Figure 1 - The majority of respondents do not own a dog

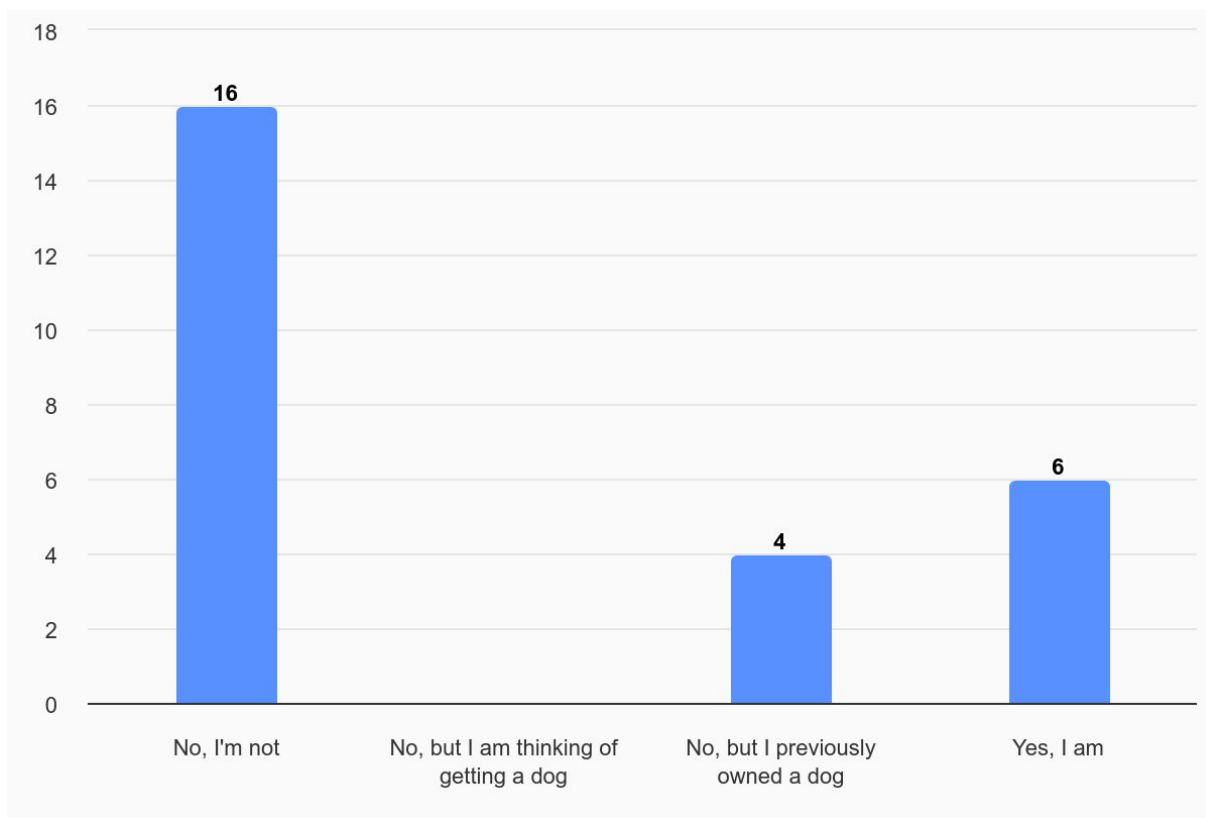


Figure 2 - No