<p>This is an application by Soho Estates Portfolio Limited for a 'shadow' premises licence, for a restaurant and bar (with opening hours of 8am to 1.00am, Monday to Saturday, and 8am to 11.30pm on Sunday) covering two floors, with a capacity of 200 excluding staff on the ground floor and 50 excluding staff in the basement area.</p> <p>We are concerned with all licences and especially those that fall outside of the core hours policy and their impact on the licensing objectives and cumulative impact, this also includes 'shadow licences' which allow landowners to protect their interest in the property.</p> <p>The Cumulative Impact Policy CIP1 says the Licensing Authority may consider granting such applications, and:</p> <p><i>'The Shadow Licence will, in the event that a licence lapses, is surrendered or is revoked the property owner can look to market the property with the licence. The holder of the Shadow Licence would in those circumstances need to apply to the Licensing Authority to vary the licence to remove any condition preventing the use of that licence.'</i> (D20)</p> <p>We are willing to withdraw this representation if the applicant agrees to model condition 97: <i>'The shadow licence will not take effect when the current licence is in operation, or lapses, is surrendered or revoked.'</i></p> <p>At a recent shadow licence hearing 24/01850/LIPSL the Licensing Sub-Committee supported our view that MC97 is designed to provide greater protection within the Cumulative Impact Zone and ensures additional scrutiny on any variation application.</p> <p>For reference, we attach evidence which supports the importance of condition MC97 in protecting residents and those on a night out.</p> <p>For reference:</p> <p>As the Committee will know, Soho is already saturated with licensed premises which currently stands at over 495 licences, of which 121 have a terminal hour between 1am and 6am, the capacity of which licences exceeds 22,000 people. The demand for licensed premises in the West End and Soho shows no tendency to reduce. From 2020 to 2024 to date 59 new alcohol</p>			

licences have been granted with a capacity of over **5,816**. It comes as no surprise that the infrastructure cannot cope with the vast number of people in the area at night, the consequences being the highest crime rates in Westminster and high levels of public nuisance which prevents residents from sleeping at night.

Residents have been subjected to noise disturbance and anti-social behaviour which are beyond

acceptable levels. They are disturbed by the night time activity as people walk by (often shouting, or arguing), noise from pedicabs playing loud music, car doors slamming, horns hooting, people vomiting and urinating in the street and in their doorways. Residents are also often disturbed even if an establishment is not located directly on their street, as customers, often noisy and intoxicated, leave premises to either carry on their night out in Soho or make their way home.

The Cumulative Impact Assessment 2023 provides the evidence that increasing the number of licensed premises or the extension of current licences in the West End is a huge concern. The modelling shows a **50% increase** in undesirable behaviours from any **NEW OR EXTENDED licence**. The figures also suggest a 26% increase in reported theft for each additional licence issued for whatever type of venue.

The CIA goes on to state the '**West End Zone 1 is the epicentre for issues associated with cumulative impact within the borough,**'

It concludes with a proposed new Licensing Authority Statement which clearly states this application should be refused;

*'It is the view of the Licensing Authority that **the number of relevant authorisations in respect of premises in the West End is such that it is likely that it would be inconsistent with the authority's duty under section 4(1) Licensing Act 2003 to grant any further relevant authorisations or variations in respect of premises in that area.**' (our emphasis)*

It comes as no surprise that crime in Soho is significant and associated with the night time economy - the statistics from the police and council highlights the magnitude of the problem. The council's own 2023 Cumulative Impact Assessment provides the evidence.

- Violence is also concentrated in the West End areas, with 47% (4,879) of all violence in West End Ward and St James's ward. Approximately 59% (6,028) took place during the night time, most concentrated in the period just prior to and after midnight. This places Westminster in contrast with other boroughs, as our violence is not in highly deprived areas but locations with an active night-time economy

- 66% of all crime in Westminster takes place in the West End and St James's

- 65% of sexual offences in Westminster are in the West End and St James's

- It confirms the majority of crime takes place on Friday / Saturday and Saturday/Sunday between 6pm - 6am and importantly overnight crime is identified as being particularly prevalent in Old Compton Street, Greek Street and Frith Street, Dean Street sits within this area.

- Just under 66% (50,462) of all crime in Westminster and 74% (43,715) of 'public realm crime' crime occurs in just two wards: West End Ward and St James's Ward

- Approximately a third 30% (8,329) of all crime (with an identifiable location) during the night time economy was identified as involving a location related to licensing and the night time economy.

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4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team:
 - a. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.
 - b. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and will include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance.
 - c. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.
 - d. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
11. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
12. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after 23.00.
13. The external tables and chairs shall only be used between 08:00 and 23:00 each day and be rendered unusable at 23:00.
14. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

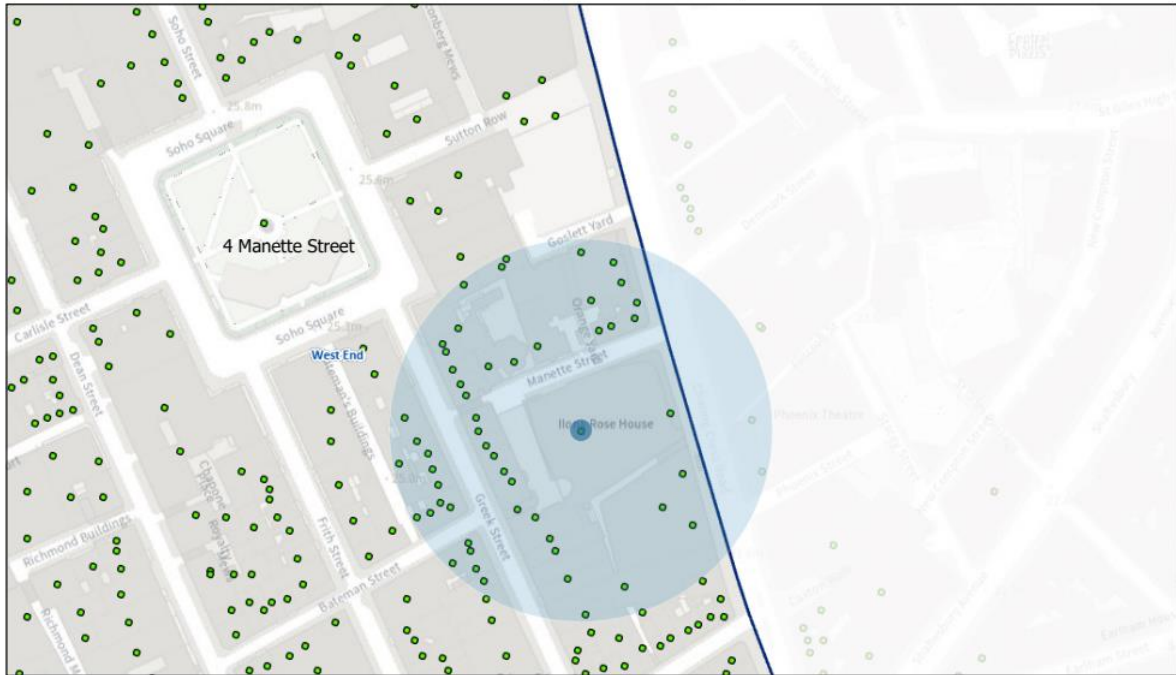
