<p>I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the above premises which is situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area.</p> <p>The applicant has submitted plans of the premises, ref drawing no.: 3195_013L, revision A, dated 14/8/2018.</p> <p>The following licensable activities are being sought:</p> <p>1. To provide for the Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off' the premises between 10:00 and 23.30 Monday to Thursday, 10:00 to 00:00 Friday and Saturday and 12:00 to 22:30 Sunday. Also non-standard times of: From end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to start of permitted hours on New Year's Day and Sundays prior to bank/public holidays 12:00 to 00:00 hours.</p> <p>2. Provision of Late Night Refreshment 'Indoors' between 23:00 and 23.30 Monday Thursday and 23:00 to 00:00 Friday and Saturday. Also non-standard times of: From end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to start of permitted hours on New Year's Day and Sundays prior to bank/public holidays 23:00 to 00:00 hours.</p> <p>I wish to make the following representations based on the plans submitted and the supporting operating schedule:</p> <p>1. The hours requested for and the Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off' the premises may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the West End Cumulative Impact Area</p> <p>2. The hours requested for Late Night Refreshment may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the West End Cumulative Impact Area</p> <p>Environmental Health also makes the following further comments:</p> <p>i. Some conditions have been offered in the operating schedule and these are under consideration as to whether they there are sufficient to allay Environmental Health concerns.</p> <p>ii. It is noted that operating under Model Condition 66 has not been offered which is a normal requirement for an application requesting 'On' sales of Alcohol in a Cumulative Impact Area. In addition provision has also been requested for 10 persons to be provided alcohol without food.</p> <p>iii. It is unclear if the premises has already been constructed for the proposed use and will in any case need to be inspected for Public Safety prior to commencement of any licensable activities</p>	

iv. The food preparation/cooking facilities will also need to be assessed in order to evaluate whether Public Nuisance may arise from cooking odour and/or from the operation of any plant and machinery.

v. Clarification is needed on the provision of sanitary accommodation arrangements for both staff and customers. This must be, for any proposed capacity, in line with at least the minimum requirements as set out in British Standard 6465 in order to help prevent an increase in Public Nuisance in the West End Cumulative Impact Area.

The applicant is therefore requested to contact the undersigned to discuss the above issues and arrange a site visit after which Environmental Health may propose additional conditions for the proposed use.

It is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder.

The venue is situated in the West End cumulative impact area, a locality where there is traditionally high crime and disorder, and we have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

I write in relation to the application submitted for a new premises licence for 49-51 Carnaby Street, London.

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The application seeks the following:

- **Late Night Refreshment - Indoors**
Monday to Thursday 23:00 to 23:30
Friday to Saturday 23:00 to 00:00

Non Standard Timings

From 23:00 on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

On Sundays prior to bank holidays/public holidays 23:00 to 00:00

- **Supply of Alcohol On and Off Premises**

Monday to Thursday 10:00 to 23:30

Friday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:00

Sunday 12:00 to 22:30

Non Standard Timings

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and PB2.

The applicant has stated in the application form that they seek to operate this premises as a restaurant/café. The Licensing Authority notes that the applicant has proposed the following condition:

“Save for a maximum of no more than 10 person at any time, the supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.”

In paragraph 2.5.3 the policy states ‘The Council is particularly concerned that restaurant premises in the cumulative impact areas do not, even in part, come to operate as bars and particularly not as “vertical drinking” premises where customers consume alcohol standing throughout the evening. The council, however, is not minded to relax conditions for restaurants where alcohol may only be consumed by persons as an ancillary to their substantial table meal.

The Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to provide information as to the proposed operation of the premises and specifically with how the alcohol will be served to these 10 persons, i.e. will the premises also operate by way of a bar with vertical drinking? Or will alcohol be served by waiter/waitress service to those seated?

This specific aspect of the application is seeking to operate part of the premises as a bar falls under the Council's policy PB2 which states that the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of new licences for pubs and bars in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be limited to exceptional circumstances.

The Licensing Authority would like to encourage the applicant to consider bringing the application in line with the Council's restaurant policy, RNT2. In order to do so, the Licensing Authority suggests the applicant considers the below condition to replace the aforementioned condition relating to the necessity of a table meal.

The premises shall only operate as a restaurant

- (i) in which customers are shown to their table,*
- (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,*
- (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,*
- (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption*
- (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and*
- (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.*

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

The Licensing Authority notes that the applicant has applied for the sale by retail of alcohol both on and off the premises to be within Westminster's core hours. The Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to provide further submissions and information as to the proposed operation of 'Off Sales' from the premises and how this is intended to be operated and controlled, to ensure that there is no adverse impact within the West End Cumulative impact area.

The applicant has proposed the below conditions in their operating schedule.

- The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be restricted to*
- a) alcohol consumed by persons who are seated in a designated external area within Kingly Court; or*
 - b) in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.*

To minimise impact within the cumulative impact area, the Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to consider module condition MC70A.

MC70A - The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be restricted to alcohol consumed by persons who are seated in a designated external in Kingly Court and bona fide taking a substantial table meal, and to where the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such a meal, and where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only.

The Licensing Authority would like confirmation whether the applicant is agreeable to the above proposed conditions to be able to assess any further relevant policy considerations.

The Licensing Authority require the applicant to provide submissions as to how the operation of the premises will not add to cumulative impact in the West End cumulative impact area, in accordance with policy CIP1.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving further submissions from the applicant in due course.

<p>Comments on 10 drinkers without food in Kingly Court</p> <p>When we met the licensees we were shown a designated seating area in Kingly Court where drinking without food will take place. It is very important that drinkers sit down and are discreet as vertical drinking would severely affect the whole nature of Kingly Court.</p> <p>There is a public right of way passing the entrance to this restaurant. It is important that the licensee is aware of this and that the pathway is kept clear at all times.</p> <p>Resident history has been that Kingly Court is a very well controlled area with its own security team and response to any issues has been professional and speedy.</p> <p>On that basis we are happy to support this application.</p>

4. Equality Implications

- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or

less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions proposed by the applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule

9. Save for a maximum of no more than 10 persons at any time, the supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
10. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available at all times.
11. The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be restricted to
 - a) alcohol consumed by persons who are seated in a designated external area within Kingly Court; or
 - b) in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.

Alternative condition 11 proposed by Licensing Authority so as to form part of the operating schedule

11. **The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be restricted to alcohol consumed by persons who are seated in a designated external in Kingly Court and bona fide taking a substantial table meal, and to where the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such a meal, and where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only.**
12. No off sales after 23.00.
13. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
14. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - i. all crimes reported to the venue
 - ii. all ejections of patrons
 - iii. any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - iv. any incidents of disorder
 - v. all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - vi. any faults in the CCTV system,
 - vii. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - viii. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
16. A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

17. All outside tables and chairs shall be removed/rendered unusable by 23.00 each day.
18. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
19. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
20. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 on the following day.
21. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 07.00 hours on the following day unless collections are arranged during the times for the Council's own commercial waste collection service for the street.
22. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the capacity of the premises has been determined by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the licensing authority has replaced this condition on the licence with a condition detailing the capacity so determined.
23. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the Licensing Authority. If there are minor changes during the course of construction new plans shall be submitted with the application to remove this condition.

Conditions proposed by the Licensing Service so as to form part of the operating schedule

24. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.
