- 1. Licensable activities for the whole premises shall be ancillary to the use as a restaurant.
- Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises after midnight e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall be limited to (10) persons at any one time and supervised by SIA Security.
- 3. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall not be permitted to take glass containers with them.
- 4. There shall be a minimum of 2 door supervisors from 11pm until 4:30am.

1-E Conditions proposed to be removed

- 11. Access to the premises between 01:00 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel and shall be restricted to hotels residents and up to 5 bona fide guests per resident.
- 12. Egress from the premises between 02:30 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel.
- 13. The supply of alcohol between the hours of 23:30 (Monday to Thursday), midnight (Friday and Saturday) and 22:30hrs (Sunday, midnight on Sundays before bank holidays) and 10:00 hours on the following day shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. Hotel residents' bona fide guests shall be limited to a maximum of 5 guests per resident.
- 14. The provision of late-night refreshment between the hours of 02:00 and 10:00 hours shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. Hotel residents' bona fide guests shall be limited to a maximum of 5 guests per resident.
- 48. There shall be no new entries to the premises after 1am until close, daily (notwithstanding the effect of conditions 11 to 14 above).

I write in relation to the application submitted for a new premises licence for HaiDiLao, Units 4 And 5, Trocadero, 13 Coventry Street, London, W1D 7AB.

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The application seeks the following:

- Increase the hours of all licensable activities to 04:00am and closing time to 04:30am.
- Delete conditions 11, 12, 13, 14 and 48 on the decision notice attached to the application.
- Add the following conditions:-
 - 1. Licensable activities for the whole premises shall be ancillary to the use as a restaurant.
 - 2. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises after midnight e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall be limited to (10) persons at any one time and supervised by SIA Security.
 - 3. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall not be permitted to take glass containers with them.
 - 4. There shall be a minimum of 2 door supervisors from 11pm until 4:30pm

The premises are located within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and RTN1.

Policy RNT1 (B) states

- B. Applications inside the West End Cumulative Impact Zone will generally be granted subject to:
- 1. The application meeting the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.
- 2. The hours for licensable activities are within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1.
- 3. The operation of any delivery services for alcohol and/or late night refreshment meeting the council's Ancillary Delivery of Alcohol and/or Late-Night Refreshment Policy DEL1.
- 4. The applicant has demonstrated that they will not add to cumulative impact within the Cumulative Impact Zone.
- 5. The application and operation of the venue meeting the definition of a restaurant as per Clause C.
- C. For the purposes of this policy a restaurant is defined as:

- 1. A premises in which customers are shown to their table or the customer will select a table themselves to which food is either served to them or they have collected themselves.
- 2. Which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at a table.
- 3. Which do not provide any takeaway service of food and/or drink for immediate consumption, except if provided via an ancillary delivery service to customers at their residential or workplace address.
- 4. Where alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are bona fide taking substantial table meals and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
- 5. The sale and consumption of alcohol prior to such meals may be in a bar area but must also be ancillary to the taking of such meal.

The Licensing Authority note that the hours sought are outside Westminster's core hours for a restaurant.

The Core hours for restaurants are: Monday to Thursday: 9am to 11.30pm. Friday and Saturday: 9am to 12am.

Sunday: 9am to 10.30pm.

Sundays immediately prior to a bank holiday: 9am to 12am.

It is noted that the conditions the applicant are seeking to remove are those that restrict the existing later hours to hotel residents and their bona fide guests. Is it the applicants intention that the premises will now be open to the public for licensable activities until 04:00?

The Licensing Authority note that that the applicant has proposed a condition that "Licensable activities for the whole premises shall be ancillary to the use as a restaurant" it is also noted that the licence contains Westminster's model restaurant condition in respect of the basement. The Licensing Authority would therefore propose that model condition MC66 (as set out below) be applicable to all areas of the premises.

"MC66: 'The premises shall only operate as a restaurant,

- (i) in which customers are shown to their table or the customer will select a table themselves,
- (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
- (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table,
- (iv) which do not provide any takeaway service of food or drink for immediate consumption off the premises,
- (v) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

For the purpose of this condition 'Substantial Table Meal' means – a meal such as might be expected to be served as the main midday or main evening meal, or as a main course at either such meal

and is eaten by a person seated at a table, or at a counter or other structure which serves the purposes of a table and is not used for the service of refreshments for consumption by persons not seated

at a table or structure servicing the purposes of a table.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal."

As the hours applied for are far in excess of Westminster's core hours and the requirement of the later hours to only be available to hotel residents and their bona fide guests is being removed, it will be for the applicant to demonstrate that the operation of the premises will not

add to cumulative impact in the West End cumulative impact zone, in accordance with policy CIP1.

The Licensing Authority would like to attend the premises to discuss the application in more detail. I understand that the Metropolitan Police have proposed a meeting for next week and I would be happy to attend this meeting if is more convenient.

I refer to the variation application for the Premises Licence, 20/01462/LIPDPS, for the above premises.

The premises are situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Zone as stated in City of Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy.

This representation is based on the Operating Schedule and the plans attached to the current licence.

The applicant is seeking the following on the ground floor and lower ground floor:

- To increase the terminal hour for the current licensable activities of plays, films, recorded music, performance of dance and anything similar, late night refreshment and the supply of alcohol from Monday-Sunday until 04:00 hours.
- 2. To delete the following conditions:
- 11. Access to the premises between 01:00 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel and shall be restricted to hotels residents and up to 5 bona fide quests per resident.
- 12. Egress from the premises between 02:30 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel.
- 13. The supply of alcohol between the hours of 23:30 (Monday to Thursday), midnight (Friday and Saturday) and 22:30hrs (Sunday, midnight on Sundays before bank holidays) and 10:00 hours on the following day shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. Hotel residents' bona fide guests shall be limited to a maximum of 5 guests per resident.

- Increase the hours of all licensable activities to 04:00am and closing time to 04:30am. Further to delete conditions 11, 12, 13, 14 and 48 on the decision notice attached to the application.
- The following conditions to be added:-
 - 1. Licensable activities for the whole premises shall be ancillary to the use as a restaurant.
 - 2. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises after midnight e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall be limited to (10) persons at any one time and supervised by SIA Security.
 - 3. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall not be permitted to take glass containers with them.
 - 4. There shall be a minimum of 2 door supervisors from 11pm until 4:30pm
- 2. The current premises licence permits the following licensable activities and timings:

- c. The removal of the following conditions:
 - i. Access to the premises between 01:00 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel and shall be restricted to hotels residents and up to 5 bona fide guests per resident.
 - ii. Egress from the premises between 02:30 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel
 - iii. The supply of alcohol between the hours of 23:30 (Monday to Thursday), midnight (Friday and Saturday) and 22:30hrs (Sunday, midnight on Sundays before bank holidays) and 10:00 hours on the following day shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. 


