shall be no cinema style showing of films.
23. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service's Community Protection Department to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
24. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
25. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
26. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents in the vicinity.
27. No drinks shall be consumed outside the premises nor glasses/bottles removed from the premises by patrons when leaving.
28. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).
29. No entertainment, performance, service, or exhibition involving nudity or sexual stimulation which would come within the definition of a sex establishment in Schedule 3 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended by the Greater London Council (General Powers) Act 1986 (whether or not locally adopted), shall be provided.
30. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times.
31. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - o dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - o smoke machines and fog generators
 - o pyrotechnics including fire works
 - o firearms
 - o lasers
 - o explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - o real flame.
 - o strobe lighting.
32. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased. NOTE: (1) This rule does not

- apply to exhibitions given under the provision of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
33. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
 34. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
 35. All exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
 36. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
 37. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
 38. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.
 39. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
 - o Any emergency lighting battery or system
 - o Any electrical installation
 - o Any emergency warning system.
 40. All waste shall be properly present and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection time.
 41. No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours.
 42. There shall be no deliveries between 23:00 and 08:00 hours.
 43. Patrons wishing to smoke may only do so in the designated Millbank Tower smoking area to the rear of the building.
 44. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
 45. All patrons and staff waiting for a taxi shall be encouraged to do so within the premises.
 46. The licence holder will enter into an arrangement with a hackney carriage or private carriage firm to provide transport for patrons when requested.
 47. The capacity for the 28th and 29th floors combined shall not exceed 600 at any one time excluding staff.
 48. Before 10:00am the sale of alcohol on the premises shall be ancillary to a table meal and for consumption ancillary to that meal.
 49. Before 10:00am the sale of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress service.

50. There shall be no new entry or re-entry to the premises after midnight save for the purposes of patrons wishing to smoke in accordance with condition 43 above.
51. No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

Introduction

The Paravana event was held in Skyloft on the 28th Floor of Millbank Tower with Reels used for entry and egress, the smoking area, licensed bar and cloakroom.

The planned event as per the event sheet was for client entry to start at 14.00 onwards with bar close at 03.00 and venue clear by 04.00

550 guests booked and the total number throughput during the whole event over all spaces was between 620-670 (it is accepted that smokers are double counted).

Eight experienced security guards were booked from our external company Valid as below, timed to be in place prior to guest arrival through to venue clear;

1x female from 13.30-03.00

2x male from 13.30-03.00

1x female from 19.00- 05.00

4x male from 19.00- 05.00

We also had our own two trained personnel working bringing a security presence of ten if required however acting in operational roles on the night

The Event

The main building lobby doors were locked and roped off. All guests entered through Reels having the opportunity to leave clothing and bags in the cloakroom. Guests then flowed through to the main lobby. The area with rope access to the turnstiles was used and in order to keep all of our guests safe and secure the male and female security officer checked all bags and people to ensure no alcohol, weapons or illegal substances entered the venue.

Small numbers of guests arrived from 14.00 as planned however it was from 16.30 to 21.00 when the main flow of guests occurred and at 21.00 550 guests were present on the 28th floor. A double clicking system was in place to count overall entry and 28th floor entry. By 23.00 approx 550 guests were on 28th floor and approx 50 in Reels and the smoking area. It is accepted that guests came in and out to smoke so our internal total figure of 670 includes double counting (clicking).

The event was largely peaceful however four incidents took place and these are detailed below.

Incidents

During the course of interviewing staff on property these are the incidents I have been informed of.

Incident 1) Circa 23.00 a guest smoking outside Reels got into an altercation with hooded youths passing the building. One hooded youth then approached the guest, hit him in the face and took his Tag Hauer watch. The guest called the police themselves to report the theft. After that the guest returned to the party with David Coley as he did not want his whole night to be ruined.

Incident 2) Circa midnight, a group jumped the barriers in the lobby and were challenged by the security guards, they pushed the female guard. I have not had access to the building security cctv footage and would need to see if this is the group involved in the later incident. Building security called the police. Ground floor security were not able to stop the group and they got to the 28th floor. Security on 28th escorted the group down again

Incident 3) Circa 01.00 28th floor, next to the bar in the corner, a scuffle between two males. Music was lowered and lights lit to allow security to escort both males from the premises.

At 01.00 Security Supervisor Kris, Operational Manager Tomas and Commercial Director David went into Belgravia to discuss the evening, the current risk and mutually agreed to keep the event running and to close if any further violence breaks out on the 28th floor.

At circa 02.00 a skirmish, again outside in the smoking area between four males was broken up and they were refused re entry to the venue.

Incident 4) Circa 3am, a group of 5/6 males began fighting. He was knocked unconscious in the corridor behind the bar by one of the men he had threatened. His friend was enraged and decided on revenge. He went looking through the floor to find the people who had hurt his friend. Two males, unrelated to the incident, had to barricade themselves into the Belgravia area on the 28th floor. The male broke the window and got into Belgravia. He threw a glass bottle of water, a bottle of vodka and a bottle of syrup at the men he suspected of hurting his friend. He calmed down when he was convinced they were not the men responsible. He then disappeared back into the crowd. The lights were turned up and the music stopped. At this time the decision to close the event was made. This man and a second group exited the building via the fire escape stairs.

The unconscious male received first aid from security and an ambulance and the police were called.

Security had started to clear the venue however when the police arrived they stopped this and declared the back corridor a crime scene. They began taking witness statements from those still in the venue.

The crime scene remained sealed until the afternoon of 28th March with two officers remaining on scene until the SOCO's had collected all evidence. During this time we did not have access to clean the bar or to cash up after the event.

The police are collecting statements from all team members and have also asked for a full guest list. They are returning on Monday April 4th to collect cctv footage from us. We have found the group on cctv and will now map back to the other camera's. The police took the bar manager's shirt as that had blood on from the incident in Belgravia.

Recommendations for the future:

Security:

- The body searches were done manually and the security company did not bring any wands with them. As a venue we'd expect the company to have the equipment or make it known to us they did not so that we could provide as this is faster and more accurate for detecting metal weapons
- Issues with comms were not highlighted to the venue in any post event update nor on the night so a comms check will form part of the on arrival requirements
- The initial search point on the left of the lobby, meant that the right side of the lobby barriers were open for people to jump the barriers and have access to the lifts to the 28th floor, which did occur. Building security, in order to stop the turnstile barriers being damaged also let people go through without passing through the search point. At that point a secondary manned station at the lifts should have been recommended with guards deployed from other areas to prevent direct access.
- One other solution would be to have a secondary barrier so that anyone jumping the turnstile could not proceed to the lifts and that would mean that all guests would have to pass the search point.
- For the venue to look at increased cover so that the smoking area has a security presence as well as the dispense bar in Belgravia.

Straight after I went to inform the manager (Tomas) and sells manager (David) that we were over capacity and in total we had 640 people , so we had to close the entrance for any other arrivals, but David refused that and later asked one of the security guards to clear the clickers.

Later around 12 o'clock we had second fight in the lift lobby area, smoking area and on the 28th floor. We sort that out, but the building security called the police . I stopped the music at the party and asked for the party to be stopped , but the managers refused.

Around 1am we had accident again on the 28th floor, I stopped the music and calmed the situation. Me and the venue manager (Tomas) wanted to stop the party but the sells manager did not allowed us to do that, but kept continuously letting people in without being through search and said that he was there to work. I took out the man , who was threatened at this accident, through the staff lifts area.

After I went to Reeses cafe and stopped an other fight.

After I went to upstairs again , I found Rosen and a man on the floor unconscious. (Rosen has to write report for that, because he is the main witness)


During the whole night we did not have good connection on the equipment provided from the company for communication between the security guards.

It was not working properly, or not working at all, which means all the guards were under threat and the costumes as well.

Overall I think if we stopped the party on time nothing of this would happen , or if they had booked more security guards. They clearly know that now, as they asked for the clickers to be cleared.

Another thought over everything that happened and the 640 people we had, I think all guards did good job and their best.

Hi there,

Here is my report about the night on 27th March, Altitude

All the time I was on the ground floor, doing bag and body search, but I still witnessed few problematic situations.

Around 12 o'clock few guys started jumping over the barriers and started to get aggressive after me telling them not to, and leave, started to push me away at the lifts area and wanted to go back to the party, so they did through me. At that time the building security called the police. I went up with the other lift and told the other guards to take them out.

Next fight I witnessed was at Reeles Bar, between 4 men, at around 2am. Our supervisor and myself stopped the men and sent them away of the building. After that around 3am I was told by phone message to call police and ambulance immediately to go on the 28th floor.

I need to mention that through the whole night David let groups of people to go to the party, without letting us to search them.

That is all I was witnessing that night.

On Sunday I arrived at Altitude at 7pm and they assigned me to the lift lobby and I was watching the fire exit. I was there until approximately 11pm. During this time I noticed that people kept coming and coming and that we weren't enough security. It was hard to cope for the eight security guys because we started getting a lot of calls from the staff, that people are going inside the kitchen.


After 11pm I was assigned to the entrance to check wristbands etc. Around this time there was a fight near the entrance between four people. One of the guys lifted a chair and tried to hit someone in the head, but I managed to grab the chair in the last moment and pulled it from his hands. After this they went outside on streets but once they were outside I didn't follow them.

Around 2am the police showed up and asked me where did the stabbing take place. As I didn't have earplugs to my walkie talkie and the place was very noisy it was hard to communicate with my colleagues, so I wasn't aware of this incident at the time. The police closed all the doors and started investigating. This went on for about an hour and then we started letting people leave. Everybody left around 5am, but we had to stay for an extra hour.

Hello there,

It is Zara here, Chris said I have to write observation over the night on 27th March at Altitude, so I do.

The first conflict I witnessed was around 11:30 pm, when a man was causing troubles to other people at the party and Plamen took him out of the building.

At around 1 o'clock I went to the ground floor, and at the lobby lift area I saw few men at the opposite lift trying to get into the lift to the party through Zhanel and Penko. They were aggressive against my colleagues and seemed irrational.

Later after 2:30 am few aggressive men were punching another man, and the fight was brought from the hall to the lifts area. Chris came to the place and took the beaten guy away through the lifts.

At the same moment another fight happened in the corridor next to the lifts. I saw an aggressive crowd and a man on the floor. I ran to call my colleagues, Rosen was the one near me. We both went near to the fight and we saw the man on the floor with a knife in his hand and unconscious on the floor. Seemed like the people involved in the last two fights were in two groups, having conflicts between them, and the biggest aggression causing the massive fight was unlocked by the man with the knife. The knife was taken off the man by Rosen.

The men, part of our security team came on the 28th floor and helped to turn away the crowd and the aggressive people around the injured man.

At that moment a call was made to the police and an ambulance.

The party was stopped and I started to orientate people to the lifts and exits.


Once last thing I need to mention is how bad was the communicative equipment we were given, so we had to use our mobile phones to forward messages and ask for help.

I should also mention that during one of my patrols around the venue I found David, the sales manager with few female costumers in the disabled toilet, which was out of use during the whole night. Also later at the night when the party was over the police came, David asked me to clear the clikers, which I did not do, because I did not want to get involved in his play.

Then around 00:30 h. Was another fight be twin IC1 male and IC3 male ! We try to calm them , wasn't easy so we need to take one of them out and send him home !was the IC1 male , his friends help us !

In the mean time music was of and we had a word whit management of Milbank to stop the party !But they didn't won't to do it then we carry on with our duties !Was ok for a while,then we have call again that is the massive fight be twin may be 10 IC3 male punching each Oder with a bottles !We try to stop them carefully ,wasn't possible ,they was mad !Then I see the boy being on the floor, his head was cover of blood !

His friend was around him and try to help , they didn't let us close to help !

We call the ambulance and police and stops the music and obviously party was over ,management ask us . to clear the venue !

Police arrived very fast and after them ambulance !



Firstly I would like to say that this party was really difficult to be controlled especially because obviously the organizer did not booked enough security for the amount of people that they expected.

They obviously knew that they will have that much people because everything was pre - booked with tickets.

It was impossible for eight security officers to deal with at least 800 people could be more.

So we started at 1.30 pm on Sunday 27th March 2016 with three of us on the entrance and floor .

At 7 pm another 5 security officers came to support us for the party .

Myself and another security were booked till 2 pm which was a bit strange when you see all this people for the party.

Anyway everything was good till about 9 pm when I was on the lifts to make sure there are no people with glasses going out. I heard people saying call Security and I went inside with my colleague to check .

Group of about five to then people were fighting each other and I went between them to try calm them down .Other security officers came as well and we managed to stop the argue and got one of the aggressors out of the venue.

In about 20 to 30 minutes later something happened again and one of my colleague who was patrolling inside called me to go inside because of another fight.

I went inside and two boys were fighting each other and other people trying to support them .

I called other officers to support me and in that time i was punched in the face with the words "do not make your night difficult leave us dealing each other" - that said one of the boys in the fight .

Anyway Cris, Penko and Rosen came to support me and we got it under control.

After that happened I went and found the venue manager named David.

Obviously he was enjoying his self with two girls and alcohol (nothing wrong with that if is not in charge) and I said to him " we have to stop that before something worse happen" and he answer to me " we work in here mate" I said " OK, It's up to you but the situation is going out of control".

So in another 20 to 30 minutes we had fight again and a boy pissing in the middle of the venue obviously drunk and probably used something different than alcohol!

I went there and said "could you come outside with me", then he got aggressive

. Penkocame to support me and I had no choice I went behind him and grabbed him around his arms so he could not move and we took him out .


There was a group of boys which were trying to control the rest of people and help us because they wanted to enjoy the party not paying for fights and no music.

That became out of control and me, Cris, Penko and friends of the white boy were trying to get him outside but the rest of the other group were coming to fight. Lucky we had other group of people helped us and stopped the IC3 group to stay inside while we took the white boy outside .

After that happened we thought everything is going to be OK and it was for about an hour and something .

I went for a break on the ground floor area and stayed in there for 30 minutes. After the break I stand on the entrance checking bags and searching people . In one point I heard Tomas(one of the managers) on the radio saying security call ambulance about three times . I said to the reception security to call ambulance and run to the lifts to get to 28th floor. When I got to 28th floor I saw blood all around the lifts and went to the corridor on the right where was a body on the floor and few people on top of him asking whats happened . Rosen was in there trying to get people away of him and I said to them ambulance is coming and went inside to check the situation.

After all that happened Cris said to me to go downstairs because police is coming and I need to meet them and get them to 28th floor + ambulance. I went downstairs and waited till police came with ambulance and sent them upstairs. People were taken downstairs and on 28th floor left only police with ambulance trying to help the person on the floor.

All I can say after that happened is very bad organization and we were supposed to be at least 20 people security and anyway I think that party was supposed to be shut down when the second fight happened. I know that they would like to earn money but on first place is the safety of the people and stuff before everything!

Rosen Zehirov - Statement

Started smoothly, what I saw loads of big lads coming in 8 or 10 groups, most people are prepaid.
190 - 200 people in venue at 19:00

23:00 – fist fight 28th floor, bottle thrown (belvedere vodka 3l) ic3 male. Male was running away, couldn't get hold of man, finally music stops they leave, him and one of his friend, threw fire ventilator – left. I ask David Coley are we going to continue he say yes.

00:00 – Fight in smoking area, female altitude staff member tells me there is a fight, when I arrive the fight has stopped but arguing, I try and find out what happens then one guy punches someone. These people suspected no payers, female altitude staff tells me to have two people in smoking area but this is impossible with short staff. Police called, asked me who was involved

01:00 – Previously ejected persons enter building, run through building, push female security officer to floor.

