<p>I am writing on behalf of residents of 47 Clarges Street which overlooks the premises. The residents of this street have had numerous problems over the years with badly managed commercial premises, including with Hide restaurant (85 Piccadilly/47 Clarges street), the most recent commercial premise to have been allowed to operate the street.</p> <p>Clarges Street is a predominantly residential street comprising 5 substantial apartment buildings with around 80 flats occupied by families with children, elderly residents and professional singles/couples across a wide range of income brackets. It is therefore imperative that new</p>	



restaurants such as that proposed by the applicant do not upset the residential character of the street. We are surprised that the applicant has made no attempt to engage with local residents.

- o We wish to object to the application on the basis of:
- o public safety;
- o the prevention of public nuisance;
- o the protection of children from harm.

As currently proposed the proposed activities and licence conditions are inadequate to ensure that these objectives are safeguarded.

### **Activities**

We do not think that live music is appropriate for a street of this kind, particularly "amplified music... via artists singing, DJs, bands and other music of a similar nature" and until midnight every day.

### **License conditions**

In terms of the license conditions, we would respectfully ask the licensing sub-committee to add the following conditions to the licence (largely to bring this license into line with that of other restaurants - eg Hide - in the same street and to address specific issues which have caused problems for the residents in the street):

1. The premises shall only operate as a fine dining restaurant:
  - (i) Customers must be shown to their table,
  - (ii) The supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
  - (iii) Food is provided in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and
  - (iv) There is no provision of any take away service of food or drink, and
  - (v) Where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
2. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23:00 and 07:00 on the following day.
3. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23:00 and 07:00 on the following day.
4. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23:00 and 07:00 on the following day. Delivery vehicles shall not be allowed to stop outside entrances to residential premises.
5. Patrons permitted temporarily to leave and then re-enter the premises, (e.g. to smoke) shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
6. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
7. The licence holder shall ensure that no queue forms outside the premises.
8. There shall be no new entry to the premises after 23:00.
9. The licence holder shall enter into an agreement with a hackney carriage and/or private carriage firm to provide transport for customers, with contact numbers made readily available to customers who will be encouraged to use such services.
10. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
11. Staff and patrons shall not be permitted to smoke or otherwise loiter in the vicinity of residential buildings (including their entrances).
12. Cooking smells shall not be allowed to emanate from the restaurant.
13. Vehicles shall not be allowed to wait in the street for patrons with their engines left on.

<p><b>Pre application advice purpose:</b> To comment on appropriate conditions including capacities for two new premises licence. The proposed operation will be a bar/restaurant and a separate patisserie. Advise on technical suitability and policy implications in advance of the appropriate application. The premises are currently empty and the operators are seeking for both premises the provision of alcohol, late night refreshment and regulated entertainment to compliment the food offer.</p> <p><b>Issues discussed and actions taken:</b></p> <p>Inspection carried out by Ian Watson (Environmental Health – EH) and Alan Lynagh (District Surveyor – DS) of the ground and basement floor. The findings are detailed below.</p> <p><u><b>District Surveyor Comments</b></u></p> <p><b>Means of Escape:</b></p> <p><b>Restaurant</b></p> <p>The Restaurant currently has two proposed exit routes at ground floor with the rear route passing through the rear BOH area. On this basis we would suggest that this exit route is purely for staff but this can be confirmed in tandem with building control. We would recommend therefor that to maximise the public capacity the main front entrance is at least 1100mm clear width and the door reversed to open on the direction of escape as is currently shown to be inward opening. Alternatively</p>		

it may be acceptable to have this door powered open if inward opening on operation of the fire alarm system to negate the inward opening nature of current proposal. This would allow up to 100 people as long as the travel distances from the rear public area to front door do not exceed 18m in line with the guidance in the Technical Standards for Places of Entertainment. There are no concerns with the means of escape from the proposed staff areas at basement level.

#### **Café**

The current proposed plan appears adequate at ground floor level. The two available exits as proposed should allow a capacity up to 100 also subject to the limited travel distances to both and the ground floor nature of the premises.

