I write in relation to the application submitted for a variation of the premises licence for Zebrano, 18 Greek Street, London.

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The application seeks the following variations:

- To amend the licence plans with the introduction of a terrace at the rear of the premises building.
- To amend the existing capacity condition (current condition 21) to a fix capacity limit to the new terrace. The application does not propose an overall increase to the existing total capacity limit of 211 persons (excluding staff).
- Condition to read as follows:

The number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) shall no exceed:

Basement - 60

Ground Floor - 211

First Floor – 50

Terrace Area (To be agreed with Environmental Health Consultation Team)

Provided that the overall number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) shall not exceed 211 persons at any one time.

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various

policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1, RNT2 and PB2.

This application seeks to add a terrace area to the proposed plans. The Licensing Authority requires the applicant to provide further information into the operation of the proposed terrace. The applicant will also have to provide submissions as to how the operation of the proposed terrace area will not add to cumulative impact in the West End cumulative impact area, in accordance with policy CIP1.

The Licensing Authority requires information on the below bullet points.

Licensable Activities and Operating Hours

The licence already permits:

Performance of Dance, Live Music, Anything similar description to Live Music, Recorded Music or Performance of Dance

Monday to Saturday 09:00 to 03:30 Sunday 09:00 to 23:00

Sale by Retail of Alcohol Monday to Saturday 10:00 to 03:00 Sunday 12:00 to 22:30

Opening Hours of Premises Monday to Saturday 09:00 to 03:30 Sunday 09:00 to 23:00

Non-standard Timings: from the end of permitted hour on New Years Eve until the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

It is not clear from the application form whether the applicant is seeking for all of the above licensable activities and operating hours to be applied to the terrace area. The Licensing Authority requires the applicant to address this for clarity on what is sought by this application.

 The Licensing Authority notes that no capacity limit has been set for the terrace. However, the premises is subject to various conditions restricting the use of certain areas within the premises. Condition 21 reads as;

In the restaurant area hatched red on the deposited plan the supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.

The Licensing Authority would like the applicant to provide further submissions as to how the terrace area is to be operated and controlled, i.e. will the proposed terrace operate by way of waiter/waitress service or as a bar with vertical drinking?

Secondly, the Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to provide further submissions in regards to the proposed plans. Previously the licenced plans had a restaurant area hatched in red on the ground floor, which related to Condition 18, this area isn't specified within the new proposed plans.

 Condition Reads: In the restaurant area hatched red on the deposited plan the supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.

The Licensing Authority requires the applicant to confirm whether the applicant is seeking to

remove condition 18 from the premises licence as this has not been applied for as part of this variation application.

Until the applicant provides further submissions to the above, the Licensing Authority believes that this application falls under Policy PB2 which is the Licensing Authorities policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1. Paragraph 2.5.23 of the statement of licensing Policy states that the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of variations should be limited to exceptional circumstances.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving further submissions from the applicant in due course.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml, and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8. (i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

- 9. This licence is subject to all the former Rules of Management for Places of Public Entertainment licensed by Westminster City Council, in force from 4 September 1998 and incorporating amendments agreed by the Council on 25 October 1999, 30 June 2000, 16 January 2001 and 1 October 2001.
- 10. On New Year's Eve the premises can remain open for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment from the time when the provision of regulated entertainment must otherwise cease on New Year's Eve to the time when regulated entertainment can commence on New Year's Day (or until New Year's Eve where no regulated entertainment takes on New Year's Day).
- 11. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rules of Management No. 6 the premises may remain open for the purposes of this licence from 23.00 on each of the days Monday to Saturday to 03.30 on the day following.
- 12. All waste is collected from within the premises and not from the public highway.
- 13. The highway in the vicinity of the premises is swept at regular intervals whilst customers are queuing to enter the premises and also at the close of business and litter and sweeping collected, stored and disposed of in accordance with the approved refuse storage and disposal arrangements.
- 14. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 15. No unauthorised advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) is inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or is distributed on street to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services.
- 16. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- No payment shall be made by or on behalf of the licensees to any person for bringing customers into the premises.
- 18. In the restaurant area hatched red on the deposited plan the supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- 19. After 23.00 on Mondays to Fridays the sale of alcohol shall at all times be ancillary to the provision of music and dancing and substantial refreshment. The sale of alcohol shall cease when music and dancing ends or is not provided.
- 20. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05.00 on New Year's Day.
- 21. The number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) shall not exceed 60 in the basement, 211 on the ground floor and 50 on the first floor with the overall number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) shall not exceed 211 persons at any one time.
- 22. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open

for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewings of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.


