I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the above premises.

The premises are situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area as stated in City of Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy.

The applicant has submitted a ground floor and basement plan, titled with the address, drawing number 03(01) and 03(02) respectively and dated 15/03/16.

This representation is based on the plans and Operating Schedule submitted.

The applicant is seeking the following licensable activities on the **ground floor and basement**:

- 1. The Supply of Alcohol for consumption 'on' and 'off' the premises Sunday to Thursday 10:00-23:30 hours and Friday and Saturday 08:00-01:00 hours.
- 2. The provision of Late Night Refreshment 'indoors' Sunday to Thursday 23:00-00:00 hours and Friday and Saturday 23:00-01:00 hours.
- 3. The provision or Recorded Music 'indoors' Sunday to Thursday 08:00-23:30 hours and Friday and Saturday 08:00-00:30 hours.
- 4. To allow the above provisions from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

I wish to make the following representations in relation to the above application:

1. The Supply of Alcohol may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area and may impact on Public Safety.

- 2. The provision of Late Night Refreshment may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area.
- 3. The provision of Recorded Music may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area.
- 4. The seasonal variations may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area.

The applicant has proposed conditions within the operating schedule which are being considered. Further conditions may be proposed by Environmental Health in order to help prevent Public Nuisance and protect Public Safety.

The granting of the new Premises Licence as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area and may impact on Public Safety.

I write to make a relevant representation to the above application on behalf of The Soho Society.

The Soho Society objects to this application as it is currently presented, on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder and cumulative impact in the West End Stress Area.

About The Soho Society

The Soho Society is a charitable company limited by guarantee established in 1972. The society is a recognised amenity group and was formed to make Soho a better place to live, work or visit by preserving and enhancing the area's existing diversity of character and uses, and by improving its facilities, amenities and environment. In particular, the society supports the Westminster City Council's policies, including the cumulative impact policy, as set out in the Statement of Licensing Policy.

New licensed premises in the West End Cumulative Impact Area

The proposal is for a new licensed premises in the West End Cumulative Impact Area. The new Sale by Retail of Alcohol On Premises licensable activity is of particular concern, with reference to Westminster City Council stress area and cumulative impact policy. Such new licenses (in particular where not ancillary to food) should be prohibited. These venues destroy residential amenity over a wide area through noise nuisance as patrons disperse.

Noise Strategy: "Protecting and enhancing tranquil areas

The proximity to Golden Square, where such uses have been restricted, is noted. Golden Square open space should be protected using objective of the 2010-2015 Noise Strategy: "Protecting and enhancing tranquil areas" and "The council wishes to reduce noise pollution and its impacts at all times, but in terms of specific improvements to tranquil areas there will be a particular focus on day-time and evening when utility of open spaces is at its highest."

Hours of operation

The proposal includes licensable activities, including sale of alcohol, outside of Westminster core hours. The premises are in the West End Stress Area. There are private homes in nearby buildings,

and residents in the immediate area are subject to noise and general nuisance every night of the week. We therefore feel it is necessary to keep the operating hours within defined core hours, namely Monday to Thursday 10am - 11.30pm, Friday and Saturday 10am - 12 midnight and Sunday 10am - 10.30 pm.

Licensing policy

This area has been identified by the Westminster City Council (2.4.1 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, as amended) as under stress because the cumulative effect of the concentration of late night and drink led premises and night cafes has led to serious problems of disorder and/or public nuisance affecting residents, visitors and other businesses.

The policies in relation to the stress areas are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole (2.4.5 of the policy). The policies are intended to be strict and will only be overridden in genuinely exceptional circumstances (2.4.2 of the policy). The growth in the entertainment industry in Soho has led to a marked deterioration in the quality of life and well-being of local residents and it has jeopardised the sustainability of the community. Soho has a substantial residential community and many of these residents suffer from problems such as, but not limited to, high levels of noise nuisance, problems with waste, urinating and defecating in the streets, threats to public safety, anti-social behaviour, crime and disorder and the change in character of historic areas. For the reasons I have set out, we believe that the application, if granted in its present form, would fail to promote the licensing objectives of prevention of public nuisance and prevention of crime and disorder. I respectfully urge the Licensing Sub-Committee to reject this application.

