b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The licensee shall ensure that the consumption of alcohol is restricted to the areas identified on the plan attached to the operating schedule.

The licensee shall ensure that person selling or supplying alcoholic drink under the authority of a personal licence holder asks for a photo ID proof of age where they have a reason to suspect that the individual may be under the age of 18.

Compliance with police guidance

- 1. The management of the premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the venue is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

Incident/Refusals Book

3. An incident/refusals book will be maintained and used at the premises. Upon request, it will be readily available for inspection by the police or local authority officer.

Security Personnel

4. All reasonable efforts are to be employed by the management and/or security personnel to keep customers quiet and orderly prior to entry and upon leaving the Premises.

Excluded Persons

5. The Premises are to permanently exclude any person found with weapons or illegal drugs at

the premises as well as customers known to have contributed to crime or serious disorder in the premises.

- 6. No person found with, or using, a weapon or illegal drugs may enter or remain on the premises.
- 7. The Premises are to take all reasonable steps to make security and other staff members aware of the identities of excluded persons.

Co-operation with authorities

- 8. Any information regarding crimes committed within the premises, including suspected drug dealing and violence, should be reported to the police immediately or as soon as is reasonably practicable.
- The Premises are to keep a record of all excluded persons. This record is to be made available to police officers and local authority officers on request.

Open bottles

10. No customers carrying open bottles shall be admitted to the premises. No customers shall be allowed to leave the premises whilst carrying open drinking vessels.

c) Public safety

The licensee will ensure that escape routes and exits including external exits, are maintained to ensure that they are not obstructed, in good order with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.

The licensee shall ensure that all exit doors are easily opened and do not require the use of key, card, code or similar mean.







 - (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 15. All tables and chairs shall be removed from the outside area by (23.00) each day.
- 16. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.
- 17. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant (i) in which customers are shown to their table, (ii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery, (iii) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption, and (iv) where intoxicating liquor shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are bona fide taking substantial table meals and provided always that the consumption of intoxicating liquor by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
- 18. Notwithstanding condition (17), alcohol may be supplied and consumed prior to their meal in the designated bar area, by up to a maximum at any one time, of 6 persons dining at the premises.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children;
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on;

 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.



- No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