respondents were assistance dog users

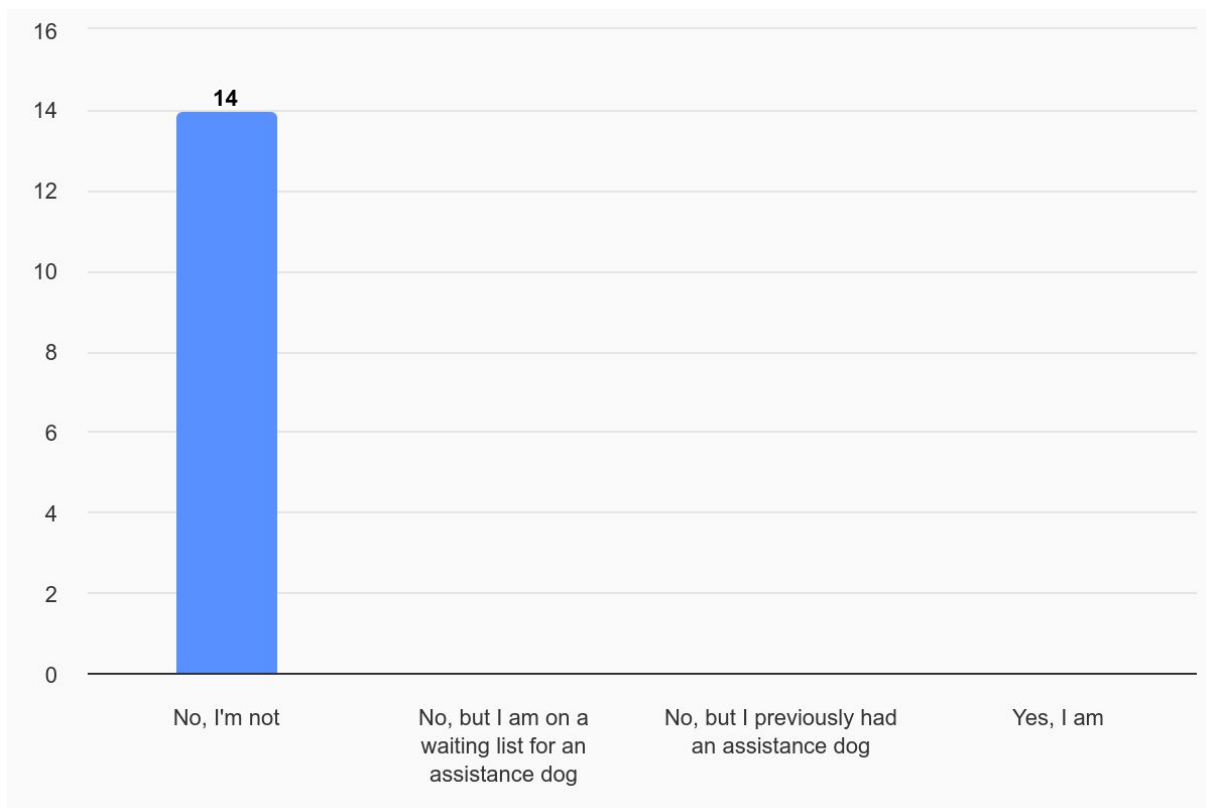


Figure 3 - Dog fouling is considered a bigger