We have 3 radios for 8 security and no connection, we communicate with our mobiles most of the night

Multiple skirmishes.

8-10 ic3 at tables next to each other. Seems aggressive environment with chance of fights

02:00 – I went upstairs I hear before I went to corridor 'get the knife' I saw a guy on his knees, I tried to take the knife from the other guy, they hold the guy down and punch and kick him. At this point I try to focus on the knife, I took the guys knife from him. 2 or 3 guys were kicking guy on the ground, he was unconscious, I gave him first aid. We wait til police came. His friends are running around looking for the people that did it. We called ambulance. It was total carnage. People were walking around with bottles hitting people whoever they saw. In the club I used to work 200 capacity, 14 security officers.

End of night - People trying to smash down bar to get alcohol.

640 people in venue.

3 times there was a fight and we stopped the music, each time it was started again.

I told Altitude manager David Coley, we need to get people down through the fire exit, he refused, by getting people out through the lift, clashes started again, bottles thrown.

David Coley, told me not to call the police. He was completely drunk and drugged up, he tried to give me thumbs up and I said no, this is not good enough.

No radio, no form of communication and too few security. Paravana organisers saying people can come in after doors closed without needing to be searched. Security undermined because organisers know some customers.

I could tell from midnight we lost control, troublemakers could see that we are outnumbered and did not listen to us.

I start at 7pm, I was told by supervisor to patrol and this is what I did, over the course of the night I got in to break up many fights, I was constantly working under the orders of my more experienced security officers who told me what to do and when.

My radio did not work so I had to use mobile phone. I assist police and ambulance when they arrived

I attended the above CAD as it came out as a large fight. Due to the injured male being on the 28th myself and my operator (attachment from CW) remained in the foyer, when 1628CW asked that patrons be kept inside the premises in case the suspects were still present. There were NO door staff in evidence so I locked the door as it was just a twist knob, then went to the bar staff who pointed out a male stood off to the side. He had no ID visible I went over to speak to the male who clearly spoke very little English and asked why he was not actually on the door where he should be and asked him to come help us as by now there was a hostile crowd of about 40-50 trying to leave. He walked to the door saw it was locked and then wandered off never to be seen again.

Thankfully your impact team arrived a short time later and were able to help calm and then disperse the crowd in a controlled manner.

I don't know if you have any control over door staff (sorry) if you do the people working at this venue need a few words of advice.

There was a witness to the GBH who said they had earlier spoken to the door staff warning them over the behaviour of the group concerned in the assault but had not paid any attention and again had just disappeared

Good to catch up with you, as discussed I conducted a visit to Altitude today with DC Emma Hammatt who is the IO for the jobs over the weekend.

Observations

- 8 Security were on for the event
- Approx 550 Tickets had been pre sold
- The entry in the foyer of the Milbank Tower had searching/ entry via a rope area behind the reception desk. The patrons would then make their way to the lift lobby then upto the 29th. CCTV showed persons jumping the barriers adjacent to the lift lobby thereby gaining access. During this process an incident has taken place where venue security was assaulted when she tried to prevent the queue jump.
- The Building security commented today that they witnessed this and that there was no security covering this area, the building security critique on the event security was in my opinion correct. An easy and simple fix would be to have the search area at the point of entry at the lifts and this would remove the risk of prohibited articles getting in.
- The CCTV was unable to be fully accessed.... This is against their conditions
- Patrons concerned in the event were able to exit via 'Back' stairs and lift into the loading bay during which no apparent control over entry and exit (No SIA staff with clickers etc). Again an issue over keeping a record of the capacity in the venue and conflicts with conditions of licence.

I was asked about prevention of drugs at event

- I explained that the brief for the venue security / DPS would be to maintain vigilance throughout event to ensure persons who were intoxicated were removed and any evidence of drug misuse could be challenged.
- I asked if Wands were in use or available and was told no.... I explained that this should have been factored into the RA and at least have them available

After viewing the CCTV it appeared that the crowd has more control of the event especially during the disorder. Given the size of the venue and it's location I would have expected more staff to be factored into the risk. The estate security were the ones on scene and dealing with the outbreak of disorder and have been able to give a salient account and parallel this with CCTV.

This was by no means a full licensing visit but my professional observations pre your visit tomorrow. Emma will have the CCTV etc in due course if you wish to later liaise.

We write further to our meeting at the above premises with you in relation to incidents that took place on 27 March.

We confirm that when we met our clients were able to provide you with a copy of the guest list, incident report, 696 risk assessment form, temporary event notice confirmation and viewing facilities for the relevant CCTV footage.

At our meeting various matters were raised. Further to this we confirm that these have been addressed as follows:

1. 696 risk assessment forms will be completed at least 14 days prior to an event taking place. Upon completion they will be emailed to you.
2. A risk assessment dealing specifically with the prevention of crime and disorder will be completed at least 14 days prior to an event taking place. Upon completion they will be emailed to you.
3. The premises current security company, Valid Security Services Ltd will no longer be contracted by our clients to provide any services for any future events at any of their venues in Millbank Tower.
4. CCTV footage will be downloaded and sent to you. As requested this will be from 2.30 am until 3.30 am on 28 March.
5. A list detailing all of the guests that were present at the event will be sent to you.

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6. Management procedures for both inside and outside the premises will be reviewed. On completion any relevant policy/procedure documents will be forwarded to you. This review will be under the direction of former Chief Inspector Adrian Studd (retired).
7. All duty managers will become personal licence holders and all permanent staff will undergo relevant licensing training on site. This will be undertaken by David Rowberry who is a registered trainer with the British Institute of Innkeepers.
8. Permanent staff will be trained or re-trained in Crime Scene Preservation, Alcohol Awareness and Drug Awareness. This will be undertaken by former Inspector Graeme Ironside (retired) assisted by Peter Spindler who has recently retired as Commander and Head of the Specialist Crime Unit for the Metropolitan Police Service.
9. The Designated Premises Supervisor is being changed to Tomas Skrina (Personal Licence No: [REDACTED] issued by London Borough of Waltham Forest).

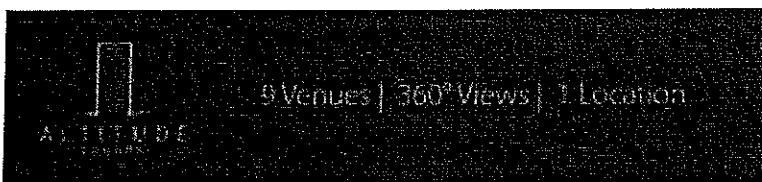



Re: Police Licensing Team visit to Altitude on 17/08/2015

On Monday 17th August Paul Hoppe and I visited you to make enquiries regarding an assault that occurred on your premises at about 3.20 am on Sunday 16th August 2015. A male who had attended your venue, alleged he had been assaulted by a group of males and had received head injuries after being hit on the head with a bottle.

It was good to meet with you and your assistant Charlotte Houlihan and discuss the incident in more detail. You were able to provide us with the guest list, incident report and limited CCTV for the event. During our meeting we discussed the incident and identified the following failings:

- The way events are booked and risk assessments not carried out, particularly for this event. The fact the organiser requested their own security should have highlighted an increased risk, more questions should have been asked of the organiser, a 696 risk assessment form completed and submitted to police.
- The Security team did not respond correctly. The minimum requirement we would have expected, is for the suspect to be detained, police called and a crime scene identified and preserved. Post incident we would expect an incident report to be completed by a member of the Security team detailing what action was taken and why.
- The CCTV system was below our minimum requirements as per condition 10 on your licence. We would expect all cameras installed to be working and if any faults arise, these should be recorded in the incident log as per condition 15, and then rectified as soon as possible.

We believe the incident was poorly managed. In order to reassure us that in future you intend to fully adhere to the licensing objectives, I would like you to provide me with an action plan detailing what changes shall be implemented to prevent similar incidents occurring again.

The CCTV system shall be brought up to the required standard immediately. The camera above the DJ box should be repaired or replaced. I would also request that you consider providing additional coverage, as there are several areas not covered by the surveillance system.

We want to work in partnership with you to promote the licensing objectives and so If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me. I must warn you that should you fail to heed Police recommendations and you experience further incidents of crime and disorder on your premises, you will leave us no option but to take enforcement action.

Police Licensing Team Visit to Altitude on 17 August 2015

We write further to your letter dated 18 August in relation to the above premises and our subsequent telephone conversations. As you are aware we act for the owners and operators of Altitude.

We are pleased that you were able to confirm that when you met with our clients they provided you with a guest list, incident report and CCTV of the event. We understand that during your meeting various matters were raised. We confirm that following your meeting these have been addressed as follows:

1. The way events are booked has been amended so that all bookings must be confirmed at least three months in advance and the deposit required has been increased from 10 to 25%. No outside security for any event will be permitted unless specifically sanctioned by you. A 696 Risk Assessment form will be completed for all future events.
2. Following your concerns about the security team our clients have changed their security company to Valid Security Services Ltd. They are ACS registered and their contract commenced on Friday 28 August 2015. All relevant members of staff will be trained in "crime scene preservation" with an approved course provider. The course date will be provided to you as soon as it becomes available.
3. The CCTV system is in the process of being upgraded and in this regard a further 22 extra cameras have been ordered. These will be installed by the end of September. As suggested a new camera has been installed in the DJ box.

Our clients confirm that they will continue to work in partnership with yourselves to promote the licensing objectives and that as previously discussed if they have any queries in relation to any future events they will notify you immediately.

