The applicant has submitted a floor plan for the basement and ground floor; these have no drawing numbers and have not been dated. This representation is based on the plans and Operating Schedule submitted.

1. The Supply of Alcohol for consumption 'on' the premises Monday to Saturday 12:00-22:00 hours and Sunday 12:00-20:00 hours.

I wish to make the following representations in relation to the above application:

1. The Supply of Alcohol will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the stress area, and may impact upon Public Safety.

The applicant has provided additional information and conditions with the operating schedule which are being considered but does not fully address the concerns of Environmental Health.

I write to make a relevant representation to the above application on behalf of The Soho Society.

The Soho Society objects to this application as it is currently presented, on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder and cumulative impact in the West End Stress Area.

## **About The Soho Society**

The Soho Society is a charitable company limited by guarantee established in 1972. The society is a recognised amenity group and was formed to make Soho a better place to live, work or visit by preserving and enhancing the area's existing diversity of character and uses, and by improving its facilities, amenities and environment. In particular, the society supports the Westminster City Council's policies, including the cumulative impact policy, as set out in the Statement of Licensing Policy.

## New licensed premises in the West End Stress Area

The proposal is for a new licensed premises in the West End Stress Area. The new Sale by Retail of Alcohol On Premises licensable activity is of concern, with reference to Westminster City Council stress area and cumulative impact policy. Such new licenses should be prohibited. These venues destroy residential amenity over a wide area through noise nuisance as patrons disperse. It is therefore felt necessary that should this license be permitted, conditions must be applied to prevent problematic vertical drinking:

MC39 The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.

MC41 Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

### Licensing policy

This area has been identified by the Westminster City Council (2.4.1 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, as amended) as under stress because the cumulative effect of the concentration of late night and drink led premises and night cafes has led to serious problems of disorder and/or public nuisance affecting residents, visitors and other businesses.

The policies in relation to the stress areas are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole (2.4.5 of the policy). The policies are intended to be strict and will only be overridden in genuinely exceptional circumstances (2.4.2 of the policy). The growth in the entertainment industry in Soho has led to a marked deterioration in the quality of life and well-being of local residents and it has jeopardised the sustainability of the community. Soho has a substantial residential community and many of these residents suffer from problems such as, but not limited to, high levels of noise nuisance, problems with waste, urinating and defecating in the streets, threats to public safety, anti-social behaviour, crime and disorder and the change in character of historic areas. For the reasons I have set out, we believe that the application, if granted in its present form, would fail to promote the licensing objectives of prevention of public nuisance and prevention of crime and disorder. I respectfully urge the Licensing Sub-Committee to reject this application.

Please let me know if any proposals are made to amend the application; particularly in respect of the hours sought or any further conditions proposed.





Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to you with regards to the above premises and the recent application by the proprietors for a license to sell alcohol on their premises.

I am currently a resident in the property above the premises in question (No.26 Frith Street), and I have been resident here for 3 years (since September 2012). Upon learning that the salon had applied for the above mentioned license, I approached them to discuss why they had applied for such, how this would change the way in which the salon operated and any potential effects to myself and the other residents of our house above the premises.

I have enjoyed a very good neighbourly relationship with the owners and their staff over the years I have been resident here and they were happy to take the time to explain to me what they wanted to do with their license, if successful, in terms of simply offering alcoholic refreshment to their clientele and remaining to operate completely as a salon still, as opposed to opening a 'bar' in the traditional sense i.e. somewhere where people meet to drink.

I must say that I have always found their clientele to be the sort of people who I suspect would have a drink for refreshment (as I suppose would be rather welcome whilst having any of the various treatments) as opposed to those who would frequent a premises for drinking to get drunk. The idea of the area where drinks would be prepared – the basement – was also appealing in terms of it not being open to public view and therein creating no issues surrounding passing drinking trade.

Most importantly, however, our conversation did allay any fears that I had with regards to concerns over disturbance, any unruly behaviour (as is sometimes associated with bars) or our personal safety as a result of that behaviour or indeed any of the families that frequent or live in the area.

In conclusion, I would like to finish by saying that I would have no objections to the approval of the application or hesitation in recommending the granting of the subsequent license. During my tenure at this property if have found Julia and Stroo Olofsson (and indeed their staff) to be professional, responsible and considerate to us (the residents/neighbours) in their professional capacity and as business owners. On a personal note, I would also like to say they are very welcoming and warm people and generally a pleasure to be in the company of as the occasion has arisen.

I trust this is of use and helps when reviewing the approval.

I am a Soho resident and have lived in Ingestre Court, Soho since 2002. I have known Julia and Stroo for around fifteen years since I have been a client of the establishments they have worked in. 







































## **APPENDIX 4**

## Original Proposed Conditions by applicant

The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of the *premises* as a *hairdressers* 

Alcohol may only be sold to and consumed by (a) patrons attending the premises for, and ancillary to, haircuts and hairstyling and/or (b) in the basement area outlined in blue by members of a private club and their bona fide guests (not exceeding (3) guests per member). No person shall be admitted to membership of the private club or be entitled to take advantage of any of the privileges of membership without an interval of at least 48 hours between their nomination or application for membership and their admission

A list of the names and addresses of members of the Club shall be kept on the premises at all times together with a book showing the names and dates of attendance of any guests introduced by members. Both the list and the book shall be produced on demand for inspection by the police or an authorised officer of the Council.

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly

A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity

All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day.

During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business

No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) on the following day.

No deliveries to the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) on the following day

There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence

No unauthorised advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services shall be inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or be distributed to the public

A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.

The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.

The basement capacity shall not exceed 25 persons (excluding staff) with the overall premises capacity not exceeding 30 persons (excluding staff).

\*There shall be no self-service of alcohol

\*All drinks served at hairdressing stations shall be done so by waitress/waiter service

The Licence will have no effect until the Licensing Authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the District Surveyor's Association – Technical Standards for Places of Entertainment and the reasonable requirements of Westminster Environmental Health Consultation Team, at which time this condition will be removed from the Licence

Prior to the Licence taking effect, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the LFEPA, Environmental Health Consultation Team, the Police and the Licensing Authority