issue than out of control dogs

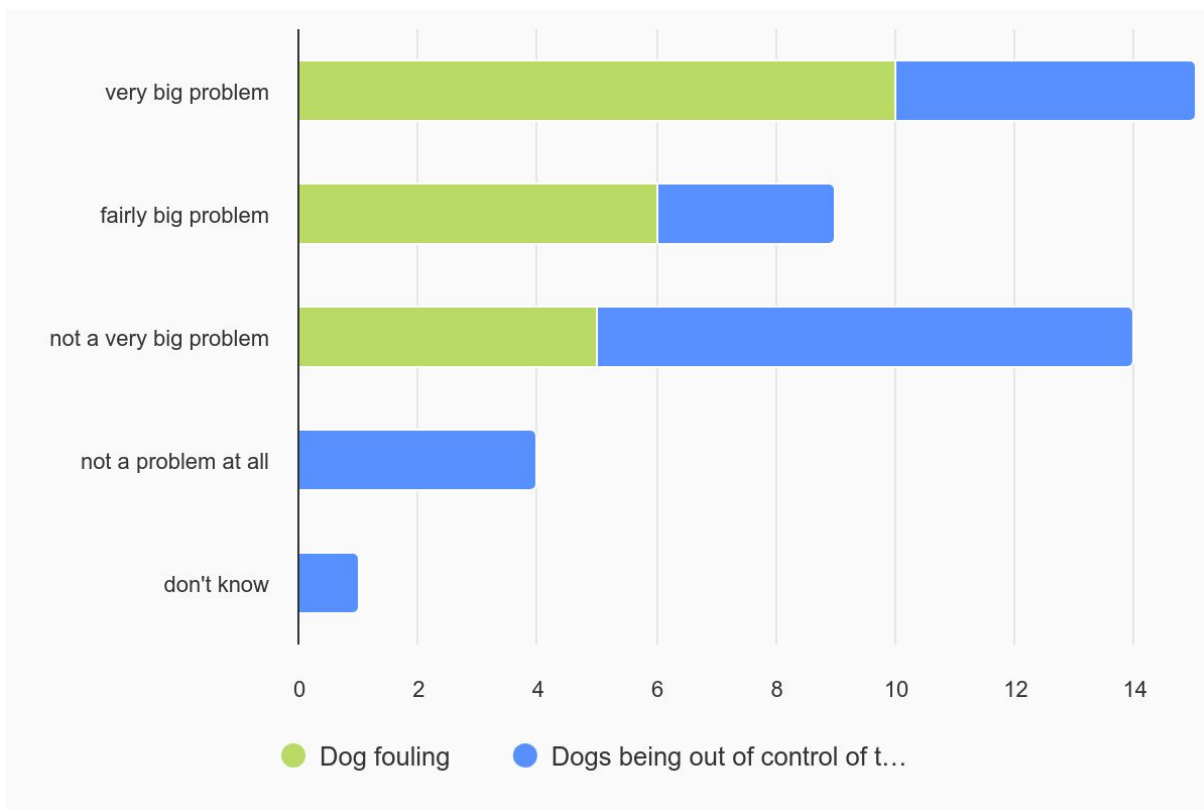
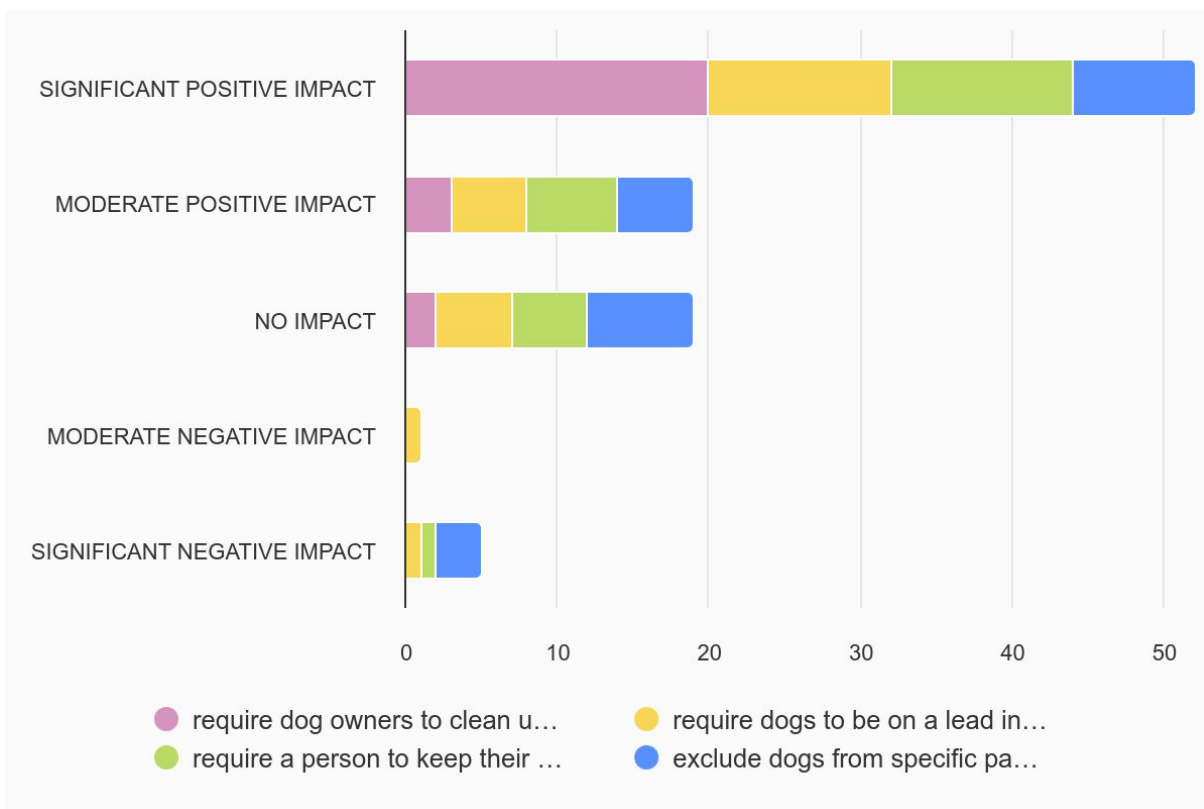


