<b>Applicant submissions:</b>	<p>In response to the representation from the Licensing Authority, the applicant provided the following submissions:</p> <p>Thank you for your letter and the points you have highlighted for us to consider. I have addressed the areas of concern below and hopefully this will give a better idea of what we are proposing. We are aiming to have minimal social impact given the nature of the business model in the coming description.</p> <p><b>Business overview:</b> Salon 64 already provides a multi-functional, lifestyle space for our clientele. We are seeking to amend this to create an environment to further the experience of current client base. The opportunity for our clients to be members of Salon64. The objective is to deliver a premium offer to our members in our relaxed social concept.</p> <p><b>Public Nuisance:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- We understand there may be an impression that this variation in license may lead to higher traffic in this street area.</li> <li>- We will have permanently placed dispersal &amp; noise courtesy notices in place to limit noise fallout with our residential neighbours in mind.</li> <li>- Our client base and perspective membership base come from valid and returning existing clients</li> </ul> <p><b>Prevention of Crime and Disorder</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- To gain access to Salon64 pass 7pm there will be a closed-door policy with only patrons granted access being clientele</li> </ul>		

with booked appointments or Members. There will be no “walk ins” pass this time.

- We have been in operation for over 18 months, we have 100% track record of no complaints within this time frame. We are in good relations with our neighbours and would like to think we contribute and add value to the immediate area.
- The biometric identification system will halt any persons not a registered member.

**Public Safety:**

- We are engaging in Members’ Club inspired business model and so apart from appointment booked clientele entering the premises from 8am to 7pm, past 7pm there will be a strict ‘member’s only’ policy enforced. We will not deviate from this.
- We have 24 hr camera surveillance on the property indoor and outdoor
- The front door of the premises will have a camera which will also be in operation 24hrs a day.

**Protection of Children from Harm**

- There will be a restriction on over 18’s sitting by any area where alcohol will be served. There are areas within the premises to seat minors away from any bar service areas.
- Our membership will only extend to those over 21 years of age
- We will operate a Challenge 25 in accordance with Westminster Licensing for any daytime client. Daytime being before 19:00, beginning 12:00 in this context.

**Opening times:**

- While the Salon opens at 08:00 for appointments.
- Between 08:00 – 12:00 Monday to Saturday inclusive we will only serve teas, coffees and soft drinks.
- We will not serve any alcoholic beverages before 12:00 Monday to Saturday

The Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to consider reducing the terminal hour for licensable activities to be in line with those of Westminster’s Core Hours Policy, HRS1.

**Core Hours – for sale of alcohol**

Monday to Thursday: 11:00 – 23:30 - we would like 12:00 to 23:30

Friday and Saturday: 11:00 – 00:00 - we would like 12:00 to 23.30

Sunday: 12:00 to 22:30 the venue is closed on this day

The proposed hours above are within those of Westminster’s Core Hours Policy, HRS1. Before 12:00 no licensable activities will be permitted/taking place on the premises.

With all of the above considered and actioned, we fully believe that Salon 64 will not cause undue stress to the West End Area of Cumulative Impact Area. As the business is limited in terms of covers, 50. We are restricting ourselves to a custom base of

<p>I write in relation to the application submitted for a variation of the premises licence for Salon 64, situated at 14 Bateman Street.</p> <p>As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority has considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Public Nuisance</li> <li>• Prevention of Crime &amp; Disorder</li> <li>• Public Safety</li> <li>• Protection of Children from harm</li> </ul> <p>The application seeks the following variation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To add recorded music as a licensable activity, permitting the operating times of Monday to Saturday 09:00 to 23:30</li> <li>• To vary the operating times for the sale by retail of alcohol from Monday to Saturday 11:00 to 20:00 to Monday to Saturday 12:00 to 23:30.</li> <li>• To vary the opening hours from Monday to Saturday 08:00 to 22:30 to Monday to Saturday 08:00 to 23:30.</li> </ul>	

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1 and HRS1.

