<p>I refer to the application for the variation of the Premises Licence for the above mentioned premises. These premises are located within the West End Cumulative Impact area. I have considered the information that you have provided within and accompanying this application. I have also considered the proposed variation in line with the relevant policies within the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy dated January 2016.</p> <p>The licensee is seeking to vary their licence to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Extend Late Night Refreshment by 1 hour to terminate at 04:00 hours on Friday and Saturday in relation to The Espresso Bar2. Extend the opening times by 1 hour to 04:00 hours on Friday and Saturday in relation to The Espresso Bar3. Make changes to the layout as per the new plan submitted with the application <p>Following consideration of the application and how it may affect the Licensing Objectives and meeting the requirements of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy I wish to make the following representations:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. To extend Late Night Refreshment by 1 hour may have the likely effect of increasing Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End Cumulative Impact area2. To extend the opening hours by 1 hour may have the likely effect of increasing Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End Cumulative Impact area3. The proposed changes to layout of the premises have not been detailed within the application and this may impact on public Safety within the West End Cumulative Impact area. <p>The fine details of the changes to the layout of the premises being sought has not been provided within and accompanying this application. Additional information regarding the proposed layout changes and its likely impact on seating capacity of the licenced outside area will be discussed further.</p> <p>The extended hours being sought may make the premises a destination likely to attract large groups of customers many of whom may have been consuming alcohol in pubs, bars or night clubs sometimes some distance away. This will increase the risk of public nuisance arising from noise and littering. As presented, the application will therefore increase the risk of Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End Cumulative Impact area.</p> <p>It is my view that there is insufficient information to address the concerns that I have raised above within and accompanying this application. As such if further information is not forthcoming, the granting of this variation, as presented, would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and may affect Public Safety within the West End</p>	

Cumulative Impact area.

The applicant has **NOT** provided any condition(s) to mitigate the risks of public nuisance and public safety likely to arise from this application. This do not address the concerns of Environmental Health. Conditions may be proposed and discussed as part of further discussion with this application.

The applicant is asked to contact the undersigned to arrange a site visit to assess the premises to ensure the premises is satisfactory and following this, additional conditions may be recommended by Environmental Health to support the licensing objectives Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

On 7th August 2018 the Environmental Health proposed the following condition:

1. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance

With reference to the above, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be making a representation against this application.

The venue is situated within the Cumulative Impact Area. It is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives in relation to The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

There are no conditions contained within the operating schedule, I have listed the following conditions the Police would like to see on the Premises Licence. Should it be granted

I have taken the opportunity to list the conditions we would like to see on the Licence should it be granted, if these are agreed i may be in a position to review my represent

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons

- (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Following the agreement of the above conditions the Metropolitan Police Service have withdrawn their representation.

I write in relation to the application to vary the premises licence for Rimini Coffee Bar, situated at 47 Cranbourn Street.

As a responsible authority under section 13(4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011 the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The application seeks to vary the licence in relation to the Espresso Bar by extending Late Night Refreshment by 1 hour to terminate at 04:00 on Fridays and Saturdays. The current licence permits late night refreshment on Friday to Saturday from 23:00 to 03:00.

The premises is within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such a number of policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and FFP2.

Policy FFP2 states that "It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas, other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1."

Paragraph 2.5.20 of the policy states that "the grant of variations... for fast food premises in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be limited to exceptional circumstances". It will be for the Licensing Sub-Committee to determine whether the applicant has demonstrated any genuinely exceptional circumstances that would allow to depart from policy.

Further discussions will be held with the applicant and forwarded on for Members information.

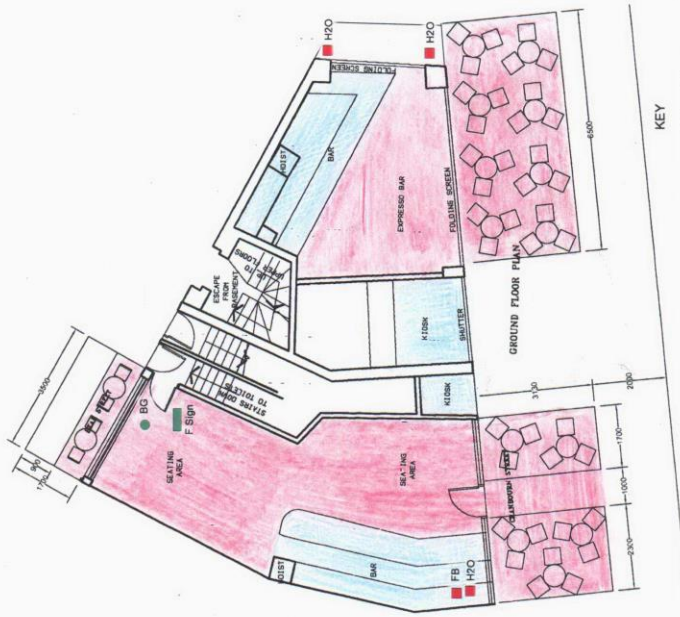

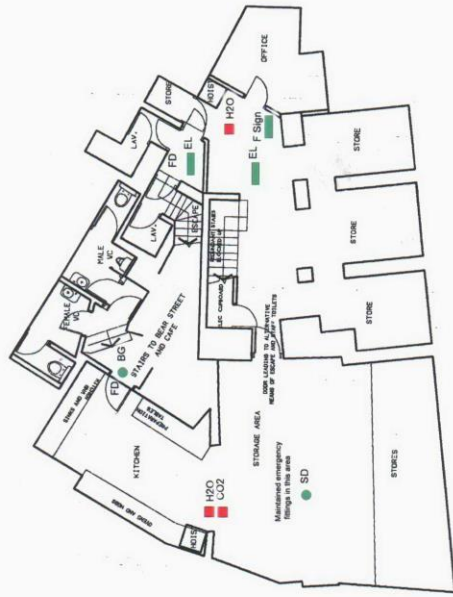

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Conditions relating to Late Night Refreshment:

4. This licence is subject to all the former regulations made by Westminster City Council prescribing standard conditions for annual night café licences, effective from 1 October 2001

Café Rimini (47 Cranbourn Street)

5. The premises may be kept open for the purposes of this licence from 12.30am to 2am on each of the days Monday to Friday and 12.30am to 4am on each of the days Saturday and Sunday
6. The total number of persons accommodated at the premises (excluding staff) shall not exceed 30.