- 4. This premises falls within the Restaurants Policy ("RNT1"). The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone ("CIZ"). Applications inside the CIZ will generally be granted subject to meeting the following:
 - **a.** The hours for licensable activities are within the council's Core Hours Policy, and;
 - **b.** The applicant has demonstrated that they will not add to cumulative impact within the Cumulative Impact Zone
- 5. The proposed hours fall significantly outside of the core hours for a restaurant and the applicant has not demonstrated that they will not add to Cumulative Impact. The additional hours of alcohol consumption will likely lead to an increase in intoxication levels amongst the customers, who will be leaving the premises at a time when the



Current levels of alcohol related assaults, sexual assaults and robberies are higher now than they were when the Cumulative Impact Assessment was undertaken in 2020. 
The applicant will need to demonstrate that they will not add to cumulative impact within the CIZ. As the application currently stands, the Police do not feel that this has been achieved.

Appendix 1 - West End Crime Statistics - April/May 2023













- 11. The Licensing Authority will take into account the active measures proposed for a 'winding down' period including arrangements for people to be collected from the premises to travel home safely.

Which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at a table. 3. Which do not provide any takeaway service of food and/or drink for immediate consumption, except if provided via an ancillary delivery service to customers at their residential or workplace address. 4. Where alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are bona fide taking substantial table meals and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. 5. The sale and consumption of alcohol prior to such meals may be

in a bar area but must also be ancillary to the taking of such meal.

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

Haidilao Hot Pot (Chinese: 海底捞火锅) is an award-winning hot pot restaurant company founded in Sichuan Province, China in 1994. The name of the company originates from a mahjong term in Sichuan, haidilao, literally meaning fortune. At an early phase, it was a small shop selling malatang. Later it developed and expanded its menu range. Zhang Yong, who came from a small village in Sichuan, is the CEO of the company.



Over the past 24 years, it has owned more than 80 direct marketing stores in Beijing, Tianjin, Shanghai, Nanjing and many other major cities.

It has now expanded to other countries including the US, Singapore, South Korea, Japan, Taiwan and as of 2019, the UK.

Customer reception to the opening of Haidilao London have been extremely positive. Haidilao appeals to everyone from locals, to UK tourists, to international tourists and even Chinese visitors looking for a taste of home.

Haidilao London has proven extremely popular. The unique experience provided by the restaurant, including communal "hot pot" style dining, enhanced by Haidilao's waiters' "dancing noodles" performances at table-side and friendly staff means that visitors (mainly tourists during the day and evening, and local workers/residents from Chinatown in the later hours) wish to socialise for longer at the venue and finish their night in Haidilao rather than migrate to other venues with later licences in the West End. For the local Chinese community, this often means frequenting the later opening casinos nearby.

The current licence already permits 24 hour dining (including sale of alcohol) by residents of the adjoining hotel and their guests. This (now modified) application has been made to increase the licensable hours to permit the general public to dine until 3.30am (from the current 2.30am) but, importantly, to only extend the permitted hours for sale of alcohol, since alcohol forms only a very small part of Haidilao's very specific clientele's spend or expectations, to 2am.



 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non-disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and page 35

(vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

- 16. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers and ancillary to a takeaway meal only and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 17. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 18. There shall be no more than 280 customers (excluding staff) in the basement of the premises at any one time.
- 19. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 20. All entrance doors and windows to be kept closed after 23:00 hours or when regulated entertainment is taking place except for immediate access and egress of persons.
- 21. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 22. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 23. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

- 24. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 25. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 26. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 hours on the following day.
- 27. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 28. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 29. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 30. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 31. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

- 32. There shall be no cinema style showing of films
- 33. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- 34. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 35. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 36. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 37. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 38. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.

No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
- 40. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licenced premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 41. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premise building.
- 42. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them unless seated in an authorised external area.

Introduction and background to application.

- 1. Marcus Lavell of Keystone law has instructed me to consider the application for an extension to the hours for HaiDiLao restaurant premises in the Trocadero, W1. I visited the premises and conducted observations in the vicinity on the night of Saturday the 2^{nd of} September 2023 from 10.30 until the early hours of Sunday 3rd September. The weather was warm and dry, and the area was very busy. I have also been supplied with copies of the licence and application and a copy of the report prepared by for the 2020 application.
- 2. HaiDiLao is located in the Westminster West End Stress Area and operates as a restaurant with alcohol only available ancillary to food. The premises operates as a Chinese 'hotpot' style restaurant where customers, usually family groups or groups of friends, order their food which is brought to the table and the customers then cook the food themselves to their taste on a hotplate in the centre of the table. The concept involves 'theatre' in the way that noodles are stretched and prepared by waiting staff at the table and other cultural type shows take place around the premises.
- 3. In 2018 a premises licence was issued to the premises for the restaurant that prior to this it operated as a souvenir shop. The premises opened in 2019 and the licence was then varied in 2020 and now authorises a number of activities, the most relevant here being late night refreshment until 02.00 hours Monday to Sunday and the sale by retail of alcohol Monday to Thursday until 23.30 and Friday and Saturday until 00.00. The

present application seeks to extend the hours for alcohol until 02.00 hours and the closing time until 04.00 hours while retaining the current last admission time of 02.00 hours.

4. At the 2020 variation application there were policy objections from Environmental Health and Licensing and a single resident objection. This application has attracted no objections from residents with the only objections being on policy grounds from the police, Licensing authority and Environmental Health. This appears to me to be a positive endorsement for the operating style of the premises. In addition I understand that there have been no incidents at the premises and no complaints made about the premises operation.

Summary of Expertise –

- 5. I retired from the police service on 2nd November 2012 having completed 31 years exemplary service with the Metropolitan Police in London. Between January 2012 and my retirement, I was employed as the Chief Inspector in charge of licensing for the London Olympic Games 2012. In this role I headed up a team of officers with responsibility for supervision of licensing compliance at all the Olympic venues, including the Olympic Park. In addition, I was responsible for ensuring that any associated events were properly licensed, sufficiently staffed and operated in accordance with the licensing legislation and best practice to ensure the safe and effective delivery of the Olympic Games. In addition to leading my team I visited and worked with both the Olympic Park management and many other venues, reviewing their policies and procedures and ensuring that the Games were delivered safely and securely. The success of this operation not only protected the reputation of the MPS but provided positive benefits for the profile of the MPS and the United Kingdom. I have been awarded an Assistant Commissioners Commendation for this work.
- 6. Prior to this role, between Jan 2002 and January 2012, I was employed first as an Inspector and then as a Chief Inspector on the MPS Clubs and Vice Unit (Now SCD9 Serious and Organised crime command). My responsibilities over this period focussed

on licensing and included day to day supervision of the licensing team that had a London wide remit to support the Boroughs with licensing activity. Providing both Overt and Covert support for policing problem licensed premises across London. My team worked with premises when licensing issues were identified to address these problems through the use of action plans in order to raise their standards. Where this failed, I would support the Boroughs with evidence for use at review hearings if required.

- 7. I devised and implemented the MPS strategy 'Safe and Sound' which sought to improve the safety of customers at licensed premises by reducing violent and other crime, in particular gun crime and the most serious violence. I also developed the Promoters Forum and risk assessment process, together these initiatives contributed to an overall reduction in violence in London of 5% and of the most serious violence and gun crime at licensed premises by 20% whilst I was there.
- 8. From 2004 until 2008 my role included representing the MPS and ACPO licensing lead both in London and nationally. In this role I developed key partnerships with industry, NGOs and Government departments in order to improve the standards at licensed premises. I sat on the British Institute of Innkeeping working party and helped develop the national training for Door Supervisors. I worked with the national regulator the Security Industry Authority to successfully introduce the new regime under the Private Security Industry Act 2001 within London. I sat on Government working parties and worked closely with the alcohol harm reduction team on identifying best practice and ensuring this was used both within London and nationally by police and local authorities. I worked with Government on the drafting of SEV legislation and gave evidence to the House of Commons Select Committee in 2009 on the impact of premises providing sexual entertainment.
- 9. I was involved with Best Bar None, a national voluntary scheme of accreditation for safe licensed premises, for a number of years and successfully helped a number of boroughs implement the initiative. I was a trained Best Bar none assessor and until my retirement sat on the Board for Best Bar None in the Royal Borough of Kensington and

Chelsea. I was also a trained assessor for Purple Flag, the national voluntary awards scheme for safe, diverse and accessible town centres. For the five years prior to my retirement, I was responsible for licensing of the Notting Hill Carnival, the largest street carnival in Europe. During this time, I contributed to a reduction in violence overall at the Carnival and delivered increased seizures of illegal alcohol, reduction of unlicensed alcohol sales and a reduction in alcohol related violence. In addition to the above I attended internal MPS training and qualification courses, I am trained in conducting health and safety risk assessments and hold the National Certificate for Licensing Practitioners, issued by the British Institute of Inn keeping.

10. Following my retirement, I established to provide independent compliance support and advice for premises and events requiring a local authority licence. Since then, I have provided evidence gathering services, advice and support to a broad range of licensed premises on a variety of issues, including crime and disorder, street drinking, rough sleepers and age-related product issues. I have also provided support to bars and shops at events such as Nottinghill Carnival and provided support and advice for high profile clubs such as Fabric in London. This work has involved premises that benefit from a variety of local authority licences including alcohol on and off licences, betting premises licences and late-night refreshment. I regularly provide expert independent witness evidence at both local authority and appeal court hearings.

Observations.

11. I conducted observations in the area and visited the premises on the night of Saturday 2nd September 2023. The area was very busy and on my arrival outside the premises at about 22.30 I observed the operation from the street for a short period. The entrance is discrete and easily missed; there were two door supervisors at the entrance who were smartly dressed in suit and tie and appeared more like members of the management than door supervisors. There was no one queuing outside the premises, and it had no impact on the vicinity.

- 12. I went to the premises and was greeted by the door supervisors and explained that I had a meeting with the compliance manager . There was a third door supervisor at a desk just inside the main entrance. The ground floor area is a waiting area set out with stools and small tables where customers can wait while their tables in the basement becomes available, this ensures there is no queuing outside the premises. There is water available in this area, but alcohol is strictly only available once customers have gone down to the basement and are seated at their tables to eat.
- was in the reception, and I also met with the manager who introduced herself as which she explained was her English name, as she was of Chinese origin and her Chinese name was difficult for westerners to pronounce. I understand that has a personal licence and is soon to take the DPS course so that she can also be the DPS as she is responsible for day-to-day running of the premises. She struck me as a professional individual who studied in the USA and who has experience of running HaiDiLao premises around the world. She appeared to be a knowledgeable and effective manager. is a very experienced compliance manager who has worked in and around licensed premise in London for many years.
- 14. I asked to be shown around the premises and we went down into the basement restaurant. The premises is fitted out to a high standard in a minimalist modern style with bright lighting and was very clean, almost sterile, in atmosphere. Seating is set out in booth style around tables that have the hotplate set in the centre. There was no loud music audible. The premises was busy although not full and most, if not all, customers appeared to me to be Chinese/Asian in appearance and in family groups of groups of friends with a wide age range.
- 15. There was a very small servery for waiting staff to collect drinks with what appeared a very limited alcoholic drinks selection mainly consisting of wine and bottled beer. There is no bar and no facility for drinking prior to being seated at your table. It is not possible to stand at the servery, any alcohol served is delivered by waiting staff to the table.

- 16. In addition to the open plan dining area there are a number of private dining rooms. Walking around the dining area I mainly observed soft drinks, bottles of water and juices, such as freshly juiced watermelon, on the tables. I saw very little alcohol being consumed in the premises and the atmosphere was calm and restrained.
- 17. It was clear walking around the premises that the attraction is the 'hotpot' style of eating where families or friends select their food and then prepare it themselves at their table. I understand that this is a traditional Chinese style of eating, and it clearly attracts many people who want 'a taste of home' whether that is tourists to London or Chinese people who live and/or work in the UK.
- 18. I remained in the area until HaiDiLao closed observing both HaiDiLao and the surrounding area and premises. The customers coming and going from HaiDiLao remained as I had observed inside the premises, and I did not see any drunkenness, noise or nuisance from any of them. There was no queuing outside the premises, no obvious security at the door and despite being in Coventry Street, one of the busiest if not the busiest, street in London the premises had no impact on the vicinity. It appeared most people would walk past without even being aware of its presence there.
- 19. This is in stark contrast to many of the premises in the surrounding area where there were large queues to enter blocking pavements, often large numbers of burly door supervisors outside marshalling and attempting to control behaviour and alcohol fuelled noise and rowdy behaviour. As the evening got later the streets became increasingly populated by younger people looking to continue their night in the music and alcohol led bars and clubs in the area. Many appeared already intoxicated and balloon sellers and touts were roaming the streets unchallenged. HaiDiLao is not a premises that would appeal to this clientele, they were oblivious to it, and it had no impact on the area.

Conclusion.