In addition to the above the following general points should also be considered:

#### **General Advice**

- The exit corridor in the basement should be provided with a minimum of 30 minutes fire separation to other parts of the premises.
- Fire detection and alarm system within the premises should ideally be BS 5839 Part 1 2002 Category L2 protection (this is advisory but this would give good flexibility with capacities and approval).
- All Fire doors protecting the escape routes in the basement and at ground floor level should be provided with intumescent strips and smoke seals and all fire doors will comply with the relevant provisions of Table B1 of ADB.
- Every escape route (other than those in ordinary use) will be marked by emergency exit signs complying with BS 5499: Part 1 and these will be located in accordance with the recommendations of BS 5499: Part 4.
- Both primary and secondary lighting should be provided throughout with particular attention drawn to any changes of level and key locations such as fire alarm panel.
- If full height doors are proposed for the sanitary provision we would recommend emergency lighting is provided in the toilet W/C's as well as the toilet lobby.
- The ansul proposed should be clearly signed and the release located appropriately to allow staff to operate in an emergency.

#### **Capacity and Toilets**

The proposed seated capacity of the restaurant and patisserie will each be around 60 covers going up to 100 persons for standing private events.

To address this capacity the minimum required toilet facilities for each premises are: 2 x WC's Female, 1 x WC and 1 Urinal Male plus 1 x Disabled. A minimum of 2 staff WC's are required for all staff.

**Licensing Policy:**

The premises are not located within any recognised impact areas therefore subject to conditions addressing the licensing objectives. If no restaurant condition is proposed then policy PB1 would apply which states that applications will only be granted if it can be demonstrated that the proposal meets the relevant criteria in policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1. If a restaurant condition is proposed then policy RNT1 would apply which states that applications will generally be granted subject to relevant criteria in policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.

The proposed hours of operation for the restaurant are;

Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off'  
Monday to Sunday 08.00 to 01.00 hours.

Late Night Refreshment 'Indoors'  
Monday to Sunday 23.00 to 01.30

Regulated Entertainment 'Indoors'  
Monday to Sunday 08.00 to 01.30 hours.

Licensable activities can be provided from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

The proposed hours of operation for the patisserie are;

Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off'  
Monday to Sunday 08.00 to 00.00 hours. (Midnight)

Late Night Refreshment 'Indoors'  
Monday to Sunday 23.00 to 00.00 hours. (Midnight)

Regulated Entertainment 'Indoors'  
Monday to Sunday 08.00 to 00.00 hours. (Midnight)

Licensable activities can be provided from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

Whilst policy does not restrict applications to operate these hours there are residents in the area who may wish to restrict these operations with some restaurant/seated conditions. Please see application 17/01572/LIPN for comments from residents.

Such hours especially if the licensing objectives of Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance were suitably addressed would not generally attract a representation from Environmental Health unless residents had concerns that needed further consideration.

**Licensing Position:**

It is proposed that a new applications are submitted with conditions to address the four licensing objectives to minimise the impact of the operation on the area.

To address the licensing objective of Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Crime and

Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm the following model conditions are proposed and to address possible concerns from residents.

**Proposed conditions (Restaurant)**

- The supply of alcohol shall,
  - (a) only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal within the hatched area.
  - or
  - (b) to persons attending a pre-booked private event.
- A waiter/waitress service shall be provided.
- The maximum number of persons permitted on the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed
  - Ground Floor xxx persons
- A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption 'Off' the premises after 23.00 hours.
- No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
- The entrance door shall be kept closed at all times when regulated entertainment is provided.
- The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premise is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.



- There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
- The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) all ejections of patrons
  - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
  - (d) any incidents of disorder
  - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
  - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- The Licence will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and this condition has been removed from the Licence.
- Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.

**Proposed conditions (Patisserie)**

- The consumption of alcohol shall,
  - (a) only be by a person seated.
 or
  - (b) only to persons attending a pre-booked private event.
- A waiter/waitress service shall be provided.