At present, the terminal operating hour applied for licensable activities currently fall outside of Westminster's core hours. For premises for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises, Westminster's core hours are as follows:

Monday to Thursday: 10:00 – 23:30  
Friday and Saturday: 10:00 – 00:00  
Sunday: 12:00 to 22:30

The Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to consider reducing the terminal hour for licensable activities to be in line with those of Westminster's Core Hours Policy, HRS1.

The Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to provide further submissions as to how the operation of the premises, coupled with the proposed operating hours, will not add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact areas.

Please accept this as a formal representation.

**On 30 April, the Licensing Authority made the following further submissions**

The application falls within the Council's policy PB2 which states at paragraph 2.5.23 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy that "the grant of variations or new licences for pubs and bars in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be limited to exceptional circumstances".

The Licensing Authority notes that the proposed extension in hours sought for licensable activities fall within Westminster's core hours, and that current conditions on the premises licence restrict the operation of the premises, namely:

Condition 11: Alcohol may only be sold to and consumed by patrons attending the premises and using the facilities in relation to, and ancillary to, hairdressing and other cosmetic services provided by the salon.

Condition 12: Only champagne, cocktails, whisky and wine to be served.

Condition 16: All drinks served at hairdressing/treatment stations shall be done by waiter/waitress service.

Condition 19: Licence intended for use by Salon 64 only and to be surrendered when they leave the premises.

Paragraph 2.4.21 of the policy states that "where applications for licenses to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises are made and... (iii) when the sale of alcohol is not permitted beyond 20:00 hours; then permitting the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises is unlikely to add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact area." The Licensing Authority require the applicant to provide further submissions to evidence how the proposed extension of licensable hours from 20:00 to 23:30 will not add to cumulative impact in the West End cumulative impact area, whilst also providing any exceptional circumstances to grant the application as per policy PB2.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving any further submissions from the applicant in relation to the above concerns.

**On 8 May 2019, the Licensing Authority made the following further submissions**

Upon further consideration of this application, the Licensing Authority are satisfied that the

application is not seeking for the premises to be used exclusively or primarily for the supply of alcohol for consumption on those premises. Therefore, policy PB2 is not applicable to this application.

However, the application does still need to be considered under the Council's CIP1 policy. It will be for Licensing Sub-Committee Members to determine whether the operation of the premises as a hairdressers, coupled with the proposed operating hours, will not add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact areas.

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I refer to the application for a variation of the Premises Licence for the above premises which is located in the West End Cumulative Impact Area.

The applicant has submitted plans of the premises showing the Ground Floor and Lower Ground Floor.

**The applicant is seeking the following variations:**

1. Change the hours for the Supply of Supply of Alcohol 'on' the premises to 12:00 to 23:30 hours Monday to Saturday.
2. Provision of Recorded Music indoors from 09:00 to 23:30 hours Monday to Saturday.

**I wish to make the following representation based on the plans and Operating Schedule submitted:**

1. The change in hours requested for the Supply of Alcohol may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the West End Cumulative Impact Area
2. The provision of Recorded Music may have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the West End Cumulative Impact Area

Environmental Health also make the following further comments:

- The applicant has offered some undertakings in the operating schedule (some of which will need to be converted into enforceable conditions) but these may be insufficient to be consistent with the Cumulative Impact Area policy.
- Clarification is needed on the level of sound insulation and the maximum music noise levels to ensure noise nuisance is not caused.
- Further information is requested on the proposed biometric system, eg is it temporary.
- Clarification is also needed if there have been any layout changes and if the different licensing activities shall be carried out in the whole of the premises.

The applicant is therefore requested to arrange a site visit with the undersigned to discuss all of the above after which Environmental Health may propose additional conditions to allay its concerns

I write to make a relevant representation to the above application on behalf of ██████████  
██████████

██████████ objects to this application as it is currently presented, on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance and prevention of crime and disorder.

