<p>With reference to the above application I am writing to inform you that the Police, as a Responsible Authority, object to your application for a New Premises Licence as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Crime Prevention Objective. The venue is situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area, a locality where there is traditionally high crime and disorder. We have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area. There is insufficient detail in the operating schedule to address the Crime Prevention Objective.</p> <p>It is for these reasons that we are objecting to the application.</p>

1. The hours requested for the Supply of Alcohol will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the West End CIA.
2. The hours requested to permit the provision of late night refreshment will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End CIA.
3. The hours requested to permit the provision of regulated entertainment will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the West End CIA.

The applicant has stated that this application be treated as a shadow application and this is being considered.

On the 5 November 2019 Environmental Health withdrew their representation after being satisfied with the application and the provisions in place.

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and PB2.

The application has been made to be a 'shadow licence' to 19/03134/LIPVM. Paragraph 3.2.11 advises that applications that have been made for premises licences at premises where a licence is already in force. The "shadow licence" is made on the same terms to the licence already existing.

However paragraph 3.2.13 states that the council remains concerned however that the holding of additional licences has the potential to undermine the sanctions available to it in response to a review application under the Act. This would be the case if action was taken in respect of one of the licences in effect at the premises, but the premises continued to operate under the authority of a second licence which had not been affected by the review proceedings.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

10. Prior to 23:00 customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.
11. An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time that it is in use.
12. The number of persons permitted on the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 235 persons.
13. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
14. There shall be a Personal Licence Holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
15. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all other persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
16. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
17. The sale of alcohol shall be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
18. The consumption of alcohol on the premises shall cease 30 minutes after the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol.
19. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
20. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
21. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised session and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
22. All drinking vessels used in the venue shall be polycarbonate. All drinks in glass bottles are to be decanted into polycarbonate containers or polycarbonate carafes prior to being served, with the exception of champagne or bottles of spirits with a minimum size of seventy 70cl supplied by waiter/waitress service to tables. Staff shall clear all empty champagne and spirit bottles promptly from tables. Customers shall not be permitted to leave the table carrying such glass bottles or drink directly from the bottle. Notwithstanding this condition, with the written agreement of Westminster Police Licensing Team, a copy of which will be held at the premises reception, glass drinking vessels may be used for private or pre-booked events within the lounge/club area

23. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
24. All customers entering the premises shall have their ID scanned upon entry, save for when a biometric scanning system is in place (when fingerprint scanning will be required for all customers who have previously showed identification at the premises).  - a) From 23:00 hours, a minimum of 2 door supervisors shall be deployed with Body Worn Video Camera, capable of recording audio and video in any light condition as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. The video cameras shall be used until 30 minutes after closing whilst customers are dispersing.
 - b) All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
 - c) A Body worn video system shall be deployed immediately during any verbal altercation or use of force made by any member of door staff.
 - d) All door staff engaged in the use of Body Worn Video shall receive relevant training to ensure that they are confident in its use. A record shall be kept on the premises of which door staff have been trained. This record will be available to the Police or Licensing Authority for inspection upon request.
50. There shall be no admittance or re-admittance to the premises after 01:00 hours except for patrons permitted to temporarily leave the premises to smoke.
51. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to be committed) the management will immediately ensure that a) the police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay; b) all measures that a reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the police; c) the crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police; and d) such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.
