Following consideration of the application and how it may affect the Licensing Objectives and meeting the requirements of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy I wish to make the following representations:

- 1. The hours requested to exhibit films would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the area
- 2. The hours requested to play recorded music would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the area
- 3. The hours requested to provide late night refreshment would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and may affect Public Safety within the area
- 4. The supply of alcohol and the hours requested would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and may affect Public Safety within the area

It is my view that there is insufficient information to address the concerns of Environmental Health and the granting of this application as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and may affect Public Safety within the area

The applicant is asked to contact the undersigned to arrange a site visit to assess the premises to ensure the premises is satisfactory and following this, additional conditions may be recommended by Environmental Health to support the licensing objectives Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

The applicant, Columbia Pictures Corporation Limited, currently operates at 25-29 Golden Square, London, W1F 9JS under premises licence number 12/04080/LIPDPS. The Operator will shortly be moving premises and proposes to operate at a new site, Brunel Building, 2 Canalside Walk, London, W2 1DG with a view to using the premises much like their current premises. The current premises licence will be surrendered at the appropriate time.

The premises is a brand new multi-tenanted commercial office development building which comprises 16 storeys with two basement levels. The applicant will be occupying the tenth to thirteenth floors. For the purposes of this new premises licence application, only the eleventh-floor forms part of the application and proposed licensed area, as shown in the attached drawing numbered 2012 FST-11 Rev C2.

The applicant proposes to have screening rooms that will be used predominantly for the screening of their films to the press both pre and post release. They will use the bar for drinks before and/or after the screening. The applicant proposes to host staff and friends/family events where they screen films and open the bar for drinks. The applicant also proposes to hold private events at the premises with the use of the requested licensable activities, as set out in the application.

The location of the premises is easily accessible either by way of public transport via the closest station, Paddington Station, by various bus links or by taxi.

#### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children;
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on;
  - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
  - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 8. The responsible person shall ensure that;
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures;
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

10. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licenses have effect.

#### **Conditions for Sale of Alcohol**

- 11. Beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 12. A closed circuit television system shall be installed operated and maintained as reasonably specified by the Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. Recording to be retained for 31 days.
- 13. No striptease, no nudity and all persons to be decently attired at all times.
- 14. Intoxicating liquor may only be sold or supplied under authority of this licence to; Employees and officers of Columbia Pictures Corporation Limited, or its associated companies (the company) Guests of the said employees, officers and Company. Persons attending a private function in respect of which the licensee has had 24 hours written notice. Persons attending a private viewing of a film in respect of which the licensee has had 24 hours written notice. A list of persons referred to at 2,3 and 4 shall be kept at reception to the premises and be made available for inspection by police.

- 15. The maximum number of persons to be accommodated on the premises at any one time shall not exceed the number agreed by the Fire Officer in writing which at the time of grant is 80 including staff.
- 16. No draught beer.



  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

#### Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 10. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 11. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show police recent data or footage with the minimum of delay when requested.
- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised council officer or the Police which will record the following:
  - (a) All crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) All ejections of patrons
  - (c) Any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
  - (d) Any incidents of disorder
  - (e) All seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - (f) Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
  - (g) Any refusals of the sale of alcohol
  - (h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

## Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health and agreed with the applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule.

- 13. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 300 persons (to be assessed on removal of works condition)
- 14. Beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied
- 15. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- 16. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 17. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 18. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 19. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

20. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the licensing authority.

## Conditions proposed by the Police and agreed with the applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule.


- 21. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 22. The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of the premise as a private film screening venue, save for staff events.
- 23. There shall be no external advertisement of the bar facilities at the premises.

## Conditions proposed by the applicant and agreed with so as to form part of the operating schedule.

- 24. Notices shall be prominently displayed at exits requesting that patrons/smokers leaving the premises respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 25. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 the following day.
- 26. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 on the following day.

#### Conditions proposed by

27. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
