The premises already benefits from a premises licence 19/16017/LIPN.</p> <p><b>The premises are situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area as stated in City of Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy.</b></p> <p>This representation is based on the Operating Schedule, no further layout plans have been submitted.</p> <p>The applicant is seeking the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To extend the hours for the Supply of Alcohol 'on' the premises to Monday-Saturday 10:00-02:00 hours and Sunday 12:00-02:00 hours.</li> <li>2. To extend the hours for Late Night Refreshment 'indoors' from to Monday-Sunday 23:00-02:00 hours.</li> </ol> <p>I wish to make the following representation in relation to the above application:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The extension of hours for the Supply of Alcohol may cause an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area.</li> <li>2. <p>I write in relation to the application submitted for a variation of the premises licence for 40 Great Windmill Street, London, W1D 7LY.</p> <p>As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Public Nuisance</li> </ul>	

- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The application seeks the following variations:

1. To vary the existing premises licence so as to vary the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises, late night refreshment and closing hour to 02:00 Monday to Sunday.

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely HSR1 and CIP1.

The Licensing Authority note that the proposed hours varied is outside core hours. Westminster's HRS1 Policy states 'Applications for hours outside the core hours set out below in this policy will be considered on their merits, subject to other relevant policies. Paragraph 2.3.4 states 'The consideration of hours of operation will be in context of the particular circumstances of each application and the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder and public nuisance. The hours at which noise may occur and disturbance of residents' rest, relaxation and sleep will be of particular concern. Paragraph 2.5.14 also goes on to say 'The granting of later hours for restaurants would depend on the extent to which the service of customers, closing up operations and customers leaving the premises would be likely to give rise to public nuisance and crime and disorder. When considering applications for the sale of alcohol after 01:00 where representations are made on the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder or public nuisance, the council will take into account the increased likelihood of crime and disorder and the greater disturbance from activities late at night.

Paragraph 2.3.6 of the Councils statement of licensing policy states the licensing authority will consider closing times and appropriate conditions. The benefits of "winding down" periods are very widely recognised as helping to reduce crime and disorder and public nuisance.

The Licensing Authority encourage the applicant to provide further submissions as to how the premises propose to manage the terminal hour for licensable activities from Monday to Sunday bearing in mind in that in its current form all customers would have to be off the premises at the same time.

The Licensing Authority require the applicant to provide submissions as to how the operation of the proposed variation of hours will not add to cumulative impact in the West End cumulative impact area, in accordance with policy CIP1.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving further submissions from the applicant in due course.

[REDACTED] objects to this application as it is currently presented, on the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance, public safety and cumulative impact in the West End Cumulative Impact Area.

**About [REDACTED]**

[REDACTED] is a charitable company limited by guarantee established in 1972. The society is a recognised amenity group and was formed to make Soho a better place to live, work or visit by preserving and enhancing the area's existing diversity of character and uses, and by improving its facilities, amenities and environment. In particular, Society supports the Westminster City Council's policies, including the Cumulative Impact Policy, as set out in the Statement of Licensing Policy.

**Application summary**

**Premises variation;** Sale of alcohol and late night refreshment 02:00 Monday to Sunday.

**Opening hours;** Mon-Thurs: 08:00 - 23:30. Fri-Sat 08:00 - 00:00. Sun: 09:00 - 22:30

**The application**

We object to this application on the following grounds,

- It seeks to extend the terminal hour to 02:00 seven days a week, this being outside core hours - policies CIP1, HRS1 and RNT2 apply. These premises will be attractive to people who have been drinking at bars and nightclubs which goes directly against CIA policies. The applicant needs to demonstrate how they will promote the licensing objectives and not add to cumulative impact.
- We note the current licence was only granted in January 2020. The applicant fails to provide any information on the application or the rationale of seeking this extension in such a short space of time. Furthermore, we are unsure if Istanbul has ever opened, as 40, Great Windmill Street is still displaying the restaurant sign of Olive & Meze.
- We are surprised that the applicant feels a new 02:00 licence requires no further measures than a core hours licence.
- Soho is at the forefront of the late-night economy in Westminster with its numerous restaurants, bars and entertainment establishments. The area is densely populated at night with people drinking on the street, creating loud levels of noise, causing disturbance and

anti-social behaviour. In Soho between **01:00 - 02:30 there are 75 licensed premises** for the sale of alcohol in Soho, **\*capacity for 49 of these premises is 13,371**. This figure would have been higher as there were 15 licences where capacity was not recorded. This application, if granted, will add an additional 02:00 licence to this already large number. We believe this addition cannot be justified and will add to cumulative impact. (\*capacity taken from premises licences).

