Subject:	Expenditure from the Ward Budgets for the Digital Inclusion Project run by Age UK Westminster.

Summary

This report seeks approval for the expenditure of £12,000 from the Churchill and Maida Vale Ward Budgets in order to commission the Digital Inclusion Project run by Age UK Westminster. The project will consist of classroom sessions which aim to help older people become less digitally isolated, and in doing so, increase their confidence in using digital devices and accessing online resources. The sessions will be 2-hours long and held twice monthly, and each session will be allocated a topic of learning. The group learning sessions will be led by a skilled tutor followed by one-to-one sessions, where participants will be buddied with a highly skilled IT volunteer to try out what they have learned on their own device.

2. Recommendation

That the Cabinet Member for Sports, Culture & Community approves expenditure of £12,000 in respect of the above proposal detailed in the report.

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1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007.
- 1.2 Budget provision of £46,000 per ward for the financial year 2018/19 exists to fund ward-based projects.

2. Proposed Projects

- 2.1 £12,000 will contribute towards the costs of running Age UK Westminster's Digital Inclusion Project. The running costs of the project include the salary of the sessional worker, volunteer expenses and training costs, practical costs including publicity, space hire costs, office facility costs and project coordinator and management costs.
- 2.2 The project will consist of classroom sessions which aim to help older people become less digitally isolated, and in doing so, increase their confidence in using digital devices and accessing online resources. The sessions will be 2-hours long and held twice monthly, and each session will be allocated a topic of learning. The group learning sessions will be led by a skilled tutor followed by one-to-one sessions, where participants will be buddied with a highly skilled IT volunteer to try out what they have learned on their own device. Sessions will be held in accessible locations in Churchill and Maida Vale.

3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 Expenditure and approvals in process from the Churchill budget to date total £25,386.69 leaving £20,613.31 to be allocated.
- 3.2 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £6,000 and leaves £14,613.31 available for future allocation.
- 3.3 Expenditure and approvals in process from the Maida Vale budget to date total £19,968.09 leaving £26,031.91 to be allocated.
- 3.4 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £6,000 and leaves £20,031.91 available for future allocation.

4. Legal Implications

4.1 Section 1 of the Localism Act, aka "the general power of competence" enables authorities "to do anything that individuals generally may do". The proposals within this report are consistent with the Council exercising this power.

5. Outstanding Issues

5.1 None of the Ward Councillors stood aside or disapproved of the decision.

6. Consultation

- 6.1 The proposals have been agreed by all Councillors from all Wards involved
- 6.2 The proposal for the Digital Inclusion project has been drawn up and verified following consultation with Age UK Westminster and the Council's Finance and Legal Services Departments.

7. Equalities

7.1 The proposals in this report will support the Council's wider equalities and diversity agenda by focusing on addressing local issues with enhanced local engagement.