██████████

██████████ is a charitable company limited by guarantee established in 1972. The society is a recognised amenity group and was formed to make Soho a better place to live, work or visit by preserving and enhancing the area's existing diversity of character and uses, and by improving its facilities, amenities and environment. In particular, the society supports the Westminster City Council's policies, including the cumulative impact policy, as set out in the Statement of Licensing Policy.

**Application summary**

Amend hours of the licensable activities for the premises. The hours proposed would be an amendment to the beginning of licensable activities from 11.00 to 12.00 and ending time for licensable activities from 20.00 to 23.30 'core hours'.

**The application**

The current licence states the opening hours to be 08.00-22.30, therefore this is an increase of one hour to the closing time.

The application states that there are 18 covers, but also states the number of people expected to attend is 50. It is unclear if this is an error or misunderstanding.

We object to the application to the extension of the terminal hour from 20.00 to 23.30. We object on the grounds that the application will fail to promote the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance: Soho is at the forefront of the late night economy in Westminster with its numerous restaurants, bars and entertainment establishments. The area is densely populated at night with people drinking on the street creating loud levels of noise, causing disturbance and anti social behavior. Over the past number of years Soho has seen a significant increase in crime and disorder and in particular drug dealing and drug taking on the streets, this activity is concentrated in this part of Soho alongside other criminal activity which is attracted by the night time economy and high numbers of intoxicated people. The proposed terminal hour of 23.30 will add to the number of intoxicated people leaving the premises at the same time as other customers leaving the two public houses in the street. In our view the proposed extended terminal hour will fail to promote the licensing objectives and therefore we feel it is necessary to keep to the current licensed operating hours and conditions.

We are concerned this application will set a precedent for other retail units in Soho, allowing the sale of alcohol late into the night and thereby increasing crime and disorder, public nuisance

and adding to the cumulative impact.

#### Licensing policy

This area has been identified by the Westminster City Council (2.4.1 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, as amended) as under stress because the cumulative effect of the concentration of late night and drink led premises and night cafes has led to serious problems of disorder and/or public nuisance affecting residents, visitors and other businesses.

The policies in relation to the stress areas are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licenses on the area as a whole (2.4.5 of the policy). The policies are intended to be strict and will only be overridden in genuinely exceptional circumstances (2.4.2 of the policy). The growth in the entertainment industry in Soho has led to a marked deterioration in the quality of life and well-being of local residents and it has jeopardised the sustainability of the community. Soho has a substantial residential community and many of these residents suffer from problems such as, but not limited to, high levels of noise nuisance, problems with waste, urinating and defecating in the streets, threats to public safety, anti-social behavior, crime and disorder and the change in character of historic areas.

For the reasons I have set out, we believe that the application, if granted in its present form, would fail to promote the licensing objectives of prevention of public nuisance and the prevention of crime and disorder. However, if you are minded to grant this licence, we would not object to a terminal hour of 22.00.

#### **On 24 April, [REDACTED] submitted the following supplementary comments expanding on their initial representation:**

I visited Salon 64 with another member of the Licensing Committee on 17th April to discuss this application. We were surprised to be told that the plan is to create a private members club from 20.00 - 23.30 hours, this information was not on the application form. If this information had been available at the time and coupled with a capacity of 50 people, we would not have proposed a terminal hour of 22.00 hours if the committee had been minded to approve the application. I would be grateful if this amendment to our objection is included following this new information.

We support the Statement of Licensing Policy 2016, 2.4.21 whereby in such premises the sale of alcohol is not permitted beyond 20.00 hours. There are other examples in Soho where this policy has been applied to retail businesses, examples being Blade, Frith Street, a hair salon which applied for a private members club and was granted a terminal hour of 20.00 hours and the retail unit Fiorucci, Brewer Street also granted to 20.00 hours. Our view is this policy should also be applied in this case.

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#### 4. Equality Implications

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
  - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
    - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
  - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule


