I write in relation to the application submitted for a new shadow licence for 84 - 86 Wardour Street, London W1F 0TQ.

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and RNT1.

The application is made by the freeholder of the premises for a 'shadow' licence of 21/14512/LIPN.

The Licensing Authority has reviewed the application against Licence number 21/14512/LIPN and the application has been made on the exact terms and conditions as the current issued licence.

The Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to consider Westminster's model condition 97 below

The shadow licence will not take effect when the current licence is in operation, or it lapses, is surrendered or revoked.

Should the applicant consider model condition MC97 it will allow the Licensing Authority to consider this application as a genuine application for a shadow licence.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving submissions from the applicant and then access the application against any further policy considerations.

Please accept this as a formal representation.

Following agreement of a further condition, the Licensing Authority withdrew their representation on 28 September 2023. The agreed condition appears at appendix 5

<p>I am a long-term resident and circa 7-year homeowner at the ██████████ ██████████. This residential property, housing around 15 flats, is situated ██████████ the premises currently under review at 84-86 Wardour Street. Hence I feel the need to voice significant concerns regarding the proposed licensing changes at 84-86 Wardour Street (Reference: 23/04677/LIPSL).</p> <p>My wife, ██████████, along with our neighbours within the ██████████ and several other residents in the densely populated residential areas of Soho on Meard Street, are convinced that these proposed amendments are in direct conflict with the principles of the Licensing Act 2003 and that they would result in substantial public harm.</p> <p>The former tenant on site 84-86 Wardour Street, Vapiano —a family-friendly Italian restaurant — was conscientious in maintaining community welfare and public safety. By ending operations at circa 11pm and by not ever hosting live music on their premises, Vapiano minimised public disturbances and fostered a quiet and respectful community-friendly environment.</p> <p>Furthermore, other businesses in the vicinity of the premises under review, both adjacent (Rudy's at 80 Wardour, Tortilla at 88 Wardour) and opposite (Amathus Liquor at 113 Wardour, Banana Tree at 103 Wardour Street), all cease operations before midnight and none of these other businesses host live music on site. This has facilitated a healthy balance between commercial activities and public tranquillity in our immediate residential vicinity.</p> <p>The proposed licensing change would transform 84-86 Wardour Street from a family-friendly restaurant into what appears to be a nightclub with live music.</p> <p>The potential adverse public impacts of these changes are profound and could create harm:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Harm to Children: As my wife and I eagerly anticipate the birth of our daughter in the next few weeks, our worries are heightened for her well-being, as well as for other children living in our building. The potential surge in noise and possible disorderly behaviour linked to a nightclub's presence directly opposite our residence could severely impact her mental health and disrupt the essential sleep patterns of a young newborn. Numerous studies underscore the absolute importance of sleep for babies and young children (not to mention adults). A deficit in sleep has been linked to numerous detrimental outcomes for young children, such as cardiometabolic risk factors, an elevated likelihood of ADHD and diminished cognitive performance, impaired emotional regulation, compromised academic achievement, and a reduced overall quality of life. - Expansion of Crime and Disorder: The venue's shift from a family-oriented restaurant to a nightclub operating until 2 am with live music would also elevate the risk of crime and disorder in the immediate vicinity. We worry about a potential rise in drug abuse, street harassment, and public intoxication, especially given the narrow pavements in this area. These factors could result in disturbances spilling into residential zones and negatively impacting our quality of life. - Expanded Public Nuisance, Unrest, and Heightened Threat to Public Safety: The proposed changes to the venue's operational nature and hours could escalate noise pollution, 	

litter, and foot traffic during unsocial hours. The anticipated influx of patrons, potentially intoxicated late at night, could jeopardise the safety of our usually peaceful streets. Minor changes in venue operations can have considerable implications for public safety in this high-density area, and we fear that this might include harassment of my wife and young child by potentially unruly club patrons.

The proposed licensing change seems likely to trigger a significant increase in late-night, loud, and potentially inebriated activity. This presents considerable risks, including severe public nuisance and medical harm to children. While Soho does maintain a delicate balance between commercial, residential, and community activities, the proposed changes at this particular site—running in stark contrast to its prior usage as a family-friendly Italian restaurant with limited hours—warrant rigorous scrutiny.

Please note our concerns would be mitigated if the proposed operating hours for this venue were aligned with its last occupied tenant on site and neighbouring businesses. We suggest that activities cease before 11pm and that live music be avoided on this site. Such a strategy would integrate with this site’s commercial neighbours and reduce any potential for adverse disruption. Deviating from this, we believe, will introduce significant harm and adverse health impacts.

We sincerely appreciate your attention to this pressing matter and await your response. We also remain open to further consultation, if you believe it would be beneficial in your deliberations.

The sale and consumption of alcohol prior to such meals may be in a bar area but must also be ancillary to the taking of such meal.</p>
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4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

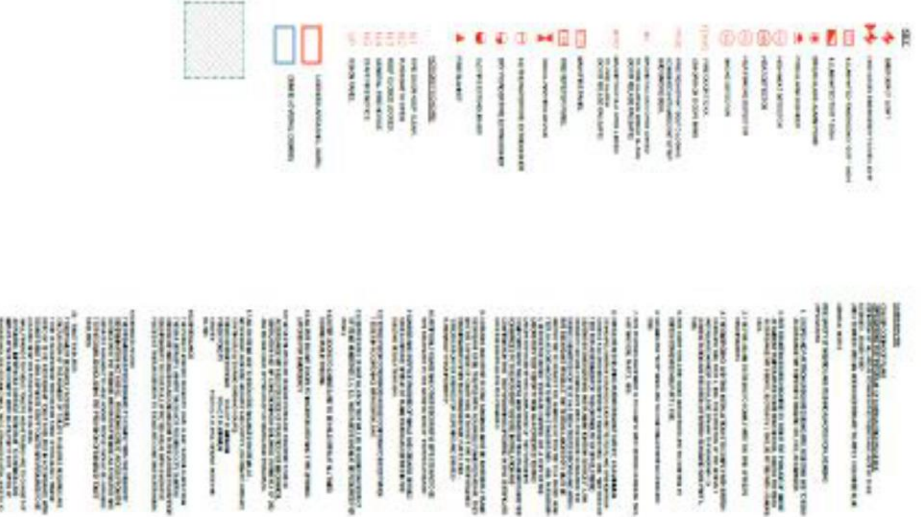

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of

alcohol under such a licence;

- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

10. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant (save for in those areas marked with cross hatches on the plans for up to 60 persons),
- a) in which customers are shown to their table or the customer will select a table
 - b) themselves,
 - c) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - d) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table,
 - e) which do not provide any takeaway service of food or drink for immediate
 - f) consumption off the premises,
 - g) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

For the purpose of this condition 'Substantial Table Meal' means – a meal such as might be expected to be served as the main midday or main evening meal, or as a main course at either such meal and is eaten by a person seated at a table, or at a counter or other structure which serves the purposes of a table and is not used for the service of refreshments for consumption by persons not seated at a table or structure servicing the purposes of a table.

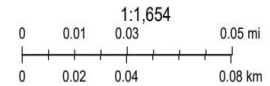