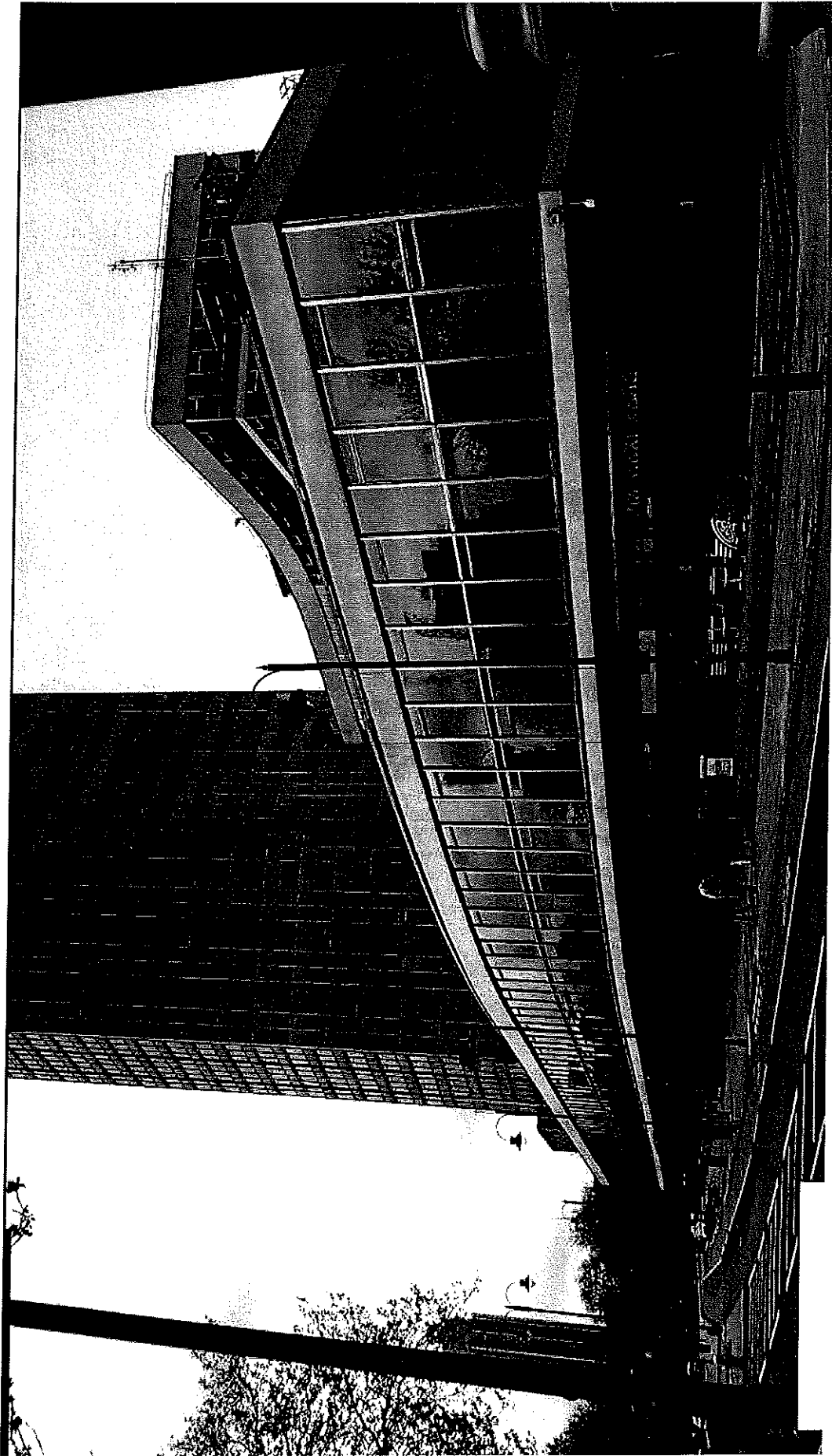

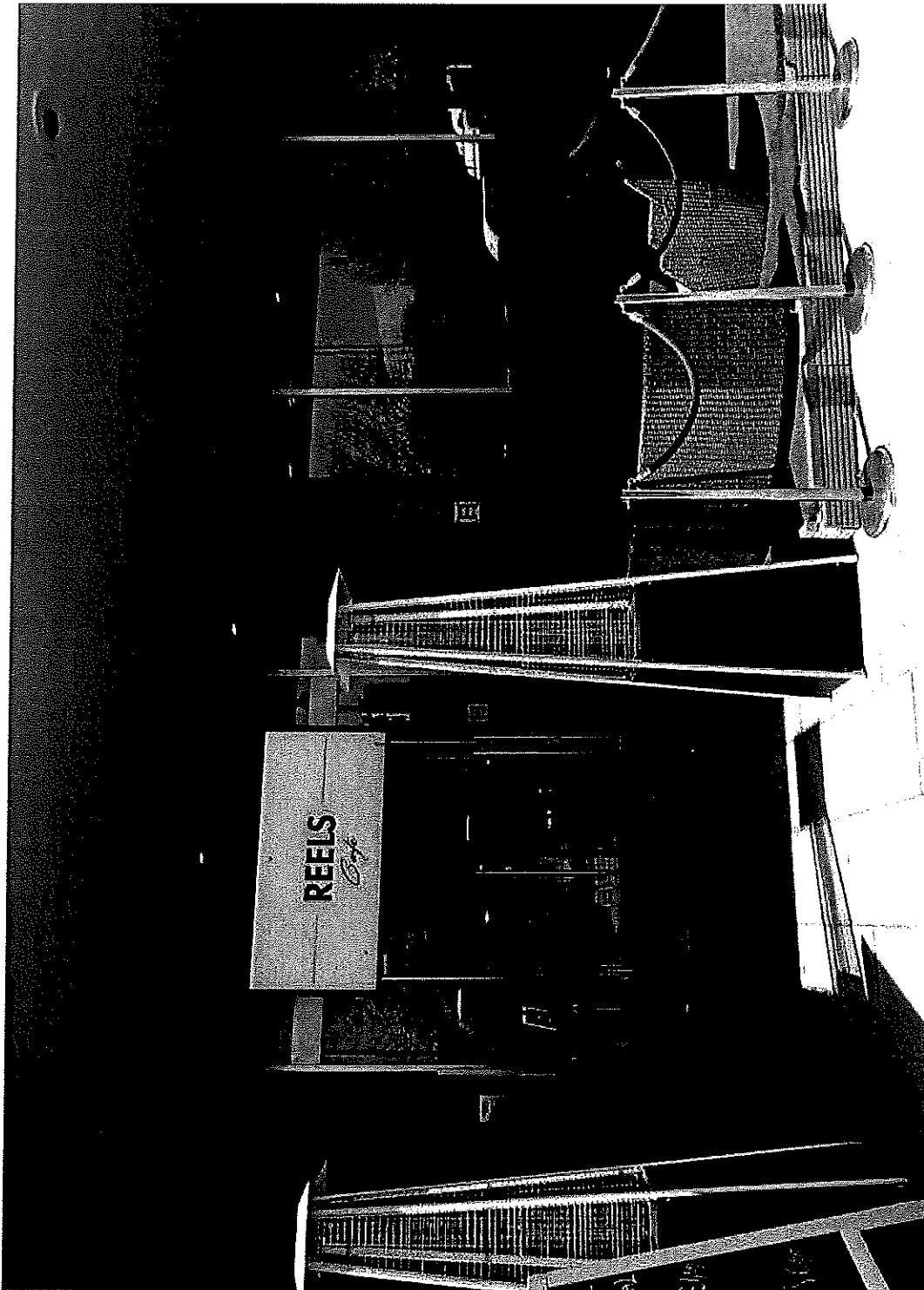

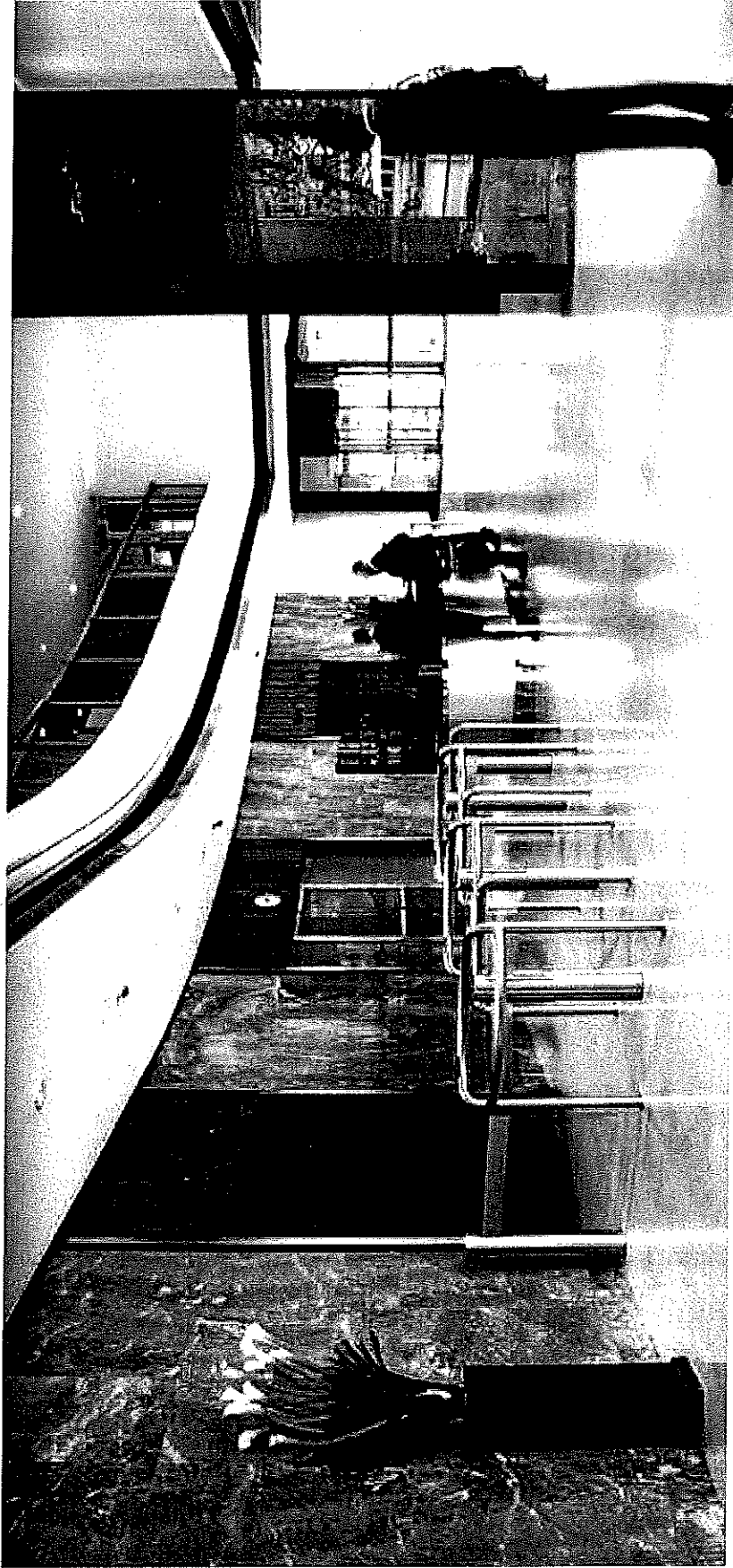

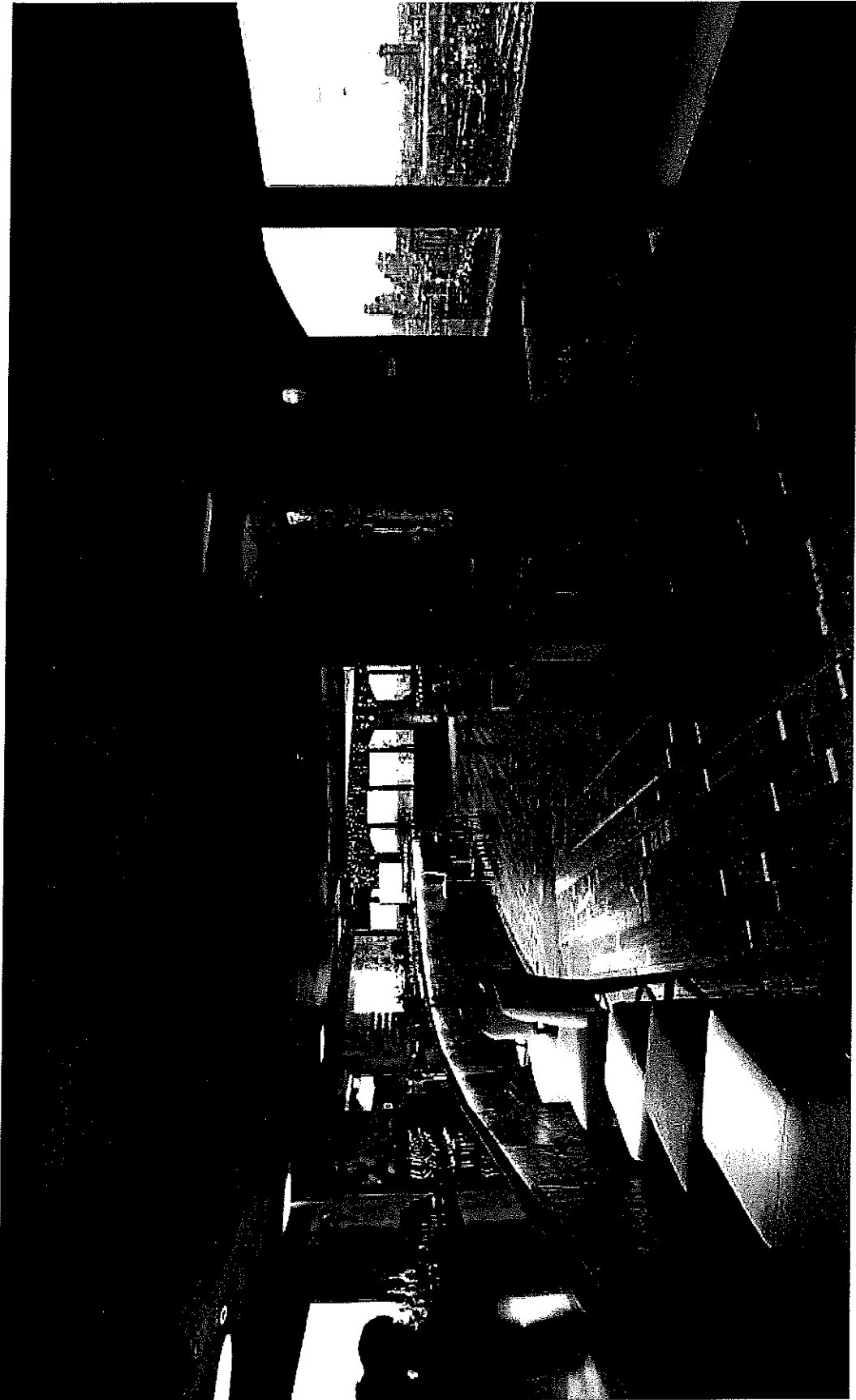

The Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974
Licensing Act 2003

As you may be aware, there have been a number of examples recently of licensed premises supplying, or permitting the supply of, Nitrous Oxide (also known as laughing gas, Nos or hippy crack) for customers to inhale. Typically the Nitrous Oxide is contained in a small cylinder which is then used to fill a balloon from which the gas is inhaled. We are aware that not all duty holders appreciate that this activity is illegal and I am therefore writing to all relevant venues in the authority's jurisdiction to clarify the legal position regarding the supply of Nitrous Oxide.

Nitrous Oxide is a pharmacy only medicine when prepared for inhalation and may only be supplied in this form by a registered pharmacist on the premises of a registered pharmacy. This is the case even where the Nitrous Oxide has been originally supplied for some other purpose (e.g. whipping cream).

The act of supplying Nitrous Oxide for the purpose of inhalation makes it a medicinal product; anyone other than a registered pharmacist supplying Nitrous Oxide for the purposes of inhalation on your premises is committing the offence under Section 52 of the Medicines Act 1968.

Any duty holder at your premises who allows Nitrous Oxide to be supplied in the circumstances described above commits the offence of aiding and abetting an offence under s.52 of the Medicines Act 1968. These offences carry a maximum sentence of two years in prison and/or an unlimited fine.

In addition there are genuine health risks attached to the use of Nitrous Oxide, both directly resulting from its consumption and in terms of injuries resulting from a fall induced by its effects (which are produced by starving the brain of Oxygen). These risks include death. There are also long-term dangers to health (including bone marrow suppression, blood cell problems and poisoning of the central nervous system). These risks are likely to be exacerbated if the drug is combined with alcohol or other narcotics. The risks are particularly severe for pregnant women.

Under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 you have a duty to protect people on your premises (including customers) from risks to their health and safety. Allowing the supply of Nitrous Oxide on your premises would render you liable to prosecution under the Act, and potentially liable to any civil claims.

The promotion of public safety is one of the core objectives of the Licensing Act 2003, under which your premises is licensed and concern about the safety of members of the public using your premises could have implications for your licence(s).

If this authority becomes aware that premises are supplying or allowing the supply of Nitrous Oxide, the MHRA (Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency) will be informed, along with any evidence obtained. In addition action may be taken under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, and the premises licence reviewed under the Licensing Act 2003.

You are therefore advised to take all necessary steps to ensure that Nitrous Oxide is not being supplied on your premises and advised to contact this authority or the MHRA should you become aware that any group or individual is attempting to use your premises to supply it.

- 2.1 An application submitted by the Metropolitan Police Service for a review of the premises licence for Altitude 360, Twenty Ninth Floor, Millbank Tower, 21- 24 Millbank Tower, London, SW1P 4QP, was received on 21st April 2016 on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. **Please see Annex A1**
- 2.2 Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (para 11.2) states that at any stage following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police or the Environmental Health Service, or any other person who can seek a review, may ask the Licensing Authority to review the premises licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.
- 2.3 As such, in accordance with section 52(2) of the above-mentioned Act, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider the application and any relevant representations.
- 2.4 The premises currently benefits from a premises licence that permits:

Playing of Recorded Music

Monday to Sunday: 08:00 until 02:00

Non-standard timings: From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

This review is being requested to Prevent Crime and Disorder and to Protect the Public Safety after there was serious disorder inside Altitude 360 on the 28th Floor which lead to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This lead to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons.

Altitude 360 on the 29th floor operates on a different premises licence from the 28th, however they can be used as a single venue that has an overall capacity of 600 excluding staff. Both licences are owned by the same company and have the same DPS named on the licence. Due to the failings by managment we have no confidence that this part of the venue will be operated any differently if the operation is moved to this floor. Both licences 15/10878/LIPDPS and 15/10890/LIPDPS have similar conditions.

There has been previous engagement by Police with the venue for a similar incident within the last 12 months.

PROTECTIVE MARKING

This Review application on behalf of the Metropolitan Police Service, concerns the events that took place in Altitude, 28th Floor, Millbank Tower on Sunday 27th March 2016 at approximately 0300 hours.

Altitude is a venue that predominantly caters for corporate events. The venue consists of a large bar area and open space that can be used as a dance floor for planned events.

The event was a promoted event held by the 'Paravana Project' which openly advertised tickets for sale to members of the public which could be purchased at any time. The event was similar to those held in night clubs.

During the event, there was serious disorder inside the venue which led to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This led to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons. They ran throughout the venue fighting as they met with the opposing group. At one point a group had to barricade themselves in a store room for safety, as the opposing males attempted to force entry, smashing the door window in the process. Security personnel completely lost control and were unable to deal with the incident as it developed. The disorder continued for approximately 10 minutes before continuing outside. Males then armed themselves with traffic cones before the Police attended, following which the males ran off.

CCTV inside the venue has captured the majority of the disorder and demonstrates the event had insufficient security personnel and was poorly managed. Males can be seen running through the venue searching for their next victim. Others are covered in blood and no attempt is made by staff to administer first aid.

The investigation to date shows that during the event there were several breaches of various licence conditions, including:

Condition 13 - The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

* Recordings were only stored for 9 days

Condition 20 - The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.

* Tickets were on sale to the general public via the internet and could be purchased at any time, even on the night of the event.

Condition 21 - In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

* No dedicated security risk assessment was completed or could be provided to Police.

Condition 51 - No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

* The event was run and advertised by PARAVANA PROJECT which is a large and well known promoted event.

Condition 17 - A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer in request.

* No record of recorded capacity has been provided to Police and security reports state they were asked to reset the clickers by management upon Police arrival.

Enquires to date also show that there was no DPS in place on the date of the event (27/03/16) as the DPS on the current licence - 15/10890/LIPDPS was released from duties by mutual consent on 28/02/16.

It is my opinion that if the premises licence conditions had been adhered to on the night of the event then the serious disorder would not have occurred.

Due to the serious nature of this incident we would like the committee to consider revocation of the premises licence. I would add that this is one of the most serious incidents of crime and disorder I have dealt with during the time I have served on the Westminster Police Licensing Team

Altitude 360 on the 29th floor operates on a different premises licence from the 28th, however they can be used as a single venue that has an overall capacity of 600 excluding staff. Both licences are owned by the same company and have the same DPS named on the licence. Due to the failings by management we have no confidence that this part of the venue will be operated any differently if the operation is moved to this floor. Both have similar conditions.

 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public.