- 20. The premises operates in a manner different to most in the area and attracts a different type of clientele. It is genuinely a food led premises where the food, style of dining and theatre are the attraction with alcohol playing a very small part of the offering.
- 21. The improvements that were proposed in the 2020 application have been implemented and have had a positive effect allowing customers to wait inside the premises and not to queue outside. Indeed, the premises is so discrete most would walk past it without noticing it was there.
- 22. Having read report from 2020 I find that my assessment now is very similar and that the premises has continued to operate in the same fashion and to a very high standard. Alcohol plays a very small part in the operation, there is no bar, and no alcohol is served before customers are seated in the restaurant and preparing their meal. There is a limited alcohol selection available to be served by waiting staff, but many customers choose not to drink alcohol, preferring water, soft drinks and fresh juices.
- 23. The atmosphere is relaxed, and the premises brightly lit, music is at a low volume and the overall experience is of a calm, orderly environment. Customers arriving and leaving do so quietly and with no impact on the surrounding area. I did not observe any drunkenness or noisy behaviour from any customers.
- 24. The premises has operated since 2019 and as far as I am aware there have been no incidents and no calls to police or the licensing authority. Unusually for an application such as this there are no objections from residents with the only objections being from the authorities on policy grounds.
- 25. The operating history, style of dining and my observations all lead me to conclude that this premises currently promotes the licensing objectives to a high standard and will continue to do so should this application be permitted. HaiDiLao appears to me to be just the sort of diverse, non-alcohol led premises that WCC wish to promote in the Stress Area, and it is my view that extending the hours to permit alcohol sales until

02.00 and late-night refreshment until 04.00 will have no impact on this operation or the wider Coventry Street area.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.
- 10. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 11. Access to the premises between 01:00 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel and shall be restricted to hotels residents and up to 5 bona fide guests per resident.
- 12. Egress from the premises between 02:30 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel.
- 13. The supply of alcohol between the hours of 23:30 (Monday to Thursday), midnight (Friday and Saturday) and 22:30hrs (Sunday, midnight on Sundays before bank holidays) and 10:00 hours on the following day shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. Hotel residents' bona fide guests shall be limited to a maximum of 5 guests per resident.
- 14. The provision of late-night refreshment between the hours of 02:00 and 10:00 hours shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. Hotel residents' bona fide guests shall be limited to a maximum of 5 guests per resident.
- 15. The basement of the premises shall only operate as a restaurant:
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non-disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.


- 16. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers and ancillary to a takeaway meal only and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 17. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 18. There shall be no more than 280 customers (excluding staff) in the basement of the premises at any one time.
- 19. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 20. All entrance doors and windows to be kept closed after 23:00 hours or when regulated entertainment is taking place except for immediate access and egress of persons.
- 21. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.


- 22. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 23. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 24. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 25. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 26. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 hours on the following day.
- 27. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 28. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 29. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 30. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 31. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 32. There shall be no cinema style showing of films
- 33. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.

- 34. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 35. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 36. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 37. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 38. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
- 39. A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental health Service, so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured by key or password to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental health Services and access shall only be by persons authorised by the Premises Licence Holder. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental health Service. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised officer of the Environmental health Service. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
- 40. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licenced premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 41. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premise building.
- 42. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them unless seated in an authorised external area.
- 43. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so on an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 44. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
- 45. There shall be no striptease or nudity and all persons shall be decently attired at all times unless the premises are operating under the provisions of a Sexual Entertainment Licence.
- 46. There shall be no sale of alcohol or provision of late-night refreshment from the ground floor.
- 47. SIA Staff will be deployed at the Premises as follows:
 - 1 SIA Door Supervisor from 7pm to 11pm
 - 2 SIA Door Supervisors from 11pm to 3am
- 48. There shall be no new entries to the premises after 1am until close, daily (notwithstanding the effect of conditions 11 to 14 above).

49. There shall be no queueing on the highway after 21:00hrs daily.

 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.


- 16. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers and ancillary to a takeaway meal only and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 17. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 18. There shall be no more than 280 customers (excluding staff) in the basement of the premises at any one time.
- 19. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.


- 22. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 23. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 24. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 25. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 26. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 hours on the following day.

 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

10. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

11. Access to the premises between 01:00 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel and shall be restricted to hotels residents and up to 5 bona fide guests per resident.

Condition 11 is proposed to be removed by the applicant.

12. Egress from the premises between 02:30 and 08:00 shall only be via the internal door (as shown on the attached plans) from the adjacent hotel.

Condition 12 is proposed to be removed by the applicant.

13. The supply of alcohol between the hours of 23:30 (Monday to Thursday), midnight (Friday and Saturday) and 22:30hrs (Sunday, midnight on Sundays before bank holidays) and 10:00 hours on the following day shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. Hotel residents' bona fide guests shall be limited to a maximum of 5 guests per resident.

Condition 13 is proposed to be removed by the applicant.

14. The provision of late-night refreshment between the hours of 02:00 and 10:00 hours shall be limited to residents from the adjacent hotel and their guests. Hotel residents' bona fide guests shall be limited to a maximum of 5 guests per resident.

Condition 14 is proposed to be removed by the applicant.

- 15. The basement of the premises shall only operate as a restaurant:
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non-disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
 - Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.
- 16. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers and ancillary to a takeaway meal only and shall not be consumed on the premises.

- 17. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 18. There shall be no more than 280 customers (excluding staff) in the basement of the premises at any one time.
- 19. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 20. All entrance doors and windows to be kept closed after 23:00 hours or when regulated entertainment is taking place except for immediate access and egress of persons.
- 21. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 22. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 23. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 24. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 25. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 26. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 hours on the following day.
- 27. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 28. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 29. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 30. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

- 31. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 32. There shall be no cinema style showing of films
- 33. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- 34. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 35. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 36. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 37. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 38. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
- 39. A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental health Service, so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured by key or password to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental health Services and access shall only be by persons authorised by the Premises Licence Holder. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental health Service. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised officer of the Environmental health Service. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
- 40. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licenced premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 41. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premise building.
- 42. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them unless seated in an authorised external area.

- 43. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so on an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 44. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
- 45. There shall be no striptease or nudity and all persons shall be decently attired at all times unless the premises are operating under the provisions of a Sexual Entertainment Licence.
- 46. There shall be no sale of alcohol or provision of late-night refreshment from the ground floor.
- 47. SIA Staff will be deployed at the Premises as follows:
 - 1 SIA Door Supervisor from 7pm to 11pm
 - 2 SIA Door Supervisors from 11pm to 3am
- 48. There shall be no new entries to the premises after 1am until close, daily (notwithstanding the effect of conditions 11 to 14 above).

Condition 48 is proposed to be removed by the applicant.

49. There shall be no queueing on the highway after 21:00hrs daily.

Conditions proposed to be added by the applicant

- 50. Licensable activities for the whole premises shall be ancillary to the use as a restaurant.
- 51. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises after midnight e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall be limited to (10) persons at any one time and supervised by SIA Security.
- 52. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall not be permitted to take glass containers with them.
- 53. There shall be a minimum of 2 door supervisors from 11pm until 4:30am.

