#### **Summary** 1.

1.1 This report seeks approval for the expenditure of £17,764.20 from the Ward Budget in order to commission:

The installation and maintenance of 130 hanging baskets throughout the Maida Vale ward in June and October 2014.

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## 1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007. The extension to the ward budget programme was agreed in March 2010 for continuation until March 2014.
- 1.2 The renewal of the ward budget programme for the years 2014-2018 was agreed in June 2014.
- 1.3 Budget provision of £46,000 for the financial year 2014/15 exists to fund ward based projects.

## 2. Proposed Projects

2.1 £17,764.20 will fund the installation and maintenance of 130 hanging baskets throughout the Maida Vale ward in June and again in October.

## 3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 To date £3,399 has been committed from the 2014/15 ward budget for Maida Vale.
- 3.2 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £17,764.20 and leaves £24,836.80 available for future allocation, taking into account the funds committed as detailed in 3.1.

## 4. Legal Implications

4.1 The proposals accordingly involve expenditure which is within the City Council's power, and within the guidelines for the use of Ward Budgets.

## 5. Outstanding Issues

5.1 Councillor Thomas Crockett and Councillor Jan Prendergast agree to the expenditure. Councillor Rita Begum has neither agreed nor disagreed with the expenditure.

#### 6. Consultation

- 6.1 The proposal has been agreed by two of the three ward members.
- 6.2 The proposal for the installation of hanging baskets has been drawn up and verified following consultation with the provider, Windowflowers, Finance and Legal.

## 7. Equalities

7.1 The proposals in this report will support the Council's wider equalities and diversity agenda by focusing on addressing local issues with enhanced local engagement.

### 8. Reason for Decision

8.1 The expenditure is expected to help address the priority of 'greening' throughout the Maida Vale ward.