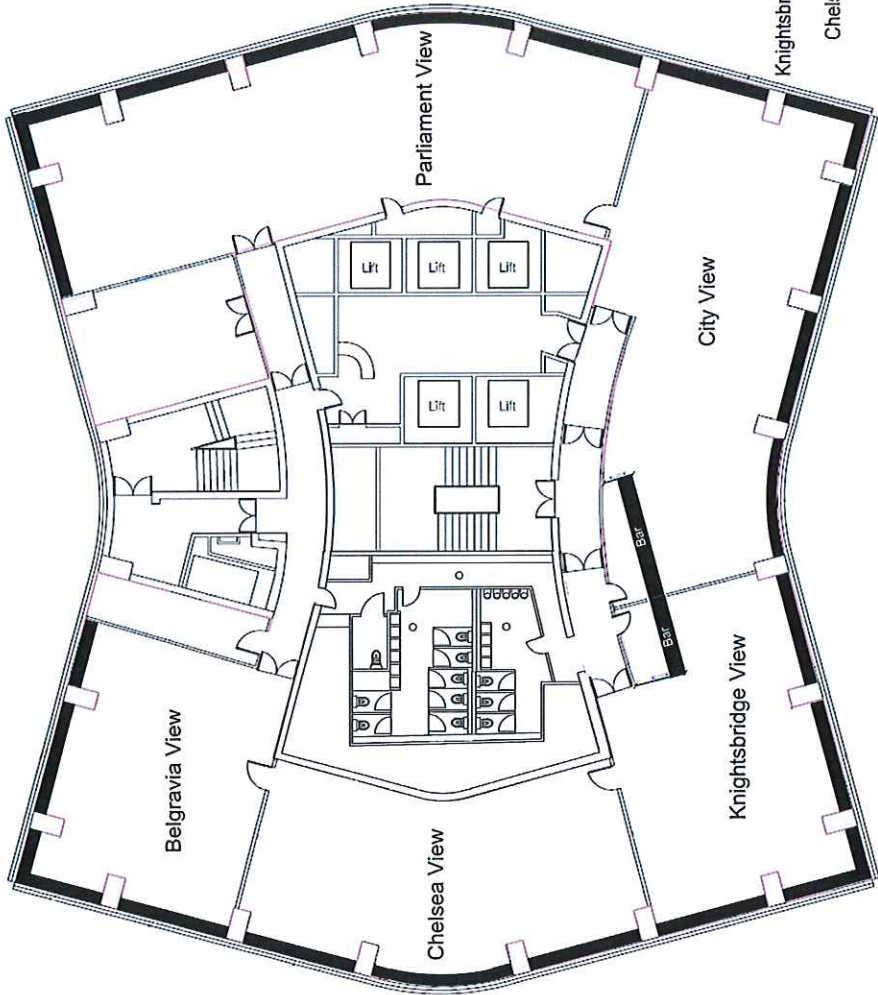

Permission was granted on 23 April 2009 (RN 08/10112/FULL) for the *'Use of 29th floor for office, conference centre and private function use (sui generis)'*.

Permission was subsequently granted on 27 October 2011 (RN 11/03155/FULL) for *'Use of 28th floor for office, conference centre and private function use (sui generis)'*. Conditions were attached to both applications as follows:

- 1) You must not open the private function and conference centre element of the use to customers, and you must not allow customers on the premises, outside the following times: between 07:00 and 02:00.
- 2) No goods, including fuel, delivered or collected by vehicles arriving at or departing from the building shall be accepted or despatched if unloaded or loaded on the public highway. You may accept or despatch such goods only if they are unloaded or loaded within the curtilage of the building.
- 3) You must not play live or recorded music which is audible outside the premises.
- 4) You must not allow more than 600 customers on either the 28/29th floor at any one time.

I would therefore note that allowing the premises to open until 4am was in breach of condition 1 above.

2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that -
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public.
11. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
12. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises.
13. A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer on request.
14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
15. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
16. The sale of alcohol shall be restricted to pre-booked functions, corporate events and conferences and members of the Altitude Club, subject to the rules of the club as agreed from time to time by the Metropolitan police. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 14 working days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.
17. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
18. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
19. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents in the vicinity.
20. No drinks shall be consumed outside the premises nor glasses/bottles removed from the premises by patrons when leaving.
21. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).
22. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
23. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.

- dry ice and cryogenic fog
- smoke machines and fog generators
- pyrotechnics including fire works
- firearms
- lasers
- explosives and highly flammable substances.
- real flame.
- strobe lighting.

24. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.
NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
25. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
26. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
27. All exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
28. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
29. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
30. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.
31. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
- Any emergency lighting battery or system
 - Any electrical installation
 - Any emergency warning system
32. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
33. No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 2300 hours and 0800 hours.
34. There shall be no deliveries between 2300 and 0800 hours.
35. Patrons wishing to smoke only do so in the designated Millbank Tower smoking area to the rear of the building, or on the terrace as shown on the attached plan.
36. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
37. All patrons and staff waiting for a taxi shall be encouraged to do so within the premises.

38. The licence holder will enter into an arrangement with a hackney carriage or private carriage firm to provide transport for patrons when requested.
39. The number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) at the premises shall not exceed:

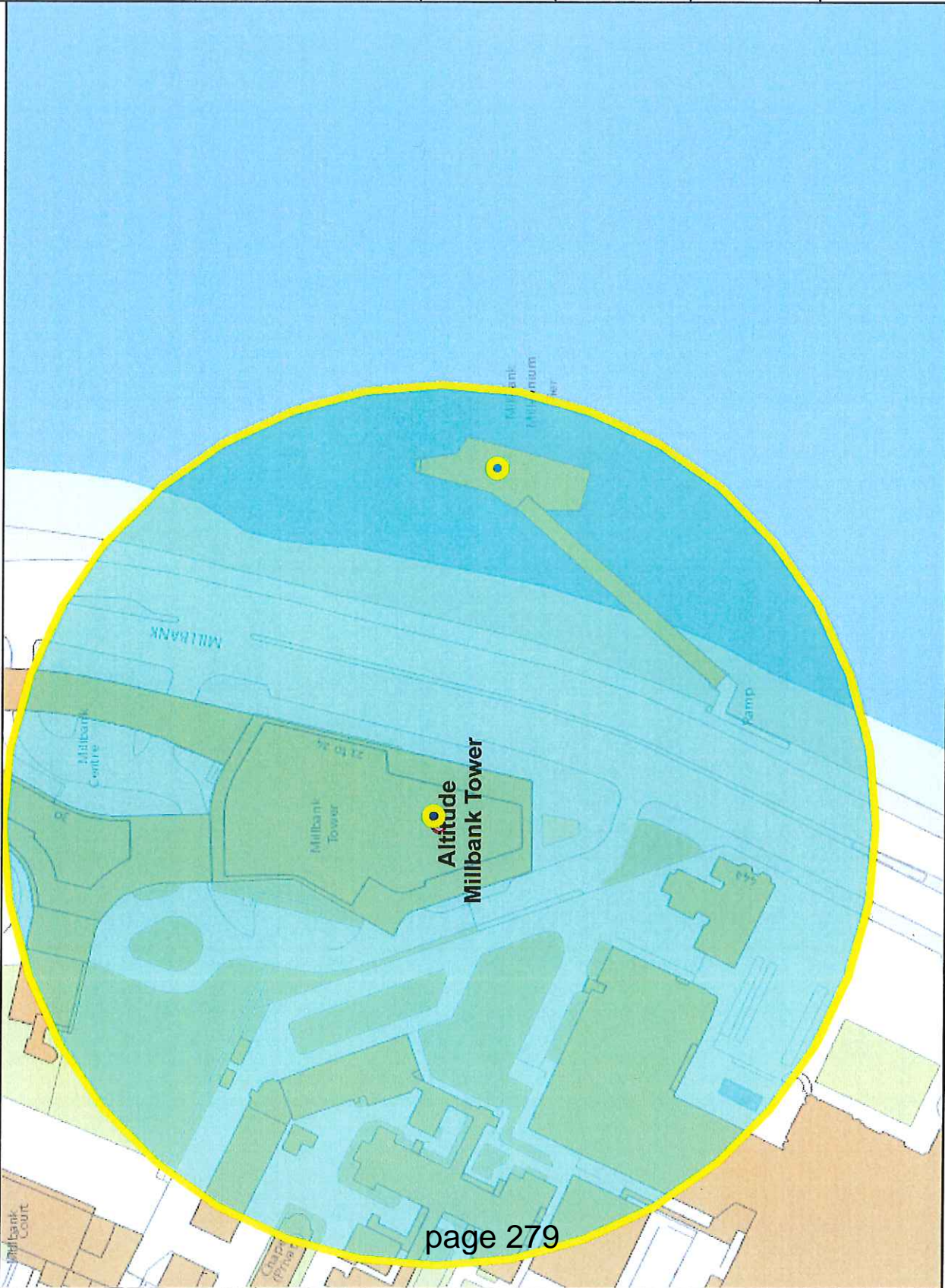

This Review application on behalf of the Metropolitan Police Service, concerns the events that took place in Altitude, 28th Floor, Millbank Tower on Sunday 27th March 2016 at approximately 0300 hours.

Altitude is a venue that predominantly caters for corporate events. The venue consists of a large bar area and open space that can be used as a dance floor for planned events.

The event was a promoted event held by the 'Paravana Project' which openly advertised tickets for sale to members of the public which could be purchased at any time. The event was similar to those held in night clubs.

During the event, there was serious disorder inside the venue which led to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This led to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons. They ran throughout the venue fighting as they met with the opposing group. At one point a group had to barricade themselves in a store room for safety, as the opposing males attempted to force entry, smashing the door window in the process. Security personnel completely lost control and were unable to deal with the incident as it developed. The disorder continued for approximately 10 minutes before continuing outside. Males then armed themselves with traffic cones before the Police attended, following which the males ran off.

CCTV inside the venue has captured the majority of the disorder and demonstrates the event had insufficient security personnel and was poorly managed. Males can be seen running through the venue searching for their next victim. Others are covered in blood and no attempt is made by staff to administer first aid.

The investigation to date shows that during the event there were several breaches of various licence conditions including:

Condition 13 - The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

* Recordings were only stored for 9 days

Condition 20 - The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.

* Tickets were on sale to the general public via the internet and could be purchased at any time, even on the night of the event.

Condition 21- In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

* No dedicated security risk assessment was completed or could be provided to Police.

Condition 51 - No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

* The event was run and advertised by PARAVANA PROJECT which is a large and well known promoted event.

Condition 17 - A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer in request.

* No record of recorded capacity has been provided to Police and security reports state they were asked to reset the clickers by management upon Police arrival.

Enquires to date also show that there was no DPS in place on the date of the event (27/03/16) as the DPS on the current licence - 15/10890/LIPDPS was released from duties by mutual consent on 28/02/16.

It is my opinion that if the premises licence conditions had been adhered to on the night of the event then the serious disorder would not have occurred.

Due to the serious nature of this incident we would like the committee to consider revocation of the premises licence. I would add that this is one of the most serious incidents of crime and disorder I have dealt with during the time I have served on the Westminster Police Licensing Team

Altitude 360 on the 29th floor operates on a different premises licence from the 28th, however they can be used as a single venue that has an overall capacity of 600 excluding staff. Both licences are owned by the same company and have the same DPS named on the licence. Due to the failings by management we have no confidence that this part of the venue will be operated any differently if the operation is moved to this floor. Both licences have similar conditions.

The criminal investigation linked to this review is ongoing and so all information contained within this application should be treated as confidential. CRIS 6513529/16 refers.

This review is being requested to Prevent Crime and Disorder and to Protect the Public Safety after there was serious disorder inside Altitude 360 on the 28th Floor which lead to several people being seriously assaulted. The disorder was initiated after a male armed with a knife, confronted a group of males and was knocked unconscious after being stamped on. This lead to a series of fights involving a number of males, who used bottles as weapons.

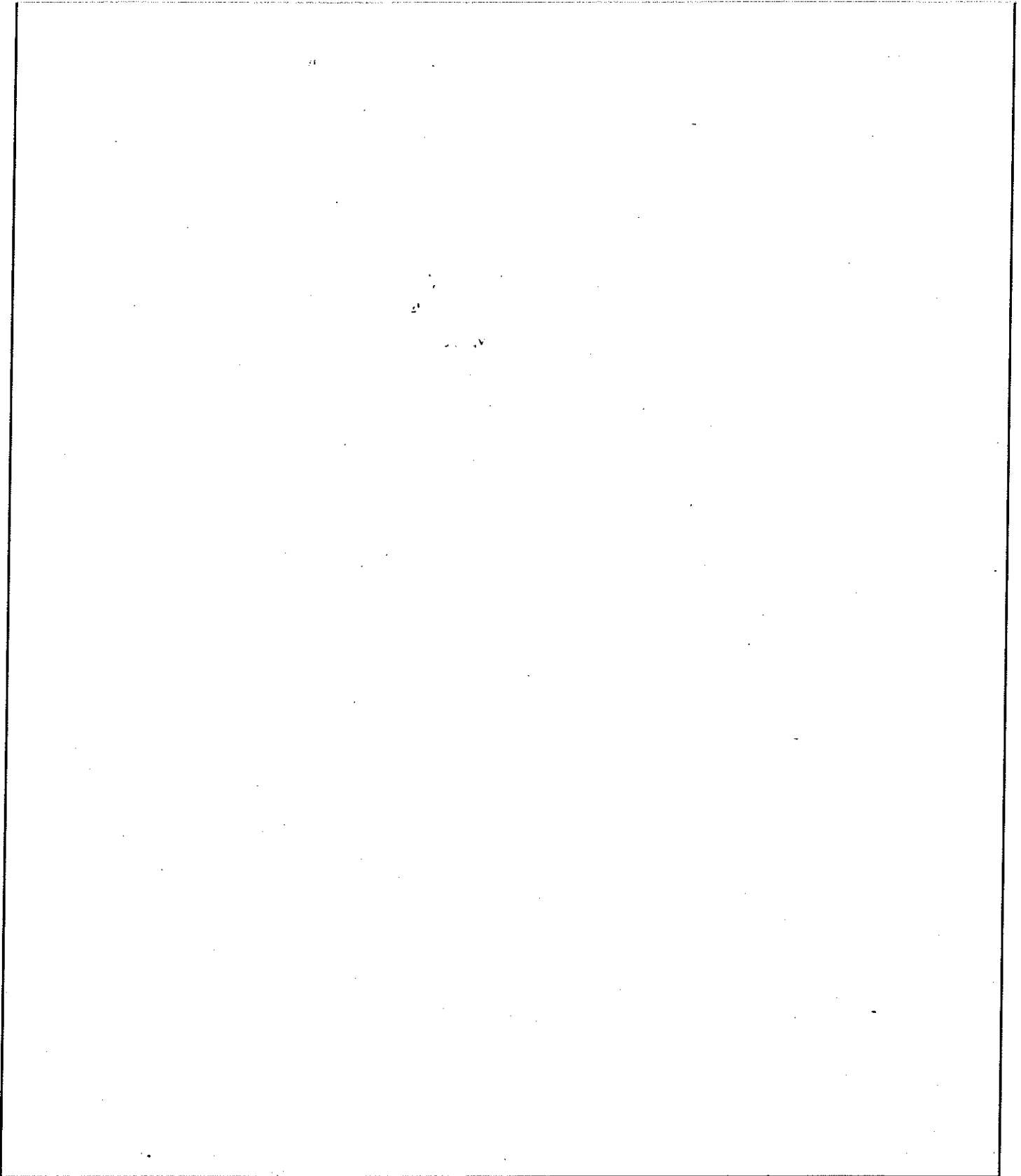
Altitude 360 on the 29th floor operates on a different premises licence from the 28th, however they can be used as a single venue that has an overall capacity of 600 excluding staff. Both licences are owned by the same company and have the same DPS named on the licence. Due to the failings by management we have no confidence that this part of the venue will be operated any differently if the operation is moved to this floor. Both licences 15/10878/LIPDPS and 15/10890/LIPDPS have similar conditions.