Please let me know if any proposals are made to amend the application; particularly in respect of the hours sought or any further conditions proposed.

In the last 3 years in the area close to our flats, 30 licensed premises have opened. Cumulative Impact has reached unprecedented levels.

Now a NEW licence in proposed asking for a 1am finish setting an unwelcome precedent. Enough is enough. Lower James Street is a main exit from Soho via heavily congested Sherwood and Denman Streets. How can Westminster consider planting a new licence for a restaurant for 125 people in this location?

Lower James Street is a narrow road with a metre wide pavement. To see what will happen if this licence is granted, check The Crown Pub next door where pedestrians have no access to the right hand pavement because of outside drinkers.

The application is for a 'restaurant' though other Foxlow websites have a bar in the basement. This application is beyond core hours morning and night, and contrary to policy HRS1. How is it possible that these hours have been passed by Planning? We are aware that the Licensing Authority is not bound by Planning.

Why 8am for alcohol on Fridays and Saturdays? Why 8am for recorded music? Why recorded music at all if this is a restaurant?

Planning states no takeaway at all rather than no takeaway 'for immediate consumption' in condition 15(iv). Clients will have more difficulty finding transport away from the cumulative impact area and add to noise already present from other bars which are difficult to identify in the melee that exists. We do not want these problems increased.

The approved capacity on the planning permission is 125 persons. This is therefore a significant addition to the numbers of people in the vicinity, particularly late at night. This application seeks to license a premises which has never been licensed under Licensing Act 2003 before and therefore has no licensed 'footprint'. It is a genuinely new application, rather than an application to replace an existing or former licensed premises. It is imperative that the scope of the licence and the conditions should be looked at in a local context (Matthew Taylor v

(1) Manchester City Council (2) TCG Bars Ltd [2012] EWHC 3467 (Admin)). An assessment should be made of what is reasonably acceptable in this particular area in terms of hours and activities. The hours proposed are not in keeping with the vicinity. Westminster, take care of the valuable legacy of these streets and the community who live and work in them.





Sale of alcohol Monday to Thursday 10:00 hours until 23:30 hours; Friday and Saturday 10:00 hours until 00:00 hours and Sunday 12:00 hours until 22:30 hours

Provision of late night refreshment Monday to Thursday 23:00 hours until 23:30 hours and Friday and Saturday 23:00 hours until 00:00 hours

Opening hours of the premises for licensable activities Monday to Thursday 10:00 hours until 23:30 hours; Friday and Saturday 10:00 hours until 00:00 hours and Sunday 12:00 hours until 22:30 hours

Amended Conditions

- 1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
- A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 3. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 4. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 5. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 6. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 7. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

- 8. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- 9. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 125 persons.
- 10. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 on the following day.
- 11.A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - b) all ejections of patrons
 - c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - d) any incidents of disorder
 - e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 13. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 on the following day.
- 14. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant:
 - i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
 - Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

- 15. The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment from the terminal hour for those activities on New Year's Eve through to the commencement time for those activities on New Year's Day.
- 16. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the reasonable requirements of Westminster Environmental Health Consultation Team, at which time this condition shall be removed from the licence by the licensing authority.
- 17. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.

There is no licence or appeal history for the premises

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -


- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 11. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 12. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 13. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 14. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 15. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 16. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- 17. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed (125) persons.
- 18. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) on the following day.

- 19.A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 20. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - b) all ejections of patrons
 - c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - d) any incidents of disorder
 - e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 21. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) on the following day.
- 22. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant:
 - a) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - b) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - c) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - d) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - e) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - f) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
 - g) Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.
- 23. The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment from the terminal hour for those activities on New Year's Eve through to the commencement time for those activities on New Year's Day.
- 24. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the reasonable requirements of Westminster Environmental Health Consultation Team, at which time this condition shall be removed from the licence by the licensing authority.
- 25. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