- 23. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 24. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - b) all ejection of patrons
 - c) any complaints received







1. Introduction

- 1.1. Zebrano's new terraces will provide an attractive al fresco area for customers to enjoy their food and drink.
- 1.2. The terraces comprise a larger terrace at upper ground floor level and a smaller terrace at first floor level.
- 1.3. The terraces will also become a new controlled designated smoking area within the building curtilage. This will reduce pressure on the existing smoking area on Greek Street.
- 1.4. Comprehensive management controls will be implemented to ensure the safe use of the terraces by customers and at all times ensure the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

2. Licence Conditions

- 2.1. The following licence conditions apply in respect of the use of the terraces:
 - 2.1.1. The overall number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) in the whole of the premises shall not exceed 211 at any one with the following local restrictions:

Basement – 60 Ground floor – 211 First floor internal area – 50 Lower terrace – 30 Upper terrace – 20

- 2.1.2. Staff shall monitor and supervise the terrace areas and institute suitable methods of controlled entry to these areas at any time they are at capacity. From 9.00 pm until close on Thursday, Friday and Saturday the staff shall include a minimum of two SIA registered door supervisors who shall be on duty to supervise the terrace areas, first floor areas and corridors.
- 2.1.3. There shall be no regulated entertainment on the terraces.
- 2.1.4. No licensable activities shall be provided on the upper terrace after 00:00 hours and there shall be no customers on the upper terrace after 00:30 hours
- 2.2. All staff and SIA supervisors will be trained on premises licence condition compliance.

3. Terrace Management

- 3.1. The terraces will at all times be set out with tables and chairs to encourage customers to remain seated and control the amount of floorspace available for standing. Particularly during daytime hours, customers are expected to use the terraces as a seated area to enjoy Zebrano's food and drinks menu.
- 3.2. Subject to compliance with the capacity limits (the lower terrace 30, upper terrace 20), customers may be permitted to stand. Standing is expected during busier trading periods and when the terraces are used for customer smoking.

- 3.3. Staff and SIA supervisors will continually monitor the number of persons using the terraces to prevent overcrowding and ensure compliance with the premises licence conditions. During busier periods, staff and/or SIA supervisors will use clickers to monitor the terrace capacity. This will safeguard customer safety and keep any noise created by customers under control. The terraces will also be covered by newly installed state of the art HD CCTV cameras.
- 3.4. SIA supervisors will be employed subject to the premises licence conditions. Additional SIA supervisors will be employed during busier trading periods and subject to an ongoing risk assessment. SIA supervisors will be specifically tasked with proactively managing the terraces and adjoining corridors to ensure a professional and responsible management of customers using the terraces.
- 3.5. These team members will also be specifically tasked with ensuring the free movement of customers along the corridors and terrace areas to avoid overcrowding. Customers will not be permitted to loiter in the corridors.
- 3.6. If necessary, colour coded wristbands will be used to identify customers using the terraces and their time of entry.
- 3.7. Although Zebrano is not aware of any local resident accommodation overlooking the terraces, staff and SIA supervisors will be trained to ensure the terraces are used responsibly alongside the area's local residents. Any customer behaviour that may risk causing a nuisance to local residents will not be tolerated.
- 3.8. Licensable activities will cease at midnight on the upper terrace to facilitate a controlled closure of the terraces and reduce customer noise levels later in the evening.

4. Smoking

- 4.1. A primary objective of the terraces is to provide a new controlled smoking area within the building curtilage that is easier to manage. Demand on the existing smoking area on Greek Street can be high and presents a risk of adversely impacting upon the licensing objectives.
- 4.2. Smokers will be closely supervised to ensure their behaviour does not create a risk of causing a nuisance to neighbours. Smokers will be encouraged to return inside the premises as soon as they have finished smoking during busier trading periods.


