I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence.

The premises are in the West End Cumulative Impact area.

The applicant has submitted a floor plan of the Ground Floor without date or reference. This representation is based on the plans and operating schedule submitted.

I wish to make the following representation

1. The hours and activity requested will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End Cl Area.

The applicant has not provided any conditions to address the licensing objectives or to minimise the impact in the West End CI area.

UPDATE: On 08 December 2016, the Environmental Health Consultations Team proposed the conditions set out in Appendix 4. There has been no response to date from the applicant about the proposed conditions.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue is situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area, a locality where there is traditionally high levels of crime and disorder. We have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

However I will suggest some conditions which if you are minded to agree to, I will reconsider our position.

UPDATE: On 24 November 2016, the Metropolitan Police Service proposed the conditions set out in Appendix 4 and these were accepted by the applicant on 07 December 2016 so now form part of the operating schedule. The representation has not been withdrawn to date.

I write to make a relevant representation to the above application on behalf of The Soho Society.

The Soho Society objects to this application as it is currently presented, on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder, and cumulative impact in the West End Cumulative Impact Area.

About The Soho Society

The Soho Society is a charitable company limited by guarantee established in 1972. The society is a recognised amenity group and was formed to make Soho a better place to live, work or visit by preserving and enhancing the area's existing diversity of character and uses, and by improving its facilities, amenities and environment. In particular, the society supports the Westminster City Council's policies, including the cumulative impact policy, as set out in the Statement of Licensing Policy 2016.

Hours of operation

This application fails to promote the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder, and public nuisance. Recent Metropolitan Police crime statistics show high levels of theft, theft from person, anti-social behaviour, drugs and sexual offenses in the area. There are private homes in nearby buildings, and residents in the immediate area are subject to noise and general nuisance every night of the week. It is therefore felt necessary that hours of late night refreshment are not extended.

Statement of Licensing Policy

The following are sections of the licensing policy are appropriate to this application:

2.4.23 'The extension of hours beyond core hours is of concern as there are greater problems of late night transport and disturbance. Late at night there is less masking background noise and disturbance is greater if people are trying to sleep or are woken up.'

2.2.12 'Late night noise is often unsettling; particularly shouting and screaming. Some of this is associated with aggression and assaults but most of it is 'high spirits'. It is impossible to distinguish between the reasons for these noises and in any case, it is very disturbing late at night. The degree of nuisance caused by noise increases with the lateness of the hour; especially if it disturbs or prevents sleep.'

Licensing policy and cumulative impact

The Licensing Authority recognises in its Statement of Licensing Policy 2016 that Westminster has a substantial residential population and that the Council has a duty to protect it from nuisance (Policy 2.2.10).

This area has been identified by the City Council (Policy 2.4.1)) as a cumulative impact area because the cumulative effect of the concentration of late night and drink led premises and/or night cafes has led to serious problems of disorder and/or public nuisance affecting residents, visitors and other businesses. The Policy states that the extent of crime and disorder and public nuisance...arises from the number of people there late at night; a particular number of them being intoxicated, especially in the West End Cumulative Impact Area (Policy 2.4.1).

The policies in relation to the stress areas are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole (Policy 2.4.5). The policies are intended to be strict and will only be overridden in 'genuinely exceptional circumstances' (Policy 2.4.2).

The growth in the entertainment industry in Soho has led to a marked deterioration in the quality of life and well-being of local residents and it has jeopardised the sustainability of the community. Soho has a substantial residential community and many of these residents suffer from the problems identified in the 'Characteristics of Cumulative Impact Areas' (Policy Appendix 14). These include, but are not limited to, high levels of noise nuisance, problems with waste, urinating and defecating in the streets, threats to public safety, anti-social behaviour, crime and disorder and the change in character of historic areas.

Conclusion

Para 9.37 of the s182 Guidance requires the licensing authority to determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community.

For the reasons I have set out, we believe that the application, if granted in its present form, would fail to promote the licensing objectives of prevention of public nuisance and prevention of crime and disorder. I respectfully urge the Licensing Sub-Committee to reject this application.



Appendix 4

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1. The prevention of crime and disorder

The store work closely with the company partners and Asset Protection to identify and minimise risks to the partners and the public. The store itself has monitored CCTV.

2. Public safety

In addition to the security mentioned above, the company promotes a minimum number of staff on shift at all times to enhance public safety.

3. The prevention of public nuisance

In addition to the measures described in promoting the second licensing objective, our view is that our store provides a relaxing environment in which measures of the public can utilise as a haven. Behaviour or anything promoting disturbances or nuisance is not encouraged or tolerated at Starbucks.

4. The protection of children from harm

In addition to these measures described in promoting the second licensing objective, our employees are instructed to report any unaccompanied children under the age of 16 to security. Also on every shift a member of staff is likely to administer first aid if necessary.

Conditions proposed by the Police and accepted by the applicant


The following conditions were proposed by the police on 24 November 2016 and were accepted by the applicant on 07 December 2016 so now form part of their operating schedule:

- 5. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 6. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 7. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 8. After midnight there shall be no glass drinkware sold by the premises. At this time, any glass drinkware will be cleared from customer area, once it is no longer in use.
- 9. There shall be one SIA door supervisor, to be employed on Thursday, Friday and Saturdays from 23:00 hours until the end of licensable hours. The Door Supervisor's SIA licence shall be displayed at all times.
- 10. Outside tables and chairs shall be removed or rendered unusable by 23:00 hours

Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health

- 11. The number of persons accommodated at the premises (excluding staff) shall not exceed:
 - Ground floor 50 persons
- 12. There shall be no takeaway of hot food or hot drink after 23:00 hours.
- 13. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- 14. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

- 15. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 16. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 17. All waste is to be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 18. No rubbish including bottles shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours.