- In Great Windmill Street there are a number of notable premises with late licences and high capacities, **Sophie's 01:00 with a capacity of 800, Ham Yard Hotel 01:00 capacity 270, The Windmill 05:00 capacity 150, total 1,200**. With such high numbers of licensed premises and capacities it is unsurprising that Soho residents and especially those living on Great Windmill Street are concerned of another late night licence being added to this long list. We note the previous application for core hours (LSC hearing 23.1.20) received an objection from a local resident. Residents already suffer from late night noise, disturbance, anti-social behaviour and increased crime and disorder from the existing number of licensed premises in Soho. In our view this application will fail to promote these objectives - see Licensing Objectives below.
- This is the latest in a series of applications for significantly extended hours in Soho and are concerned this trend will continue as the result of the effect of COVID on the hospitality industry. Whilst we acknowledge the difficulties for restaurants, bars, cinemas and theatres, the Statement of Licensing Policy 2016 remains the same, and we also maintain our position that there needs to be a balance between the late night economy and residential amenity. We consider this balance has for some time been in favour of late night premises which in turn has led to a deterioration and reduction in residential amenity. The view of the Soho Society is that the way for Soho to thrive post COVID is for rents and rates to fall rather than by extending licences.

### **The Licensing Objectives**

In relation to the licensing objectives our concerns are as follows.

#### **Prevention of crime and disorder**

Criminal activity associated with the late-night economy / venues and large numbers of people on the streets results in high levels of serious crime. In Soho the majority of robberies take place late at night. People are targeted as they leave late night venues which is evidenced by the crime figure. Figures for Soho highlight a huge increase in robberies, \* 111 robberies took place within the four-month period from Nov - Feb 2017/18, for the same period in 2018/19 the figure was 266 an increase of 140%. Figures for theft from person also show a similar increase 401 for the same period in 2017/18 to 1,028 in 2018/19, a significant increase of 156%. (\*Source; Police UK data).

For Great Windmill Street recent reported crime from September 2019 - February 2020 highlights the following, Theft from person = 14, Robbery = 4, Violence with injury = 8, All crime = 86, and it should be borne in mind that this is a relatively short and narrow street.

Criminal activity is not limited to robberies at night. Drug dealers are also in the area targeting people. Dealers are seen in this area daily, with an increase in numbers from the early evening until late into the night, and they openly approach people on a night out. Drug dealers are in Soho late at night as there is a huge market for drugs which is linked to the number and late terminal hours of licensed venues. We are in no doubt that more customers leaving a restaurant at 02:00 in this area will attract criminal elements and result in an increase in crime and disorder.

#### **Prevention of public nuisance**

As described above, residents will be disturbed by customers leaving these premises at 02:00. It will add to public nuisance and anti-social behaviour and have a detrimental impact

on residential amenity. Residents are already disturbed by noise from people loitering in the street, drug dealers, taxis, pedicabs and anti-social behaviour in the form of street fouling.

### **Public Safety**

Under the objective PS1, the applicant needs to '*... demonstrate that the public will be safe within and in the vicinity of the premises,*' and goes on to state '*Crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour inside and in the vicinity of licensed premises may threaten public safety and affect perceptions of public safety.*' Drunk and highly intoxicated people on the streets late at night are very vulnerable requiring support and to prevent them from becoming victims of crime. To help people who become vulnerable on a night out Westminster City Council with the LGBT foundation has established the Soho Angels. These are group of volunteers who work on Friday and Saturday nights between 10pm and 5am helping vulnerable or distressed people on a night out. They work with St. John Ambulance who provide medical assistance at a 8 bedded night hub in St. Anne's Church on Dean Street. In their first year of operation they helped over 1,200 people, medical assistance was given to 230 cases of which 80 were classed as serious incidents, and 40 crimes where reported. This is further evidence of the impact of the high number of late night uses and large number of people out on the streets, such that a dedicated team of volunteers is required to help the vulnerable, keeping them safe from harm.

### **Licensing Policy - Cumulative Impact**

This area has been identified by the Westminster City Council (2.4.1 of the Statement of Licensing Policy (as amended) as under stress because the cumulative effect of the concentration of late night and drink-led premises and night cafes has led to serious problems of disorder and/or public nuisance affecting residents, visitors and other businesses.

The policies in relation to the stress areas are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole (2.4.5 of the policy). The policies are intended to be strict and will only be overridden in genuinely exceptional circumstances (2.4.2 of the policy). The growth in the entertainment industry in Soho has led to a marked deterioration in the quality of life and wellbeing of local residents, and has also jeopardised the sustainability of the community. Soho has a substantial residential community and many of these residents suffer from problems such as, but not limited to, high levels of noise nuisance, problems with waste, urinating and defecating in the streets, threats to public safety, anti-social behaviour, crime and disorder and the change in character of historic areas.

We have already highlighted the large number of late night licences, 75 in total between the hours of 01:00 - 02:30 with a capacity of over 13,371, and we believe that if this new licence is granted it will add to cumulative impact in the West End CIA.

### **Conclusion**

We believe another late night premises which closes at 02:00 would fail to promote the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and public safety and will add negatively to cumulative impact. Considering all the issues raised within this representation we respectfully request this application is rejected.

## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
  - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
    - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
  - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that –

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

8(iv).

- (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.