I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the above premises which is located in the West End Cumulative Impact Zone (CIZ)

Plans of the premises have been submitted showing the Basement and Ground Floor (labelled 12 Soho Square).

The licensable activities being sought are:

I wish to make the following representations based on the operating schedule and plans submitted:

- 1. The Regulated Entertainments sought and for the times requested may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the CIZ and adversely impact on Public Safety
- 2. The provision of Late-Night Refreshment for the times requested may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the CIZ
- 3. The Supply of Alcohol and for the times requested may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the CIZ and impact on Public Safety

Environmental Health also makes the following further comments:

- Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy see on the Council's website requires licensed premises demonstrating compliance with policy CH1, Protection of Children from Harm. Free advice on complying with this can be found in the Policy (see page 36 of policy).
- Some conditions have been offered and these are being assessed to see if they are sufficient to allay Environmental Health concerns. Also clarity is requested on the address stated on the plans and the address stated for these premises.
- The applicant states '3 Soho Street is a coffee shop, bar and live entertainment venue, with the coffee shop and bar being situated on the ground floor, and the venue auditorium being situated in the basement' it is unclear if the premises have already been refurbished for the proposed use any refurbishment should be constructed at least in line with the advice laid out in the District Surveyor's Technical Standards for Places of Entertainment.
- The applicant also states 'Access to the venue auditorium is via one flight of stairs, leading into the basement space from the main cafe and bar space' this is unlikely to be sufficient for the proposed capacities in the basement.
- The provision of sanitary accommodation must be at least in line with recommendations in BS6465 for any proposed capacity.
- In addition the applicant is requested to submit an acoustic assessment of the proposed use in accordance with guidance in Appendix 11 of Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy including prevention of noise transference through the building structure to other users of the building block.

The applicant is therefore requested to contact the undersigned to discuss the above and arrange a site visit after which Environmental Health may propose additional conditions for the proposed use.

MC 86: "The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of the premises as live entertainment venue"

The Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to provide further submissions based on the above.

The Licensing Authority's policies, in relation to the Cumulative Impact Areas, are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole. We request Councillors on the panel to carefully consider our concerns about this application for a new alcohol licence in the West End Cumulative Impact Zone. As the Committee are aware the onus is on the applicant to demonstrate they will not increase cumulative impact and will promote the licensing objectives.

We will present evidence on the impact of the huge number of licensed premises is having on the lives of residents and how the high level of crime has made the area very unsafe for people on a night out. Any new licensed premises which increases the number of people on the streets at night will have a negative impact on residents living nearby on Soho Square and will increase the level of crime in the area.

This is an application for a new bar linked to a performance venue for 130 (seated) to 200 (vertical) people, considering the nature of this application it is very disappointing that the applicant has provided very little information on how the venue will operate. Following a request

the plan of the basement originally missing from the initial bundle has recently be submitted, reviewing the new plans the licensable area on the ground floor is significantly larger than the original plan. We would also point out the premises do not benefit from planning consent for a live performance venue, its current permission being dual /alternative use retail or restaurant.

The applicant offers a list of conditions set against the licensing objectives, some of which are of concern, for example the reference to external tables and chairs and queuing outside on this narrow street.

We are also concerned there is not a condition that ties the use as a performance venue and which also ties the applicant.

We strongly oppose the provision for off sales in this area, residents are concerned with the noise nuisance from people drinking outside on Soho Street which has one only other licensed premises.

If the Committee are minded to grant this application we ask the hours in the basement (as the performance venue) and ground floor are different, with consumption of alcohol to cease on the ground floor at 10pm **AND** ancillary to a table meal.

The Committee will be aware the premises is in the heart of Soho with its **487** licensed premises which includes a large proportion being late night **121** (25%) licensed with a terminal hour between 1am - 6am and a **capacity of over 22,827**.

The position of this performance venue is very important, it is situated in an area of Soho with the highest concentration of licensed premises in Soho, 118 with terminal hours between 12am to 3.30am and a capacity of over 11,200.

This area is unsafe at night, the Committee will know of a number of recent serious incidents that have taken place on Greek Street, these incidents confirm what residents already know that Soho is unsafe at night. It has reached such a level that public safety is threatened.

Evidence from the Night Stars who support vulnerable people late at night confirms this, data for the past year shows Soho as one of the areas with the highest number of service interactions, with most interactions taking place in a range of venues including; night clubs, bars, restaurants and hotels. Unsurprisingly the streets in Soho where the most interactions have taken place were Greek Street followed by Soho Square, Wardour Street, Old Compton Street, Dean Street and Frith Street all falling within in the area already identified as having the highest concentration of licensed premises.

We know residents living on Soho Square have submitted representations raising concerns of a new licensed premises close by with the loss of residential amenity.

Residents are disturbed by noise and anti-social behaviour at night. They are disturbed by the late night activity as people leave premises by either shouting, screaming or arguing, noise from pedicabs, car doors slamming, horns honking, and are subjected to anti-social behaviour with people vomiting and urinating in the street and in their doorways.

Residents are also disturbed even if an establishment is not located directly on their street, as patrons usually intoxicated leave premises and either carry on their night out in Soho or as they make their way home making a noise and disturbing residents along the way.

Please see the results of the Soho Society Sleep Survey October 2022 in Appendix 1.

The year on year rise in the number of licensed premises in Soho continues to add to cumulative impact, from 2022 to June 2023 **48** new licences were granted with a total capacity of **3,902**, and of the 48 licences, **9** were granted outside core hours with a capacity of **1,178**.

The Cumulative Impact Assessment 2020 is clear, it states for every additional licence premises the analysis will continue to show that reported incidents are likely to increase by something between 6% and 17% and crimes to increase by over 10%.

It comes as no surprise that the crime statistics repeatedly show the level of crime is increasing. The latest figures show levels of certain crimes are now higher than at pre COVID times, and the peak times for crime being between **10pm - 2am.** All the evidence shows there will be an increase in cumulative impact if this application is granted.

The applicant has failed to fully address the impact of 130 to 200 people attending an event where alcohol is available without the purchase of food. They have failed to demonstrate the premises will not increase cumulative impact and that it will promote the licensing objectives, we therefore respectfully request this application to be refused.

Appendix 1 : Sleep Survey Results - 31 October 2022

The survey conducted by the Soho Society confirms that residents are disturbed by noise at night and this is having a negative impact on their lives.

87 people have responded of which 78 are Soho residents with ages spread fairly evenly from 22 to 80.

