I refer to the new Premises Licence for the above premises. The premises does already benefit from a licence 16/07297/LIPVM.

This representation is based on the Operating Schedule, and layout plans for the basement, ground floor and first floor plans referenced with address, and dated 10/2/22.

The applicant is seeking to provide Late Night Refreshment both 'indoors and outdoors' from 23:00 hours to 02:00 hours Monday to Sunday.

I wish to make the following representation in relation to the above application, the proposed of hours and activity of Late Night Refreshment may cause an increase in Public Nuisance in the area and may impact on Public Safety.

Further information has been provided, which is being considered, but further conditions may be proposed by Environmental Health in order to protect the Licensing Objectives.

The granting of the new Premises Licence as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the area and may impact on Public Safety.

With reference to the above, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police Service as a Responsible Authority are **objecting** to this application on the basis that if granted, it would undermine the Licensing Objectives, namely The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

At present, you are seeking the following:

#### 1. Provide late night refreshment Indoors & outdoors at the following times:

Monday-Sunday: 2300 - 0200 hours

The hours being sought are beyond those of Westminster Councils core hours policy. There are also concerns that fast food premises which are open after 11pm can attract large groups of customers, many of whom have been consuming alcohol. The Metropolitan Police Service are also concerned with the levels of crime and disorder that happen outside fast food premises late at night due to alcohol fuelled behaviour, and the opportunities for crime afforded by the congregation of people.

There is insufficient detail within the operating schedule to promote the Licensing Objectives and we have concerns that if granted, this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

I would therefore urge the applicant to supply me with further information on how the Licensing Objectives will be promoted and how the venue will not add to any cumulative impact in the area and consider reducing the hours sought nearer to those of the core hours policy.

Also, can you please can you confirm whether the venue will be providing takeaway deliveries (Deliveroo, Just Eat etc) and if so, what measures will be taken to avoid any anti-social behaviour of the riders/drivers?

Please feel free to contact me should you wish to discuss the matter further.

Following the reduction of hours and agreement of additional conditions, the Metropolitan Police withdrew their representation on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2023

# 3. Policy & Guidance

The following policies within the City Of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy apply:

#### **Policy HRS1 applies**

- A. Applications within the core hours set out below in this policy will generally be granted for the relevant premises uses, subject to not being contrary to other policies in the Statement of Licensing Policy. B. Applications for hours outside the core hours set out in Clause C will be considered on their merits, subject to other relevant policies, and with particular regard to the following:
- 1. The demonstration of compliance in the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1 associated with the likelihood of the effect of the grant of a licence for later or earlier hours on crime and disorder, public safety, public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.
- 2. If the application is located within a Special Consideration Zone they have demonstrated that they have taken account of the issues identified in that area and provided adequate mitigation.
- 3. Whether there is residential accommodation in the proximity of the premises that would likely be adversely affected by premises being open or carrying out operations at the hours proposed.
- 4. The proposed hours of the licensable activities and when customers will be permitted to remain on the premises.
- 5. The proposed hours when any music, including incidental music, will be played.
- 6. The hours when customers will be allowed to take food or drink outside the premises or be within open areas which form part of the premises.
- 7. The existing hours of licensable activities and the past operation of the premises (if any) and hours of licensable premises in the vicinity.
- 8. Whether customers and staff have adequate access to public transport when arriving at and leaving the premises, especially at night.
- 9. The capacity of the premises.
- 10. The type of use, recognising that some venues are more likely to impact the licensing objectives than others; for example, pubs and bars are higher risk than theatres, cinemas and other cultural and sporting venues due to the nature of the operation.
- 11. The Licensing Authority will take into account the active measures proposed for a 'winding down' period including arrangements for people to be collected from the premises to travel home safely.

- 12. Conditions on hours may be attached that require that the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises ceases a suitable period of time before customers are required to leave the premises.
- 13. The council, acting as the Licensing Authority, may reduce hours if, after review, it is necessary to impose conditions specifying shorter hours in order to promote the licensing objectives.
- 14. Specific days for non-standard hours should be identified and justified as part of the application to allow responsible authorities and interested parties to evaluate the impact that these licensable activities may have, and to plan accordingly. The consideration of applications for later hours for Bank Holiday Mondays will take into account that later hours are generally granted for preceding Sundays and that the next day is a working day. Non-specific days are expected to be covered by Temporary Event Notices or variation applications.
- C. For the purpose of Clauses A and B above, the Core Hours for This application as defined within this policy is:
- 8. **Restaurants:** Monday to Thursday: 9am to 11.30pm. Friday and Saturday: 9am to 12am. Sunday: 9am to 10.30pm. Sundays immediately prior to a bank holiday: 9am to 12am.

#### Policy FFP1 (A) applies

- A. Applications outside the West End Cumulative Zones will generally be granted subject to:
- 1. The application meeting the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.
- 2. The hours for licensable activities are within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1.
- 3. The operation of any delivery services for alcohol and/or latenight refreshment meeting the council's Ancillary Delivery of Alcohol and/or Late-Night Refreshment Policy DEL1.
- 4. The applicant has taken account of the Special Consideration Zones Policy SCZ1 if the premises are located within a designated zone.
- 5. The application and operation of the venue meet the definition of a fast food premises in Clause D.
- D. For the purposes of this policy a Fast Food Premises is defined as:
- 1. A premises that provides late night refreshment, either by way of fast food over a counter, via a self-seating basis or take away for immediate consumption.
- 2. Food and drink are: a. Available on the premises for self-selection. b. Prepared on the premises. c. Cooked or produced off the premises but brought to that premises in advance of its sale to customers.
- 3. The food and drink are provided in pre-sealed or open disposable packaging which is intended for immediate consumption.
- 4. A fast-food premises can provide a delivery service as part of its operation, however that service must be ancillary to the main function of the premises as defined within sub-clauses D,1 to D,3 above.