Figure 4 - Respondents were overwhelmingly positive about the impact that the orders would have in their area

Figure 5 - Respondents were evenly split on their concerns over street drinking and people being drunk and rowdy

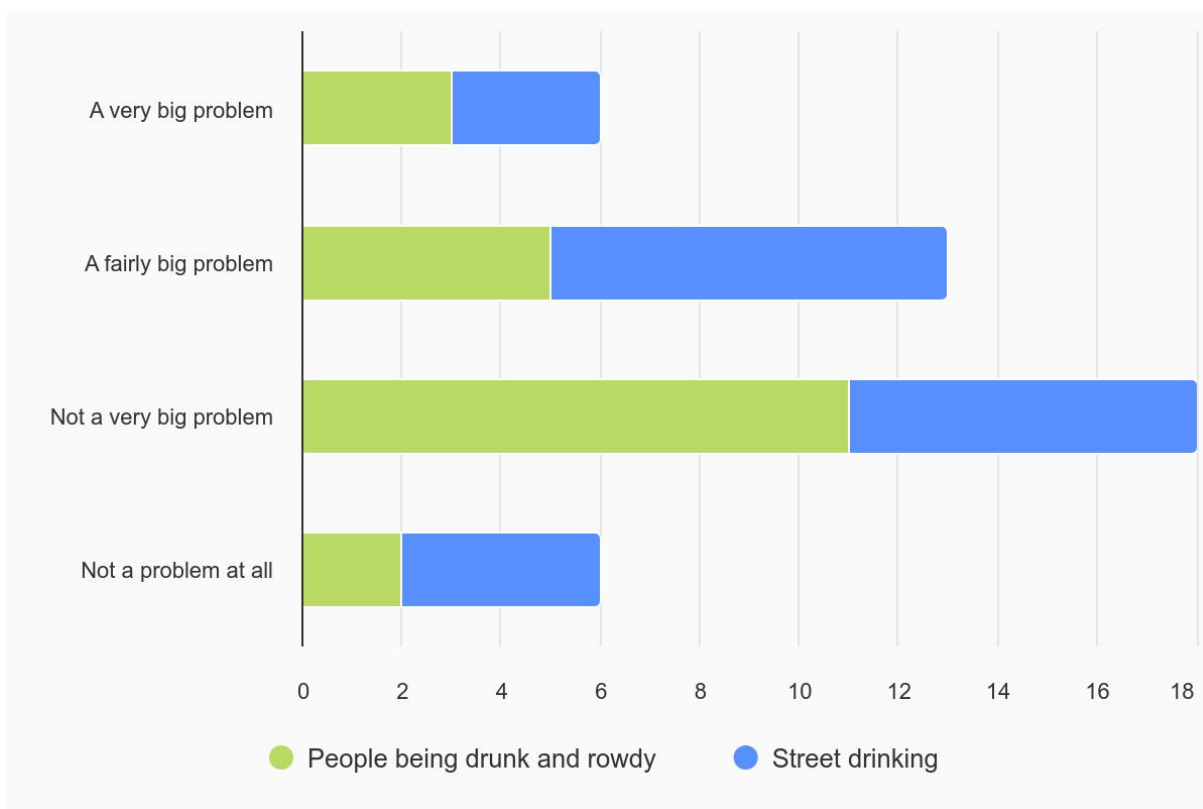
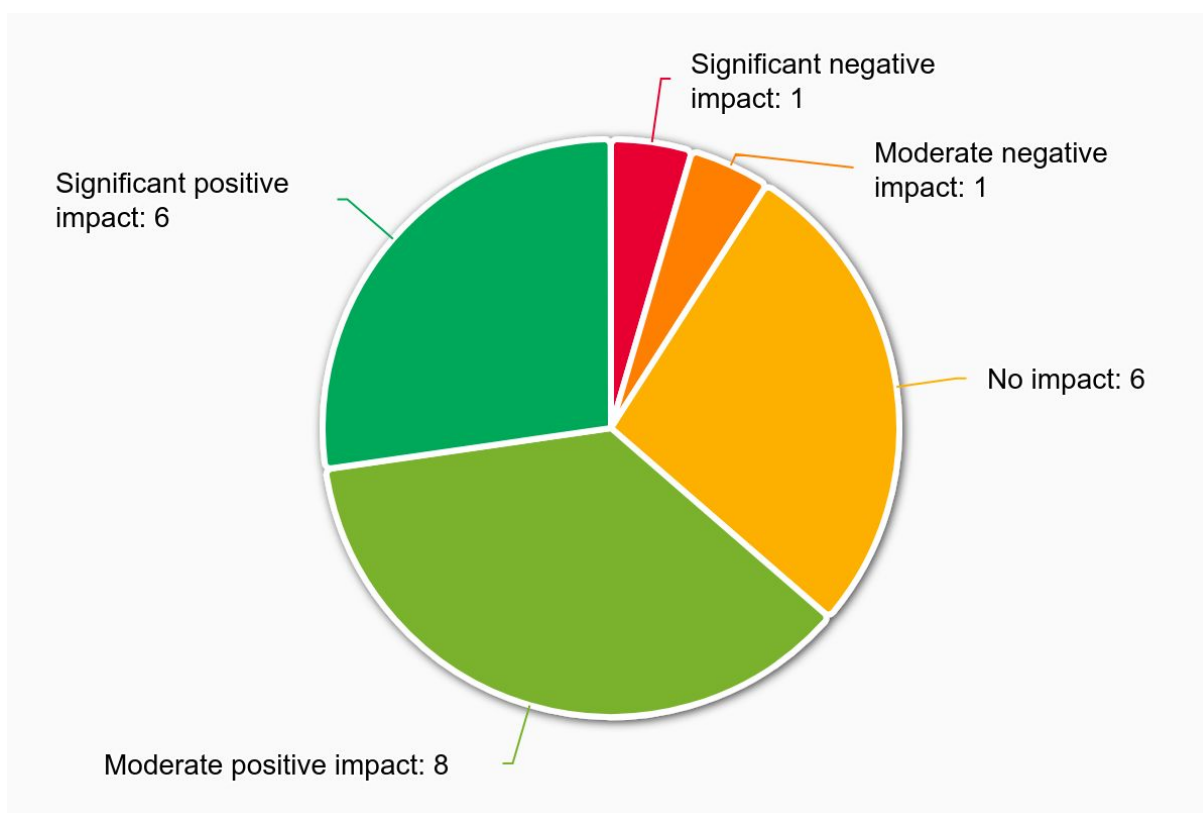


Figure 6 - The majority of respondents felt that the controlled drinking PSPO would have a positive impact



Comments

Generally I don't find street drinking an issue in Westminster where I live, and I don't think changes to the PSPO will impact this as those that are causing issues are unlikely to change their ways because of this!

We have regular issues with drinkers from a local pub blocking pavement areas in breach of the pubs licence. Despite intervention from WWC and the local Met team, these continue,

The phrasing "likely to cause ASB" gives a lot of discretion to the police to decide who does and doesn't get to drink on the street. I don't trust the Metropolitan Police to use their discretion in a way that is fair and equitable.

I would feel safer coming home from bus stop or underground station. Fed up with people standing around drinking. Or during day elderly might want to sit down on bench for rest and people are sitting on bench drinking. Same as children's playgrounds youngsters sitting in there drinking. Also we have people drinking in their cars with doors open talking loudly
