

## Mental Health and the Criminal Justice System task group scoping paper

Objective(s)

<b>T</b> imescale	
Key questions	What are the experiences people with mental health problems have of the criminal justice system?  Is the criminal justice system able to treat people with mental health issues?  Are their needs met in a way that enables them to access justice?  Are alternative pathways available and utilised?
Intended outcomes	To produce a report on the experiences people with mental health problems have of the criminal justice system focusing on:  1) How the criminal justice system deals with people with mental health problems; or 2) Are people with mental health problems caught up in the criminal justice system when they should be cared for elsewhere?
