With reference to the above applications, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, are objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

There is insufficient detail contained within the operating schedule to promote the licensing objectives.

It is for these reasons that we object to this application.

The Metropolitan Police Service withdrew their representation on the 1st November 2023 due to conditions that were agreed with the applicant. These can be found at Appendix 4.

1. The provision and the hours requested for Supply of Alcohol will the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the area and may impact on Public Safety.

The granting of the application as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the area and may impact on Public Safety within the area.

The applicant has provided additional information within the application which is being assessed. Additional conditions will be proposed by Environmental Health to address the licensing objectives.

Received:28 September 2023I object to this licence because the location of the premises are entirely unsuitable for licensed retail activity including deliveries because it is situated on a red route which is part of the Congestion Zone bypass.There is no suitable area for any delivery vehicles to stop and unload stock for the premises. We are resident in Victoria Square adjacent to Lower Grosvenor Place and are surrounded by many licensed premises including off licences such as Marks&Spencers, Waitrose and other wine bars. This causes antisocial behaviour late at night and considerable noise. A late night off-licence will encourage more people to buy alcohol and then consume it in the Square. Any application, if granted, for deliveries after 9pm or indeed up to then will cause enormous problems. There is no parking for scooters in Lower Grosvenor Place so they will park illegally on the pavement outside the premises and the adjacent buildings or on the pavement in Victoria Square. On collecting their deliveries they will then go through Victoria Square rather than carrying on round Lower Grosvenor Place. this will add to the late night noise experienced in the Square. Given the premises are in the Victoria SCZ it would add to the existing problems of noise, street drinking and antisocial behaviour which the SCZ seeks to address. It would contravene DEL 1, criteria 1,5,7. certainly make this worse. The proposed licence would require the premises to close at 9pm, but that will not prevent antisocial behaviour during the day and it is inevitable that some customers will loiter after 9pm.

Permission is also sought for deliveries after 9pm. Deliveries from local restaurants and takeaway services already cause significant problems, particularly in the part of the square which adjoins Buckingham Palace Road. This application would create worse problems at the Lower Grosvenor Place side of the square as well and does not comply with DEL1, criteria 1, 5 and 7. No waiting area is proposed (G4) and no consideration is given to noise (G4) or parking (G5). Lower Grosvenor Place is a busy red route. There is nowhere to park scooters legally or safely. A licence condition to restrict deliveries to Beeston Place only might mitigate the problems but would not be observed in practice by 3rd party delivery services and drivers.

The premises are also in the Victoria SCZ. Street drinking and noise at night are recognised as particular local problems: Licensing Policy D56. Contrary to SCZ1, the applicant makes no proposals to address any of these problems and wrongly states that the premises are not in an SCZ at all.

The application should therefore be refused.

inebriated states. Cannabis cigarettes have been stubbed out in my doorstep flower pots, empty alcohol tins and bottles have been left on my doorstep and thrown into my basement. Syringes

have been found in the locked square. I have seen people climbing into the locked square and many sitting on the curb surrounding the square, on a daily basis. They are drinking and eating. They leave litter. We are a residential area with pensioners living alone and many small children.

We already have enough alcohol outlets with bars, pubs and shops like Waitrose and M & S close by. Litter is dumped and our doorsteps which have been used as toilets. We already have a plethora of illegal parking by builders, non residents and suppliers plus a myriad of food and drink delivery scooters.

There is no public parking in this part of Lower Grosvenor Place and no waiting or drop off areas for motor bikes and scooters .We are in the Victoria SCZ and this will increase the noise, outside drinking, noise and antisocial behaviour which the SCZ wants to eradicate. This application would contravene DEL 1, criteria 1,5,7. No consideration is given to a waiting area or noise contrary to G4 and no parking G5.

We already have suspicious parked cars at meters whose drivers sit with interior lights on, waiting for hours from around from midnight to 3am. I assume they are drug dealers.

Street drinkers sometimes sit on doorsteps eating, drinking and carousing for hours: Licensing Policy D56, contrary to SCZ1, the applicant makes no proposals to address any if these issues and wrongly states that the premises are not in an SCZ at all.

I am opposed to the granting of the application because I believe it will result in a significant increase in antisocial behaviour, noise nuisance, and public safety issues. The operations of such an establishment will disturb the local businesses and residents on Lower Grosvenor Place and Victoria Square.

Lower Grosvenor Place is home to both commercial and residential properties. The addition of another licensed premises located so close to residential and professional establishments will cause noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour from customers who choose to consume their purchases and loiter in the area.

Moreover, there is already a significant problem with parking in Victoria Square, which is likely to overflow onto Lower Grosvenor Place, an already busy red route. There is already a significant problem with parking in the area including safety and rubbish left be behind from delivery companies. The addition of more deliveries, plus third-party delivery drivers who already park on the pedestrian walkway causing health and safety risks. There is already a particular issue at the Buckingham Palace Road end of Victoria Square, which is likely to be repeated at Lower Grosvenor Place. This puts pedestrians at risk.

We have several healthcare practices, we are concerned about how our clients with restricted mobility will safely traverse the footpath given the above concerns.

As a local healthcare business owner among the 7 health and beauty-based businesses, I feel that this would disrupt the harmony of the local business community and have a negative impact on health and safety.

For these reasons, I strongly believe that this application should be refused.

