The Metropolitan Police Service objects to this application as it is likely that if the application where to be granted, the premise would undermine the following licensing objective/s:

- the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The applicant has failed to demonstrate in the application that they can uphold and promote the licensing objectives. The applicant has not offered sufficient conditions and as such we object to this application.

Further submissions will be submitted.

Conditions have been proposed by the Metropolitan Police and agreed by the applicant to form part of the operating schedule. As the conditions were agreed with the Police they have now withdrawn their representation on the 29th April 2024. These can be found at Appendix 4.

The application states that the "majority of the premises on the same street also are open until 23:30/00:00". That is inaccurate. I have not been able to find any premises that are open so late.			
I oppose the propros	ed extension of Fireawa	ay's opening hours.	

It will almost certainly lead to more nuisance to local residence.

There will clearly be much more car traffic/parking late night, very close to neigbours' flats, for restaurant visits. Cars will also stop and wait, often with engines running, while the takeaway pizza is being prepared. People will stand outside chatting and smoking until late.

Intoxicated crowds will go to this pizza restaurant/takeaway (which would be open much later than Domino's on Warwick Way) much later than other restaurants in the street. Fireaway pizza boxes will occasional be left on neighbours front doors and benches in the area (as is presently already the case).

This is not an appropriate area for late night openings.

Strongly object. Ths granting of change if use from retail to yet another take away was controversial- with a front page licsl media piece saying this area now serves as a take away and delivery area for most if SW1. We are already plagued with noise and disruption from			

delivery drivers and late night eaters and drinkers - and terrible air pollution from restaurants and take aways. I would strongly object to having this premises having even longer opening hours - making it a magnet late at night - let alone being licensed and serving alcoholespecially late at night. If the Council has any care at all for dwindling population who live and are trying to bring up a family in this area this application would be turned down. I am happy to provide more information if helpful.

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

(a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;

(b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and

(c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.



 (a) The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team.
 (b) All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person

entering in any light condition. (c) The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and will include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance.

(d) All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.

(e) Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.

- 2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons

(c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder

(d) any incidents of disorder

(e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons


(f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment

- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 4. There shall be no use of any external food delivery companies e.g. Deliveroo & Uber after 23:00.