#### 4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.





#### Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. There shall be a minimum of two employees on the premises from 22:00.
- 2. No noise shall be audible outside the facade of the premises.
- 3. All outdoor tables and chairs are to be removed from the public highway no later than 23:00 hours daily.
- 4. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises including the gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, is to be swept whilst the premises are open for business and litter and sweeping collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
- 5. At the close of business each day the premises are open for the purposes of this licence the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises is to be thoroughly washed down, unless the air temperature is 4 degrees Centigrade or less.
- 6. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 7. A litter bin shall be provided and placed outside the premises and regularly checked to ensure it is emptied when full.




Photo 2. Floor Plan






Photo 3. Location Plan










#### 4.0 PROMOTING 4 LICENCING OBJECTIVES

332 Edgware Rd, London W2 1EA is committed to promoting the Licensing Objectives, as outlined in the Licensing Act 2003, to ensure that our premises operate safely, responsibly, and in the best interests of our customers and the local community.

We understand that promoting the Licensing Objectives is a shared responsibility, and we are committed to working closely with the relevant authorities and local residents to maintain a safe and welcoming environment for all.

#### 1. Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

332 Edgware Rd, London W2 1EA takes the prevention of crime and disorder seriously, and we have implemented a number of measures to ensure that our premises are safe and secure for our customers and staff.

#### These measures include:

- a. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. (b) All entry and exit points shall be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. (c) The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and shall include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance. (d) All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. (e) Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
- b. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
  - a. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and shall record the following: (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - b. (b) all ejections of patrons
  - c. (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
  - d. (d) any incidents of disorder
  - e. (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - f. (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
  - g. (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - h. (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- Signage stating that "anti-social behaviour and/or disorder shall not be tolerated" shall be displayed at the premises.
- d. All staff to be trained on induction and every 6 months, in relation to conflict management.
- e. This training to be recorded and provided to the Responsible Authorities upon request.



#### 2. Public Safety:

332 Edgware Rd, London W2 1EA is committed to ensuring the safety of our customers and staff, and we have taken a number of steps to promote public safety within our premises.

These steps include:

a. Fire safety measures must be in place, including smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and clearly marked escape routes.

#### 3. Prevention of Public Nuisance:

332 Edgware Rd, London W2 1EA is committed to ensure that our premises do not cause undue disturbance or nuisance to local residents.

We have taken steps to prevent public nuisance, including:

- a. A direct phone number of the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. The telephone number and/or is to be made available to residents and businesses in vicinity.
- b. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- c. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area guietly.
- All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- e. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- No deliveries to the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- g. Delivery drivers shall be given clear, written instructions to use their vehicles in a responsible manner so as not to cause a nuisance to any residents or generally outside the licensed premises; not to leave engines running when the vehicles are parked; and not to obstruct the highway.
- h. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- j. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties, save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime.
- k. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated
- I. Instruct delivery drivers to be mindful of noise levels and avoid disturbing nearby residents during late-night or early-morning deliveries.



#### 4. Protection of Children from Harm:

332 Edgware Rd, London W2 1EA is committed to protecting children from harm.

We have taken steps to protect children from harm, including:

a. Unaccompanied children shall not be admitted on the premises.

# CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

- 10. A direct phone number of the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. The telephone number and/or is to be made available to residents and businesses in vicinity.
- 11. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 12. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 13. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 14. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- 15. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- 16. Delivery drivers shall be given clear, written instructions to use their vehicles in a responsible manner so as not to cause a nuisance to any residents or generally outside the licensed premises; not to leave engines running when the vehicles are parked; and not to obstruct the highway.
- 17. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 18. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) hours on the following day.
- 19. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties, save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime.


- 20. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 21. Instruct delivery drivers to be mindful of noise levels and avoid disturbing nearby residents during late-night or early-morning deliveries.
- 22. Unaccompanied children shall not be admitted on the premises.

# Conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the applicant so as to form paret of the operating schedule

- 23. After midnight, the number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) on the venue shall not exceed 40 persons.
- 24. The Premises Licence Holder shall undertake a written risk assessment quarterly or where the circumstances require, to determine whether or not a SIA licensed door supervisor is required during the hours of 23:00-01:00 and this risk assessment should be available to the Metropolitan Police and Licensing Authority upon request.
- 25. The store shall operate a "No Open Alcohol Containers" policy to prevent persons carrying open alcohol into the premises.
- 26. Signage stating that "no open alcohol containers to be allowed on the premises" shall be displayed at the premises.
- 27. The delivery of food shall only be made to a residential or business address, where the customer uses that address as an official place of residence or their recognised designated place of work. The delivery of food shall not be made or completed in a public place (on the street, in a park, by the bus stop, etc.).