59% have lived in Soho more than 10 years

26% between 3 and 10 years

6% between 1 and 3 years and

9% have lived here less than a year

42% own their homes

20% are Soho Housing Association and the rest tenants with other landlords

10 respondents have children living at home with them

58% have double glazing

37% single glazing

5% have triple glazing

24% of respondents have their sleep disturbed 7 nights a week

16% of respondents have their sleep disturbed 5 or 6 nights a week

19% of respondents have their sleep disturbed 3 or 4 nights a week

19% of respondents have their sleep disturbed once or twice a week

20% do not have a problem with environmental noise pollution

Topping the list in September was people drinking in the street with 54 mentions, then pedicabs with 51, waste collections at 48, construction noise 36 and car horns 33 and deliveries at 25. Other noise sources identified were air conditioning, motorbikes revving, building alarms and music from licensed venues. The most common identified problem at 42% of respondents was people drinking and shouting in the street.

64% of respondents agreed that noise nuisance from increased commercial activity at night is the most serious problem impacting Soho residents quality of life.

46% of respondents agreed that noise nuisance is so bad that they have considered moving away from Soho.

60% of respondents agreed that noise nuisance and sleep deprivation is adversely impacting my health and the health of the people they live with.

67% of respondents agreed that the council should base its noise policy on the World Health Organisation guidelines.

64% of respondents agreed that our ward councillors should make this their priority during the next four years.

69% of respondents agreed that during the time I have lived in Soho noise pollution has got significantly worse.

73% of respondents agreed that if noise limits are being exceeded the council should consider reviewing existing alcohol licenses.

72% of respondents agreed that the council should install electronic noise monitoring in Soho

56% of respondents agreed that the council should not grant additional premises licence for the sale of alcohol in Soho.

62% of respondents agreed that the council should not grant any extensions of hours for premises in Soho.

68% of respondents agreed that the council should renew its noise strategy as a matter of urgency.

Many respondents made additional comments: -

I left Soho 4 years ago. After 20 years, the noise & air pollution finally broke me. Like the frog in the pan of water with the heat gradually turned up, it took me a while to realise that it wasn't me going soft, it was the significant degradation of the environment around me. Since moved out of my flat, several other tenants have moved in & swiftly out again citing sleep disruption & excessive night noise as their reason for leaving. The flat is now used as an office rather than as

I am disappointed that another restaurant unit is going to be let on Hopkins Street by Shaftesbury when the residents already have an enormous amount of noise from the existing restaurants. No doubt they will also want an alcohol license, which will increase the noise and disturb residents even more.

As a disabled person working from home, I find it extremely exhausting not able to have rest at night, Screams and noise of drunk people every night, The Landlord WCC does not want to change the windows to a double glazing nor allow tenants to pay privately for windows to be upgraded. Noise at home, lack of sleep, and concentration in the day time. I have a hand held noise monitor, I recorded noise levels of 97db outside the pub at the corner of Broadwick and Berwick Streets.

More consideration needs to be given to residents from councillors, people visiting the area and local businesses in particular those who serve alcohol and have late night licences. Decisions such as granting planning and licence applications should not be made by people who do not live in the area and are therefore not impacted by the decision making.

Very difficult to get the local authority to understand and take complaints seriously. Officers often helpful but then the case goes to committee and they always seem to rule in favour of the commercial premises rather than residents.

There is supposed to be a presumption to refuse new licences but in practice the council still

lets new things through until after Midnight, which is far too late and has made a nonsense of the policy.

There should be a quiet window of 11pm to 8am every day. 7am deliveries are far too early for a lot of people if they are noisy or use cages or refrigeration.

I live in Marshall St and overlook it. Regularly now (most nights) there are traffic jams in the street at 3am in the morning with cars picking up people leaving clubs. The cars frequently are using their horns. Last night they had their door open with music blaring. we have 2 motorbike stands close together. 1 in Broadwick St and 1 in Marshall St. There is always at least one bike revving up at either 3am or really early like 530amThis noise has changed and increased over the past 3-4 years. I am woken up most nights at about 3am. And i have double glazing and am on [a high] floor.

Businesses take no responsibility for their customers drinking/eating and mainly shouting outside, including when they are queuing, and particularly when they are leaving. Post al fresco, there is a new attitude that anything goes on the streets and that includes contempt for the community who live here. The Council need to rethink this and put some major resource into enforcement.

I've lived in Soho for 60 years... Born and bred.. It's never been this noisy!

Early hours waste collections (including bottle smashing) also includes the food & beverage businesses putting their waste in the street and bottle bins at anti-social hours ahead of collection times. Our local restaurants are not supposed to put bottles out between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 but they frequently do. Frequently delivery trucks some with noisy refrigeration units are also delivering early hours.

Also deliveries & pedicabs. Unfortunately my lack of sleep due to noise has caused serious health issues and I now cannot work and suffer anxiety and depression. I'm woken up on average 5 times per night and have considered suicide. Why I'm being denied sleep between the hours of 11pm and 7am astonishes me. The freeholders Shaftesbury Carnaby show a total disrespect to the effects that noise has on the residents of Soho.

Appendix 2: Cumulative Impact Policy

This area has been identified by the Westminster City Council as under stress because the cumulative effect of the concentration of late night and drink led premises and night cafes has led to serious problems of disorder and/or public nuisance affecting residents, visitors and other businesses. The evidence presented in the Cumulative Impact Assessment 2020 is overwhelming, it describes the high level of cumulative impact in the West End Zone between 2017-2019. It concludes that:

'After consideration of the cumulative impact assessment it is the Licensing Authority's view that the number of premises licences in the West End, are such that it is likely granting further types of licences or varying existing licences would be inconsistent with the authority's duty to promote the licensing objectives. The granting of licences for certain types of operation that are likely to add to Cumulative Impact within these areas would not be consistent with the Licensing Authority's duty under the Licensing Act 2003.' (p.19) (Our emphasis)

In any applications for an alcohol licence in the Cumulative Impact Zone, the applicant is required to demonstrate that the application will not increase the Cumulative Impact. The analysis in the Cumulative Impact Assessment 2020 showed a very strong correlation between the number of licences and the extent to crime, violence and anti-social behaviour generally. This data means that **impact is increased by any additional drinkers.** So for any new licence or any extension of an existing licence, the resulting increase in drinkers will increase the

impact. In the absence of any data on numbers of people drinking, the best proxy for this increase is the number of licences. Any application to increase the number of licences will therefore contribute to the cumulative impact and so should be refused.

It states for every additional licence premises (including restaurants) the analysis will continue to show that reported incidents are likely to increase by something between 6% and 17% and crimes to increase by over 10%.

The policies in relation to the cumulative impact zone are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole (D16. of the policy).

