<p>I write in relation to the application submitted for a new premises licence for 63-64 Frith Street, London.</p> <p>As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Public Nuisance</li> <li>• Prevention of Crime &amp; Disorder</li> <li>• Public Safety</li> <li>• Protection of children from harm</li> </ul> <p>The application seeks the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Recorded Music – Indoors</b> Monday to Sunday 00:00 to 00:00</li> <li>• <b>Late Night Refreshment Indoors</b> Monday to Saturday 23:00 to 00:30 Sunday 23:00 to 00:00</li> </ul>

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1, PB2 and RNT2.

The Licensing Authority require the applicant to provide submissions as to how the operation of the premises will not add to cumulative impact in the West End cumulative impact area, in accordance with policy CIP1.

At present, the operating hours applied for licensable activities currently fall outside of Westminster's core hours. For premises for the supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises and other licensable activities, we encourage that the applicant to reduce the hours to be within Westminster's Core hours as stated below;

Monday to Thursday 10:00 to 23:30

Friday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:00

Sunday 12:00 to 22:30

**Other Licensable activities**

Monday to Thursday 09:00 to 23:30

Friday to Saturday 09:00 to 00:00

Sunday 09:00 to 22:30

The Licensing Authority notes that the applicant has applied for the Sale of Retail of Alcohol on and off the premises, as part of the application form the applicant described the proposed operation of the premises as a restaurant. The Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to provide further submissions and information as to the proposed operation of 'Off Sales' from the premises and how this is intended to be operated and controlled from the premises, to ensure that there is no adverse impact within the West End Cumulative impact area. The Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to consider module condition MC17 to minimise impact within the cumulative impact area.

MC 17 – All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.

As previously mentioned the applicant stated in the application form the intention to operate the premises as a restaurant. Currently the operating schedule suggests the premises will operate as a Pub/Bar with the potential for a restaurant operation, so the application must be considered under the Council's PB2 Policy. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1.

In paragraph 2.5.23 the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of new licences for pubs and bars in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be limited to exceptional circumstances.

The Licensing Authority note that the premises benefit from a premises licence under 17/08562/LIPDPS. Condition 9 in the current licence states the below;

9. In the area shown as restaurant on plans intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied otherwise than to persons taking table meals there and for consumption by any such person as ancillary to his meal.

In the application form the applicant has stated that the new application is on the same terms and conditions to licence 17/08562/LIPDPS. The Licensing Authority has reviewed both the application and the licence and would like the applicant to provide further information on where the restaurant area is within the new proposed plans.

The applicant has not proposed to surrendered licence 17/08562/LIPDPS as part of this new premises licence application. Does the applicant have capacity to surrender the licence?

The Licensing Authority is treating this as a new application so determining it on its individual merit.

The Licensing Authority encourage the applicant to replace condition 9 with the Council's Model Condition 66 (full restaurant condition) that would enable the application to be considered and brought in line with policy RNT2. Model Condition 66 reads as follows:

*The premises shall only operate as a restaurant*

- (i) in which customers are shown to their table,*
- (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,*
- (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,*
- (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,*
- (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and*
- (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.*

*Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.*

Policy RNT2 requires the applicant to demonstrate how the operation of the premises as a restaurant will not add to cumulative impact in the West End Cumulative Impact Area.

The Licensing Authority would like confirmation whether the applicant is agreeable to the above proposed conditions to be able to assess any further relevant policy considerations.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving further submissions from the applicant in due course.

I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the above premises. The premises has benefitted from a premises licence in the past 17/08562/LIPDPS.

**The premises are situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area as stated in City of Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy.**

This representation is based on the Operating Schedule and the submitted plans, for the ground floor (drawing number Frith\_LD.1) and basement (drawing number Frith\_LD) both dated 20/03/17.

The applicant is seeking the following on the **ground floor and basement**:

1. To allow the Supply of Alcohol 'on' and 'off' the premises Monday to Saturday 10:00-00:00 hours and Sunday 12:00-23:30 hours. To also allow variations at Christmas, New Year and Good Friday.
2. To allow Late Night Refreshment 'indoors' Monday-Saturday 23:00-00:00 hours and Sunday 23:00-00:00hours. To also allow from the end of New Year's Eve to the start of New Year's Day.
3. To allow the provision of recorded music indoors unrestricted

I wish to make the following representation in relation to the above application:

1. The provision of the Supply of Alcohol may cause an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area, it may also impact on Public Safety.
2. The provision of Late Night Refreshment may cause an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area.
3. The provision of recorded music may cause an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area.

The applicant has proposed conditions within the Operating Schedule which are being considered. Further conditions may be proposed by Environmental Health in order to help prevent Public Nuisance and protect Public Safety.

**The granting of the new Premises Licence as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area and may impact on Public Safety.**

#### 4. Equality Implications

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.



## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
  - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
    - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
  - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
  - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.