7. The premises may be kept open for the purposes of this licence from 11pm on Sundays to 01.30am on the day following, from 11pm on each of the days Monday to Thursday to 2am on the day following and from 11pm on each of the days Friday to Saturday to 3am on the day following.

Conditions related to Sale of Alcohol

9. In the area hatched black on the deposited plan intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied on the premises otherwise than to persons taking table meals there and for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to his meal.
10. Suitable beverages, other than intoxicating liquor including drinking water, shall be equally available for consumption with or otherwise as an ancillary to food supplied in the premises.
11. Service of intoxicating liquor shall be by Waiter/waitress service only.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments.

For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.

- (a) during the first thirty minutes in Café Rimini and twenty minutes in Espresso Bar after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking table meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

13. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
- (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
 - (d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

14. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day'

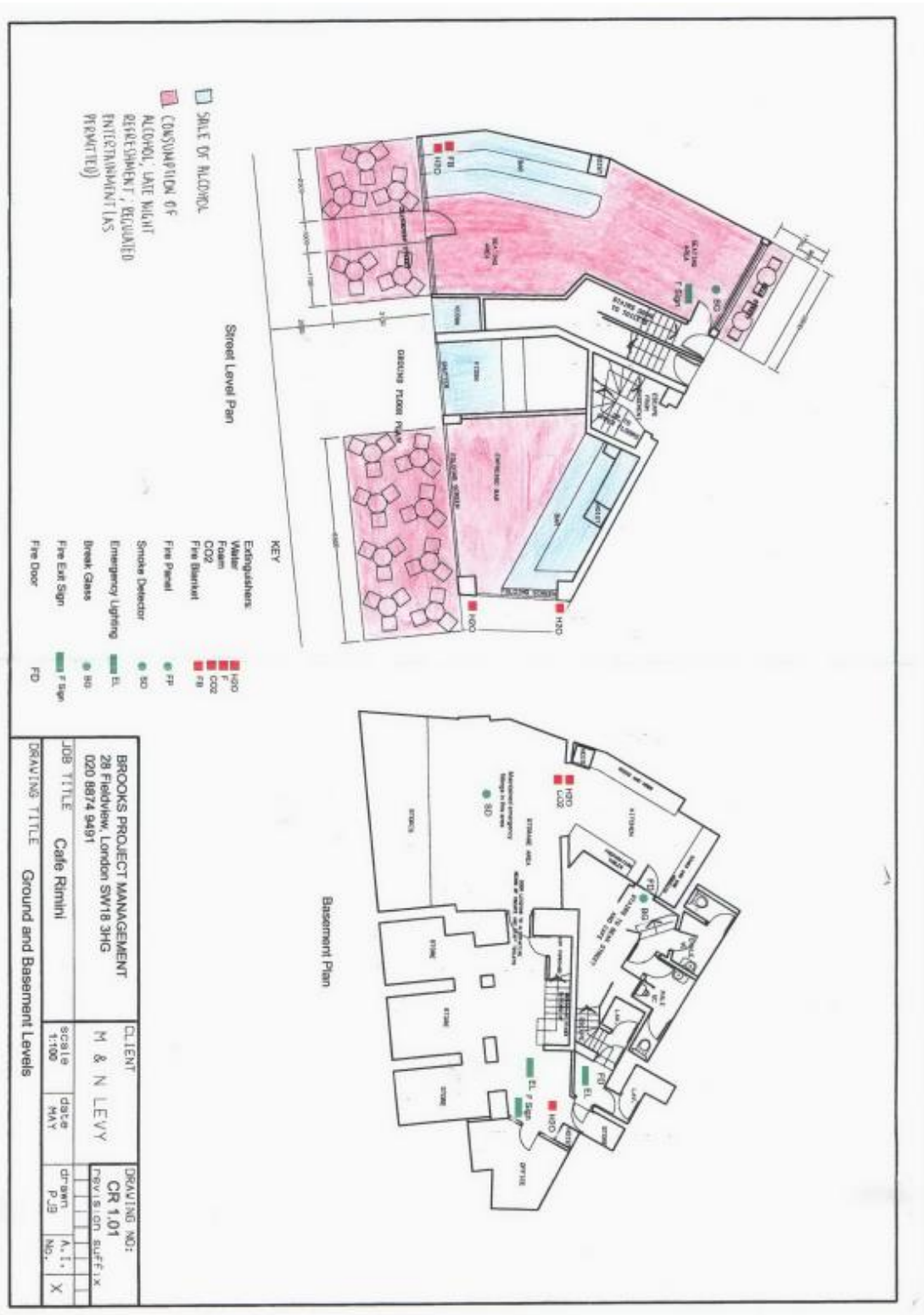

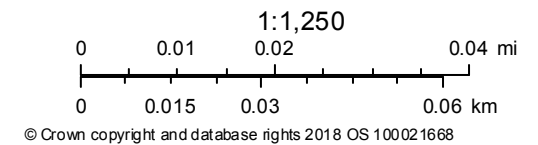