D23. 'The proximity of residential accommodation is a general consideration with regard to the prevention of public nuisance. It goes on, 'The nature of cumulative impact is that it is cumulative and affects not only the immediate vicinity of the premises, but the wider area; thus the number of people visiting the premises, the nature of licensable activities and the lateness of operations have an impact on an area as a whole, irrespective of whether or not there is residential accommodation in proximity to the premises.' (our emphasis) It is important to note the policy relates to the global effects of alcohol licences in the whole impact zone and not just a part of it.

Appendix 3: Crime and Disorder

The Cumulative Impact Assessment 2020 presents overwhelming evidence of the year on year increase in cumulative impact in the West End Zone 1, *it highlights the rate of crime as 10 - 13 times higher between 6pm - 6am compared to the borough average.*

The level of crime, disorder and anti social behaviour continues to be a huge problem in Soho, the crime figures are high and rising. The recent police crime reports for April /May shows current levels of alcohol related assaults, sexual assaults and robberies within the West End area are now higher than at pre-COVID levels. The peak times for crime being between **10pm - 2am.**

In Soho the majority of robberies take place at night, Greek Street and the junction of Old Compton Street and Wardour Street being particular hotspots as people are targeted as they leave the numerous venues on these streets. Alongside the robberies and assaults drug dealing is a huge problem with groups of dealers congregating to sell drugs to people as they leave premises or as they pass by. There are more dealers in the area at night than during the day, this is directly linked to the large number of venues and people which creates the drugs market. Pickpockets also operate in the area, they are a part of a well organised criminal group who arrive in a van at night and disperse into Soho before returning to be driven away.

It is well known that intoxicated people become victims of crime, their vulnerability being exploited by gangs or individuals who are in Soho explicitly to target them. We believe patrons leaving this venue at night will be at high risk of becoming victims of crime.

Appendix 4 : The Application New Premises Licence

- Coffee shop and bar on ground floor, venue and auditorium in basement.
- During licensed hours guests will be able to purchase alcohol from the bar in the ground floor area and consume in that space or in the venue auditorium if a show is taking place.
- The venue auditorium will be used primarily for live performances, talks and rehearsals.

Appendix 5: The Soho Society

The Soho Society is a charitable company limited by guarantee established in 1972. The Society is a recognised amenity group and was formed to make Soho a better place to live, work or visit by preserving and enhancing the area's existing diversity of character and uses, and by improving its facilities, amenities and environment.

3. Policy & Guidance

The following policies within the City Of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy apply:

Policy HRS1 applies

- A. Applications within the core hours set out below in this policy will generally be granted for the relevant premises uses, subject to not being contrary to other policies in the Statement of Licensing Policy.
- B. Applications for hours outside the core hours set out in Clause C will be considered on their merits, subject to other relevant policies, and with particular regard to the following:
 - 1. The demonstration of compliance in the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1 associated with the likelihood of the effect of the grant of a licence for later or earlier hours on crime and disorder, public safety, public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.
 - 2. If the application is located within a Special Consideration Zone they have demonstrated that they have taken account of the issues identified in that area and provided adequate mitigation.
 - Whether there is residential accommodation in the proximity of the premises that would likely be adversely affected by premises being open or carrying out operations at the hours proposed.
 - 4. The proposed hours of the licensable activities and when customers will be permitted to remain on the premises.
 - 5. The proposed hours when any music, including incidental music, will be played.
 - 6. The hours when customers will be allowed to take food or drink outside the premises or be within open areas which form part of the premises.
 - 7. The existing hours of licensable activities and the past operation of the premises (if any) and hours of licensable premises in the vicinity.
 - 8. Whether customers and staff have adequate access to public transport when arriving at and leaving the premises, especially at night.
 - 9. The capacity of the premises.
 - 10. The type of use, recognising that some venues are more likely to impact the licensing objectives than others; for example, pubs and bars are higher risk than theatres, cinemas and other cultural and sporting venues due to the

- nature of the operation.
- 11. The Licensing Authority will take into account the active measures proposed for a 'winding down' period including arrangements for people to be collected from the premises to travel home safely.
- 12. Conditions on hours may be attached that require that the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises ceases a suitable period of time before customers are required to leave the premises.
- 13. The council, acting as the Licensing Authority, may reduce hours if, after review, it is necessary to impose conditions specifying shorter hours in order to promote the licensing objectives.
- 14. Specific days for non-standard hours should be identified and justified as part of the application to allow responsible authorities and interested parties to evaluate the impact that these licensable activities may have, and to plan accordingly.
- 15. The consideration of applications for later hours for Bank Holiday Mondays will take into account that later hours are generally of granted for preceding Sundays and that the next day is a working day. Non-specific days are expected to be covered by Temporary Event Notices or variation applications.
- C. For the purpose Clauses A and B above, the Core Hours for applications for each premises use type as defined within this policy are:
- 10a. Shops (all licensable activities that are provided as ancillary to the primary use of the premises as a shop except the off sale of alcohol)
 - Monday to Thursday: 9am to 11.30pm.
 - Friday and Saturday: 9am to Midnight.
 - Sunday: 9am to 10.30pm. Sundays immediately prior to a bank holiday: 9am to Midnight.

10b. Shops (off-sales of alcohol where it forms either the ancillary or primary use of the premises) Monday to Saturday: 8am to 11pm. Sunday: 9am to 10.30pm.

D. Core hours are when customers are permitted to be on the premises and therefore the maximum opening hours permitted will be to the same start and terminal hours for each of the days where licensable activity is permitted

Policy PB1 applies

A. Applications outside the West End Cumulative Zone will generally be granted subject to:

- 1. The application meeting the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.
- 2. The hours for licensable activities being within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1.
- 3. The operation of any delivery services for alcohol and/or latenight refreshment meeting the council's Ancillary Delivery of Alcohol and/or Late-Night Refreshment Policy DEL1.

- 4. The applicant has taken account of the Special Consideration Zones policy SCZ1 if the premises are located within a designated zone.
- 5. The application and operation of the venue meet the definition of a Public House or Bar in Clause D.
- B. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone other than:
 - 1. Applications to vary the existing licence hours within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1.
 - 2. Applications that seek to vary the existing licence so as to reduce the overall capacity of the premises.
- C. The applications referred to in Clause B1 and B2 will generally be granted subject to:
 - 1. The application meeting the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1, and/or,
 - 2. The operation of any delivery services for alcohol and/or latenight refreshment meeting the council's Ancillary Delivery of Alcohol and/or Late-Night Refreshment Policy DEL1.
 - 3. The application and operation of the venue continuing to meet the definition of a Public House or Bar in Clause D.
- D. For the purposes of this policy a Public House or Bar is defined as a premises, or part of a premises that's primary use is the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on those premises and/or for consumption off the premises for consumption outside the venue.

