As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011 the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact and as such a number of policy points must be considered.

The premises, as applied for, falls within PB2 on the Council's Statement of Licensing policy. Please be aware that it is the Council's policy to refuse applications of this nature when they fall in the cumulative impact area. No additional information has been received which addresses these policy concerns and you must therefore demonstrate how this premises and the additional people will not add to the cumulative impact within the cumulative impact area

We note that following your meeting with Mr Koduah, from Environmental Health, you have agreed with withdraw regulated entertainment from your application and have reduced the hours to 23:00 Monday to Sunday.

We also acknowledge that the licensable activities (sale by retail of alcohol on and off the premises) as applied for fall within core hours from Monday to Saturday; however we would also ask that you consider reducing the terminal hour for Sundays to 22:30 in accordance with the council's core hours policy (HRS1) for Sundays.

Furthermore, we would ask that you consider adding the following conditions to the operating schedule on the licence to support the council's policy relating to sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises. If the below conditions are adopted then the premises would be better considered in line with the Council's policy RNT2 in which applications will generally be granted subject to other policies and therefore you will only have to demonstrate how the additional capacity of the premises will not add to cumulative impact within the cumulative impact area as opposed to both the capacity and the operation of the premises. For your information and assistance I attach a copy of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy that I have referred to above.

Suggested conditions:

- The premises shall only operate as a restaurant
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal. Food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

- The number of persons seated in the premises at any one time shall not exceed xx persons excluding staff.
- There shall be no self-service of alcohol
- A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS hologram.

Please accept this as a formal objection and we look forward to discussing this application further with you.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue is situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area, a locality where there is traditionally high levels of crime and disorder. We have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

I refer to the application for a New Premises Licence number for the above premises located in the West End Cumulative Impact area.

This representation is based on plans of basement, mezzanine and ground floors dated June 2011 submitted with the operating schedule.

The applicant is seeking the following licensable activity:

Supply of alcohol for consumption "On & Off" the premises Monday to Sunday from 12:00 hours to 23:00 hours.

I wish to make the following representations:

The supply of alcohol and the hours requested may have the likely effect of increasing Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End Cumulative Impact area.

The granting of the new premises licence as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and may impact on Public Safety within the West End Cumulative Impact area.

There are safety concerns around means of escape from the basement which passes though a food preparation kitchen, a fire high risk area.

Though applicant has indicated a total seating capacity of 80 for the entire premises, there are only two public wcs and this is insistent with Table 10 of BS 6465 - 2006 + A1:2009. The safety and capacity concerns shall be discussed further with the District Surveyor.

The applicant has provided conditions in support of the application but these do not fully address the concerns of Environmental Health and additional conditions may be proposed.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 9. Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so that they are aware of the premises licence and the requirements to meet the 4 licensing objectives with particular attention to:
 - a) No selling of alcohol to underage people
 - b) No drunk and disorderly behaviour on the premises area
 - c) Vigilance in preventing the use and sale of illegal drugs at the retail area
 - d) No violent and anti-social behaviour
 - e) No harm to children
- 10. Operating Schedule providing the hours of operation and licensable activities during those hours.
- 11. Designated premises supervisor confirmed it is obligated to be in day-to-day control of the premises, to provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record), to make or authorise each sale.
- 12. CCTV system installed with recording option available.
- 13. Secure exterior window will be fixed to ensure that shop front is safe and secure at all times.
- 14. CCTV system installed to monitor entrances, exits and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective.
- 15. A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.
- 16. Clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.
- 17. No selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

- 18. Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.
- 19. Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the retail unit area.
- 20. Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner and prevent drinking alcohol at the retail unit (ex. canned or bottled beer).
- 21. Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.
- 22. Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements.
- 23. Training and implementation of underage ID checks.
- 24. A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statue, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.
- 25. All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air condition, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition.
- 26. Noise reduction measures to address the public nuisance objective.
- 27. Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 28. Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.
- 29. The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents.
- 30. Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises.
- 31. Customers will not be admitted to premises above opening hours.
- 32. The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11.00pm. This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises.

- 33. Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.
- 34. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided in the local vicinity.
- 35. All the details provided in Training Record Book available the retail unit. Log Book will be kept upon the premises all the time.
- 36. Nothing belong existing Health & Safety requirements.
- 37. Alcohol will be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only.

Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health

- 38. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption, and
 - (v) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

(Proposed condition agreed by Applicant)

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

- 39. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only
- 40. Sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be supplied with, and ancillary to a take-away meal.
- 41. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period
- 42. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue

- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g)) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 43. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 44. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 45. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises is open.
- 46. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 24 persons.
- 47. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- 48. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 49. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 50. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 51. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 52. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 53. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.


- 54. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 55. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 56. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 57. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 58. No licensable activities shall take place at the basement floor until the basement floor has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time the Licensing Authority shall remove this condition from the Licence.

Conditions proposed by the Licensing Authority and agreed with the applicant and so as to be incorporated within the operating schedule

- 59. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
- 60. The number of persons seated in the premises at any one time shall not exceed xx persons excluding staff.
- 61. There shall be no self-service of alcohol.
- 62. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