- The maximum number of persons permitted on the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed
  - Ground Floor xxx persons
- A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption 'Off' the premises after 23.00 hours.
- No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
- The entrance door shall be kept closed at all times when regulated entertainment is provided.
- The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premise is open. - Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.

The premises have a dedicated delivery/refuse area and therefore no specific conditions are proposed to address this issue.

#### **Conclusion**

The proposed applications should be applied for in line with the hours stated above but not past 01.00 hours. The conditions proposed are in line with model conditions and suitably address the licensing objectives. Conditions have also been proposed to address Prevention of Crime and Disorder in line with police concerns. The new operations should not impact on the area if the conditions proposed are observed. The works condition will allow the responsible authorities comfort in assessing the premises on completion in line with Public Safety.

As part of the application process it is advised that the other responsible authorities will also need to assess the proposals and may wish to make additional comments.

## CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

4.
  - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or

less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—

  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

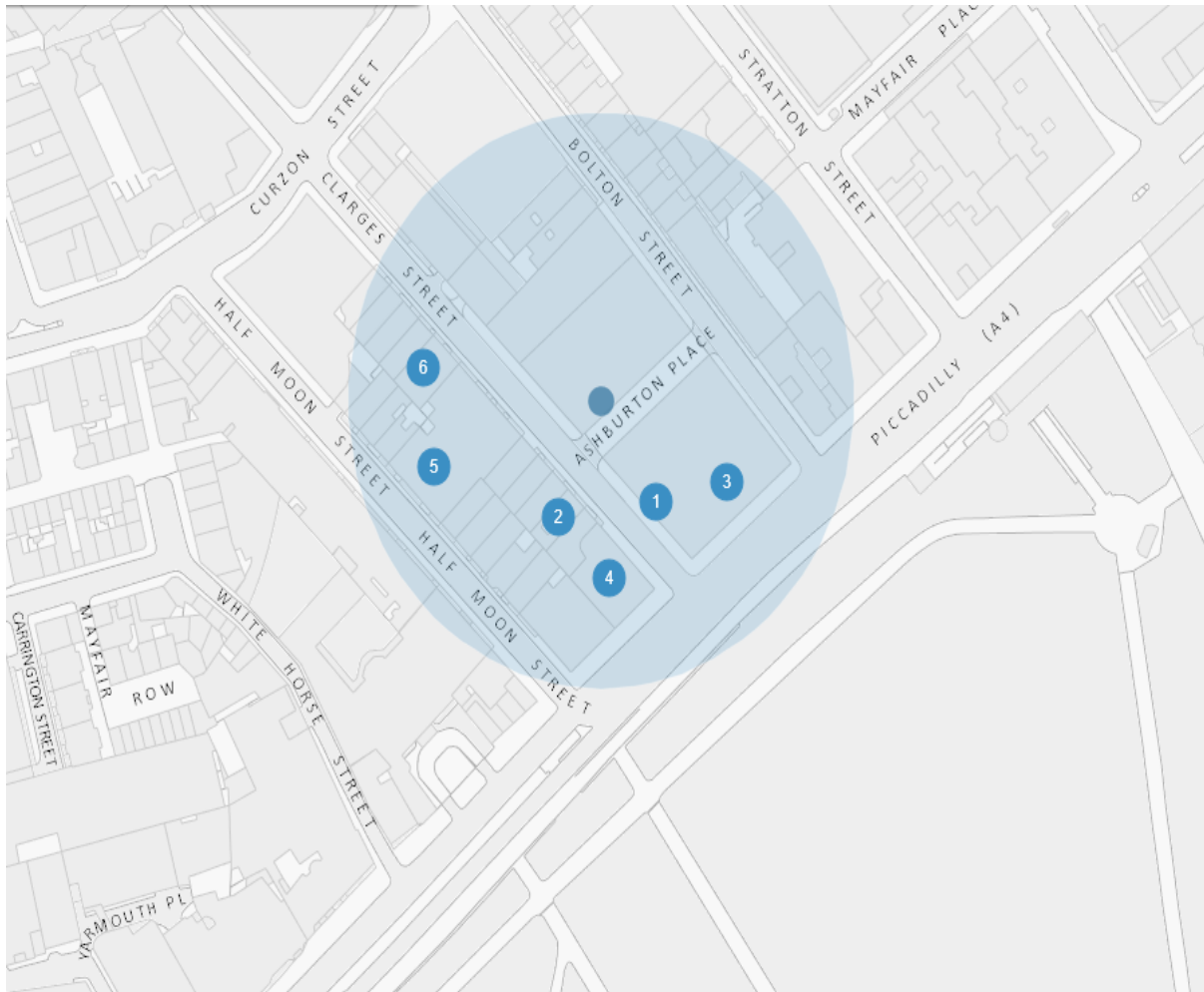

#### **Conditions proposed by the objector**

27. The premises shall only operate as a fine dining restaurant:
- (i) Customers must be shown to their table,
  - (ii) The supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
  - (iii) Food is provided in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
  - (iv) There is no provision of any take away service of food or drink, and
  - (v) Where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
28. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23:00 and 07:00 on the following day.
29. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23:00 and 07:00 on the following day.
30. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23:00 and 07:00 on the following day. Delivery vehicles shall not be allowed to stop outside entrances to residential premises.
31. Patrons permitted temporarily to leave and then re-enter the premises, (e.g. to smoke) shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.

32. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
33. The licence holder shall ensure that no queue forms outside the premises.
34. There shall be no new entry to the premises after 23:00.

General public would not be able to come in the event space at all.</p> <p><b>During consultation, the applicant agreed to reduce the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol on Sundays from 23:00 to 22:00</b></p>		





The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and PB2.

At present, the hours applied for licensable activities currently fall outside of Westminster's core hours. For premises for the supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises, Westminster's core hours are as follows:

Monday to Thursday: 10:00 – 23:30  
Friday and Saturday: 10:00 – 00:00  
Sunday: 12:00 to 22:30

The Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to consider reducing the Sunday hours for licensable activities by 30 minutes to be in line with those of Westminster's Core Hours Policy, HRS1