There has been previous engagement by Police with the venue for a similar incident within the last 12 months.





I am the above named person and am employed by the Metropolitan Police Service. I joined the Police in 2002 and during my service I have worked in a number of operational roles. I am currently attached to the Westminster Police Licensing Team where I have worked for approximately 3 years. During this time I have dealt with a range of licensing matters and have carried out numerous visits to licensed premises. I am qualified to BIIAB level 2 licensing Practitioners.


This statement refers to the application for review of the premises licence for Altitude 360, Millbank Tower, London SW1P 4QP, on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. The application was submitted after serious disorder occurred at the venue on Monday 28th March 2016. I exhibit my notice of application for a review of a premises licence as TJ/1.

Location

The Millbank Tower is a 33 storey building that is predominantly set out as office space. Altitude and the Sky Loft Bar are situated on the 28th and 29th floors of the Millbank tower and use the same ground level entrance/exit as the other businesses within the building. The venue is accessed via a lift from the ground floor which is situated behind the 24 hour reception desk and electronic barrier gates.

Altitude on the 28th Floor consists of a large bar area and open space that can be used as a dance floor and has panoramic views of the city. This space is generally used for corporate and private functions.

Exhibit TJ/13 refers to pictures of the ground floor entrance and reception area.

Incident

The review application follows an incident of serious disorder which resulted in a number of serious injuries to members of the public and required a large Police call out,

On Sunday 28th March 2016 a promoted event known as the 'Paravana Project' was held at Altitude on the 28th Floor. The event started at 1400 hours and finished the following morning at 0400 hours, with the last two hours operating under a Temporary Events Notice. Tickets were available to members of the public and were being sold online via the Paravana website.

At 23:15 hours on Sunday 27th March 2016 Police received an emergency call from a witness stating 30 to 40 people from the party were fighting at the location CAD 7792 27MAR16 refers. Police attended and found no sign of a disturbance but spoke to a male victim who had attended the event at Altitude. The male stated that while he was standing in the smoking area, outside the venue, he was punched in the face and knocked to the floor and while on the floor his watch had been stolen. He states that security did not assist him and Police have no record of either the management or security informing the Police. CRIS 6513519/16 refers.


At 00:32 hours on Monday 28th of March, Police received an emergency call from a witness stating that 3 males were hitting a female security guard in the lift on the ground floor CAD 227 28MAR16 refers. Police attended and spoke to a member of security and resulted the incident as a lawful ejection.

At 00:33 hours on Monday 28th March Police received a call from the building security stating there was a fight in progress on the ground floor between two males and they need Police quickly as Altitude security were struggling. Police attended and were informed that two males had entered the building and jumped over the barriers to gain entry to the lift, members of security for Altitude attempted to stop them but were pushed aside and the males managed to get into the left and go to the 28th floor and gain entry to the venue.

At 03:10 hours on Monday 28th March Police received a further call from building security stating that there were 7 to 8 males fighting and that weapons were being used. CAD 1141 28MAR16 refers

At 03:13 hours on Monday 28th March Police received a call from the London Ambulance Service requesting Police assistance as there was a fight in progress at the location and a person had been stabbed. CAD 1148 28MAR16 refers.

Police attended and after speaking to building security on the ground floor went directly to the 28th Floor, where they found a male with both head and torso injuries; more units were requested as a large crowd was gathering. A primary survey found that this male had not been stabbed but had been bottled and had also

sustained a fractured leg. On the way to hospital he was found to be in possession of a large quantity of class A drugs. At the time of attending Police also found a trail of blood leading to the service lift and so a total of three crime scenes were put in place linked to this assault..

At no point did the Police receive a call from the Management or any staff member from Altitude.

Licensing Investigation


On Tuesday 29th March 2016 Police Licensing received several emails from police officers who had attended on the night of the incident and had concerns about the way in which the event was managed, Exhibit TJ/9 refers. We also identified a number of crimes that had been recorded from the night of the event which included an Affray CRIS 6513529/16, Robbery CRIS 6513519/16 and a Crime related incident CRIS 6513531/16.

I contacted the management at Altitude and a meeting was arranged for Friday 30th March 2016.

We attended the venue and met with David Coley (Marketing manager) Tomas Skrina who introduced himself as the Designated Premises Supervisor and their legal representative Thomas O'Maoileoin.

We pointed out that Tomas was not the DPS shown on the premises licence and then Thomas stated an application was in the process of being submitted. We enquired as to the whereabouts of the Mr Suresh Abbas the DPS shown on the licence and were told he was still the DPS but was not able to meet us.

Tomas left the meeting shortly after introducing himself and David Coley described the incident to us in more detail. He began by informing us that the event was a private event held for the fashion model industry and that the evening had been largely peaceful and they had not expected any trouble. He showed us the ground floor entrance and then took us through reception and up to the 28th floor via the lift where he later walked us around the venue. He informed us that they had employed 8 SIA security personnel from a contractor named Valid Security and that they had 550 guests booked prior to the event starting. It was evident to us that due to the lay out of the building and the number of expected guests, the numbers of security had not been properly risk assessed and the number of security used on the night was insufficient for a venue this size: placing both the customers and staff at risk. They had used a total of 8 security personnel and had placed two security outside at the entrance, who were required to manage the guests arriving and the smoking area which was close by. Approximately 30 meters into the building on the ground floor they had placed two more security near

the lift to search guests prior to entering the lift. They had one managing the lift, which left only 3 security personnel to manage up to 550 guests in a large nightclub on the 28th floor with two dance floor areas, corridors and toilets.


We asked to see the risk assessment for SIA security as required by condition 21 on the licence, David was only able to provide a general risk assessment form (TJ/4) and not one dedicated to risk assessing security. He also provided us with a Promoted Event Risk Assessment Police 696 form (TJ/5,) which had been completed just one day before the event. These forms are clearly marked to be completed and submitted to Police 14 days before an event.

David also provided us with a guest list and an incident report (TJ/3) for the night in question. The incident report included details of 5 separate incidents of disorder including males forcing their way past security into the venue, fights on the dance floor and a male being knocked unconscious. None of these incidents were reported directly to Police by the venue staff or their security.

I then asked to view the CCTV. While they were finding the correct cameras it became evident that the system had only recorded 9 days of data and not the 31 days as required by CCTV condition 13 on the premises licence.

As the seriousness of the incident was becoming more apparent I requested that they provide the footage from all cameras for that evening. Due to the time it would have taken to copy the footage it was agreed that we would wait until the Monday to give them a reasonable period of time to download the images.

I continued to investigate the event and via a search on the internet found that the event was being advertised by Paravana Project, the same company that was promoting the event. Exhibit TJ/12 refers. They displayed a clear ticket price list and easy links for members of the public to purchase tickets right up to the night the event was taking place. They also offered discounts to anyone attending their other events at various locations. This provided evidence that the event was open to any member of the public and was not a private pre-booked event as conditioned on the premise licence. Condition 20 states that the provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private pre-booked event. It also appears that the event had been booked by the promoter 'Paravana Project' a further breach as detailed in condition 51 on the premises licence, 'No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises'.

On Tuesday 5th April 2016 I sent an email to Thomas O'Maoileoin requesting a number of assurances from the Management of Altitude while we continued our investigation.

They responded with the following:

1. *My client will not permit similar events on the 28th floor to run past midnight until this matter has been resolved*
2. *David Coley will not be involved with the operation of the premises*
3. *Tomas, whilst remaining DPS, will not be "in-charge" of any event*
4. *The DPS prior to Tomas left the employment of the company on 31st March*
5. *I understand the CCTV had been supplied*

In relation to our letter of 31 March I am pleased to confirm that

1. *Crime scene preservation training is taking place on 6th April*
2. *Award for Personal License Holders: for more staff to apply for Personal Licence will be held on site next week*
3. *Award in Responsible Alcohol Retailing: particularly for bar staff will be held on site next week*
4. *A review of the policies and procedures with the new head of security will take place with Adrian Studd next week.*

On Wednesday 6th April I received the CCTV footage provided by the venue which I exhibit as TJ/16 and TJ/17

I viewed all the footage provided and it soon became apparent that the incident was far more serious than described by the Managers at the time of the meeting.


The CCTV footage within the venue is of good quality and clearly shows a series of failings by the management.

The incident in the smoking area is not covered and there is no footage of this assault, however there is limited footage from the buildings CCTV that shows two males jumping over the barriers on the ground floor reception and security personnel are unable to stop them and they gain entry to the lift.

The venues CCTV shows the following:

At 02:52 Camera 1 shows a fight on the dance floor between two males, during which a member of security is present and watches the fight take place. He intervenes only once punches are thrown and with the assistance of others, ejects one of the males. Camera 9 shows the same Security officers being followed by a group into the corridor. There is disorder during this ejection, as it appeared they only had a limited number of security personnel to deal.

At 02:54 Camera 6 shows a group of 4 males standing outside the toilets in the corridor. There is no static security deployed in this area and no regular Security patrol to ensure this area is monitored. One of the males


is seen to show a knife to the rest of the group, which he had concealed in his waist band. It is clear by their facial expressions that some of the groups do not agree with him carrying the knife.

At 02:56 Camera 10 shows the male with the knife walk into the corridor, with his hand in his pocket; which we now know contained the knife. He stops and is confronted by another group of males. It is not clear what happens next but witnesses states the male pulls out the knife, which causes the group of males to respond by punching him to the ground. He is knocked unconscious and violently stamped on several times. He sustained injuries to his face, torso and a fractured leg.

Security personnel arrive and stop the fighting. The knife is picked up by Rosen, a member of the Security Team. He confirms this in his Security Report and also states he was told by David Coley not to call the Police; Exhibit TJ/7 refers.

At 02:57 Camera 9 shows a very aggressive male roaming around the venue, apparently looking for the group that knocked his friend unconscious. David Coley attempts to talk to the male but he is grabbed by the head before he backs away. The male then starts to fight with two other males and punches are thrown as they struggle near the bar. This fight continues and on Camera 7 a male in a black top is seen arming himself with a large bottle and striking another male hard on the head with it. Again there is no Security to deal with the incident and Management does not stop the event even though they witnessed the disorder.

At 02:59 on Camera 6 another male with a larger knife is seen chasing a large male in a white top. He chases him along the corridor and the disorder spills into the area where the male is still lying unconscious, from the first knife incident. The chase continues and female customers and staff can be seen barricading themselves into a room as the male with the knife runs past. A large knife is clearly seen in the hand of the suspect. At this point CCTV coverage is lost but a statement taken from a member of staff- the Operations Supervisor - OROS states that while she was hiding in the store room, two males ran in and barricaded themselves in making attempts to keep the door shut. The door was then forced open by two other males, smashing the glass window in the door, while forcing entry. Once inside one of the males who had forced entry, picked up a full bottle of Vodka, which he used to strike one of the males. He hit the male over the head with such force that the bottle smashed upon impact. The male victim fell to the floor and the two suspects ran out of the room grabbing another glass bottle on the way out.

At 03:14 Camera 8 shows a male covered in blood, with a head injury, walking around the venue with his friends. He is unchallenged by staff and no first aid is given.

At 03:15 Camera 10 shows the unconscious male still lying on the floor.

On the buildings CCTV the male with the head injury is captured leaving the venue unchallenged, via the fire exit/ service entrance to the rear of the building. A short time later, the male who was in possession of the large knife is also seen leaving via this route.

A blood trail down stairs from the 28th floor was later found by Police and suggesting an unknown victim has sustained serious injuries, possibly a stab wound due to the amount of blood found. In total three crime scenes were setup within the building.

The outside cameras then show a further fight where males arm themselves with traffic cones, as the male with the large knife chases them around a parked vehicle.

At 03:30 hours outside camera footage shows the extent of the Police resources required to regain control of this incident.


As well as the serous disorder, customers can be seen throughout the evening walking around and drinking from large bottles of Vodka and openly inhaling Nitrous Oxide contained in rubber party balloons, in full view of bar staff.

I exhibit a summarised CCTV log at TJ/2

Police have no record of any calls made by the premises Management, to report any of the crime and disorder that occurred that evening.

The evidence gained from watching the CCTV was so serious and revealed so many breaches of both the licence conditions and the licensing objectives, that I had no option but to submit a Premises Review application.

Throughout the initial investigation, we made several requests to speak with Mr. Suresh Abbas, who was the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) shown on the Premises Licence and we were lead to believe he was the DPS still in place prior to the application being submitted on 31st March 2016. This is evidenced in an email received from Thomas O'Maoileoin, Exhibit TJ/10 refers.

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Continuation of Statement of:

I managed to make contact with Suresh Abbas. He provided me with an email stating that he was no longer employed at Altitude. He stated by mutual agreement, he had been released from his duties as of 28th February 2016. Exhibit TJ/11 refers.

It appears that at the time of the event there was no DPS in place and that the Management of Altitude were fully aware of this.

The following breaches of Premises Licence conditions have been identified during this investigation:

Condition 13 - The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

Recordings were only being stored for a total of 9 days.

Condition 20 - The provision of licensable activities at all times shall only be to persons attending a private, pre-booked event. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.


Tickets were openly being sold on the Paravana website and Facebook to the general public. Tickets were advertised at various prices and could be purchased up until and including the day of the event.

Condition 21 - In respect of all individual events, the need for SIA security staff be risk assessed and a documentary copy of the assessment be retained for a minimum of 28 days for inspection by the Responsible Authorities.

The venue was unable to provide a dedicated security risk assessment to Police and Security numbers on the night were not sufficient to ensure the safety of customers and staff.

Condition 51 - No events booked by promoters shall be permitted to take place on the premises.

The event was being promoted and run by Paravana project that advertised online and were selling tickets for the event to members of the public. Paravana Project are a well-known company that organise and run events both in the UK and internationally.

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
Other concerns over the responsible running of the venue include:

- **Failure to call Police** - after several fights throughout the venue, the management failed to call Police. It was not until the male with the knife was knocked unconscious that security informed the building security who then called for assistance.
- **No 696 Risk Assessment Form submitted** – The venue has previously been advised by Police to submit a 696 for promoted events.
- **Security numbers were insufficient** and well below what we would expect for an event and customer capacity of this size.
- **No SIA licence badges displayed by Security**
- **Nitrous Oxide (legal high) was being openly used** and inhaled by customers in full view of bar staff which could be an unlawful activity and a risk to Public Safety.
- **Customers were walking around the venue drinking directly from large bottles** of Vodka and were not challenged by staff.
- **Management did not respond when advised by security that the event was out of control** and that there were not enough security present.
- **The fire exits and rear stairs were not managed by security** - this allowed customers to exit the venue via the service area. It is also possible that customers may have been able to enter via this route and in doing so would have avoided any checks by security.

Other Concerns

Incident Reports have been provided by security personnel who were working at the venue that evening.

- Door Supervisor Rosen Zehirov's report states David Cooley told him not to call the Police and Paravana organisers were allowing customers to enter without being searched.
- Door Supervisor Krasimir Pantev states he informed both David Coley and Tomas that the venue was over capacity as they had 640 customers inside and he wanted to close the entrance. David refused and later asked for one of the security to clear the customer capacity clickers.
- Door Supervisor Plamen Pantev also advised David to stop the event as it was out of control, but David refused.

