Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8 (i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licences have effect

Conditions relating to regulated entertainment

10. This licence is subject to all the former Rules of Management for Places of Public Entertainment licensed by Westminster City Council, in force from 4 September 1998 and incorporating amendments agreed by the Council on 25 October 1999, 30 June 2000, 16 January 2001 and 1 October 2001.
11. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule of Management No. 6 the premises may remain open for the purposes of this licence from 23:00 to midnight on Mondays and from 23:00 on each of the days Monday to Wednesday to 00:30am on the days following, from 23:00 on each of the days Thursday to Saturday to 01:00am on the day following and from 23:00 to midnight on Sundays.
12. On New Year's Eve the premises can remain open for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment from the time when the provision of regulated entertainment must otherwise cease on New Year's Eve to the time when regulated entertainment can commence on New Year's Day (or until midnight on New Year's Eve where no regulated entertainment takes place on New Year's Day).
13. The entertainment provided at the premises shall be of the type commonly known as DISCO Recorded Music and Live Bands.
14. The entertainment authorised under this licence shall remain ancillary to the main use of the premises as a restaurant.

15. A sound limiting device shall be located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of a authorised officer of the Environmental Health Services Community Protection Department so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the applicant only, and shall not be accessed by any other persons. The limiter shall not be altered without the prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
16. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without the prior knowledge of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service.
17. Any additional sound generating equipment shall not be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
18. A door supervisor shall remain outside the main exit of the premises at least 30 minutes prior to the closing until such time as all patrons have vacated the premises and dispersed.
19. All refuse is paid for, properly presented and cannot be left on the highway for more than 2.5 hours.
20. No unauthorised advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) is affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building structure, works, street furniture, tree, or other property, or is distributed on street to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services.
21. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time in the basement (excluding staff) shall not exceed: Ground Floor: 220 Basement: 190

Conditions related to sale of alcohol

(Applies to such parts of the basement and ground floor as are shown more particularly coloured and edged in red on the deposited plan)

22. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
23. A closed circuit television shall be installed, maintained and operated correctly as specified by the Metropolitan Police Crime prevention officer.
25. No striptease, no nudity and all persons on the premises to be decently attired.
26. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licensees to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
27. No gaming otherwise than by machines authorised under part III, Gaming Act, 1968.
28. The maximum numbers of persons, including staff, to be present in the licensed premises shall not exceed the numbers specified from time to time by the proper officer of the London Fire and Civil Defence Authority. The numbers currently specified: As to the basement 190 persons; As to the ground floor 220 persons.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments

29. (a) Subject to the following paragraphs, the permitted hours on weekdays shall commence at 10:00 and extend until 00:30 on the morning following, except that -

- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00:00 midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight; and
- (ii) on any day that music and dancing end between 00:00 midnight and 00:30, the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end;
- (b) The permitted hours on Sundays shall extend until 00:00.
- (c) The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
- (d) The permitted hours on New Year's Eve will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- (h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

30. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

31. If any entertainment is provided for children or if an entertainment is provided at which the majority of persons attending are children, then, if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100, it shall be the duty of the holder of the premises licence (or the holder of the club premises certificate):
 - (a) to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or to any part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate,
 - (b) to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or any part thereof, and
 - (c) to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children.
32. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

APPENDIX D

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICES

1. TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE PROCEDURE

- 1.1 Under s.100 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003 certain temporary events, which include licensable activities, are permitted under the Act if they are notified to the Council and the Police/Environmental Health by giving a 'Temporary Event Notice'. The notice must be given by the 'premises user' (usually the event organiser responsible for all aspects of the event).
- 1.2 Permitted temporary events are events that take place in any premises, open space or temporary structure. The event must consist of one or more licensable activities; and the premises must be used over a period of no longer than 168 hours, with no more than 499 people in attendance.
- 1.3 Licensable activities include the sale by retail of alcohol; the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late night refreshment (hot food or drink supplied between 11pm and 5am).
- 1.4 The premises user must send two copies of the temporary event notice to the Council, one copy to the environmental health department and one copy to the police leaving at least 10 clear working days before the event is due to begin. The Council must acknowledge receipt of the temporary event notice by the next working day.

2. NOTICE OF OBJECTION BY POLICE/ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

- 2.1 If the Police/ Environmental Health are satisfied that the event would undermine one or more of the licensing objectives, they must give a notice of objection stating their reasons as to why an objective would be undermined to the Council and premises user within 3 working days of receipt of the notice.

3. HEARING PROCEDURE FOLLOWING NOTICE OF OBJECTION BY POLICE/ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

- 3.1 The Sub-Committee is being asked to consider the notice of objection and hear any oral evidence given by or on behalf of the premises user and the Police/Environmental Health.
- 3.2 The Sub-Committee must consider whether to give a counter notice to the temporary event notice given by the premises user if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 3.3 The Council must convene a hearing to consider the notice of objection and give at least two day's notice to the premises user and the police.
- 3.4 The Sub-Committee must either reject the notice of objection to allow the event to take place, or issue a counter notice to prevent the event from taking place, or where or, after hearing the objections, allow the notice but attach relevant conditions from the premises licence. Please note not all premises will hold a premises licence.

- 3.5 The Council must, where it decides not to give a counter notice, give the premises user and the Police/Environmental Health a notice of the decision at least 24 hours before the beginning of the event period specified in the temporary event notice.
- 3.6 Where the Council decides to give a counter notice, it must give the premises user the counter notice and the reasons for its decision; and a copy of the counter notice and the reason for its decision to the police, at least 24 hours before the beginning of the event period specified in the temporary event notice.

4. APPEAL

- 4.1 Schedule 5, Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides a right of appeal to the premises user against the giving of a counter notice, and a right of appeal to the chief officer of Police/Environmental Health where the Council decides not to give a counter notice. Such an appeal must be commenced within 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the Licensing Authority of the decision appealed against.
- 4.2 No appeal may be brought later than five working days before the day on which the event period specified in the temporary event notice begins.

5. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 5.1 The Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy for applications relating to premises and personal licences and temporary event notices made under the Licensing Act 2003 was determined for a three-year period commencing 7 January 2011. This contains no specific policy for Temporary Event Notices but urges longer periods of notice to be given for events which involve the use of the streets or necessitate the special management of traffic and services.