The application proposes to operate with a provision of a bar within a workplace, solely for the use of those working there, and their invited guests, which therefore falls within PB2 of the Councils Policy. The policy is to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Area other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under HRS1.

Paragraph 2.5.23 of the policy states that the provision of a bar in a work place will generally be regarded as an exception to the policy. However, the Licensing Authority would like further submissions on the intended use of the bar and how the applicant will reduce the impact in the Cumulative Impact Area. Further, the Licensing Authority would like the applicant to explain how the intended bona fide guests will be managed as this has not been dealt with in the applicants operating schedule. Therefore further clarity is needed.

The Licensing Authority notes that there is currently discussion with Environmental Health and Police with proposed conditions, The Licensing Authority would also seek model condition 86 to read as follows;

## **CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING**

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

### **Mandatory Conditions**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
  - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or

less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -
- $$P = D + (D \times V)$$
- Where -
- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.



**Conditions proposed by the Police and Environmental Health and agreed by the Applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule**

10. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
11. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
12. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
13. The number of persons permitted in the external terrace at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed (X) persons.
14. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) all ejections of patrons
  - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
  - (d) any incidents of disorder
  - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
  - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
16. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
17. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
18. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device
19. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
20. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.

21. All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features including materials used in finishing and furnishing shall be either non-combustible or be durably or inherently flame-retarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes (other than foyers), entertainment areas or function rooms, shall be non-combustible.
22. The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of the premises as offices.
23. Alcohol shall only be sold for consumption by:
  - (i) members of the 'Runway East' (Rwe 66 Compton Street Ltd) group of companies or employees of member companies, or their bona fide guests.
  - (ii) persons attending a pre-booked and bona fide private function or event to which members of the public are not admitted. A register of persons attending the event shall be kept at the premises and made available for immediate inspection by police or an authorised officer of the Council.
24. On Friday and Saturday when the terrace is used for hosting a pre-booked event, which lasts 5 hours or more, there will be a minimum of 1 SIA licensed door supervisor on duty at the premises. The SIA door supervisor will facilitate the safe dispersal of its patrons after the event