- There are several reports that refer to David being advised to stop the event due to the amount of fights that were occurring. Each time David refused to stop the event.
- David Coley appears on CCTV to be wearing very casual clothing and had clearly chosen not to be identified by customers as someone managing the event. Some Security reports state David had appeared to be under the influence of alcohol and illegal substances.


Previous Engagement

On Monday 17th August 2015 Police attended Altitude and spoke with the DPS Phillip Hilbeck after a serious assault occurred at the venue during an event, when a male had been hit on the head with a bottle, sustaining a serious injury. During the meeting the following failings were identified:

- 1.No 696 risk assessment form submitted despite it being a promoted event. The organiser had requested their own security which should have highlighted an increased risk
2. The Security Team did not respond appropriately to the assault. The suspect was not detained and Police not called.
3. The CCTV was well below the minimum standard expected by Police.

An Action Plan was requested and the venue agreed to submit a 696 for all future promoted events and provide Crime Scene Management training to staff. They made the decision to change the existing Security company. Police advised that the new company should be ACS registered, (Approved Contractor Scheme). The current company Valid security are not ACS registered. They were also required to update the CCTV system to meet the minimum requirements by Police.

In summary, this is the most serious incident of crime and disorder I have dealt with during my time in Police Licensing. The large scale disorder that occurred at Altitude on Sunday 28th March resulted in at least four customers receiving serious injuries as a direct result of the Management's failing to adhere to the licence conditions. If the licence conditions had been adhered to, then the event would not have taken place, tickets would not have been sold openly to members of the public and a Security Risk Assessment would have identified the appropriate security numbers to use for an event of this nature.


The absence of a Designated Premises Supervisor and a lack of management of the venue, added to the escalating violence and disorder during the event. A total loss of control of the premises resulted.


Due to the serious nature of the incident and the fact that Police have engaged with the venue on a previous occasion due to similar failings, Police do not have any confidence in the Licensee.

The nature of this crime and disorder is so serious that it represents significant failings in upholding and promoting the Licensing Objectives. Therefore we feel the only option remaining, is full revocation of this Premises Licence; to ensure the prevention of crime and disorder. We feel that a full variation to add conditions to the existing premises licence would not be sufficient to address the concerns of police.

Since submitting the review application I have not heard from the premises operator or their legal representative and they have not sort further discussions with Police to provide us with sufficient assurances that there will not be a repetition of this type of incident.

Altitude 360 on the 29th Floor is operated by the same Licensee as Altitude 360 on the 28th Floor. Although they hold different Premises licenses they are intrinsically linked. The venues can trade individually or operate as one. When operating together they have a combined capacity of 600 as conditioned on the Premises Licence and share the same terminal hour and similar licence conditions. Our concern is that the 29th Floor could continue to be used for similar high risk events, for this reason we are also seeking joint revocation of both licences.

Background


I am a serving officer with the Metropolitan Police and am currently attached to the Westminster Professional Standards Unit. Throughout the policing year my duties also include the policing of Alcohol Licensing events which involve the supervision and policing of licensing related activity under the Licensing Act 2003. I have previously been employed as a Police Licensing Officer within the Clubs and Vice Operational Command Unit. My duties included the supervision of Liquor Licensed venues with 'Pan London' responsibility to assist other Boroughs to offer advice and provide assistance to address problematic premises. Other forces and Licensing Councils also made such requests and my specialist experience was used around the UK. I have also been employed as a Sergeant on a night time economy team dealing with alcohol fuel related disorder within Night-time economy premises within Westminster. I was the Officer in charge of the 2012 Olympic Licensing Response to Criminality in licensed premises across London. I feel that I am experienced in commenting on Licensing issues surrounding anti social behaviour linked with the night-time economy and venues engaged in Licensable activity.

Information

I make this statement in order to give my professional observations and concerns to the Police Licensing team following a visit to a Westminster Licensed Premises namely Altitude 360, 28th Floor Milbank Tower, 21-24 Milbank, SW1P 4QP.

On 29th March 2016 I accompanied Detective Emma Hammatt to Altitude as part of her enquiry following disorder that had occurred at the venue on the 26th and 27th March 2016.

I met two persons at the venue Tomas Skrina who introduced himself as the DPS and Karen Linforth who is the finance Director. Prior to meeting them at the venue on the 28th floor I had an opportunity to meet with the estate security of Milbank Tower. I observed CCTV footage of various incidents at the venue both in the Foyer leading upto the premises, in the car park outside and also in the venue itself.

The incidents included violence against security staff at the venue and a person seen chasing another outside using traffic cones to effect violence. Within the venue the CCTV is clear and shows groups of males assaulting each other and running through the venue causing concern and panic to other patrons.

Observations


Having spoken with the DPS and Director of the venue information was provided to enable Detective Hammatt to investigate the disorder. The following information was provided

- 8 Security were on for the event
- Approximately 550 Tickets had been pre sold
- The entry in the foyer of the Milbank Tower had searching/ entry via a rope area behind the reception desk. The patrons would then make their way to the lift lobby then upto the 29th. CCTV showed persons jumping the barriers adjacent to the lift lobby thereby gaining access. During this process an incident has taken place where venue security was assaulted when she tried to prevent the queue jump.
- The Building security commented that they witnessed this and that there was no security covering this area, the building security critique on the event security was in my opinion correct. An easy and simple fix would be to have the search area at the point of entry at the lifts and this would remove the risk of prohibited articles getting in.
- The CCTV was unable to be fully accessed. Standard conditions would be listed on the premises license indicating that CCTV should be made available by Police an authorised person on request for the 31 days following the event date. The CCTV was unable to be made available in full due to the DPS stating that they were on separate severs.
- Patrons concerned in the event were able to exit via 'Back' stairs and lift into the loading bay during which no apparent control over entry and exit (No SIA staff with clickers etc). Again an issue over keeping a record of the capacity in the venue and conflicts with conditions of licence.

The director asked me about prevention of drugs at event

- I explained that the brief for the venue security / DPS would be to maintain vigilance throughout event to ensure persons who were intoxicated were removed and any evidence of drug misuse could be challenged.
- I asked if Wands were in use or available and was told no, I explained that this should have been factored into the risk assessment and at least have them available

After viewing the CCTV it appeared that the crowd has more control of the event especially during the disorder. Given the size of the venue and its location I would have expected more staff to be factored into the risk. The estate security were the ones on scene and dealing with the outbreak of disorder and have been able to give a salient account and parallel this with CCTV.



During the outbreak of the disorder in the venue I saw on the CCTV two security staff who appeared to follow and watch the disorder but no proactive approach appeared to have been taken.

On the estate CCTV I saw a male re-entering the venue with what appeared to be a head injury and blood running down his back. He did not appear to be challenged by the event security and if he were connected to disorder allowing him back into the venue placed staff and the public at risk.

Westminster premises are expected to observe the Licensing Objectives and parallel an appropriate risk assessment for events to ensure that they are met. On this occasion I had concerns on my limited information that the venue failed to prevent crime and disorder and also to protect public safety.

While it was not my intention to conduct licensing observations during this visit, my concerns were such that I made them available immediately to the licensing team who subsequently conducted a full visit to the premises the following day.



I am the above named person and reside at the address overleaf. I am employed by Altitude 360 which is situated on the 28th and 29th floors of MILBANK TOWER, LONDON SW1P 4QP. I have worked with the company for nine months and hold the position of Operations Supervisor.

My role involves briefing staff members, delegating tasks and ensuring that all events held at the venue run smoothly.

On Sunday 27th March 2016 I attended work. On this day the venue was hosting a promoter event by the 'PARAVANA PROJECT'.

This event was being managed by our Sales Director David COOLEY. I attended work at 1900 hours and at this time the event had already started and there were already customers in the venue.

I spent the majority of my time walking around the venue ensuring my team were doing their jobs. I had approximately 6 staff on the floor with me. The evening was running smoothly and was

without incident up until approximately 2300 hours. At this time I was in the corridor when I saw a number of people running into the venue's bar area. It was dark and there were too many people so I cannot remember who was involved. I called security that were stationed on the ground floor and asked them to come up as I believed there was a fight. A few minutes later I saw a male being ejected by two security personnel. One of the members of security told me he had been punched while breaking up the fight. I do not know the name of this member of security and am not aware that the police were called for this incident. I then continued with my work.

At approximately 0255 hours I was in the corridor area when I heard another outbreak of disorder. I went back into the bar area and the fighting had stopped however there were bottles and cups all over the floor. I instructed my staff to assist me in cleaning up. After I had finished I went to the other side of the venue to check everything was ok. While over the other side I saw a several males gathering and thought they were



getting ready to start another fight. I cannot describe any of these males. I then ran to my manager and told him to go and check, just before this a member of Security called Chris approached me and my manager Thomas and told us that we need to stop the event and should turn off the music. We both agreed but it was not our decision. I was aware that Thomas had spoken to David about the issues, but the final decision was David's and the event continued.

I then went to the store room where I stayed for approximately 10 minutes. I was also with another member of my staff. All of a sudden a girl came running into the room. She was very distressed and crying. I asked if she was with them - meaning someone else. She replied "I NEED TO HIDE". She then hid under the table and the other member of my staff also hid. At this point two black males ran into the room. One was wearing a white T-shirt and one was wearing a grey T-shirt. The male wearing the white T-shirt closed the door and held it shut as if to block anyone else entering. At that point someone on

the other side of the door started to hit the door with windows in the door with force. He was trying to force his way in. He hit the windows so many times that it smashed. The black male in the white T-shirt was unable to hold the door and I saw one black male force his way in. I don't remember what the male was wearing. I am unable to describe any of the black males in detail. The male who forced his way in wanted to attack the other two males and I saw him looking around for something to grab. I saw him grab a bottle off one of the tables, the bottle was glass and full of alcohol. It was a standard size bottle (approx 70cl). The male in the white shirt was shouting "IT'S NOT US, IT'S NOT US" and was not being aggressive. At that point the male with the bottle hit the male in the white shirt over the head with the bottle. The force of the blow caused the bottle to smash on the male's head and knocked the male to the ground. He got up quickly, ~~and ran out~~, ~~and~~ ~~he~~ ~~grabbed~~ ~~two~~ ~~glass~~ ~~bottles~~ ~~himself~~. The male with the bottle ran out grabbing to glass bottles on the way. The male

in the grey t-shirt picked up a coat rack and walked out the room along with the male who was hit.

While I was trapped in the room with the male trying to force entry I was scared and found the whole incident very distressing.

Although I was worried about my own safety, I was more worried about members of my staff. I have never seen an incident this violent before and hope I never see something like this again.

The incident in the store room lasted for approximately 5 minutes and at all times I had a good and unobstructed view of what was happening. The lights were on and my visibility was good.

I have not seen any of these males before and would not recognise them again.

Although I am happy to assist police I do not want to attend court.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public.
11. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
12. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises.
13. A record shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded for each event and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer on request.
14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
15. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
16. The sale of alcohol shall be restricted to pre-booked functions, corporate events and conferences and members of the Altitude Club, subject to the rules of the club as agreed from time to time by the Metropolitan police. Functions are to be booked no less than 24 hours in advance. Details of the type of function, the host, and the number of guests shall be kept for a minimum of 14 working days after the function. Details shall be made available to all relevant authorities when requested.
17. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
18. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
19. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents in the vicinity.
20. No drinks shall be consumed outside the premises nor glasses/bottles removed from the premises by patrons when leaving.

21. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).
22. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
23. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - smoke machines and fog generators
 - pyrotechnics including fire works
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - real flame.
 - strobe lighting.
24. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.

NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
25. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
26. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
27. All exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
28. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
29. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
30. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.
31. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
 - Any emergency lighting battery or system
 - Any electrical installation
 - Any emergency warning system
32. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

33. No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 2300 hours and 0800 hours.
34. There shall be no deliveries between 2300 and 0800 hours.
35. Patrons wishing to smoke only do so in the designated Millbank Tower smoking area to the rear of the building, or on the terrace as shown on the attached plan.
36. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
37. All patrons and staff waiting for a taxi shall be encouraged to do so within the premises.
38. The licence holder will enter into an arrangement with a hackney carriage or private carriage firm to provide transport for patrons when requested.
39. The number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) at the premises shall not exceed:

40. Before 10.00 am the sale of alcohol on the premises shall be ancillary to a table meal and for consumption ancillary to that meal.
41. Before 10.00 am the sale of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress service.
42. A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service, Premises Management so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured by key or password to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental Health Service and access shall only be by persons authorised by the Premises Licence holder. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Environmental Health Service. All sound generating equipment shall be used through the sound limiter device approved by the Environmental Health Service.

Incident Reports

Paravana: post event report

Event date: Sunday March 27th 2016

Introduction

The Paravana event was held in Skyloft on the 28th Floor of Millbank Tower with Reels used for entry and egress, the smoking area, licensed bar and cloakroom.

The planned event as per the event sheet was for client entry to start at 14.00 onwards with bar close at 03.00 and venue clear by 04.00

550 guests booked and the total number throughput during the whole event over all spaces was between 620-670 (it is accepted that smokers are double counted).

Eight experienced security guards were booked from our external company Valid as below, timed to be in place prior to guest arrival through to venue clear;

1x female from 13.30-03.00

2x male from 13.30-03.00

1x female from 19.00- 05.00

4x male from 19.00- 05.00

We also had our own two trained personnel working bringing a security presence of ten if required however acting in operational roles on the night

The Event

The main building lobby doors were locked and roped off. All guests entered through Reels having the opportunity to leave clothing and bags in the cloakroom. Guests then flowed through to the main lobby. The area with rope access to the turnstiles was used and in order to keep all of our guests safe and secure the male and female security officer checked all bags and people to ensure no alcohol, weapons or illegal substances entered the venue.

Small numbers of guests arrived from 14.00 as planned however it was from 16.30 to 21.00 when the main flow of guests occurred and at 21.00 550 guests were present on the 28th floor. A double clicking system was in place to count overall entry and 28th floor entry. By 23.00 approx 550 guests were on 28th floor and approx 50 in Reels and the smoking area. It is accepted that guests came in and out to smoke so our internal total figure of 670 includes double counting (clicking).

The event was largely peaceful however four incidents took place and these are detailed below.

Incidents

During the course of interviewing staff on property these are the incidents I have been informed of.

Incident 1) Circa 23.00 a guest smoking outside Reels got into an altercation with hooded youths passing the building. One hooded youth then approached the guest, hit him in the face and took his Tag Hauer watch. The guest called the police themselves to report the theft. After that the guest returned to the party with David Coley as he did not want his whole night to be ruined.

Incident 2) Circa midnight, a group jumped the barriers in the lobby and were challenged by the security guards, they pushed the female guard. I have not had access to the building security cctv footage and would need to see if this is the group involved in the later incident. Building security called the police. Ground floor security were not able to stop the group and they got to the 28th floor. Security on 28th escorted the group down again

Incident 3) Circa 01.00 28th floor, next to the bar in the corner, a scuffle between two males. Music was lowered and lights lit to allow security to escort both males from the premises.

At 01.00 Security Supervisor Kris, Operational Manager Tomas and Commercial Director David went into Belgravia to discuss the evening, the current risk and mutually agreed to keep the event running and to close if any further violence breaks out on the 28th floor.

At circa 02.00 a skirmish, again outside in the smoking area between four males was broken up and they were refused re entry to the venue.

Incident 4) Circa 3am, a group of 5/6 males began fighting. He was knocked unconscious in the corridor behind the bar by one of the men he had threatened. His friend was enraged and decided on revenge. He went looking through the floor to find the people who had hurt his friend. Two males, unrelated to the incident, had to barricade themselves into the Belgravia area on the 28th floor. The male broke the window and got into Belgravia. He threw a glass bottle of water, a bottle of vodka and a bottle of syrup at the men he suspected of hurting his friend. He calmed down when he was convinced they were not the men responsible. He then disappeared back into the crowd. The lights were turned up and the music stopped. At this time the decision to close the event was made. This man and a second group exited the building via the fire escape stairs.