Policy CIP1 applies

It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone for: pubs and bars, fast food premises, and music and dancing and similar entertainment, other than applications to:

- 1. Vary the hours within Core Hours under Policy HRS1, and/or
- 2. Vary the licence to reduce the overall capacity of the premises.
- C. Applications for other premises types within the West End Cumulative Impact Zones will be subject to other policies within this statement and must demonstrate that they will not add to cumulative impact.
- D. For the purposes of this policy the premises types referred to in Clause A are defined within the relevant premises use policies within this statement.

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.





CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or

- less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions proposed by the applicant to form part of the operating schedule

9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team.

- 10. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.
- 11. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and will include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance.
- 12. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.
- 13. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
- 14. All door supervisors will correctly display their SIA licence so as to be visible when on duty at the premises.
- 15. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after (23.00) hours.
- 16. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 17. All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by (23.00) hours each day.
- 18. All tables and chairs shall be removed from the outside area by (23.00) hours each day.
- 19. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises is open.
- 20. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - b) all ejections of patrons
 - c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - d) any incidents of disorder
 - e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 21. As soon as possible, and in any event within 1 month from the grant of this licence, the premises shall join the local Pubwatch, Safer Business Network or other local crime reduction scheme approved by the police, and local radio scheme if available.
- 22. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged, operated and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the licensing authority where consent has not previously been given:
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - smoke machines and fog generators
 - pyrotechnics including fireworks
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - real flame

- strobe lighting.
- 23. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall not be permitted to take glass containers with them.
- 24. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- 25. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 26. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 27. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 28. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 29. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
- 30. All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features including materials used in finishing and furnishing shall be either non-combustible or be durably or inherently flame-retarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes (other than foyers), entertainment areas or function rooms, shall be non-combustible.
- 31. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the licensing authority upon written request.
 - a) Any permanent or temporary emergency lighting battery or system
 - b) Any permanent or temporary electrical installation
 - c) Any permanent or temporary emergency warning system
- 32. A copy of the premises' dispersal policy shall be made readily available at the premises for inspection by a police officer and/or an authorised officer of Westminster City Council. The
- 33. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 34. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance and exit of the premises or outside the building.
- 35. All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after (21:00) hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
- 36. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 37. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.

- 38. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number and/or is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
- 39. The licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by door staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction to the public highway.
- 40. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 41. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- 42. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 43. No person on behalf of the premises or on behalf or a person carrying or attempting to carry on a licensable activity shall cause, permit, employ or allow, directly or indirectly, whether on payment or otherwise, any person(s) to importune, solicit or tout members of the public on any public highway within the specified area outlined below for the purpose of bringing customers to the premises. The distribution of leaflets or similar promotional material is also prohibited within the specified area. For the purpose of this condition: 'Directly' means employ, have control of or instruct. 'Indirectly' means allowing / permitting the service of or through a third party. 'Specified' Area' means the area encompassed within (insert name of boundary roads.)
- 44. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are properly supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 45. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties, save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime.
- 46. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.



This representation is being made by recognised by WCC for the area within which these premises are located.

We object to this application as there is insufficient detail as to how it would not compromise the Licencing Objectives. The area in which the premises are located is extremely busy until very late at night being at the bottom of Edgware Road and within it's SCZ. It is near Marble Arch tube station and opposite Speaker's Corner.

There is no detail as to who the operator of the restaurant might be so it is impossible to know if the eventual operator is capable of managing the establishment well and in accordance with licencing laws. Therefore we object to this application for a licence outside Core Hours for both LNR and alcohol.

3. Policy & Guidance

The following policies within the City Of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy apply: Policy HRS1 applies A. Applications within the core hours set out below in this policy will generally be granted for the relevant premises uses, subject to not being contrary to other policies in the Statement of Licensing Policy. B. Applications for hours outside the core hours set out in Clause C will be considered on their merits, subject to other relevant policies, and with particular regard to the following: 1. The demonstration of compliance in the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1 associated with the likelihood of the effect of the grant of a licence for later or earlier hours on crime and disorder, public safety, public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. 2. If the application is located within a Special Consideration Zone they have demonstrated that they have taken account of the issues identified in that area and provided adequate mitigation. 3. Whether there is residential accommodation in the proximity of the premises that would likely be adversely affected by premises being open or carrying out operations at the hours proposed. 4. The proposed hours of the licensable activities and when customers will be permitted to remain on the premises. 5. The proposed hours when any music, including incidental music, will be played. 6. The hours when customers will be allowed to take food or drink outside the premises or be within open areas which form part of the premises. 7. The existing hours of licensable activities and the past operation of the premises (if any) and hours of licensable premises in the 8. Whether customers and staff have adequate access to public transport when arriving at and leaving the premises, especially at

The application and operation of the venue meeting the definition of a restaurant as per Clause C. C. For the purposes of this policy a restaurant is defined as: 1. A premises in which customers are shown to their table or

the customer will select a table themselves to which food is either served to them or they have collected themselves. 2. Which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at a table. 3. Which do not provide any takeaway service of food and/or drink for immediate consumption, except if provided via an ancillary delivery service to customers at their residential or workplace address. 4. Where alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are bona fide taking substantial table meals and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. 5. The sale and consumption of alcohol prior to such meals may be in a bar area but must also be ancillary to the taking of such meal

4. Equality Implications

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 9. All doors and windows to be kept closed after 23:00 hours except for immediate access and egress of persons.
- 10. There shall be no take-away of hot food or hot drink after 23.00 hours.
- 11. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only save when consumed at the outside tables and chairs shown on the licence plan
- 12. No off sales after 23:00 Monday to Saturday or 22:30 Sunday.
- 13. All tables and chairs shall be removed from the outside area by (23.00) hours each day.
- 14. No deliveries to the premises shall be made between the hours of 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours.
- 15. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance areas or outside the premises building.
- 16. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 17. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal.
- 18. Identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 19. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 20. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - a. all crimes reported to the venue
 - b. all ejections of patrons
 - c. any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - d. any incidents of disorder
 - e. all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - f. any faults in the CCTV system,
 - g. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - h. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 21. A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

- 22. Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 23. Save for the ground floor, the premises shall only operate as a restaurant
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery, (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

- 24. On the ground floor, the supply of alcohol on the premises shall only be to a person seated
- 25. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall be limited to (X) persons at any one time.
- 25. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re- enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- 26. Food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 27. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 28. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the capacity of the premises has been determined by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the licensing authority has replaced this condition with a condition detailing the capacity so determined.
- 29. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where there are minor changes to the premises layout during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.
- 30. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed (x) persons. (Final figure shall be determined on clearance of 'works' conditions and shall be based on whichever gives the lower figure from an assessment of safe capacity or provision of sanitary accommodation but it shall not be more than x).