Firstly I would like to	make three comments	about their application:

a. They state in their application that the average price of a bottle of wine will be £30. This is unlikely. I am the chairman of a company which includes a wine shop in Pavilion Road SW3, where even in this premium location, the average price is about £18 a bottle. In general in London the prices are between £10 and £15. Given its location, I think it will attract few local residents buying premium wines but rather and more likely London visitors walking past and paying no more than the average.

b. In their further information document they state that there are no shops in the vicinity making off sales. This is incorrect as there is a Waitrose within 300 metres and an M&S store within 400, both of which sell premium wines. There are also all the shops in Victoria station.

c. I understand that the owner's other business is a vaping shop in High Holborn (F&S Vape Shop in Holborn, Central London | Same Day Delivery (fsvapeshop.co.uk)). The application suggests that vaping products will be available in this wine store, and I fear that this will become a prominent product in the store, which is unsuitable for the area. Their website currently only sells vaping products.

d. The applicant incorrectly states that the premises do not fall within the Victoria Special Consideration Zone. So the relevant policies should apply to these premises.

So I wish to object to the granting of a license on the grounds currently proposed, on the basis of harm to the licensing objectives, principally prevention of public nuisance for the following reasons.

1. Considerable mention is made of sales by collections, e.g. by Uber, Just Eat etc. The Square already has too many scooter collections. Indeed the reason for the applicant's extended hours is to facilitate these type of sales. The entrance to the Square from Buckingham Palace Road is permanently clogged by scooters collecting from restaurants in Buckingham Palace Road and Nova. The only place that scooters will stop to collect from these new premises is the small space before the parking places (see photograph) opposite 5 Lower Grosvenor Place/19 Victoria Square – they cannot stop outside the premise as it is a redline and the sheer weight of traffic will prevent this. Furthermore, this is controlled by a red line, but this will be ignored. I think no scooter collections should be perfectly capable of meeting online orders and located in a much more appropriate location for such activity.

Furthermore if collections are to be permitted, I understand that the reason they wish to remain operating beyond opening hours is to permit such collections between the hours of 9 pm and 11 pm. This is unacceptable because of the lack of parking and the noise late at night.
 The shop should only be allowed to sell premium beers, ciders etc so as to discourage the

buying of cheap alcohol, which is then consumed in the Square, and not in single cans. 4. For all the above reasons the shop, as currently proposed, will not be able to support the aims of the Licensing Objectives and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy unless it is limited to its main objective of being a boutique retail wine shop where customers attend to purchase wine, and therefore not selling for scooter collection or cheap alcohol encouraging street drinking in the vicinity of our homes.

5. I understand that the Council has a policy regarding deliveries of alcohol, DEL1. The application does not comply with this policy – for instance, it is clear that delivery drivers would be third party app-based, not employed by the licence holder or indeed by the app companies, and therefore very difficult to control/regulate. This in itself should be enough to mitigate against any delivery service (a common planning condition), even without the location-specific concerns set out above.

I believe this application will cause a local nuisance and therefore object:

(1) Lower Grosvenor Place is a "red route" forming part of the Inner London Ring Road. It will be impossible for delivery drivers to stop outside the shop. It is therefore very likely indeed that

delivery drivers on scooters will instead congregate outside numbers 16-18 and 19-22 Victoria Square, or else in the Square itself.

(2) The Square already suffers from delivery drivers on scooters waiting there and driving far too quickly around it. As a parent of two young children this is very concerning. It is also entirely out of keeping with a Square of Grade II* listed buildings in a Conservation Area.
(3) Operating hours of up to 11pm are unreasonable in view of (1) and (2) above.

 (3) Operating hours of up to Trpm are unreasonable in view of (1) and (2) above.
 (4) The shop, as currently proposed, will not be able to support the aims of the Licensing Objectives and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy unless it is limited to its main objective of being a boutique retail wine shop where customers attend to purchase wine, and therefore not selling for scooter collection or cheap alcohol encouraging street drinking in the vicinity of our homes.

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

(a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;

(b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and

(c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.



- 21. No commercial deliveries and/or collections, including refuse and recyclable food waste, shall take place between 19:00 and 07:00 hours. (This restriction does not apply to deliveries to customers or collections by made by them)

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 5(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 5(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 5(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act

1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D + (DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 5(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 5(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 5(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 5(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 5(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 6. The intended primary use of the premise shall be as a specialist wine retail shop.
- 7. Any licensable activities shall be ancillary to the running of a specialist wine shop.

Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health and agreed with the applicant to form part of the operating schedule

8. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.

- 9. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 10. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 11. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 12. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.


Conditions proposed by the Police and agreed with the applicant to form part of the operating schedule

- 13. All tills shall automatically prompt staff to ask for age verification identification when presented with an alcohol sale.
- 14. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
- 15. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 16. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 17. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 18. A direct telephone number for the manager to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity on request.
- 19. Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol and whilst the premises are open to the public, the licence holder shall ensure that all alcohol within the premises (including alcohol behind the counter) is secured in a locked store room or behind locked grilles, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by both customers and staff.
- 20. No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders or spirit mixtures of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises, except for premium beers and ciders supplied in glass bottles.
- 21. There shall be no self-service of spirits on the premises, save for spirit mixtures less than 5.5% ABV.

- 22. Prominent signage indicating the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol shall be displayed so as to be visible before entering the premises, where alcohol is on public display, and at the point of sale.
- 23. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 24. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram
- 25. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system,
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 26. No miniature bottles of spirits of 20 cl or below shall be sold from the premises.
- 27. All cashiers shall receive refresher training on the relevant alcohol laws and the licence holder's policy on challenging for ID. Such training shall take place at least twice a year. Records shall be maintained at the premises containing information about the training of any person who may make a sale of alcohol including the date of their training and the nature of the training undertaken. The relevant documentation shall be produced on request to a police officer or relevant officer of a responsible authority.