The unconscious male received first aid from security and an ambulance and the police were called.

Security had started to clear the venue however when the police arrived they stopped this and declared the back corridor a crime scene. They began taking witness statements from those still in the venue.

The crime scene remained sealed until the afternoon of 28th March with two officers remaining on scene until the SOCO's had collected all evidence. During this time we did not have access to clean the bar or to cash up after the event.

The police are collecting statements from all team members and have also asked for a full guest list. They are returning on Monday April 4th to collect cctv footage from us. We have found the group on cctv and will now map back to the other camera's. The police took the bar manager's shirt as that had blood on from the incident in Belgravia.

Recommendations for the future:

Security:

- The body searches were done manually and the security company did not bring any wands with them. As a venue we'd expect the company to have the equipment or make it known to us they did not so that we could provide as this is faster and more accurate for detecting metal weapons
- Issues with comms were not highlighted to the venue in any post event update nor on the night so a comms check will form part of the on arrival requirements
- The initial search point on the left of the lobby, meant that the right side of the lobby barriers were open for people to jump the barriers and have access to the lifts to the 28th floor, which did occur. Building security, in order to stop the turnstile barriers being damaged also let people go through without passing through the search point. At that point a secondary manned station at the lifts should have been recommended with guards deployed from other areas to prevent direct access.
- One other solution would be to have a secondary barrier so that anyone jumping the turnstile could not proceed to the lifts and that would mean that all guests would have to pass the search point.
- For the venue to look at increased cover so that the smoking area has a security presence as well as the dispense bar in Belgravia.

Around 11 o'clock at the evening we had a fight which we managed to deal with. Straight after I went to inform the manager (Tomas) and sells manager (David) that we were over capacity and in total we had 640 people , so we had to close the entrance for any other arrivals, but David refused that and later asked one of the security guards to clear the clickers.

Later around 12 o'clock we had second fight in the lift lobby area, smoking area and on the 28th floor. We sort that out, but the building security called the police . I stopped the music at the party and asked for the party to be stopped , but the managers refused.

Around 1am we had accident again on the 28th floor, I stopped the music and calmed the situation. Me and the venue manager (Tomas) wanted to stop the party but the sells manager did not allowed us to do that, but kept continuously letting people in without being through search and said that he was there to work. I took out the man , who was threatened at this accident, through the staff lifts area.

After I went to Reelas caffe and stopped an other fight.

After I went to upstairs again , I found Rosen and a man on the floor unconscious. (Rosen has to write report for that, because he is the main witness)


During the whole night we did not have good connection on the equipment provided from the company for communication between the security guards.

It was not working properly, or not working at all, which means all the guards were under threat and the costumes as well.

Overall I think if we stopped the party on time nothing of this would happen , or if they had booked more security guards. They clearly know that now, as they asked for the clickers to be cleared.

Another thought over everything that happened and the 640 people we had, I think all guards did good job and their best.

Hi there,
Here is my report about the night on 27th March, Altitude

All the time I was on the ground floor, doing bag and body search, but I still witnessed few problematic situations.

Around 12 o'clock few guys started jumping over the barriers and started to get aggressive after me telling them not to , and leave , started to push me away at the lifts area and wanted to go back to the party, so they did through me. At that time the building security called the police. I went up with the other lift and told the other guards to take them out.

Next fight I witnessed was at Reeles Bar, between 4 men, at around 2am. Our supervisor and myself stopped the men and sent them away of the building. After that around 3am I was told by phone message to call police and ambulance immediately to go on the 28th floor.

I need to mention that through the whole night David let groups of people to go to the party, without letting us to search them.

That is all I was witnessing that night.

Hello Will,

On Sunday I arrived at Altitude at 7pm and they assigned me to the lift lobby and I was watching the fire exit. I was there until approximately 11pm. During this time I noticed that people kept coming and coming and that we weren't enough security. It was hard to cope for the eight security guys because we started getting a lot of calls from the staff, that people are going inside the kitchen.


After 11pm I was assigned to the entrance to check wristbands etc. Around this time there was a fight near the entrance between four people. One of the guys lifted a chair and tried to hit someone in the head, but I managed to grab the chair in the last moment and pulled it from his hands. After this they went outside on streets but once they were outside I didn't follow them.

Around 2am the police showed up and asked me where did the stabbing take place. As I didn't have earplugs to my walkie talkie and the place was very noisy it was hard to communicate with my colleagues, so I wasn't aware of this incident at the time. The police closed all the doors and started investigating. This went on for about an hour and then we started letting people leave. Everybody left around 5am, but we had to stay for an extra hour.

Hello there,

It is Zara here, Chris said I have to write observation over the night on 27th March at Altitude, so I do.

The first conflict I witnessed was around 11:30 pm, when a man was causing troubles to other people at the party and Plamen took him out of the building.

At around 1 o'clock I went to the ground floor, and at the lobby lift area I saw few men at the opposite lift trying to get into the lift to the party through Zhanel and Penko. They were aggressive against my colleagues and seemed irrational.

Later after 2:30 am few aggressive men were punching another man, and the fight was brought from the hall to the lifts area. Chris came to the place and took the beaten guy away through the lifts.

At the same moment another fight happened in the corridor next to the lifts. I saw an aggressive crowd and a man on the floor. I ran to call my colleagues, Rosen was the one near me. We both went near to the fight and we saw the man on the floor with a knife in his hand and unconscious on the floor. Seemed like the people involved in the last two fights were in two groups, having conflicts between them, and the biggest aggression causing the massive fight was unlocked by the man with the knife. The knife was taken off the man by Rosen.

The men, part of our security team came on the 26th floor and helped to turn away the crowd and the aggressive people around the injured man.

At that moment a call was made to the police and an ambulance.

The party was stopped and I started to orientate people to the lifts and exits.


One last thing I need to mention is how bad was the communicative equipment we were given, so we had to use our mobile phones to forward messages and ask for help.

I should also mention that during one of my patrols around the venue I found David, the sales manager with few female customers in the disabled toilet, which was out of use during the whole night. Also later at the night when the party was over the police came, David asked me to clear the officers, which I did not do, because I did not want to get involved in his play.

Then we had another call , was a IC3 male very drunk or on drogues felt like peeing on the table of the costumers an pushing them.

We take him out street away !He was very aggressive !

Then around 00:30 h. Was another fight be twin IC1 male and IC3 male ! We try to calm them , wasn't easy so we need to take one of them out and send him home lwas the IC1 male , his friends help us !

In the mean time music was of and we had a word whit management of Milbank to stop the party !But they didn't won't to do it then we carry on with our duties !Was ok for a while,then we have call again that is the massive fight be twin may be 10 IC3 male punching each Oder with a bottles !We try to stop them carefully ,wasn't possible ,they was mad !Then I see the boy being on the floor, his head was cover of blood !

His friend was around him and try to help , they didn't let us close to help !

We call the ambulance and police and stops the music and obviously party was over ,management ask us . to clear the venue !

Police arrived very fast and after them ambulance !



Firstly I would like to say that this party was really difficult to be controlled especially because obviously the organizer did not booked enough security for the amount of people that they expected.

They obviously knew that they will have that much people because everything was pre - booked with tickets.

It was impossible for eight security officers to deal with at least 800 people could be more.

So we started at 1.30 pm on Sunday 27th March 2016 with three of us on the entrance and floor .

At 7 pm another 5 security officers came to support us for the party .

Myself and another security were booked till 2 pm which was a bit strange when you see all this people for the party.

Anyway everything was good till about 9 pm when I was on the lifts to make sure there are no people with glasses going out. I heard people saying call Security and I went inside with my colleague to check .

Group of about five to then people were fighting each other and I went between them to try calm them down .Other security officers came as well and we managed to stop the argue and got one of the aggressors out of the venue.

In about 20 to 30 minutes later something happened again and one of my colleague who was patrolling inside called me to go inside because of another fight.

I went inside and two boys were fighting each other and other people trying to support them .

I called other officers to support me and in that time i was punched in the face with the words "do not make your night difficult leave us dealing each other" - that said one of the boys in the fight .

Anyway Cris, Penko and Rosen came to support me and we got it under control.

After that happened I went and found the venue manager named David.

Obviously he was enjoying his self with two girls and alcohol (nothing wrong with that if is not in charge) and I said to him " we have to stop that before something worse happen" and he answer to me " we work in here mate" I said " OK, It's up to you but the situation is going out of control".

So in another 20 to 30 minutes we had fight again and a boy pissing in the middle of the venue obviously drunk and probably used something different than alcohol!

I went there and said "could you come outside with me", then he got aggressive . Penkocame to support me and I had no choice I went behind him and grabbed him around his arms so he could not move and we took him out .


There was a group of boys which were trying to control the rest of people and help us because they wanted to enjoy the party not paying for fights and no music.

That became out of control and me, Cris, Penko and friends of the white boy were trying to get him outside but the rest of the other group were coming to fight. Lucky we had other group of people helped us and stopped the IC3 group to stay inside while we took the white boy outside .

After that happened we thought everything is going to be OK and it was for about an hour and something .

I went for a break on the ground floor area and stayed in there for 30 minutes. After the break I stand on the entrance checking bags and searching people . In one point I heard Tomas(one of the managers) on the radio saying security call ambulance about three times . I said to the reception security to call ambulance and run to the lifts to get to 28th floor.

When I got to 28th floor I saw blood all around the lifts and went to the corridor on the right where was a body on the floor and few people on top of him asking whats happened . Rosen was in there trying to get people away of him and I said to them ambulance is coming and went inside to check the situation.

After all that happened Cris said to me to go downstairs because police is coming and I need to meet them and get them to 28th floor + ambulance. I went downstairs and waited till police came with ambulance and sent them upstairs. People were taken downstairs and on 28th floor left only police with ambulance trying to help the person on the floor.

All I can say after that happened is very bad organization and we were supposed to be at least 20 people security and anyway I think that party was supposed to be shut down when the second fight happened. I know that they would like to earn money but on first place is the safety of the people and stuff before everything!

Rosen Zehirov - Statement

Started smoothly, what I saw loads of big lads coming in 8 or 10 groups, most people are prepaid.
190 - 200 people in venue at 19:00

23:00 – fist fight 28th floor, bottle thrown (belvedere vodka 3l) ic3 male. Male was running away, couldn't get hold of man, finally music stops they leave, him and one of his friend, threw fire ventilator – left. I ask David Coley are we going to continue he say yes.

00:00 – Fight in smoking area, female altitude staff member tells me there is a fight, when I arrive the fight has stopped but arguing, I try and find out what happens then one guy punches someone. These people suspected no payers, female altitude staff tells me to have two people in smoking area but this is impossible with short staff. Police called, asked me who was involved

01:00 – Previously ejected persons enter building, run through building, push female security officer to floor.

We have 3 radios for 8 security and no connection, we communicate with our mobiles most of the night

Multiple skirmishes.

8-10 ic3 at tables next to each other. Seems aggressive environment with chance of fights

02:00 – I went upstairs I hear before I went to corridor ' get the knife' I saw a guy on his knees, I tried to take the knife from the other guy, they hold the guy down and punch and kick him. At this point I try to focus on the knife, I took the guys knife from him. 2 or 3 guys were kicking guy on the ground, he was unconscious, I gave him first aid. We wait til police came. His friends are running around looking for the people that did it. We called ambulance. It was total carnage. People were walking around with bottles hitting people whoever they saw. In the club I used to work 200 capacity, 14 security officers.

End of night - People trying to smash down bar to get alcohol.

640 people in venue.

3 times there was a fight and we stopped the music, each time it was started again.

I told Altitude manager David Coley, we need to get people down through the fire exit, he refused, by getting people out through the lift, clashes started again, bottles thrown.

David Coley, told me not to call the police. He was completely drunk and drugged up, he tried to give me thumbs up and I said no, this is not good enough.

No radio, no form of communication and too few security. Paravana organisers saying people can come in after doors closed without needing to be searched. Security undermined because organisers know some customers.

I could tell from midnight we lost control, troublemakers could see that we are outnumbered and did not listen to us.

Daniel Kokutev - Statement

I start at 7pm, I was told by supervisor to patrol and this is what I did, over the course of the night I got in to break up many fights, I was constantly working under the orders of my more experienced security officers who told me what to do and when.

My radio did not work so I had to use mobile phone. I assist police and ambulance when they arrived

Apologies for sending it generically to all CW - Licensing

I attended the above CAD as it came out as a large fight. Due to the injured male being on the 28th myself and my operator (attachment from CW) remained in the foyer, when 1628CW asked that patrons be kept inside the premises in case the suspects were still present. There were NO door staff in evidence so I locked the door as it was just a twist knob, then went to the bar staff who pointed out a male stood off to the side. He had no ID visible I went over to speak to the male who clearly spoke very little English and asked why he was not actually on the door where he should be and asked him to come help us as by now there was a hostile crowd of about 40-50 trying to leave. He walked to the door saw it was locked and then wandered off never to be seen again.

Thankfully your impact team arrived a short time later and were able to help calm and then disperse the crowd in a controlled manner.

I don't know if you have any control over door staff (sorry) If you do the people working at this venue need a few words of advice.

There was a witness to the GBH who said they had earlier spoken to the door staff warning them over the behaviour of the group concerned in the assault but had not paid any attention and again had just disappeared

Good to catch up with you, as discussed I conducted a visit to Altitude today with DC Emma Hammatt who is the IO for the jobs over the weekend.

Observations

- 8 Security were on for the event
- Approx 550 Tickets had been pre sold
- The entry in the foyer of the Milbank Tower had searching/ entry via a rope area behind the reception desk. The patrons would then make their way to the lift lobby then upto the 29th. CCTV showed persons jumping the barriers adjacent to the lift lobby thereby gaining access. During this process an incident has taken place where venue security was assaulted when she tried to prevent the queue jump.
- The Building security commented today that they witnessed this and that there was no security covering this area, the building security critique on the event security was in my opinion correct. An easy and simple fix would be to have the search area at the point of entry at the lifts and this would remove the risk of prohibited articles getting in.
- The CCTV was unable to be fully accessed.... This is against their conditions
- Patrons concerned in the event were able to exit via 'Back' stairs and lift into the loading bay during which no apparent control over entry and exit (No SIA staff with clickers etc). Again an issue over keeping a record of the capacity in the venue and conflicts with conditions of licence.

I was asked about prevention of drugs at event

- I explained that the brief for the venue security / DPS would be to maintain vigilance throughout event to ensure persons who were intoxicated were removed and any evidence of drug misuse could be challenged.
- I asked if Wands were in use or available and was told no.... I explained that this should have been factored into the RA and at least have them available

After viewing the CCTV it appeared that the crowd has more control of the event especially during the disorder. Given the size of the venue and it's location I would have expected more staff to be factored into the risk. The estate security were the ones on scene and dealing with the outbreak of disorder and have been able to give a salient account and parallel this with CCTV.

This was by no means a full licensing visit but my professional observations pre your visit tomorrow. Emma will have the CCTV etc in due course if you wish to later liaise.



In addition to this can we also have the following footage:

1. The incident involving the guest in the smoking area where he is punched and robbed of his watch. This occurs at approximately 2300 hours. The footage may have been captured by the Buildings CCTV rather than the venues.
2. Footage of the reception area (Buildings CCTV) where a number of males enter and jump the barriers pushing past security, this occurred just after midnight.
3. Footage of the fight outside of the premises (Building CCTV) where a number of males pick up cones to fight each other, this occurred approximately 0315.

We write further to our meeting at the above premises with you in relation to incidents that took place on 27 March.

We confirm that when we met our clients were able to provide you with a copy of the guest list, incident report, 696 risk assessment form, temporary event notice confirmation and viewing facilities for the relevant CCTV footage.

At our meeting various matters were raised. Further to this we confirm that these have been addressed as follows:

1. 696 risk assessment forms will be completed at least 14 days prior to an event taking place. Upon completion they will be emailed to you.
2. A risk assessment dealing specifically with the prevention of crime and disorder will be completed at least 14 days prior to an event taking place. Upon completion they will be emailed to you.
3. The premises current security company, Valid Security Services Ltd will no longer be contracted by our clients to provide any services for any future events at any of their venues in Millbank Tower.
4. CCTV footage will be downloaded and sent to you. As requested this will be from 2.30 am until 3.30 am on 28 March.
5. A list detailing all of the guests that were present at the event will be sent to you.

6. Management procedures for both inside and outside the premises will be reviewed. On completion any relevant policy/procedure documents will be forwarded to you. This review will be under the direction of former Chief Inspector Adrian Studd (retired).
7. All duty managers will become personal licence holders and all permanent staff will undergo relevant licensing training on site. This will be undertaken by David Rowberry who is a registered trainer with the British Institute of Innkeepers.
8. Permanent staff will be trained or re-trained in Crime Scene Preservation, Alcohol Awareness and Drug Awareness. This will be undertaken by former Inspector Graeme Ironside (retired) assisted by Peter Spindler who has recently retired as Commander and Head of the Specialist Crime Unit for the Metropolitan Police Service.
9. The Designated Premises Supervisor is being changed to Tomas Skrina (Personal Licence No: [REDACTED] issued by London Borough of Waltham Forest).

Our client confirms that they will continue to work in partnership with yourselves to promote the licensing objectives and that as previously discussed if they have any queries in relation to any future events they will notify you immediately.

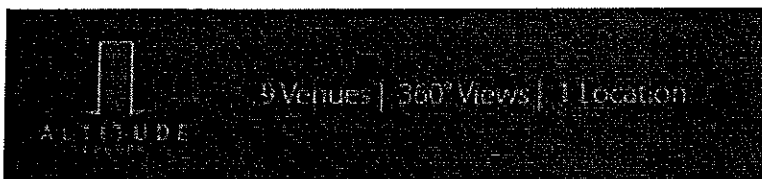



Re: Police Licensing Team visit to Altitude on 17/08/2015

On Monday 17th August Paul Hoppe and I visited you to make enquiries regarding an assault that occurred on your premises at about 3.20 am on Sunday 16th August 2015. A male who had attended your venue, alleged he had been assaulted by a group of males and had received head injuries after being hit on the head with a bottle.

It was good to meet with you and your assistant Charlotte Houlihan and discuss the incident in more detail. You were able to provide us with the guest list, incident report and limited CCTV for the event. During our meeting we discussed the incident and identified the following failings:

- The way events are booked and risk assessments not carried out, particularly for this event. The fact the organiser requested their own security should have highlighted an increased risk, more questions should have been asked of the organiser, a 696 risk assessment form completed and submitted to police.
- The Security team did not respond correctly. The minimum requirement we would have expected, is for the suspect to be detained, police called and a crime scene identified and preserved. Post incident we would expect an incident report to be completed by a member of the Security team detailing what action was taken and why.
- The CCTV system was below our minimum requirements as per condition 10 on your licence. We would expect all cameras installed to be working and if any faults arise, these should be recorded in the incident log as per condition 15, and then rectified as soon as possible.

We believe the incident was poorly managed. In order to reassure us that in future you intend to fully adhere to the licensing objectives, I would like you to provide me with an action plan detailing what changes shall be implemented to prevent similar incidents occurring again.

The CCTV system shall be brought up to the required standard immediately. The camera above the DJ box should be repaired or replaced. I would also request that you consider providing additional coverage, as there are several areas not covered by the surveillance system.

We want to work in partnership with you to promote the licensing objectives and so If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me. I must warn you that should you fail to heed Police recommendations and you experience further incidents of crime and disorder on your premises, you will leave us no option but to take enforcement action.

Police Licensing Team Visit to Altitude on 17 August 2015

We write further to your letter dated 18 August in relation to the above premises and our subsequent telephone conversations. As you are aware we act for the owners and operators of Altitude.

We are pleased that you were able to confirm that when you met with our clients they provided you with a guest list, incident report and CCTV of the event. We understand that during your meeting various matters were raised. We confirm that following your meeting these have been addressed as follows:

1. The way events are booked has been amended so that all bookings must be confirmed at least three months in advance and the deposit required has been increased from 10 to 25%. No outside security for any event will be permitted unless specifically sanctioned by you. A 696 Risk Assessment form will be completed for all future events.
2. Following your concerns about the security team our clients have changed their security company to Valid Security Services Ltd. They are ACS registered and their contract commenced on Friday 28 August 2015. All relevant members of staff will be trained in "crime scene preservation" with an approved course provider. The course date will be provided to you as soon as it becomes available.
3. The CCTV system is in the process of being upgraded and in this regard a further 22 extra cameras have been ordered. These will be installed by the end of September. As suggested a new camera has been installed in the DJ box.

Our clients confirm that they will continue to work in partnership with yourselves to promote the licensing objectives and that as previously discussed if they have any queries in relation to any future events they will notify you immediately.

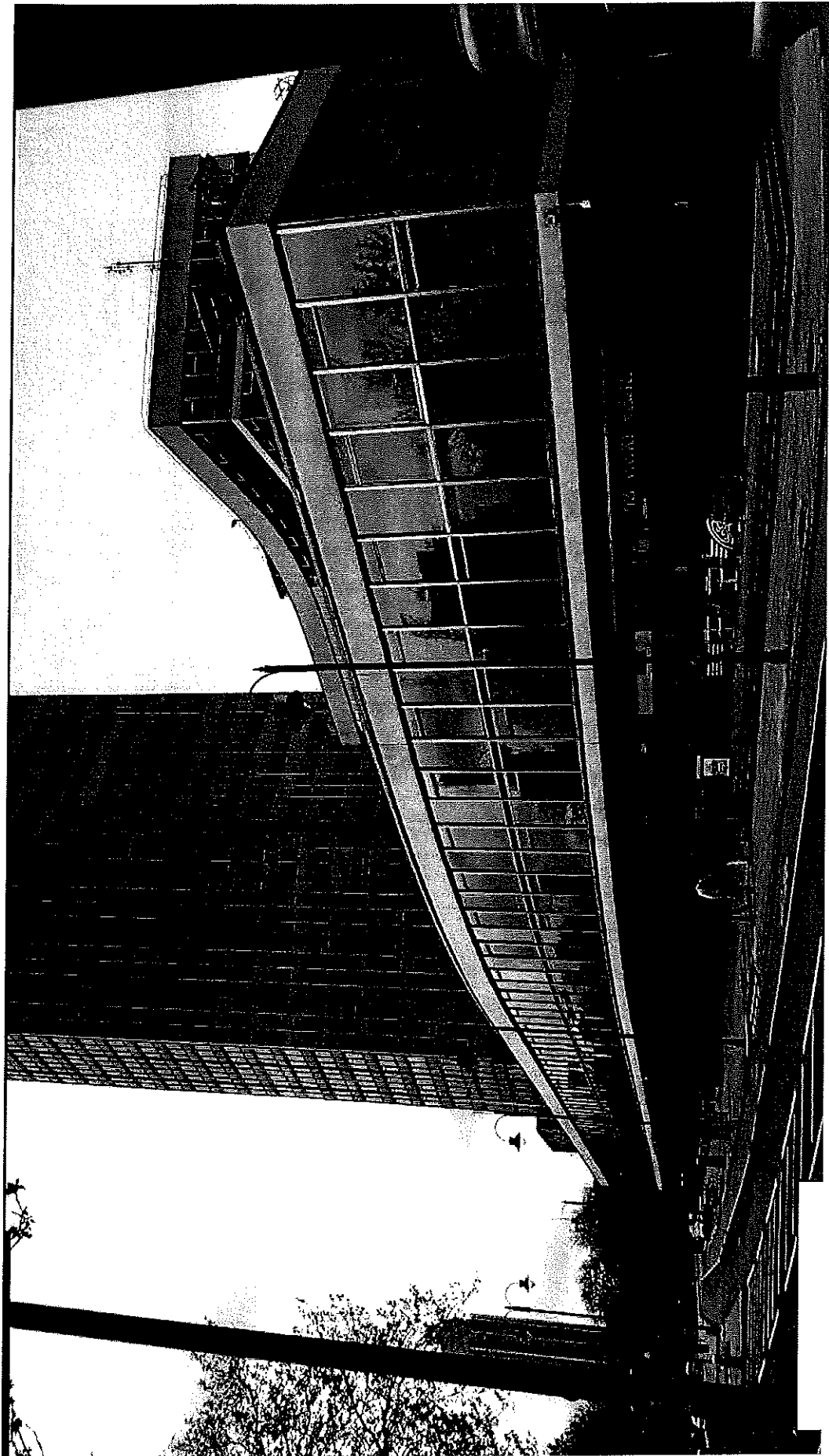

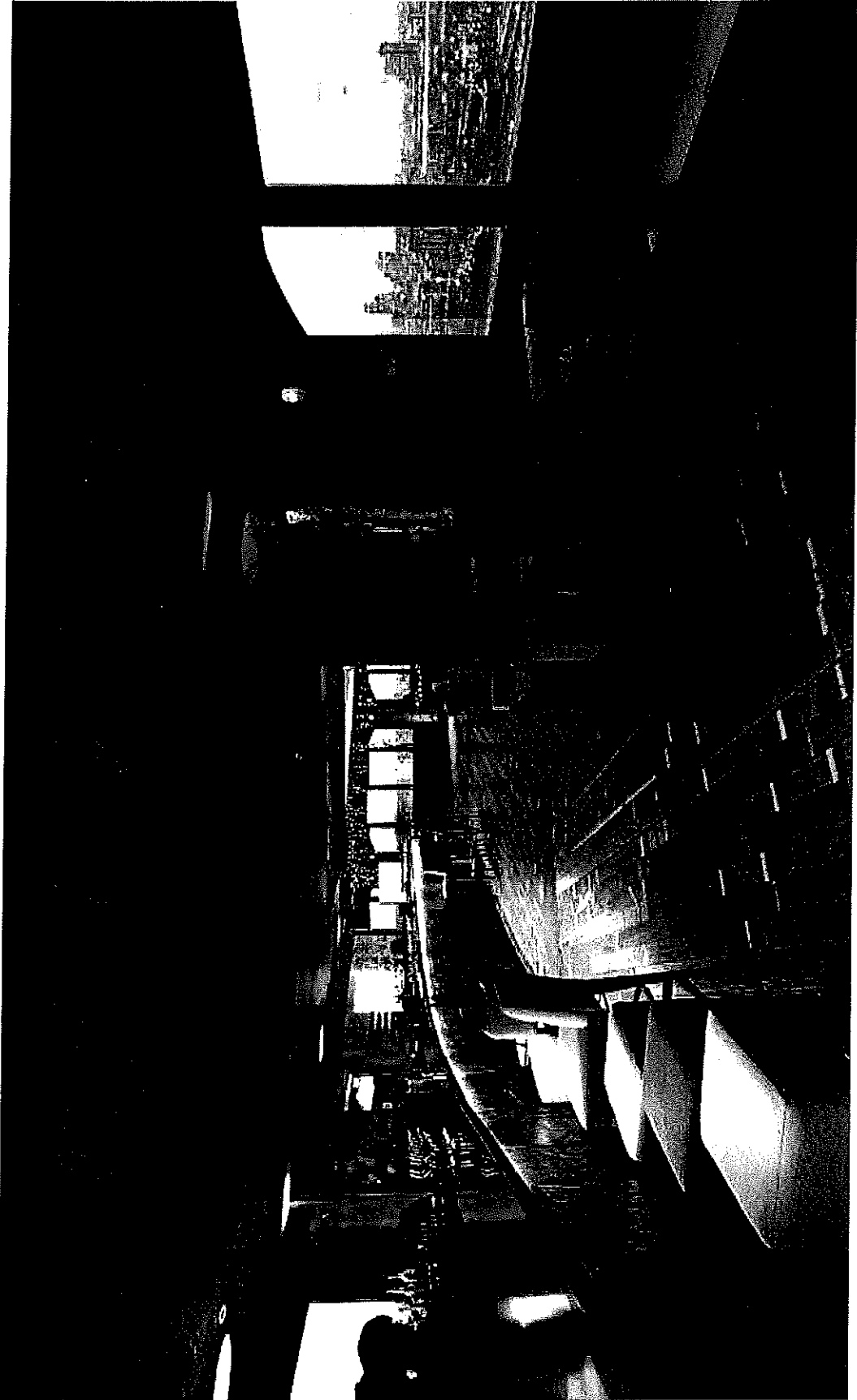

The Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974
Licensing Act 2003

As you may be aware, there have been a number of examples recently of licensed premises supplying, or permitting the supply of, Nitrous Oxide (also known as laughing gas, Nos or hippy crack) for customers to inhale. Typically the Nitrous Oxide is contained in a small cylinder which is then used to fill a balloon from which the gas is inhaled. We are aware that not all duty holders appreciate that this activity is illegal and I am therefore writing to all relevant venues in the authority's jurisdiction to clarify the legal position regarding the supply of Nitrous Oxide.

Nitrous Oxide is a pharmacy only medicine when prepared for inhalation and may only be supplied in this form by a registered pharmacist on the premises of a registered pharmacy. This is the case even where the Nitrous Oxide has been originally supplied for some other purpose (e.g. whipping cream).

The act of supplying Nitrous Oxide for the purpose of inhalation makes it a medicinal product; anyone other than a registered pharmacist supplying Nitrous Oxide for the purposes of inhalation on your premises is committing the offence under Section 52 of the Medicines Act 1968.

Any duty holder at your premises who allows Nitrous Oxide to be supplied in the circumstances described above commits the offence of aiding and abetting an offence under s.52 of the Medicines Act 1968. These offences carry a maximum sentence of two years in prison and/or an unlimited fine.

In addition there are genuine health risks attached to the use of Nitrous Oxide, both directly resulting from its consumption and in terms of injuries resulting from a fall induced by its effects (which are produced by starving the brain of Oxygen). These risks include death. There are also long-term dangers to health (including bone marrow suppression, blood cell problems and poisoning of the central nervous system). These risks are likely to be exacerbated if the drug is combined with alcohol or other narcotics. The risks are particularly severe for pregnant women.

Under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 you have a duty to protect people on your premises (including customers) from risks to their health and safety. Allowing the supply of Nitrous Oxide on your premises would render you liable to prosecution under the Act, and potentially liable to any civil claims.

The promotion of public safety is one of the core objectives of the Licensing Act 2003, under which your premises is licensed and concern about the safety of members of the public using your premises could have implications for your licence(s).

If this authority becomes aware that premises are supplying or allowing the supply of Nitrous Oxide, the MHRA (Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency) will be informed, along with any evidence obtained. In addition action may be taken under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, and the premises licence reviewed under the Licensing Act 2003.

You are therefore advised to take all necessary steps to ensure that Nitrous Oxide is not being supplied on your premises and advised to contact this authority or the MHRA should you become aware that any group or individual is attempting to use your premises to supply it.
